It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the ability of real estate professionals to assist courts in determining the value of property is hampered under current law and that this act will enable courts to better utilize the testimony of realtors in appropriate cases. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto."

Dear Mr. President:

This is to inform you that I shall allow Senate Bill 999, a measure from the Eighty-Fifth General Assembly, to become law without my signature. I strongly considered a veto of this bill. Having veto power as weak or weaker than any governor in the country, however, I wasn't confident a veto would be sustained. And while it's little consolation, this measure still must be voted on by people in Garland and Crittenden counties. My basic philosophy of government has always been that the best government is that which is closest to the people. I consistently have advocated allowing local people to make decisions directly whenever feasible.

It's no secret I've opposed any expansions of gambling in our state. Though I'll reluctantly allow it to become law, I believe this bill is bad government policy. The rates at which taxes would be collected are inconsistent with taxes and fees applied in similar situations in other states. In essence, this measure gives specific private businesses favored tax treatment.

Let me list some of the reasons I'll urge the voters of Garland and Crittenden counties to defeat this measure:

1. It would give a franchise to specific businesses without regard to opening the process to competition. While I don't want to see our state attempt to build its economy on games of chance under any circumstance, I'm especially alarmed that such an expansion of gambling would be turned over to the operators of the games without allowing the process to be open for bids or negotiation.
2. This legislation essentially would give the gambling operators the unfettered right to regulate the election process for approval of the measure and, once approved, to operate without the kind of oversight that has been standard for other states that have chosen to expand gambling.
3. The levels and methods of gambling this bill would potentially legalize go far beyond what have been portrayed as "electronic games of skill."
4. The lack of an independent gaming commission to oversee and regulate the industry is troubling.

I cannot believe our citizens have changed their minds to the extent this bill would change our repeatedly expressed collective will by way of the popular vote. I also don't feel there has been adequate examination of the deeper implications of the measure. I hope voters in the two counties will consider those implications before casting their votes.

It surprised me that this bill sailed through the legislative process without a thorough vetting by the attorney general as to its constitutionality, a more thorough economic analysis as to fiscal impact and a comparison of how other states have implemented such measures. If we as a state choose to finance our future with gambling, are we collecting the level of revenue from this enterprise that's being collected in other states? All of these things trouble me deeply. But, as stated, I wasn't confident a veto would be sustained. In what has been a great legislative session to this point, I'm not looking to be at odds with either the House or the Senate. We have important issues we must work together on in the final days of this session as they relate to the education our children receive, the roads their parents drive on, the health of our people and more. I'll let this bill become law while counting on the good judgment of the people in Garland and Crittenden counties to consider thoroughly the issue I've raised. I certainly hope the Legislature will act upon the urgent need to fully fund higher education, develop a highway plan, improve the health of our citizens and resolve lingering school facilities issues with the same level of urgency with which this bill made its way through the process.
