SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 8-6-704(b), regarding the powers and duties of regional solid waste management boards, is amended to read as follows:

(b)(1) The regional solid waste management boards may:

~~(1)(A)~~ (A) Apply for such permits, licenses, certificates, or approvals as may be necessary to construct, maintain, and operate any portion of a solid waste management system and to obtain, hold, and use licenses, permits, certificates, or approvals in the same manner as any other person or operating unit of any other person;

~~(2)(B)~~ (B) Employ such engineers, architects, attorneys, real estate counselors, appraisers, financial advisors, and other consultants and employees as may be required in the judgment of the district and fix and pay their compensation from funds available to the district therefor; ~~and~~

~~(3)(C)~~ (C) Purchase all kinds of insurance, including, but not limited to, insurance against tort liability, business interruption, and risks of damage to property; ~~and~~

(D) Employ an environmental officer who may:  
(i) Inspect all landfills;  
(ii) Inspect other solid waste facilities;  
(iii) Inspect waste haulers and other vehicles;  
(iv) Insure compliance with all district regulations;  
(v) Collect evidence of noncompliance and present the evidence to the prosecuting attorney; or  
(vi) Issue citations for the violation of any regulation throughout the district.

(2)(A) If a regional solid waste management board employs an environmental officer under this subsection (b), then the environmental officer may complete the training course for law enforcement officers at the Arkansas Law Enforcement Training Academy.

(B) After satisfactory completion of the training course, the environmental officer shall be a law enforcement officer.

(C) After satisfactory completion of the training course, the environmental officer may:

(i) Carry firearms;

(ii) Execute and serve a warrant or other processes issued under the authority of the district and related to violations of district regulations; and

(iii) Make arrests and issue citations for violations of district regulations regarding environmental protection.”

"AN ACT TO ALLOW ANY CERTIFIED PERSONNEL TO EARN UP TO TWELVE (12) HOURS OF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT CREDIT FOR TIME REQUIRED AT THE BEGINNING OF THE SCHOOL YEAR TO PLAN AND PREPARE A CURRICULUM AND OTHER INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIAL FOR HIS OR HER ASSIGNED CLASSES; TO ALLOW CERTIFIED PERSONNEL TO EARN PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT CREDIT FOR ACTIVITIES DIRECTLY RELATED TO STUDENT PERFORMANCE THAT ARE REQUIRED AND PERFORMED OUTSIDE REGULAR SCHOOL DAY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

Delete the subtitle in its entirety and substitute:

"AN ACT TO ALLOW ANY CERTIFIED PERSONNEL TO EARN UP TO TWELVE (12) HOURS OF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT CREDIT."

AND

Delete everything following the enacting clause entirely and substitute:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 17, Subchapter 7 is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:

6-17-705. Professional development credit.

(a)(1) Up to twelve (12) hours of professional development credit may be earned by any certified personnel for time required at the beginning of each school year to plan and prepare a curriculum and other instructional material for his or her assigned classes, if the time is:

(A) Spent in his or her classroom, office, or media center at the public school; and

(B) Prior to the first student-teacher interaction day of the school year, but no school district shall require certified personnel to work additional days that are not included in his or her contract for the professional development credit provided under this section.

(2) A school district superintendent or building level principal may allow certified personnel to earn professional development credit for time required to prepare student improvement plans, individual education plans, or other required duties that are not performed during the regular school day and are directly related to student academic progress.

(b) Certified personnel shall earn one (1) hour of professional development credit for each one (1) hour of planning and preparation that meets the requirements of subdivision (a)(1) of this section or student progress related activities that meets the requirements of subdivision (a)(2) of this section.

(c) The State Board of Education shall promulgate the rules necessary for the proper implementation of this section.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that school districts are currently entering into contracts for professional development programs to be offered during the 2005-2006 school year; that school districts need sufficient time to plan and schedule professional development programs for certified personnel; and that this act is immediately necessary because a delay in its enactment may cause some districts to enter into unnecessary contracts for professional development programs. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto."

(b) The Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board, in consultation with the colleges and universities, shall develop the criteria and guidelines for the development of the State Minimum Core Curriculum.

(c)(1) By December 1, 2006, the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall publish an Internet-based student manual that identifies and describes how general education courses at public institutions of higher education transfer to other public institutions of higher education within Arkansas.

(2) General information concerning the State Minimum Core Curriculum, including the web-page link, shall be published in all versions of course catalogs of all public colleges and universities.

SECTION 2. Guidelines for course review.

(a)(1) Arkansas public colleges and universities shall submit to the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board an application for courses to be included in the State Minimum Core Curriculum.

(2) Courses shall be reviewed and recommended by a peer review project team established in the discipline.

(b)(1)(A) The Department of Higher Education shall establish peer review project teams composed of faculty members of Arkansas universities and two-year colleges.

(B) The peer review project team for each discipline shall include no less than four (4) faculty members equally divided between two-year and four-year institutions who teach in the discipline. Members shall be appointed by a majority vote of the Executive Council of Presidents and Chancellors of the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

(2)(A) The peer review project team for each discipline shall review and recommend to the Department of Higher Education courses in the applicable discipline to be recommended to the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board for inclusion in the State Minimum Core Curriculum.

(B)(i) Courses not receiving a recommendation by the peer review project team shall receive from the peer review project team suggested improvements or revisions for the course or its application.

(ii) Colleges and universities may resubmit course applications to the peer review project team if the original application is not recommended to the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board, after appropriate adjustments have been made based on the suggested improvements or revisions from the peer review project team.

SECTION 3. Reporting.

All public institutions of higher education and any participating private institutions of higher education shall file a report annually within the Department of Higher Education identifying the number of students who requested transfer credit for a completed course in the State Minimum Core Curriculum but were not given credit."
