SENATE RESOLUTION PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE ARKANSAS CONSTITUTION TO PROHIBIT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FROM ENACTING A LAW TO LEVY A TAX OR FEE OR TO INCREASE THE RATE OF CERTAIN TAXES OR FEES EXCEPT UPON THE VOTE OF THREE-FIFTHS (3/5) OF THE TOTAL MEMBERSHIP OF EACH HOUSE; TO PROHIBIT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FROM ENACTING A LAW TO DECREASE THE RATE OF ANY TAX OR PROVIDING A TAX EXCEPTION, CREDIT, EXCLUSION, OR DEDUCTION EXCEPT UPON THE VOTE OF A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE; TO PROHIBIT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FROM ENACTING A LAW REMOVING A TAX EXEMPTION, CREDIT, EXCLUSION, OR DEDUCTION EXCEPT UPON THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF THREE-FIFTHS (3/5) OF THE TOTAL MEMBERSHIP OF EACH HOUSE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

**State of the State Address
Governor Mike Beebe
January 10, 2007**

* * * * *

Mr. President, Mr. Speaker, Mr. President Pro-Tempore, Constitutional Officers, Mr. Chief Justice, Members of the Court; and distinguished guests, friends, and fellow Arkansans: I am honored to uphold our constitutional tradition and bring to you today *an account of* the State of our State.

Ginger and I congratulate the new members of this hall, the new constitutional officers, and all those returning to the service of our State.

It was in 1983 that I first sat in this room to hear the Governor's Address. I've heard three governors perform this task. I've listened as Senator, as Attorney General, as a business person, a husband, a father, and as a citizen of our State.

Yesterday, many of us... along with people from every corner of Arkansas... witnessed the time-honored tradition of Democracy in action and the peaceful transfer of elected office.

Those of us who participated in that awesome electoral process humbly accept the mandate of our ultimate bosses, the People of Arkansas.

Today, we begin the work we have been tasked to do... we must all undertake the great challenge of moving Arkansas forward, working together for the good of the Natural State... working beyond partisan and regional boundaries ...working as one people... as one spirit... to make Arkansas everything we know she can be.

That means breaking the negative stereotypes of our State.

As we reflect on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of the Central High crisis, let us take stock of how far we've come and yet realize how far we have to go. Who would have thought that 50 years ago there would be statues just outside this building commemorating those courageous nine young people and the countless black and white, men and women – everyday people -- throughout this State, who helped to usher in a time of greater equality and a more just society?

As we gather today, taking stock of our resources, our people, our achievements, and our challenges, I am proud to say that ours is a State of optimism and determination.

Optimism, because we are a State and a people proud of who we are, our traditions, and our heritage. And yet, we recognize all that we still can be.

Determination, because we will not be dissuaded from fulfilling the potential that we know is inside every individual and every community.

For more than a year, I've worked with many of the people here today... and with countless others across our State... to craft a vision for that optimism and a framework to go forth with that determination.

As Governor, I will go about the business of making a reality of that vision and making use of that framework by making the office of governor an office of ideas, direction and leadership.

The first part of making that vision real will be ensuring that our young people receive only the best from our schools, not just because it is a legally mandated first priority, but because it is the RIGHT thing to do and the most important task at hand.

No one appreciates more than I do the General Assembly's role as the policy-maker of Arkansas. I envision that we will have a genuine partnership, but one forged by leadership on my part.

As Governor, I will offer that leadership on the issues facing our State. As we look to the future and begin the great undertaking of moving Arkansas forward, I intend to be especially involved in the most critical issues of educational advancement, economic development, the well-being of our future, and meaningful tax relief.

Education is the hinge on which our future swings.

Excellence in education will be one of our greatest challenges, and it will be one of our most important victories.

Everyone wants to talk about excellence in education. But it will take all of us: parents, educators, and legislators – every Arkansan – to combine our efforts and achieve that excellence.

Just as the number-one priority of the federal government is protecting the Nation from threats, both foreign and domestic, so too is our State's primary responsibility the education of our people. Under the Constitution, it is our first legal obligation. Under the mandate of preparing for our future, it is our first moral obligation.

The first demand on a substantial portion of the surplus will be to fulfill our obligation to school facilities, the one major area of education left to be addressed.

Education is the seed from which our future grows.

Let us no longer be satisfied with the legal requirement of adequacy, but strive for the moral imperative of excellence.

Today, I propose approximately \$19 million in additional revenue for public education above that recommended by the education committees. This support will be devoted to school districts and students with special needs.

Education is not a process that should end at the schoolhouse door. It is about continuous, lifelong learning. Education encompasses everything from pre-school to the end of life.

Just as we provide ARKids First for children in need of health care so that they can lead healthy lives, we will provide pre-kindergarten education to at-risk children to help them begin school ready to learn.

We'll make this a reality by investing an additional \$40-million into the Arkansas Better Chance program to provide voluntary, top-quality pre-school classes to all children whose families earn up to 200% of the poverty level. Total funding will now be \$111 million.

And we'll create partnerships with industry to expand opportunities for parents or guardians to be able to attend parent-teacher conferences and volunteer at their children's schools with paid leave. That means leading by example.

We will propose, by legislation or rule, as appropriate, to permit state employees in the executive branch one day of paid leave each year to volunteer in their children's schools or attend parent-teacher conferences.

And no education plan would address the needs of our children without working to ensure teacher quality.

That means building a Traveling Teachers program so that schools can pool their resources to share teachers in specialized subject areas, primarily to assist our small or rural schools.

Ensuring teacher quality means attracting and retaining quality teachers by continually upgrading the teacher-mentor model and launching a pilot program for comprehensive alternative pay.

And education shouldn't have to end when high school ends.

Young people with the talent and the ability to pursue higher education in Arkansas should not be hindered by a lack of resources.

Those whose families earn less than \$25,000 a year will be eligible for a \$1,000 state scholarship each year for a maximum of four years.

Realizing that not everyone will be able to attend school full-time, part-time students will also benefit with pro-rated aid over a longer period of time.

And not everyone has the opportunity to immediately pursue higher education after high school. I'll work with the legislature to further increase opportunity for higher education by expanding the Career Pathways Initiative from the current 11 community colleges to all 22.

And we'll expand educational access to more young people and adults through our public libraries. The old image of people reading books in a quiet library isn't the only reality anymore. Public libraries bring children's reading programs, the Internet, and today's technology to countless Arkansans.

So, to make sure that the resources are available for the task our public libraries are charged with, we'll increase funding for them by \$1.7 million.

But the best schools and educational opportunities in the world are useless without good-paying jobs here at home. Otherwise, we are preparing our best and brightest for jobs in Chicago, Dallas, Atlanta, or other big cities.

That's why we have to focus on job creation and job retention as never before, helping to expand the businesses already here and attracting new ones. It's that simple.

But it will require a change in philosophy, and that must begin at the very core of our efforts.

The mission of the Arkansas Department of Economic Development, first and foremost, should be to aggressively seek to provide better-paying jobs that offer a greater quality of life to our people.

Part of that mission will focus on building stronger relationships between community colleges and economic-development efforts.

The Arkansas Delta Training and Education Consortium in East Arkansas is the model for how we can match the curricula of our community colleges to the needs of potential businesses and area employers in the State.

And this mission will put a greater emphasis on regional partnerships. We are all in this together and what is good for Southeast Arkansas is good for Northwest Arkansas.

We should not be jealous of the success of one region of the State or begrudge helping another. As I have said on many occasions, "When one of us succeeds, we all rejoice. But when one of us hurts, all of us should hurt."

And to give us the ability for aggressive economic development, I'm asking you to dedicate \$50 million of the General Improvement Fund to enable the State to attract new businesses and retain existing ones. If we are going to compete with our sister states and with foreign nations, we must have the ability to aggressively negotiate in real time and good faith.

To help attract new manufacturers and retain the ones we have, we'll phase out the sales tax on utilities for manufacturers, with the first step being a one-sixth reduction.

As we look forward to the future, we must put a special focus on the industries of the 21st century that will ensure our long-term economic success.

I will work with the Legislature and the legislative leadership to roll back the sales tax on off-road diesel fuel and replace it with a per-gallon tax coupled with an incentive to purchase bio-diesel.

And I'll work with the legislative leadership on crafting a tax credit for the construction of crushers and other bio-fuel infrastructure. For an investment today, we can seed the industry of the future right here in our own backyard.

Today, there is the potential to create gasoline – not ethanol, but gasoline – from cellulose products already growing right here in Arkansas.

Imagine stopping at a gas station and filling your tank with fuel made from Arkansas wood products and created at an Arkansas bio-refinery.

Our vision for the future must never be limited by the circumstances of today.

The well-being of our future requires more than just education and jobs. It also depends on the prosperity of our communities. Working together, we'll increase city and county turn-back by \$8 million – \$4 million for cities and \$4 million for counties – so that our communities have the resources for success.

The well-being of our future depends upon the character of our society. And the character of a society is demonstrated by how it treats its elders.

I'll work with the Department of Health and Human Services to educate our populace about choices between nursing home and community-based or at-home care options under the Elder Choices Medicaid Waiver so that families, doctors, and patients -- not Medicaid regulations -- make choices for seniors based on less restrictive care.

The well-being of our future must be safeguarded in each and every one of our communities.

Dangerous streets are flanked by businesses that will eventually have to shut their doors and families who will retreat to other communities.

To help safeguard our communities, we will increase funding for probation monitoring by \$3.4 million. Our current probation system sees the average caseload for a probation officer at more than 100 cases. We're going to add 60 new officers, taking the average caseload to 85.

We'll increase resources for drug-court counselors to rehabilitate drug offenders and keep prison space open for violent offenders by investing roughly \$5 million in the Drug Court program.

We know that crime today isn't limited to streets and parking lots. The Internet has created a new avenue for the darkest of minds.

That's why the State will work to help local law-enforcement agencies understand computer-based crimes as an integral part of law enforcement.

We'll make it a part of basic law-enforcement training at the Arkansas Law Enforcement Training Academy and the University of Arkansas Criminal Justice Institute.

We will make this a reality by creating a new computer training lab for law enforcement.

We have to do these things because we have to protect our most valuable asset, our children. That's why I plan to work with the Task Force on Abused and Neglected Children on the comprehensive plan they've been developing for addressing child abuse in our State.

Working with them, my administration will explore expansion of the Child Advocacy Centers throughout the State, improved training at our institutions of higher education for students considering careers in a child-protection field, and greater professional development for our child-protection officials.

Because the well-being of our future must be protected against large-scale natural and man-made disasters, we will work to connect all our communities in times of emergency.

We need to facilitate funding to support full-time local emergency-management functions for local governments that have not otherwise had the resources to do so. I'll use the Governor's Office to request federal resources for the positions and will explore options for pooling resources on a regional basis and will examine the potential for state matching funds.

We can do all of these things, and with a reasonable approach, we can offer tax relief for working Arkansans within the requirements to balance the budget.

I know there are some people who think we should use our increased revenue for a one-time tax break.

But I believe we can do more. I think we can use it as seed money for permanent, meaningful tax relief.

There are those who think we should spend our increased revenue on one project or another, but I believe it isn't ours to spend. This money belongs to the people of Arkansas and they ought to get it back the same way they spent it. If they paid that money in taxes, then it ought to go back to them in the form of tax relief.

