(17) Disclosure to a capital development company organized under the Arkansas Capital Development Company Act, § 15-4-1001 et seq., of the name and tax identification number of and amount of any tax credit received by a taxpayer as a result of the purchase of an equity interest in a capital development company; and

(18)(A) For the purpose of timely and accurate collection of local sales and use tax, disclosure of the names and addresses of taxpayers that have failed three (3) times within any consecutive twenty-four month period to either report or remit state or local gross receipts or compensating use tax and have been served with a business closure order pursuant to § 26-18-1001, et seq.

(B) Disclosure shall be made by posting weekly on the Internet site maintained by the Department of Finance and Administration the business name, the business address, and the city and county in which the business is located as it appears on the sales tax permit of each taxpayer identified in subdivision (18)(A) of this section.

(C) The information posted on the Internet site for a taxpayer shall remain on the Internet site until that taxpayer is no longer subject to the business closure provisions of § 26-18-1001 et seq.”

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that a decision of the Arkansas Supreme Court has called into question the authority of the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality to enforce provisions of hazardous waste management permits; that this authority is necessary for the department to receive delegation from the United States Environmental Protection Agency to administer the federal hazardous waste management permit program; and that this act is immediately necessary to allow the State of Arkansas to continue to administer the federal hazardous waste management permit program, to continue to receive federal grants, and to prevent the State of Arkansas from losing approximately one million dollars (\$1,000,000) in federal grant money.
