

## SENATE AMENDMENT 1 TO SB121.

deleting line 5 on page 1 and substituting therefor "Senators Wilson and Bell"

AND

by deleting Section 2 of the bill, the same being lines 33 through 36 on page 1 and lines 1 through 11 on page 2, and substituting therefor the following:

"SECTION 2. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the powers and duties enumerated in this act shall be the exclusive statutory grant of powers and duties to constables.

(b) The minimum training requirement for constables are as follows:

(1) The constable shall complete at least one hundred twenty (120) hours of law enforcement training certified by the Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training Office. This requirement shall not apply during a person's first year of service as a constable. This requirement shall not be interpreted as requiring additional training for a constable who has met the training requirement prior to the effective date of this act; and

(2) Each year after meeting the requirements of subdivision (b)(1) the constable shall complete at least ten (10) hours of continuing education in law enforcement.

(b) A constable who meets the minimum training requirements of subsection (b):

(1) shall have full statutory law enforcement authority.

(2) may serve civil process directed to the county sheriff.

(3) may accept surplus equipment donated by the county.

(4) shall transport his own prisoners and shall be responsible for any and all evidence seized in an arrest; and

(5) shall not make any vehicle stops if or when not in a clearly marked automobile with the ability to immediately communicate the fact of the stop to a full-time law enforcement agency. Upon any traffic stop the constable shall immediately communicate the fact of the stop to the nearest full-time law enforcement agency.

(c) A constable who fails to meet the minimum training requirements of subsection (b) shall not make any vehicle stops nor shall the constable have any other powers or duties, except that the constable may serve civil process that has been directed to the county sheriff by a court of law.

(d) This section shall apply to deputy constables where such officers are authorized by law.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective January 1, 1998."

AND

by appropriately renumbering the subsequent sections of the bill striking line 5 on page 1 and substituting therefor "Senators Wilson and Bell"

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