There are those who want to look at our increased revenue as a reason to restructure the tax code. But I believe we have to do first things first. And we have a moral charge to rid our State of its most regressive tax, the state sales tax on food.

We have the opportunity now to begin eliminating it in a responsible way that will end the tax over time and not impede state services in the interim. We all share a common desire to move our State forward and to offer help to those among us who need it most. That desire is a noble one and should drive us to work together to a common end: never making the perfect the enemy of the good.

Those who seek to inscribe history on their terms rarely succeed. Instead, we must strive to make our efforts plentiful and beneficial to all, so that when history writes itself, it will have no choice but to reflect favorably upon our accomplishments and upon our State.

Compromise is rarely graceful and often complex. But it can be civil, it can be inspiring, and its results can build a strong and sure-footed foundation for unprecedented achievement. I will ask you to end the grocery tax with a phase-out that begins now, with a fifty-percent cut -- a three-cent cut.

And we're going to offer real tax relief to Arkansans in the form of reducing property taxes by increasing the homestead credit from \$300 to \$350.

We'll be facing more issues as a State, and there will be more challenges in the Session ... more plans to be formulated and detailed ... more steps we can take in moving Arkansas forward.

Going forward, the word "Arkansas" should be synonymous with the great strides we will make and forever erase these tired negative stereotypes that have hampered us in the past.

We must capitalize on the assets we have to map our course for the future.

When people look to Arkansas, they should see the Nano-Technology Center in Fayetteville; the Bio-Sciences Center at ASU, UAMS and the U of A; the Cancer Research Center at UAMS; the Cyber College at UALR; the Forestry Program at UAM; and the Aquaculture Center at UAPB.

When people look from across the globe to South Arkansas, they should see the future of the bio-fuels industry – from cellulose products to animal waste and soy beans – the foundation for our energy needs and conservation stewardship going forward.

When people look to Northwest Arkansas, they should see a natural business incubator with entrepreneurship unmatched anywhere in the global economy.

When people look to Northeast Arkansas and the Delta, they should see a leader in community building and aggressive economic development.

When people look to Arkansas, they should see a leader in the nation – in the world -- and say, "We want to do what they did in Arkansas."
This can be accomplished only by keeping in mind that attitudes follow actions.

If we are going to change the attitudes, we have to take real and meaningful action.

We all believe in Arkansas, but now we must demonstrate the works that prove our faith.

If we are going to make Arkansas the envy of the nation, we must roll up our sleeves and begin our work with the optimism and determination our success will be built on.

So, now we go about that action together.

Let us never lose focus of why we are here, why we are so determined, and why we have such reason for our optimism. We have been entrusted by our people with a call for action today and with the fragile future of generations to come... to serve them at the helm of State, going forward to do man's work and God's will.

§ 10-4-405. Employment and removal of Legislative Auditor.

- (a) The Legislative Auditor shall be employed by a majority vote of the membership of the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee, and the name of the person selected shall be presented to each house of the General Assembly for confirmation by both houses if the General Assembly is in session at the time of the selection.

- (b)(1) If the Legislative Auditor is selected while the General Assembly is not in session, he or she shall in all respects carry out the functions, powers, and duties as provided in this subchapter until the next regular session of the General Assembly.
 - (2)(A) During the next regular legislative session, the name of the person selected as Legislative Auditor shall be presented to both houses of the General Assembly for confirmation.
 - (B) Unless upon the presentation his or her selection is rejected, he or she shall in all respects continue to carry out the functions, powers, and duties as Legislative Auditor.

- (b) When a vacancy in the position of Legislative Auditor exists, the position shall be filled by the Committee by majority action of the Committee membership, subject to approval of both houses of the General Assembly at its next regular session.

- (c) The Legislative Auditor may be removed for cause at any time by a majority vote of the membership of the Committee after a public hearing.

(C) Providing the conductor of a game with other information requested for accounting or other business purposes;

(4)(A) "Game of bingo" means a single game of the activity commonly known as “bingo” in which the participants pay a sum of money for the use of one (1) or more bingo cards.

(B) "Game of bingo" shall include only games in which the winner receives a preannounced, fixed-dollar prize and in which the winner is determined by the matching of letters and numbers on a bingo card imprinted with at least twenty-four (24) numbers, with letters and numbers appearing on objects randomly drawn and announced by a caller, in contemporaneous competition among all players in the game;

(5)(A) "Bingo equipment" means equipment used, made, or sold for the purpose of use in bingo.

(B) "Bingo equipment" includes:

(i) A machine or other device from which balls or other items are withdrawn to determine the letters and numbers or other symbols to be called;

(ii) A bingo card;

(iii) A bingo ball; and

(iv) Any other device commonly used in the direct operation of a bingo game; and

(C) "Bingo equipment" does not include:

(i) A bingo game set commonly manufactured and sold as a child's game for a retail price of \$20 or less unless the set or a part of the set is used in bingo subject to regulation under this chapter; or

(ii) A commonly available component part of bingo equipment such as a light bulb or fuse;

(6) "Bingo occasion" means all activities incident to the conduct of a series of bingo games by a licensed authorized organization, including the organization's licensed times and any preparatory or concluding activities incident to the conduct of bingo;

(7) "Charitable purpose" means a purpose described by § 23-114-904;

(8) "Gross receipts" means the total amount received from the sale, rental, transfer, or use of bingo cards and entrance fees charged at premises at which bingo is conducted;

(9) "Licensed authorized organization" means an authorized organization that holds a license to conduct bingo;

(10) "Licensed authorized agent" means a person licensed to lease premises for the purpose of Bingo;

(11)(A) "Raffle" means the selling of tickets or chances to win a prize awarded through a random drawing;

(B)(i) The game of bingo or raffles conducted by an authorized bingo and raffles organization shall not be a lottery prohibited by Section 14 of Article 19 of the Arkansas Constitution if all net receipts over and above the actual cost of conducting the game or raffle are used only for charitable, religious, or philanthropic purposes.

(ii) No net receipts shall be used to compensate in any manner any person who works for or is in any way affiliated with the authorized bingo and raffles organization;

(12)(A) "Premises" means the area subject to the direct control of and actual use by a licensed authorized organization or group of licensed authorized organizations to conduct bingo.

(B) "Premises" includes a location or place;

(13) "Primary business office" means the location at which all records relating to the primary purpose of a licensed authorized organization are maintained in the ordinary course of business.

SUBCHAPTER 2. -- Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission.

23-114-201. Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission – Creation – Members.

(a) There is created the "Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission."

(b)(1) The commission shall consist of five (5) members appointed by the Governor for terms of five (5) years.

(2) The term of office shall begin on July 1 and shall end on June 30 of the fifth year following the year in which the regular term commenced.

(3) The terms of the initial members of the commission shall be determined by lot so that the term of one (1) member expires each year.

(c) The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration or his or her designee shall serve as an ex officio member of the commission.

(d) Any vacancies arising in the membership of the commission for any reason other than the expiration of the regular terms for which the members were appointed shall be filled by appointment by the Governor, to be effective until the expiration of the regular term.

(e)(1) Each congressional district shall be represented on the commission.

(2) Each member of the commission shall have been a resident of Arkansas for not less than ten (10) years next preceding the date of his or her appointment and shall be a qualified voter at the time of his or her appointment.

(3) No person who is officially connected with, employed by, financially interested in, or related to, within the third degree of consanguinity or affinity, any officer of an applicant for, or any officer of a holder of, a license applied for or issued under or pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be eligible to serve as a member of the commission.

(f) The Governor shall have the right to remove any member of the commission for cause.

(g) Before entering upon his or her duties, each member of the commission shall take, subscribe, and file in the office of the Secretary of State an oath to support the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of Arkansas and to faithfully perform the duties of the office upon which he or she is about to enter.

(h) Members of the commission shall not receive compensation for their services, but, within the limitations of appropriations made available by the General Assembly, each member may receive expense reimbursement and stipends in accordance with § 25-16-901 et seq.

23-114-202. Control and supervision of bingo -- Bingo Operations Division.

(a) The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission shall administer this chapter.

(b) The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission has broad authority and shall exercise strict control and close supervision over all bingo conducted in this state so that bingo is fairly conducted and the proceeds derived from bingo are used for an authorized purpose.

(c)(1) Staff support for the commission shall be provided by the Department of Finance and Administration.

(2) The Department of Finance and Administration shall execute its responsibility through a bingo operations division established within the department.

23-114-203. Director of Bingo Operations.

(a)(1) The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission shall appoint a Director of Bingo Operations from a list of three (3) names submitted by the Governor.

(2) The Director of Bingo Operations shall be employed by the Department of Finance and Administration.

(b) The Director of Bingo Operations shall administer the Bingo Operations Division under the direction of the commission.

23-114-204. Officers and investigators.

The Department of Finance and Administration may employ officers or investigators the commission considers necessary to administer this chapter.

23-114-205. Rulemaking authority.

The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission may adopt rules to enforce and administer this chapter.

23-114-206. Regulation of games.

The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission by rule may establish the number and type of bingo games that may be played during a bingo occasion.

23-114-207. Approval of bingo cards.

(a) The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission by rule shall provide procedures for the approval of bingo cards.

(b) A license holder may not use or distribute a bingo card unless the card has been approved by the commission.

(c) The commission may set the price or adopt a schedule of prices for the sale or provision of bingo cards by a licensed authorized organization.

(d) A licensed authorized organization may not sell or provide a bingo card at a price other than a price authorized by the commission or a schedule adopted by the commission.

(e) The commission by rule may require a licensed authorized organization to notify the commission of the price for bingo cards the organization will use for one or more reporting periods.

SUBCHAPTER 3. -- License to conduct bingo.23-114-301. Authorized organization.

The Department of Finance and Administration may license a person who is an authorized organization eligible for a license to conduct bingo if the person is eligible for a license to conduct bingo and raffles who is a nonprofit tax-exempt religious, educational, veterans, fraternal, service, civic, medical, volunteer rescue service, volunteer firefighters organization, or volunteer police organization that has been in continuing existence as a nonprofit tax-exempt organization in this state for a period of not less than five (5) years immediately prior to conducting the game of bingo or raffles.

23-114-302. License application.

An applicant for a license to conduct bingo must file with the Department of Finance and Administration a written, executed, and verified application on a form prescribed by the Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission.

23-114-303. License issuance or renewal.

The Department of Finance and Administration shall issue or renew a license to conduct bingo on payment of the license fee provided by § 23-114-501 et. seq.

23-114-304. Form and contents of license.

A license to conduct bingo must include:

- (1) The name and address of the license holder;
- (2) The names and addresses of the member or members of the license holder under whom the bingo will be conducted;
- (3) An indication of the premises where and the time when bingo is to be conducted;
- (4) The specific purposes to which the net proceeds of bingo are to be devoted; and

(5) A statement of whether a prize is to be offered and the amount of any authorized prize.

SUBCHAPTER 4. -- Authorized agent license.

23-114-401. Training program.

(a) The person shall complete eight hours of training as provided by the Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission rule.

(b) A training program approved by the commission must include training related to:

- (1) Conducting bingo;
- (2) Administering and operating bingo; and
- (3) Promoting bingo.

(c) The commission by rule shall establish:

- (1) The content of the training course;
- (2) Information concerning training to be reported to the Department of Finance and Administration; and
- (3) Other training program requirements that the commission determines to be necessary to promote the fair conduct of bingo and compliance with this chapter.

