Any unexpended balance of such fees at the end of each state fiscal year shall be carried forward to the next fiscal year to be used for the same intent and

purposes as set forth in §§ 17-107-205, 20-9-214(b), 20-10-812(a), 20-7-117(e) and 20-9-222."