23-114-402. License application.

(a) An applicant for an authorized agent license or an authorized organization license must file with the Department of Finance and Administration a written verified application on a form prescribed by the Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission.

(b) The license application must include:

- (1) The name and address of the applicant and each other person who has a financial interest in or who is in any capacity a real party in interest in the applicant's business as it pertains to this chapter;
- (2) A designation and address of the premises intended to be covered by the license;
- (3) The lawful capacity of the premises for public assembly purposes;
- (4) A statement that a copy of the application has been sent to the appropriate governing body; and
- (5) A statement that the applicant complies with the conditions for eligibility for the license.

(c) Any person applying for any licensed issued by the commission shall meet the following requirements:

(1) No applicant shall have been found guilty of or pleaded guilty or nolo contendere to:

- (A) Any felony by any court in the State of Arkansas; or
- (B) Any similar offense by a court in another state or of any similar offense by a military or federal court;

(2)(A) In order to determine the applicant's suitability for a permit, the applicant shall be fingerprinted, and the fingerprints shall be forwarded for a criminal background check through the Department of Arkansas State Police.

(B) After the completion of the criminal background check through the department, the fingerprints shall be forwarded by the department to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history record check; and

(3) The applicant shall sign a release that allows the department to release:

(A) An Arkansas noncriminal justice background check to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board; and

(B) A fingerprint card of the applicant to the bureau to allow a federal fingerprint-based background check to be performed.

SUBCHAPTER 5 -- Licenses.

23-114-501. Licenses

(a) An authorized organization license may be issued to an organization as defined in § 23-114-301 et. seq. The applicant shall pay an annual fee of \$100 and post financial security in the amount of \$5,000.

(b) An authorized agent's license may be issued to a person as defined in § 23-114-401 et. seq. The applicant shall pay an annual fee of \$5,000 and post a surety bond in the amount of \$100,000.

23-114-502. License issuance.

(a) Department of Finance and Administration shall issue an authorized agents license if the Department of Finance and Administration determines that:

(1) The applicant has paid the license fee.

(2) The applicant qualifies to be licensed under this chapter;

(3) The applicant satisfies the requirements for an Authorized Agent under this subchapter;

(4) The rent to be charged is fair and reasonable and will be charged and collected in compliance with law;

(5) There is no diversion of the funds of the proposed lessee from the lawful purposes under this chapter;

(6) The person whose signature or name appears in the application is in all respects the real party in interest and is not an undisclosed agent or trustee for the real party in interest; and

(7) The applicant will lease the premises for the conduct of bingo in accordance with this chapter.

23-114-503. Denial, suspension, or revocation of licenses – Proceedings before the Department of Finance and Administration.

(a) All proceedings for the suspension and revocation of licenses shall be before the Director of Department of Finance and Administration or his designee.

(b) The proceedings shall be in accordance with rules and regulations which shall be established by the Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission and not inconsistent with law.

(c) No license shall be revoked except after a hearing by the Director of Bingo Operations with reasonable notice to the licensee and an opportunity to appear and defend.

(d) However, the Director of Bingo Operations shall not be bound by the legal rules of evidence in conducting hearings and in making his decisions and may take into consideration any testimony, papers, or documents which he or she may deem relevant to the issue.

(e)(1) Whenever the Director of Bingo Operations shall refuse an application for any license or shall suspend or revoke any license, he shall prepare an order so providing which shall be signed by the Director of Bingo Operations or some person designated by him, and the seal of the Director of Bingo Operations shall be affixed thereto.

(2) The order shall be mailed by registered mail by the Director of Bingo Operations to the applicant at the address as shown on the application, or to the licensee at the address of the premises licensed, as the case may be.

(3) The order shall be final and binding on all parties.

23-114-504. Conduct of hearings.

(a) For the purpose of hearing or conducting any appeal authorized to be heard by it, the Department of Finance and Administration shall have power:

(1) To examine, or cause to be examined, under oath, any licensee, or any other person and to examine, or cause to be examined, the books and records of any such licensee;

(2) To hear testimony and to take proof material for its information in hearing an appeal;

(3) To administer or cause to be administered oaths; and

(4) To issue subpoenas requiring the attendance of witnesses and the production of records for any such purposes.

(b) The subpoenas shall be effective in any part of this state. Any circuit court may by order duly entered require the attendance of witnesses and the production of relevant records subpoenaed by the department, and the court may compel obedience to its orders by proceedings for contempt.

(c) An applicant involved in a hearing before the Director of Bingo Operations shall be entitled, on request, to subpoena for the compulsory attendance of witnesses desired by him.

(d) All witnesses shall be entitled to mileage and fees as are prescribed by law for witnesses in the circuit courts of the state; and the mileage and fees of witnesses subpoenaed at the request of an applicant shall be paid by him.

23-114-505. Appeal to courts.

An appeal of the decision of the Department of Finance and Administration may be filed in conformance with the provisions of the Arkansas Administrative Procedure Act, §25-15-201 et seq.

23-114-506. Display of license.

A licensed authorized organization or licensed authorized agent shall conspicuously display a license issued under this chapter and a license to lease premises for conducting bingo at the premises at which bingo is conducted at all times during the conduct of bingo.

23-114-507. Failure to file tax or fee reports. A person is not eligible for a license or a license renewal unless all required reports and requested information have been filed under this chapter.

SUBCHAPTER 6. -- Denial, revocation, and suspension of license.

23-114-601. Denial of license.

The Department of Finance and Administration may deny an application for a license or renewal of a license issued under this chapter for a cause that would permit or require the suspension or revocation of a license issued under this chapter.

SUBCHAPTER 7. -- Operation of bingo.

23-114-701. Restrictions on premises providers. A person may not, for direct or indirect consideration, lease or otherwise make a premises available for conducting bingo unless the person is a licensed authorized agent

23-114-702. Single premises.

(a) Bingo may not be conducted at more than one premises on property owned or leased by a licensed authorized organization.

(b) The Department of Finance and Administration may not license more than two affiliated organizations to conduct bingo at the same premises.

(c) No more than seven licensed authorized organizations may conduct bingo at the same premises.

23-114-703. Admission to bingo games.

(a) A person may not be denied admission to a bingo game or the opportunity to participate in a game because of race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, or disability or because the person is not a member of the licensed authorized organization conducting the bingo game.

(b) Each license holder can set the age requirements for participating in bingo occasions and being admitted to the bingo facility.

23-114-704. Bingo records.

(a) The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission by rule may provide for different recordkeeping procedures for licensed authorized organizations by class based on the amount of gross receipts of the organization.

(b) An organization conducting bingo must record on a cash register all transactions for which it receives bingo gross receipts in conformance with Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission rules relating to transaction recording specifications.

23-114-705. Advertisements.

(a) A person other than a licensed authorized organization or a licensed authorized agent may not advertise bingo.

(b) A licensed authorized organization, licensed authorized agent, may include in an advertisement or promotion the amount of a prize or series of prizes offered at a bingo occasion.

23-114-706. Gift certificates.

(a) Nothing in this chapter prohibits a licensed authorized organization from selling or redeeming a gift certificate that entitles the bearer of the certificate to play a bingo game.

(b) A licensed authorized organization that sells or redeems a gift certificate must keep adequate records relating to the gift certificate as provided by Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission rule.

23-114-707. Bingo occasions.

(a) A bingo occasion begins when the premises are opened to the public.

(b) A licensed authorized organization may not conduct a bingo occasion more often than three days during a calendar week and not to exceed more than four hours during a 24-hour period.

(c) A licensed authorized organization may conduct two bingo occasions during a 24-hour period. No more than two bingo occasions may be conducted at the same premises during one day except that a third bingo occasion may be conducted under a temporary license held by a licensed authorized organization at that premises.

(d) No more than two licensed authorized organizations may conduct bingo at the same premises during a 24-hour period. If two organizations conduct bingo at the same premises during a 24-hour period, the bingo occasions must be announced separately, and an intermission of at least 10 minutes must occur between the bingo occasions.

(e) If two licensed authorized organizations are authorized to conduct bingo at the same premises on the same day, the bingo occasion of one organization may overlap with the bingo occasion of the other organization, but their games must be separated by the intermission required under subsection (d) of this section. In that event, the intermission is considered part of each organization's bingo occasion.

23-114-708. Prizes.

(a) A bingo prize may not have a value of more than \$500 for a single game.

(b) For bingo games, a person may not offer or award on a single bingo occasion prizes with an aggregate value of more than \$1,500.

(c) A licensed authorized organization or other person may not award or offer to award a door prize with a value of more than \$250.

(d) A prize may be merchandise with a recognized wholesale cost not to exceed \$500. A copy of the receipt for such merchandise must be included in the charity's daily report

SUBCHAPTER 8. -- Unit accounting.

23-114-801. Definitions.

As used in this subchapter:

(1) "Unit" means two or more licensed authorized organizations that conduct bingo at the same location joining together to share revenues, authorized expenses, and inventory related to bingo operations;

(2) "Unit accounting" means a method by which licensed authorized organizations that are members of a unit account for the sharing of revenues, authorized expenses, and inventory related to bingo operations;

(3) "Unit accounting agreement" means a written agreement by all the licensed authorized organizations that are members of a unit that contains, at a minimum:

(A) The taxpayer name and number of each licensed authorized organization that is a member of the unit;

(B) The method by which the net proceeds of the bingo operations of the unit will be apportioned among the members of the unit;

(C) The name of the unit manager or designated agent of the unit; and

(D) The methods by which the unit may be dissolved and by which one or more members of the unit may withdraw from participation in the unit, including the distribution of funds, records, and inventory and the allocation of authorized expenses and liabilities on dissolution or withdrawal of one or more members of the unit; and

(4) "Unit manager" means an individual licensed under this subchapter to be responsible for the revenues, authorized expenses, and inventory of a unit.

23-114-802. Forming accounting unit.

(a) Two or more licensed authorized organizations may form and operate a unit as provided by this subchapter by:

(1) Executing a unit accounting agreement; and

(2) Stating in the unit accounting agreement whether the unit will use:

(A) A unit manager; or

(B) A designated agent.

(b) More than one unit may be formed at a single location. A licensed authorized organization may not be a member of more than one unit.

(c) This subchapter does not require a licensed authorized organization to join a unit. Except as provided by Subsection (d), whether to join or withdraw from a unit is at the discretion of each licensed authorized organization.

(d) The members of a unit may determine whether to allow another licensed authorized organization to join the unit. The terms of the withdrawal of a member from the unit are governed by the unit accounting agreement.

23-114-803. Applicability of chapter.

A licensed authorized organization that uses unit accounting is subject to the other provisions of this chapter to the extent the provisions are applicable and are not inconsistent with this subchapter.

23-114-804. Conduct of bingo.

(a) Each licensed authorized organization that is a member of a unit shall conduct its bingo games separately from the bingo games of the other members of the unit.

(b) A unit may purchase or lease bingo supplies and equipment in the same manner as a licensed authorized organization.

23-114-805. Unit accounting.

(a) A unit:

(1) Shall establish and maintain one checking account designated as the unit's bingo account;

(2) Shall maintain one inventory of bingo supplies and equipment for use in the bingo operations of members of the unit; and

(3) May maintain an interest-bearing savings account designated as the unit's bingo savings account.

(b) Each member of a unit shall deposit into the unit's bingo account all funds derived from the conduct of bingo, less the amount awarded as cash prizes. The deposit shall be made not later than the next business day after the day of the bingo occasion on which the receipts were obtained.

(c) All authorized expenses and distributions of the unit and its members shall be paid from the unit's bingo checking account.

23-114-806. Disbursement of funds by dissolved unit.

(a) For purposes of this subchapter, the requirements that are applicable to a licensed authorized organization shall be applied to a unit.

(b) A unit that has dissolved for any reason and has unexpended bingo funds shall disburse those funds to the bingo account of each member of the unit before the end of the next calendar quarter after the calendar quarter in which the unit dissolves.

23-114-807. Unit manager -- License.

(a) If the unit accounting agreement of a unit states that a unit manager is responsible for compliance with Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission rules and this chapter, the unit manager is responsible for:

(1) The filing of one quarterly report for the unit on a form prescribed by the Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission; and

(2) The payment of fees and the maintenance of the bingo inventory and financial records of the unit.

(b) A unit with a unit manager shall notify the Department of Finance and Administration of the name of the unit manager and immediately notify the Department of Finance and Administration of any change of unit manager.

(c) A person may not provide services as a unit manager to licensed authorized organizations that form a unit unless the person holds a unit manager license under this subchapter. A person designated as an authorized agent is not a unit manager on account of that designation for purposes of this section.

(d) An applicant for a unit manager license must file with the Department of Finance and Administration a written application on a form prescribed by the Department of Finance and Administration that includes:

(1) The name and address of the applicant;

(2) Information regarding whether the applicant, or any officer, director, or employee of the applicant, has been convicted of a felony, criminal fraud, gambling or gambling-related offense, or crime of moral turpitude; and

(3) Any other information required by Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission rule.

(e) The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission by rule shall establish an annual license fee for a unit manager license in an amount reasonable to defray administrative costs plus any costs incurred to conduct a criminal background check.

(f) A person who holds a unit manager license shall post a bond or other form of security authorized by Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission.

(g) A person is not eligible for a unit manager license under this subchapter if the person, or any officer, director, or employee of the person:

(1) Has been convicted of a felony, criminal fraud, a gambling or gambling-related offense, or crime of moral turpitude, if less than 10 years has elapsed since the termination of a sentence, parole, or community supervision served for the offense;

(2) Is an owner, officer, or director of a licensed authorized agent, is employed by a licensed authorized agent, or is related to a licensed authorized agent within the second degree by consanguinity or affinity, unless the holder of the license is a licensed authorized organization or an association of licensed authorized organizations; or

(3) Holds or is listed on another license under this chapter, unless the holder of the license is a licensed authorized organization or an association of licensed authorized organizations.

(h) A unit manager must complete the training required by § 23-114-401.

SUBCHAPTER 9. -- Bingo accounts and use of proceeds.

23-114-901. Organization bingo accounts.

(a) A licensed authorized organization shall establish and maintain one regular checking account designated as the "bingo account." The organization may also maintain an interest-bearing savings account designated as the "bingo savings account."

(b)(1) A licensed authorized organization shall deposit in the bingo account all funds derived from the conduct of bingo, less the amount awarded as cash prizes. Except as provided by subdivision (b)2) of this section, a deposit must be made not later than the next business day after the day of the bingo occasion on which the receipts were obtained.

(2) A licensed authorized organization may deposit funds derived from the conduct of bingo that are paid through a debit card transaction in the bingo fund not later than 72 hours after the transaction.

(c) A licensed authorized organization may lend money from its general fund to its bingo account if the organization requests and receives the prior approval of the Department of Finance and Administration. Except as provided by this section, no other funds may be deposited in the bingo account.

(d) A licensed authorized organization may not commingle gross receipts derived from the conduct of bingo with other funds of the organization.

(e) Except as permitted, the licensed authorized organization may not transfer gross receipts to another account maintained by the organization.

(f) A licensed authorized organization shall maintain all of its savings and checking accounts in a financial institution in this state.

23-114-902. Bingo account withdrawals.

(a) Funds from the bingo account must be withdrawn by preprinted, consecutively numbered checks or withdrawal slips, signed by an authorized representative of the licensed authorized organization and made payable to a person. A check or withdrawal slip may not be made payable to "cash," "bearer," or a fictitious payee. The nature of the payment made must also be noted on the face of the check or withdrawal slip.

(b) The checks for the bingo account must be imprinted with the words "Bingo Account" and must contain the organization's bingo license number on the face of each check.

(c) A licensed authorized organization shall keep and account for all checks and withdrawal slips, including voided checks and withdrawal slips.

23-114-903. Authorized uses of bingo account.

(a) A licensed authorized organization may draw a check on its bingo account only for:

(1) The payment of necessary and reasonable bona fide expenses, including compensation of personnel incurred and paid in connection with the conduct of bingo;

(2) The disbursement of net proceeds derived from the conduct of bingo to charitable purposes; or

(3) The transfer of net proceeds derived from the conduct of bingo to the organization's bingo savings account pending a disbursement to a charitable purpose.

(b) A licensed authorized organization must make the disbursement of net proceeds on deposit in the bingo savings account to a charitable purpose by transferring the intended disbursement back into the organization's bingo account and then withdrawing an amount by a check drawn on the bingo account.

23-114-904. Use of net proceeds for charitable purposes.

(a) A licensed authorized organization shall devote to the charitable purposes of the organization its net proceeds of bingo.

(b) Except as otherwise provided by law, the net proceeds derived from bingo are dedicated to the charitable purposes of the organization only if directed to a cause, deed, or activity that is consistent with the federal tax exemption the organization obtained under 26 U.S.C. Section 501 and under which the organization qualifies as a nonprofit organization as defined by law. If the organization is not required to obtain a federal tax exemption under 26 U.S.C. Section 501, the organization's net proceeds are dedicated to the charitable purposes of the organization only if directed to a cause, deed, or activity that is consistent with the purposes and objectives for which the organization qualifies as an authorized organization.

23-114-905. Use of proceeds by recipient.

A person given bingo proceeds for a charitable purpose may not use the donation:

(1) To pay for services rendered or materials purchased in connection with the conduct of bingo by the donor organization; or

(2) For a purpose that would not constitute a charitable purpose if the activity were conducted by the donor organization.

23-114-906. Use of proceeds by licensed authorized organization.

A licensed authorized organization may not use the net proceeds from bingo directly or indirectly to:

(1) Support or oppose a candidate or slate of candidates for public office;

(2) Support or oppose a measure submitted to a vote of the people; or

(3) Influence or attempt to influence legislation.

23-114-907. Items of expense.

(a) An item of expense may not be incurred or paid in connection with the conduct of bingo except an expense that is reasonable or necessary to conduct bingo, including an expense for:

(1) Advertising, including the cost of printing bingo gift certificates;

(2) Security;

(3) Repairs to premises and equipment;

(4) Bingo supplies and equipment;

(5) Prizes;

(6) Stated rental or mortgage and insurance expenses;

(7) Bookkeeping, legal, or accounting services related to bingo;

(8) Fees for callers, cashiers, ushers, janitorial services, and utility supplies and services;

(9) License fees;

(10) Attending a bingo seminar or convention; and

(11) Debit card transaction fees.

(b) The value of health insurance or a health benefit provided by a licensed authorized organization to an employee is not included under subdivision (a)(8) of this section.

23-114-908. Expenses paid from bingo account.

(a) The following items of expense incurred or paid in connection with the conduct of bingo must be paid from an organization's bingo account:

(1) Advertising, including the cost of printing bingo gift certificates;

(2) Security during a bingo occasion;

(3) The purchase or repair of bingo supplies and equipment;

(4) Prizes, other than authorized cash prizes;

(5) Stated rental expenses;

(6) Bookkeeping, legal, or accounting services;

(7) Fees for callers, cashiers, and ushers;

(8) Janitorial services;

(9) License fees; and

(10) Payment for services provided by a system service provider.

SUBCHAPTER 10. -- Taxes and prize fees.

23-114-1001. Prize fee.

A licensed authorized organization shall collect from a person who wins a bingo prize a fee in the amount of one and one half (1 1/2%) percent of the amount or value of the prize.

23-114-1002. Payment and reporting of fee.

(a) A fee authorized or imposed under this subchapter is due and is payable by the license holder or a person conducting bingo without a license to the Department of Finance and Administration quarterly on or before the 25th day of the month succeeding each calendar quarter.

(b) The report of a fee must be filed under oath on forms prescribed by the Department of Finance and Administration.

(c) The Department of Finance and Administration shall adopt rules for the payment of the fees.

(d) The Department of Finance and Administration shall deposit the revenue collected under this section to the credit of the general revenue fund.

23-114-1003 Report of expenses.

(a) A licensed authorized organization conducting bingo shall submit quarterly to the Department of Finance and Administration and to the comptroller a report under oath stating:

(1) The amount of the gross receipts derived from bingo;

(2) Each item of expense incurred or paid;

(3) Each item of expenditure made or to be made, the name and address of each person to whom each item has been paid or is to be paid, and a detailed description of the merchandise purchased or the services rendered;

(4) The net proceeds derived from bingo;

(5) The use to which the proceeds have been or are to be applied; and

(6) A list of prizes offered and given, with their respective values.

(b) A license holder shall:

- (1) Maintain records to substantiate the contents of each report; and
- (2) Furnish a copy of each report to the appropriate governing body.

23-114-1004. Record of prize winner.

The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission by rule may require a licensed authorized organization to maintain records relating to each person to whom a prize is awarded at a bingo occasion.

23-114-1005. Collection and disbursement of prize fee.

The Department of Finance and Administration shall deposit the revenue collected from the fee on prizes to the credit of a General Revenue Fund Account of the State Apportionment Fund.

23-114-1006. Determination if no return made.

(a) If a license holder fails to make a required return, or if a person conducts bingo without a license, the Department of Finance and Administration shall make an estimate of the prizes awarded at a bingo occasion or of the gross rentals received by a license holder for the rental of premises. The Department of Finance and Administration shall make the estimate for the period in respect to which the license holder or other person failed to make a return.

(b) The estimate shall be based on any information covering any period possessed by the Department of Finance and Administration or that may come into the possession of the Department of Finance and Administration.

(c) On the basis of the Department of Finance and Administration's estimate, the Department of Finance and Administration shall compute and determine the amount of taxes or fees required to be paid to the state and shall add to that amount a penalty of 10 percent of the amount.

(d) One or more determinations may be made under this section for one or more periods.

23-114-1007. Jeopardy determination.

(a) If the Department of Finance and Administration believes that the collection of a fee on prizes, an amount of the fee on prizes required to be remitted to the state, or the amount of a determination will be jeopardized by delay, the Department of Finance and Administration shall make a determination of the fee on prizes or amount of the fee required to be collected, noting the finding of jeopardy on the determination. The determined amount is due and payable immediately.

(b) If a license holder against whom the determination is made does not pay the amount specified by a determination on or before the 20th day after the date of service of the determination on the license holder, the amount becomes final at the end of the 20th day unless the license holder files a petition for redetermination on or before the 20th day after service of notice of the determination.

(c) A delinquency penalty of 10 percent of the fee on prizes interest at the rate of 10 percent a year attaches to the amount of the fee on prizes.

23-114-1008. Security.

(a) To secure payment of the fee on prizes imposed under this subchapter, each license holder shall furnish to the Department of Finance and Administration:

- (1) A cash bond;
- (2) A bond from a surety company chartered or authorized to do business in this state;
- (3) Certificates of deposit;
- (4) Certificates of savings;
- (5) United States treasury bonds;
- (6) Subject to the approval of the Department of Finance and Administration, an assignment of negotiable stocks or bonds; or
- (7) Other security as the Department of Finance and Administration

considers sufficient.

(b) The Department of Finance and Administration shall set the amount of the bond or other security, taking into consideration the amount of money that has or is expected to become due from the license holder. The amount required by the Department of Finance and Administration may not exceed three times the amount due according to the license holder's average quarterly reports.

(c) On a license holder's failure to pay the fee on prizes imposed under this subchapter, the Department of Finance and Administration may notify the license holder and any surety of the delinquency by jeopardy or deficiency determination. If payment is not made when due, the Department of Finance and Administration may forfeit all or part of the bond or security.

(d) If the license holder ceases to conduct bingo and relinquishes the license holder's license, the Department of Finance and Administration shall authorize the release of all bonds and other security on a determination that no amounts of the gross rentals tax or the fee on prizes remain due and payable under this subchapter.

SUBCHAPTER 11. -- Enforcement.

23-114-1101. Unlawful bingo offense.

(a) In this section, "bingo" or "game" means a specific game of chance, commonly known as bingo or lotto, in which prizes are awarded on the basis of designated numbers or symbols on a card conforming to numbers or symbols selected at random, whether or not a person who participates as a player furnishes something of value for the opportunity to participate.

(b) A person conducting, promoting, or administering bingo commits an offense if the person conducts, promotes, or administers bingo other than:

(1) Under a license issued under this chapter;

(2) Within the confines of a home for purposes of amusement or recreation when:

(A) No player or other person furnishes anything of more than nominal value for the opportunity to participate;

(B) Participation in the game does not exceed 15 players; and

(C) The prizes awarded or to be awarded are nominal;

(3) On behalf of an organization of individuals 60 years of age or over, a senior citizens' association, a senior citizens' community center program operated or funded by a governmental entity, the patients in a hospital or nursing home, residents of a retirement home, or the patients in a Veteran's Administration medical center or a military hospital, solely for the purpose of amusement and recreation of its members, residents, or patients, when:

(A) No player or other person furnishes anything of more than nominal value for the opportunity to participate; and

(B) The prizes awarded or to be awarded are nominal; or

(4) On behalf of a business conducting the game for promotional or advertising purposes if:

(A) The game is conducted by or through a newspaper or a radio or television station;

(B) Participation in the game is open to the general public and is not limited to customers of the business;

(C) Playing materials are furnished without charge to a person on request; and

(D) No player is required to furnish anything of value for the opportunity to participate.

(c) An offense under subsection (b) of this section is a Class C felony.

(d) An exempted game is not required to be licensed under this chapter.

(e) An exempted game is subject to the following restrictions:

(1) A person licensed or required to be licensed under this chapter or having an interest in a license under this chapter may not be involved, directly or indirectly, in bingo;

(2) The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission by rule may require a person conducting or involved in conducting the game to:

(A) Notify the Department of Finance and Administration of:

(i) The persons involved in conducting the game;

(ii) The manner in which the game is to be conducted;

and

(iii) Any other information required by the Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission; and

(B) Keep records of all transactions connected with the game available for Department of Finance and Administration inspection.

23-114-1102. Fraudulent award of prizes -- Offense.

(a) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly participates in the award of a prize to a bingo player in a manner that disregards, to any extent, the random selection of numbers or symbols.

(b) An offense under this section is a Class C felony.

(c) It is a defense to prosecution under this section that no participant in the game furnished anything of value for the opportunity to participate in the game.

23-114-1103. Other offenses -- Revocation of license.

(a) A person commits an offense and the person's license is subject to revocation under this chapter if the person:

(1) Makes a false statement or material omission in an application for a license under this chapter;

(2) Fails to maintain records that fully and accurately record each transaction connected with the conducting of bingo, the leasing of premises to be used for bingo, or the manufacture, sale, or distribution of bingo supplies or equipment;

(3) Falsifies or makes a false entry in a book or record if the entry relates to bingo, the disposition of bingo proceeds, the application of rent received by a licensed authorized organization, or the gross receipts from the manufacture, sale, or distribution of bingo supplies or equipment;

(4) Diverts or pays a portion of the net proceeds of bingo to a person except in furtherance of one or more of the lawful purposes provided by this chapter; or

(5) Violates this chapter or a term of a license issued under this chapter.

(6) A person whose license is revoked under this section may not apply for another license under this chapter before the first anniversary of the date of revocation.

23-114-1104. Exemption from prosecution.

(a) A person lawfully conducting or participating in bingo or permitting the conduct of bingo on premises owned or leased by the person under a license issued under this chapter is not subject to prosecution or conviction for a violation of a provision of any other law or ordinance to the extent that the person's action is specifically authorized by this chapter.

(b) The immunity granted under this section does not extend to a person:

(1) Knowingly conducting or participating in bingo under a license obtained by a false pretense, false statement, or material omission made in an application for license or otherwise; or

(2) Knowingly permitting the conduct of bingo on premises owned or leased by the person under a license known to the person to have been obtained by a false pretense or statement.

(c) A license holder under this chapter may possess paraphernalia or equipment that is required to conduct bingo.

23-114-1105. Inspection of premises.

The Department of Finance and Administration, its officers or agents, or a state, municipal, or county peace officer may enter and inspect the contents of premises where:

- (1) Bingo is being conducted or intended to be conducted; or
- (2) Equipment used or intended for use in bingo is found.

23-114-1106. Injunction -- Civil penalty.

(a) If the Department of Finance and Administration has reason to believe that this chapter has been or is about to be violated, the Department of Finance and Administration may petition a court for injunctive relief to restrain the violation.

(b) Venue for an action seeking injunctive relief is in a Circuit Court in Pulaski County.

(c) If the court finds that this chapter has been violated or is about to be violated, the court shall issue a temporary restraining order and, after due notice and hearing, a temporary injunction, and after a final trial, a permanent injunction to restrain the violation.

(d) If the court finds that this chapter has been knowingly violated, the court shall order all proceeds from the illegal bingo to be forfeited to the Department of Finance and Administration as a civil penalty.

23-114-1107. REMEDIES NOT EXCLUSIVE.

The Department of Finance and Administration may suspend or revoke a license under Section impose an administrative penalty under or both, depending on the severity of the violation.

23-114-1108. Examination of records -- Disclosure of information.

(a) The Department of Finance and Administration or a person authorized in writing by the Department of Finance and Administration may examine the books, papers, records, equipment, and place of business of a license holder and may investigate the character of the license holder's business to verify the accuracy of a return, statement, or report made, or, if no return is made by the license holder, to ascertain and determine the amount required to be paid.

(b) The Department of Finance and Administration may set and charge to the license holder a fee in an amount reasonably necessary to recover the cost of an authorized investigation or audit authorized under this chapter.

(c) If the Department of Finance and Administration determines that a person is not complying with this chapter, the Department of Finance and Administration shall notify the attorney general and the governing body of the appropriate political subdivision.

SUBCHAPTER 12. -- Administrative penalty.

23-114-1201. Imposition of penalty.

The Department of Finance and Administration may impose an administrative penalty against a person who violates this chapter or a rule or order adopted by the Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission under this chapter.

23-114-1202. Amount of penalty.

(a) The amount of the administrative penalty may not exceed \$1,000 for each violation. Each day a violation continues or occurs may be considered a separate violation for purposes of imposing a penalty.

(b) In determining the amount of the penalty, the Director of Bingo Operations shall consider:

- (1) The seriousness of the violation, including the nature, circumstances, extent, and gravity of the prohibited acts;
- (2) The history of previous violations;
- (3) The amount necessary to deter future violations;
- (4) Efforts to correct the violation; and
- (5) Any other matter that justice may require.

23-114-1203. Notice of violation and penalty.

(a) If, after investigating a possible violation and the facts surrounding that possible violation, the Director of Bingo Operations determines that a violation has occurred, the Director of Bingo Operations may issue a violation report stating the facts on which the conclusion that a violation occurred is based, recommending that an administrative penalty be imposed on the person alleged to have committed the violation, and recommending the amount of the proposed penalty. The Director of Bingo Operations shall base the recommended amount of the proposed penalty on the seriousness of the violation determined by consideration of the factors set out in § 23-114-120(b).

(b) Not later than the 14th day after the date on which the report is issued, the Director of Bingo Operations shall give written notice of the report to the person alleged to have committed the violation.

(c) The notice must:

- (1) Include a brief summary of the alleged violation;
- (2) State the amount of the administrative penalty recommended; and
- (3) Inform the person of the person's right to a hearing on the occurrence of the violation, the amount of the penalty, or both.

23-114-1204. Penalty to be paid or hearing requested.

(a) Not later than the 20th day after the date the person receives the notice, the person may:

- (1) Accept the recommendation of the Director of Bingo Operations, including the recommended administrative penalty; or
- (2) Make a written request for a hearing on the determination.

(b) If the person accepts the determination of the Director of Bingo Operations, the Director of Bingo Operations by order shall approve the determination and impose the proposed penalty.

23-114-1205. Hearing.

(a) If the person timely requests a hearing or does not respond to the notice in the time allowed, the Director of Bingo Operations shall set a hearing and give notice of the hearing to the person.

(b) The hearings examiner shall make findings of fact and conclusions of law and promptly issue to the Department of Finance and Administration a proposal for decision as to the occurrence of the violation and the amount of the proposed penalty, if a penalty is warranted.

23-114-1206. Decision by Director of Bingo Operations.

(a) Based on the findings of fact and conclusions of law and the recommendations of the hearings examiner, the Director of Bingo Operations by order:

- (1) May find that a violation has occurred and may impose an administrative penalty; or
- (2) May find that a violation has not occurred.

(b) The Director of Bingo Operations shall give notice of the order to the person. The notice must include:

- (1) separate statements of the findings of fact and conclusions of law;
- (2) The amount of any penalty imposed;

order; and

(3) A statement of the right of the person to judicial review of the

(4) Other information required by law.

23-114-1207. Options following decision -- Pay or appeal.

(a) Not later than the 30th day after the date on which the order becomes final, the person shall:

(1) Pay the administrative penalty;

(2) Pay the penalty and file a petition for judicial review contesting the finding that a violation occurred, the amount of the penalty, or both; or

(3) Without paying the penalty, file a petition for judicial review contesting the finding that a violation occurred, the amount of the penalty, or both.

(b) Within the 30-day period, a person who acts under Subsection (a)(3) may:

(1) Stay enforcement of the penalty by:

(A) Paying the penalty to the court for placement in an escrow account; or

(B) Giving to the court a supersedeas bond approved by the court for the amount of the penalty that is effective until all judicial review of the order is final; or

(2) Request the court to stay enforcement of the penalty by:

(A) Filing with the court a sworn affidavit of the person stating that the person is financially unable to pay the penalty and is financially unable to give the supersedeas bond; and

(B) Giving a copy of the affidavit to the Director of Bingo Operations by certified mail.

(c) On receipt of a copy of the affidavit as provided by subdivision (b)(2) of this section, the Director of Bingo Operations may file with the court, not later than the fifth day after the date the copy is received, a contest to the affidavit. The court shall hold a hearing on the facts alleged in the affidavit as soon as practicable and shall stay the enforcement of the penalty on finding that the alleged facts are true. The person who files an affidavit has the burden of proving that the person is financially unable to pay the penalty and to give a supersedeas bond.

23-114-1208. Collection of penalty.

If the person does not pay the administrative penalty and the enforcement of the penalty is not stayed, the Director of Bingo Operations may refer the matter to the attorney general for collection of the penalty.

23-114-1209. Determination by court.

(a) If the court sustains the finding that a violation occurred, the court may uphold or reduce the amount of the administrative penalty and order the person to pay the full or reduced amount.

(b) If the court does not sustain the finding that a violation occurred, the court shall order that a penalty is not owed.

23-114-1210. Remittance of penalty and interest.

(a) If, after judicial review, the administrative penalty is reduced or not upheld by the court, the court shall, after the judgment becomes final:

(1) Order the appropriate amount, plus accrued interest, be remitted to the person if the person paid the penalty; or

(2) If the person posted a supersedeas bond, order the release of the bond:

(A) If the penalty is not upheld; or
(B) After the person pays the reduced penalty, if the amount of the penalty is reduced.

(b) The interest paid under subdivision (a)(1) of this section is accrued at the rate charged on loans to depository institutions by the New York Federal Reserve Bank. The interest shall be paid for the period beginning on the date the penalty is paid and ending on the date the penalty is remitted."

Delete SECTION 1 of the bill and substitute the following:

“SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 23 is amended to add an additional chapter to read as follows:

CHAPTER 114 CHARITABLE BINGO AND RAFFLES

SUBCHAPTER 1 GENERAL PROVISIONS

23-114-101. Short title.

This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the “Charitable Bingo and Raffles Enabling Act”.

23-114-102. Definitions.

As used in this chapter:

(1) "Authorized organization" means an organization eligible for a license to conduct bingo and raffles that is a nonprofit tax-exempt religious, educational, veterans, fraternal, service, civic, medical, volunteer rescue service, volunteer firefighters organization, or volunteer police organization that has been in continuing existence as a nonprofit tax-exempt organization in this state for a period of not less than five (5) years immediately prior to conducting the game of bingo or raffles;

(2) "Automated bingo services" means a computer program or system for:

(A) Registering or accounting for bingo sales, prizes, inventory, and prize fees;

(B) Generating required reports to the Department of Finance and Administration; and

(C) Providing the conductor of a game with other information requested for accounting or other business purposes;

(3)(A) "Bingo equipment" means equipment used, made, or sold for the purpose of use in bingo.

(B) "Bingo equipment" includes:

(i) A machine or other device from which balls or other items are withdrawn to determine the letters and numbers or other symbols to be called;

(ii) A bingo card;

(iii) A bingo ball; and

(iv) Any other device commonly used in the direct operation of a bingo game.

(C) "Bingo equipment" does not include:

(i) A bingo game set commonly manufactured and sold as a child's game for a retail price of twenty dollars (\$20) or less, unless the set or a part of the set is used in bingo subject to regulation under this chapter; or

(ii) A commonly available component part of bingo equipment such as a light bulb or fuse;

(4) "Bingo session" means all activities incident to the conduct of a series of bingo games by a licensed authorized organization, including the organization's licensed times and any preparatory or concluding activities incidental to the conduct of bingo;

(5) "Charitable purpose" means a purpose described by § 23-114-904;

(6) "Financial security" means cash, surety bond, certificate of deposit, savings account, or United States Treasury Bonds;

(7)(A) "Game of bingo" means a single game of the activity commonly known as “bingo” in which the participants pay a sum of money for the use of one (1) or more bingo cards.

(B) "Game of bingo" includes only games in which the winner receives a pre-announced, fixed-dollar prize and in which the winner is determined by the matching of letters and numbers on a bingo card imprinted with at least twenty-four (24) numbers, with letters and numbers appearing on objects randomly drawn and announced by a caller, in contemporaneous competition among all players in the game;

(8) "Gross receipts" means the total amount received from the sale, rental, transfer, or use of bingo cards and entrance fees charged at premises at which bingo is conducted;

(9) "Licensed agent" means a person eligible under this chapter for an agent's license to lease bingo premises and provide all necessary support for one (1) or more charities to use the premise;

(10) "Licensed authorized organization" means an authorized organization that holds a license to conduct bingo;

(11) "Premises" means the area subject to the direct control of and actual use by a licensed authorized organization or group of licensed authorized organizations to conduct bingo. Premises includes a location or place;

(12) "Primary business office" means the location at which all records relating to the primary purpose of a licensed authorized organization are maintained in the ordinary course of business; and

(13) "Raffle" means the selling of tickets or chances to win a prize awarded through a random drawing.

23-114-102. General provisions.

(a) The game of bingo or raffles conducted by a licensed authorized organization shall not be a lottery prohibited by Arkansas Constitution, Article 19, Section 14, if all net receipts over and above the actual cost of conducting the game or raffles are used only for charitable, religious, or philanthropic purposes.

(b) No net receipts shall be used to compensate in any manner any person who works for or is in any way affiliated with the licensed authorized organization.

(c) Entering into a contract between an authorized organization and a licensed agent or unit will not constitute an affiliate relationship under this act.

SUBCHAPTER 2 CHARITABLE BINGO AND RAFFLES COMMISSION

23-114-201. Charitable Bingo and Raffles Oversight Commission – Creation – Members.

(a) There is created the Charitable Bingo and Raffles Oversight Commission.

(b)(1) The commission shall consist of five (5) members appointed by the Governor for terms of five (5) years.

(2) The term of office for each member shall begin on July 1 and shall end on June 30 of the fifth year following the year in which the regular term commenced.

(3) The terms of the initial members of the commission shall be determined by lot so that the term of one (1) member expires each year.

(c) The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration or his or her designee shall serve as an ex officio member of the commission.

(d) Any vacancies arising in the membership of the commission for any reason other than the expiration of the regular terms for which the members were appointed shall be filled by appointment by the Governor, to be effective until the expiration of the regular term.

(e)(1) Each congressional district shall be represented on the commission.

(2) Each member of the commission shall have been a resident of Arkansas for not less than five (5) years next preceding the date of his or her appointment and shall be a qualified voter at the time of his or her appointment.

(3) No person who is officially connected with, employed by, financially interested in, or related to, within the third degree of consanguinity or affinity, any officer of an applicant for, or any officer of a holder of, a license applied for or issued under or pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be eligible to serve as a member of the commission.

(f) The Governor shall have the right to remove any member of the commission for cause.

(g) Before entering upon his or her duties, each member of the commission shall take, subscribe, and file in the office of the Secretary of State an oath to support the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of Arkansas and to faithfully perform the duties of the office upon which he or she is about to enter.

(h) Members of the commission shall not receive compensation for their services, but within the limitations of appropriations made available by the General Assembly, each member may receive expense reimbursement and stipends in accordance with § 25-16-901 et seq.

23-114-202. Control and supervision of bingo -- Bingo Operations Division.

(a) The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission shall administer this chapter.

(b) The commission has broad authority and shall exercise strict control and close supervision over all bingo conducted in this state so that bingo is fairly conducted and the proceeds derived from bingo are used for an authorized purpose.

(c)(1) Staff support for the commission shall be provided by the Department of Finance and Administration.

(2) The department shall execute its responsibility through the Bingo Operations Division established within the department.

23-114-203. Director of Bingo Operations.

(a)(1) The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission shall appoint a Director of Bingo Operations from a list of three (3) names submitted by the Governor.

(2) The director shall be employed by the Department of Finance and Administration.

(b) The director shall administer the Bingo Operations Division under the direction of the commission.

23-114-204. Officers and investigators.

The Department of Finance and Administration may employ officers or investigators the Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission considers necessary to administer this chapter.

23-114-205. Rulemaking authority.

The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission may adopt rules to enforce and administer this chapter. The rules will be drafted by the Department of Finance and Administration and submitted to the commission for final approval.

23-114-206. Regulation of bingo games.

The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission by rule may establish the number and type of bingo games that may be played during a bingo session.

23-114-207. Approval of bingo cards.

(a) The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission by rule shall provide procedures for the approval of bingo cards.

(b) A license holder may not use or distribute a bingo card unless the card has been approved by the commission.

(c) The commission may set the price or adopt a schedule of prices for the sale or provision of bingo cards by a licensed authorized organization.

(d) A licensed authorized organization may not sell or provide a bingo card at a price other than a price authorized by the commission or a schedule adopted by the commission.

(e) The commission by rule may require a licensed authorized organization to notify the commission of the price for bingo cards the licensed authorized organization will use for one or more reporting periods.

SUBCHAPTER 3 LICENSING

23-114-301. Authorized organization license.

The Department of Finance and Administration may license an entity that is an authorized organization eligible for a license to conduct bingo that is a nonprofit tax-exempt religious, educational, veterans, fraternal, service, civic, medical, volunteer rescue service, volunteer firefighters organization, or volunteer police organization that has been in continuing existence as a nonprofit tax-exempt organization in this state for a period of not less than five (5) years immediately prior to conducting the game of bingo or raffles.

23-114-302. Licensed agent's license.

The Department of Finance and Administration shall issue a licensed agent's license if the department determines that:

- (1) The applicant has paid the license fee;
- (2) The applicant qualifies to be licensed under this chapter;
- (3) The applicant satisfies the requirements for a licensed agent under this subchapter;
- (4) The rent to be charged is fair and reasonable and will be charged and collected in compliance with law;
- (5) There is no diversion of the funds of the proposed lessee from the lawful purposes under this chapter;
- (6) The person whose signature or name appears in the application is in all respects the real party in interest and is not an undisclosed agent or trustee for the real party in interest; and
- (7) The applicant will lease the premises for the conduct of bingo in accordance with this chapter.

23-114-303. Licensed agent's residence -- Authority.

(a) A licensed agent shall be an individual resident of Arkansas, a partnership domiciled in Arkansas, or an Arkansas corporation.

(b) A Licensed agent has the authority on behalf of a multiple charity unit to provide services. The licensed agent shall enter into individual bingo leases with each charity and a management agreement with the unit, as defined in § 23-115-501, to provide some or all of the following services:

- (1) Leasing or otherwise obtaining a suitable piece of real estate at which to conduct charitable bingo on behalf of the unit;
- (2) Improving premise to accommodate bingo including providing for street, exterior and interior signage; ceiling, floor, wall finishes; heating, ventilation and air conditioning; lights and electrical service; utility services; cable television; sound and audio visual systems; security cameras; rest rooms; snack bar; and, offices;
- (3) Providing bingo equipment to include a ball blower with computer, bingo number boards, monitors; callers sound system; point of sale equipment and counters; and, other equipment necessary to conduct bingo;
- (4) Providing tables, chairs, waste receptacles, mats and other furnishings;
- (5) Maintaining and repairing the physical plant and all furnished bingo and general equipment;
- (6) Maintaining a single inventory of bingo paper on behalf of all of the charities;

(7) Retaining a paid staff of cashiers, callers, runners and a bingo hall manager to conduct bingo on behalf of the charities;

(8) Providing directly or retaining the services of suitable security workers, janitorial staff, and bookkeepers or accountants, or both;

(9) Maintaining the unit bingo account for the benefit of the unit including receiving and accounting for all revenue, expenses and capital expenditures, and preparing a monthly cash receipts and disbursements journal;

(10)(A) Preparing and certifying the monthly, quarterly, and annual income statement, balance sheet, and statement of cash flows for the unit.

(B) The quarterly financial statements shall be reviewed and the annual financial statements shall be audited by an independent auditor selected by the unit;

(11) Preparing the daily and quarterly reports to the State of Arkansas for the unit;

(12) Collecting and remitting to the State of Arkansas all prize fees on a quarterly basis; and

(13) Developing an annual written business plan and a financial forecast and marketing plan for the unit and bingo hall. These plans shall be updated on a quarterly basis and submitted to the unit for review and approval.

(c) The licensed agent shall enter into individual bingo leases with each charity and a management agreement with the unit. Sample documents shall be promulgated.

23-114-304. License fees and training.

(a) An authorized organization license may be issued to an authorized organization. The applicant shall pay an annual fee of one hundred dollars (\$100) and post financial security in the amount of five thousand dollars (\$5,000).

(b) A licensed agent's license may be issued to a person as described in § 23-114-401 et seq. The applicant shall pay an annual fee of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) and post financial security in the amount of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000).

(c) Before the issuance of licenses under subsections (a) or (b) of this section, the applicant for a licensed agent's license or a person designated by the applicant for an authorized organization license shall complete the training required under § 23-114-306.

23-114-305 License application.

(a) An applicant for a licensed agent license or an authorized organization license shall file with the Department of Finance and Administration a written verified application on a form prescribed by the Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission.

(b) The license application shall include:

(1) The name and address of the applicant and each other person who has a financial interest in or who is in any capacity a real party in interest in the applicant's business as it pertains to this chapter;

(2) A designation and address of the premises intended to be covered by the license;

(3) The lawful capacity of the premises for public assembly purposes;

(4) A statement that a copy of the application has been sent to the appropriate governing body; and

(5) A statement that the applicant complies with the conditions for eligibility for the license.

(c) Any person applying for any license issued by the commission shall meet the following requirements:

(1) No applicant shall have been found guilty of or pleaded guilty or nolo contendere to:

(A) Any felony by any court in the State of Arkansas; or

(B) Any similar offense by a court in another state or of any similar offense by a military or federal court;

(2)(A) In order to determine the applicant's suitability for a permit, the applicant shall be fingerprinted, and the fingerprints shall be forwarded for a criminal background check through the Department of Arkansas State Police.

(B) After the completion of the criminal background check through the Department of Arkansas State Police, the fingerprints shall be forwarded by the department to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history record check; and

(3) The applicant shall sign a release that allows the Department of Arkansas State Police to release:

(A) An Arkansas non-criminal justice background check to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board; and

(B) A fingerprint card of the applicant to the bureau to allow a federal fingerprint-based background check to be performed.

23-114-306. Training program.

(a) The person shall complete eight (8) hours of training as provided by the Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission rule.

(b) A training program approved by the commission shall include training related to:

(1) Conducting bingo;

(2) Administering and operating bingo; and

(3) Promoting bingo.

(c) The commission by rule shall establish:

(1) The content of the training course;

(2) Information concerning training to be reported to the Department of Finance and Administration; and

(3) Other training program requirements that the commission determines to be necessary to promote the fair conduct of bingo and compliance with this chapter.

23-114-307. License issuance.

(a) The Department of Finance and Administration shall issue a licensed agents license if the department determines that:

(1) The applicant has paid the license fee;

(2) The applicant qualifies to be licensed under this chapter;

(3) The applicant satisfies the requirements for a licensed agent under this subchapter;

(4) The rent to be charged is fair and reasonable and will be charged and collected in compliance with law;

(5) There is no diversion of the funds of the proposed lessee from the lawful purposes under this chapter;

(6) The person whose signature or name appears in the application is in all respects the real party in interest and is not an undisclosed agent or trustee for the real party in interest; and

(7) The applicant will lease the premises for the conduct of bingo in accordance with this chapter.

23-114-308. Denial, suspension, or revocation of licenses – Proceedings before the department.

(a) All proceedings for the suspension and revocation of licenses shall be before the Director of Department of Finance and Administration or his or her designee.

(b) The department may deny an application for a license or renewal of a license issued under this chapter for a cause that would permit or require the suspension or revocation of a license issued under this chapter.

(c) The proceedings shall be in accordance with the Arkansas Administrative Procedure Act, § 25-15-201 et seq.

23-114-309. Display of license.

A licensed authorized organization or licensed agent shall conspicuously display a license issued under this chapter and a license to lease premises for conducting bingo at the premises at which bingo is conducted at all times during the conduct of bingo.

23-114-310. Failure to file fee reports.

A person is not eligible for a license or a license renewal unless all required reports and requested information have been filed under this chapter.

SUBCHAPTER 4 OPERATION OF BINGO

23-114-401. Restrictions on premises providers.

A person shall not for direct or indirect consideration lease or otherwise make a premises available for conducting bingo unless the person is a licensed agent.

23-114-402. Single premises.

(a) Bingo shall not be conducted at more than one (1) premises on property owned or leased by a licensed authorized organization.

(b) The Department of Finance and Administration shall not license more than two (2) affiliated organizations to conduct bingo at the same premises.

(c) Up to seven (7) licensed authorized organizations may conduct bingo at the same premises if they have formed a unit, as defined in § 23-115-501, and retained a licensed agent.

23-114-403. Admission to bingo games.

(a) A person shall not be denied admission to a bingo game or the opportunity to participate in a bingo game because of race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, or disability or because the person is not a member of the licensed authorized organization conducting the bingo game.

(b) Each license holder can set the age requirements for participating in bingo sessions and being admitted to the bingo facility.

23-114-404. Bingo records.

(a) The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission by rule may provide for different recordkeeping procedures for licensed authorized organizations by class based on the amount of gross receipts of the organization.

(b) An organization conducting bingo shall record on a cash register all transactions for which it receives bingo gross receipts in conformance with Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission rules relating to transaction recording specifications.

23-114-405. Advertisements.

(a) A person other than a licensed authorized organization, unit, or a licensed agent shall not advertise bingo.

(b) A licensed authorized organization and a licensed agent may include in an advertisement or promotion the amount of a prize or series of prizes offered at a bingo session.

(c) A licensed authorized organization, unit, and licensed agent may market bingo to the general public by utilizing any of the following tools:

(1) Advertising the playing times and prizes for its bingo hall in any marketing channels, for example, print, radio, or television, which accept such ads and in printed flyers prepared for that specific purpose;

(2) Providing targeted promotional and discounted pricing to attract bingo customers;

(3) Providing gift certificates or bingo bucks or discount coupons to attract bingo customers;

(4) Offer a door prize by means of a raffle with a value not to exceed \$250 at each session of bingo; and

(5) Offering in cooperation with a snack bar, discounted or promotional food pricing to attract bingo customers.

23-114-406. Gift certificates.

(a) Nothing in this chapter prohibits a licensed authorized organization from selling or redeeming a gift certificate that entitles the bearer of the certificate to play a bingo game.

(b) A licensed authorized organization that sells or redeems a gift certificate shall keep adequate records relating to the gift certificate as provided by Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission rule.

23-114-407. Bingo sessions.

(a)(1) A bingo session begins when the first bingo game of that bingo session is commenced by calling the first bingo ball drawn.

(2) A licensed authorized organization may conduct up to three (3) bingo sessions on each of two (2) calendar days during a calendar week.

(b)(1) No more than two (2) licensed authorized organizations may conduct bingo at the same premises during a twenty-four-hour period.

(2) If two (2) organizations conduct bingo at the same premises during a twenty-four-hour period, the bingo sessions shall be announced separately, and an intermission of at least ten (10) minutes shall occur between the bingo sessions.

23-114-408. Prizes.

(a) A bingo prize shall not have a value of more than five hundred dollars (\$500) for a single game.

(b)(1) For the total prizes of all bingo games, an authorized organization shall not offer or award during a single bingo session prizes with an aggregate value of more than one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500).

(2) In addition to the prize limitation of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) in subdivision (b)(1) of this section, an authorized organization can play unlimited twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) bingo games before and after the bingo session.

(c) A licensed authorized organization shall not award or offer to award a door prize with a value of more than two hundred fifty (\$250) per bingo session. This door prize value shall not accrue against the one thousand five hundred dollar (\$1,500) bingo session prize limitation.

(d) A bingo prize, other than cash, may be merchandise with a recognized wholesale cost not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500). A copy of the receipt for such merchandise shall be included in the charity's daily report.

23-114-409. Purchase of bingo paper.

Authorized organizations, units, and licensed agents may purchase bingo paper directly from printers and suppliers and are not obligated to purchase bingo paper from distributors.

SUBCHAPTER 5 UNIT ACCOUNTING

23-114-501. Definitions.

As used in this subchapter:

(1) "Unit" means two (2) or more licensed authorized organizations that conduct bingo at the same location joining together to share revenues, authorized expenses, and inventory related to bingo operations;

(2) "Unit accounting" means a method by which licensed authorized organizations that are members of a unit account for the sharing of revenues, authorized expenses, and inventory related to bingo operations;

(3) "Unit accounting agreement" means a written agreement by all the licensed authorized organizations that are members of a unit that contains, at a minimum:

(A) The taxpayer name and number of each licensed authorized organization that is a member of the unit;

(B) The method by which the net proceeds of the bingo operations of the unit will be apportioned among the members of the unit;

(C) The name of the unit manager or designated agent of the unit; and

(D) The methods by which the unit may be dissolved and by which one or more members of the unit may withdraw from participation in the unit, including the distribution of funds, records, and inventory and the allocation of authorized expenses and liabilities on dissolution or withdrawal of one or more members of the unit; and

(4) "Unit manager" means an individual licensed under this subchapter to be responsible for the revenues, authorized expenses, and inventory of a unit and represents the interests of the authorized organizations with the licensed agent.

23-114-502. Accounting unit formation.

(a) Two (2) or more licensed authorized organizations may form and operate a unit as provided by this subchapter by executing a unit accounting agreement that identifies the unit manager and the duties of that unit manager.

(b)(1) This subchapter does not require a licensed authorized organization to join a unit.

(2) Except as provided by subsection (c) of this section, whether to join or withdraw from a unit is at the discretion of each licensed authorized organization.

(c)(1) The members of a unit may determine whether to allow another licensed authorized organization to join the unit.

(2) The terms of the withdrawal of a member from the unit are governed by the unit accounting agreement.

23-114-503. Applicability of chapter.

A licensed authorized organization that uses unit accounting is subject to the other provisions of this chapter to the extent the provisions are applicable and are not inconsistent with this subchapter.

23-114-504. Conduct of bingo.

(a) Each licensed authorized organization that is a member of a unit shall conduct its bingo games separately from the bingo games of the other members of the unit.

(b) A unit may purchase or lease bingo supplies and equipment in the same manner as a licensed authorized organization.

23-114-505. Unit accounting.

(a) A unit:

(1) Shall establish and maintain one (1) checking account designated as the unit's bingo account;

(2) Shall maintain one (1) inventory of bingo supplies and equipment for use in the bingo operations of members of the unit; and

(3) May maintain an interest-bearing savings account designated as the unit's bingo savings account.

(b) Each member of a unit shall deposit into the unit's bingo account all funds derived from the conduct of bingo, less the amount awarded as cash prizes. The deposit shall be made not later than the next business day after the day of the bingo session on which the receipts were obtained.

(c) All authorized expenses and distributions of the unit and its members shall be paid from the unit's bingo checking account.

23-114-506. Disbursement of funds by dissolved unit.

(a) For purposes of this subchapter, the requirements that are applicable to a licensed authorized organization shall be applied to a unit.

(b) A unit that has dissolved for any reason and has unexpended bingo funds shall disburse those funds to the bingo account of each member of the unit before the end of the next calendar quarter after the calendar quarter in which the unit dissolves.

23-114-507. Unit Manager -- License.

(a) If the unit accounting agreement of a unit states that a unit manager is responsible for compliance with Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission rules and this chapter, the unit manager is responsible for:

(1) The filing of one quarterly report for the unit on a form prescribed by the commission; and

(2) The payment of fees and the maintenance of the bingo inventory and financial records of the unit.

(b) A unit with a unit manager shall notify the Department of Finance and Administration of the name of the unit manager and immediately notify the Department of any change of unit manager.

(c)(1) A person shall not provide services as a unit manager to licensed authorized organizations that form a unit unless the person holds a unit manager license under this subchapter.

(2) A person designated as a licensed agent is not a unit manager on account of that designation for purposes of this section.

(d) An applicant for a unit manager license shall file with the department a written application on a form prescribed by the department that includes:

(1) The name and address of the applicant;

(2) Information regarding whether the applicant, or any officer, director, or employee of the applicant, has been convicted of a felony, criminal fraud, gambling or gambling-related offense, or crime of moral turpitude; and

(3) Any other information required by commission rule.

(e) A person who holds a unit manager license shall post a bond or other form of security authorized by the commission.

(f) A person is not eligible for a unit manager license under this subchapter if the person, or any officer, director, or employee of the person:

(1) Has been convicted of a felony, criminal fraud, a gambling or gambling-related offense, or crime of moral turpitude, if less than ten (10) years has elapsed since the termination of a sentence, parole, or community supervision served for the offense;

(2) Is an owner, officer, or director of a licensed agent, is employed by a licensed agent, or is related to a licensed agent within the second degree by consanguinity or affinity, unless the holder of the license is a licensed authorized organization or an association of licensed authorized organizations; or

(3) Holds or is listed on another license under this chapter, unless the holder of the license is a licensed authorized organization or an association of licensed authorized organizations.

(g) A unit manager shall complete the training required by § 23-114-306.

SUBCHAPTER 6 BINGO ACCOUNTS AND USE OF PROCEEDS

23-114-601. Organization bingo accounts.

(a)(1) A licensed authorized organization shall establish and maintain one regular checking account designated as the bingo account.

(2) A licensed authorized organization may also maintain an interest-bearing savings account designated as the bingo savings account.

(b)(1) A licensed authorized organization shall deposit into the bingo account all funds derived from the conduct of bingo, less the amount awarded as cash prizes. Except as provided by subdivision (b)(2) of this section, a deposit shall be made not later than the next business day after the day of the bingo session on which the receipts were obtained.

(2) A licensed authorized organization may deposit funds derived from the conduct of bingo that are paid through a debit card transaction into the bingo fund not later than seventy-two (72) hours after the transaction.

(c) A licensed authorized organization may lend money from its general fund to its bingo account if the organization requests and receives the prior approval of the Department of Finance and Administration. Except as provided by this section, no other funds may be deposited into the bingo account.

(d) A licensed authorized organization shall not commingle gross receipts derived from the conduct of bingo with other funds of the organization.

(e) Except as permitted, the licensed authorized organization shall not transfer gross receipts to another account maintained by the licensed authorized organization.

(f) A licensed authorized organization shall maintain all of its savings and checking accounts in a financial institution in this state.

23-114-602. Withdrawals from bingo account.

(a)(1) Funds from the bingo account shall be withdrawn by preprinted, consecutively numbered checks or withdrawal slips, signed by an authorized representative of the licensed authorized organization and made payable to a person.

(2) A check or withdrawal slip shall not be made payable to "cash," "bearer," or a fictitious payee.

(3) The nature of the payment made shall also be noted on the face of the check or withdrawal slip.

(b) The checks for the bingo account shall be imprinted with the words "Bingo Account" and shall contain the licensed authorized organization's bingo license number on the face of each check.

(c) A licensed authorized organization shall keep and account for all checks and withdrawal slips, including voided checks and withdrawal slips.

23-114-603. Authorized uses of bingo account.

(a) A licensed authorized organization may draw a check on its bingo account only for:

(1) The payment of necessary and reasonable bona fide expenses, including compensation of personnel incurred and paid in connection with the conduct of bingo;

(2) The disbursement of net proceeds derived from the conduct of bingo to charitable purposes; or

(3) The transfer of net proceeds derived from the conduct of bingo to the licensed authorized organization's bingo savings account pending a disbursement to a charitable purpose.

(b) A licensed authorized organization shall make the disbursement of net proceeds on deposit in the bingo savings account to a charitable purpose by transferring the intended disbursement back into the licensed authorized organization's bingo account and then withdrawing an amount by a check drawn on the bingo account.

23-114-604. Use of net proceeds for charitable purposes.

(a) A licensed authorized organization shall devote to the charitable purposes of the licensed authorized organization its net proceeds of bingo.

(b) Except as otherwise provided by law, the net proceeds derived from bingo are dedicated to the charitable purposes of the licensed authorized organization only if directed to a cause, deed, or activity that is consistent with the federal tax exemption the licensed authorized organization obtained under 26 U.S.C. Section 501, as in existence on January 1, 2007, and under which the organization qualifies as a nonprofit organization as defined by law. If the licensed authorized organization is not required to obtain a federal tax exemption under 26 U.S.C. Section 501, as in existence on January 1, 2007, the licensed authorized organization's net proceeds are dedicated to the charitable purposes of the licensed authorized organization only if directed to a cause, deed, or activity that is consistent with the purposes and objectives for which the licensed authorized organization qualifies as a licensed authorized organization.

(c)(1) The charity shall make mandatory annual or more frequent disbursement from the bingo account to the general fund of the charity after providing for appropriate reserves and funds necessary to pay for short term payables of the bingo hall.

(2) Once funds are distributed to the charity general fund under subdivision (c)(1) of this section, no funds shall be returned to the bingo account except by means of a loan from the charity general fund to the bingo account as evidenced by a written instrument.

23-114-605. Use of proceeds by recipient.

A person given bingo proceeds for a charitable purpose shall not use the donation:

(1) To pay for services rendered or materials purchased in connection with the conduct of bingo by the donor organization; or

(2) For a purpose that would not constitute a charitable purpose if the activity were conducted by the donor organization.

23-114-606. Use of proceeds by a licensed authorized organization.

A licensed authorized organization shall not use the net proceeds from bingo directly or indirectly to:

(1) Support or oppose a candidate or slate of candidates for public office;

(2) Support or oppose a measure submitted to a vote of the people; or

(3) Influence or attempt to influence legislation.

23-114-607. Items of expense.

(a) Expenses that are reasonable or necessary to conduct bingo may be incurred or paid in connection with the conduct of bingo, including expenses for:

- (1) Advertising, including the cost of printing bingo gift certificates;
 - (2) Security;
 - (3) Repairs to premises and equipment;
 - (4) Bingo supplies and equipment;
 - (5) Prizes;
 - (6) Stated rental or mortgage and insurance expenses;
 - (7) Bookkeeping, legal, or accounting services related to bingo;
 - (8) Fees for callers, cashiers, ushers, janitorial services, and utility supplies and services;
 - (9) License fees;
 - (10) Attending a bingo seminar or convention; and
 - (11) Debit or credit card transaction fees.
- (b) The value of health insurance or a health benefit provided by a licensed authorized organization to an employee is not included under subdivision (a)(8) of this section.

23-114-608. Expenses paid from bingo account.

The following items of expense incurred or paid in connection with the conduct of bingo must be paid from a licensed authorized organization's bingo account:

- (1) Advertising, including the cost of printing bingo gift certificates;
- (2) Security during a bingo session;
- (3) The purchase or repair of bingo supplies and equipment;
- (4) Prizes, other than authorized cash prizes;
- (5) Stated rental expenses;
- (6) Bookkeeping, legal, or accounting services;
- (7) Fees for callers, cashiers, and ushers;
- (8) Janitorial services;
- (9) License fees; and
- (10) Payment for services provided by a system service provider.

SUBCHAPTER 7 PRIZE FEES

23-114-701. Prize fee.

A licensed authorized organization shall collect from a person who wins a bingo prize a fee of one and one half percent (1.5%) of the amount or value of the prize.

23-114-702. Payment and reporting of fee.

(a) A fee authorized or imposed under this subchapter is due and is payable by the license holder or a person conducting bingo without a license to the Department of Finance and Administration quarterly on or before the twenty-fifth day of the month succeeding each calendar quarter.

(b) The report of a fee shall be filed under oath on forms prescribed by the department.

(c) The department shall adopt rules for the payment of the fees.

(d) The department shall deposit the revenue collected under this section to the credit of the General Revenue Fund Account of the State Apportionment Fund.

23-114-703. Report of expenses.

(a) A licensed authorized organization conducting bingo shall submit quarterly to the Department of Finance and Administration a report under oath stating:

- (1) The amount of the gross receipts derived from bingo;
- (2) Each item of expense incurred or paid;
- (3) Each item of expenditure made or to be made, the name and address of each person to whom each item has been paid or is to be paid, and a

detailed description of the merchandise purchased or the services rendered;

(4) The net proceeds derived from bingo;

(5) The use to which the proceeds have been or are to be applied; and

(6) A list of prizes offered and given, with their respective values.

(b) A license holder shall:

(1) Maintain records to substantiate the contents of each report; and

(2) Furnish a copy of each report to the appropriate governing body.

23-114-704. Record of prize winner.

The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission by rule may require a licensed authorized organization to maintain records relating to each person to whom a prize is awarded at a bingo session.

23-114-705. Collection and disbursement of prize fee.

The Department of Finance and Administration shall deposit the revenue collected from the fee on prizes to the credit of a General Revenue Fund Account of the State Apportionment Fund.

23-114-706. Determination if no return made.

(a) If a license holder fails to make a required return or if a person conducts bingo without a license, the Department of Finance and Administration shall make an estimate of the prizes awarded at a bingo session or of the gross rentals received by a license holder for the rental of premises. The department shall make the estimate for the period in respect to which the license holder or other person failed to make a return.

(b) The estimate shall be based on any information covering any period possessed by the department or that may come into the possession of the department.

(c) On the basis of the department's estimate, the department shall compute and determine the amount of taxes or fees required to be paid to the state and shall add to that amount a penalty of ten percent (10%) of the amount.

(d) One (1) or more determinations may be made under this section for one (1) or more periods.

SUBCHAPTER 8 ENFORCEMENT

23-114-801. Unlawful bingo offense.

(a) As used in this section, "bingo" or "game" means a specific game of chance, commonly known as bingo, in which prizes are awarded on the basis of designated numbers or symbols on a card conforming to numbers or symbols selected at random, whether or not a person who participates as a player furnishes something of value for the opportunity to participate.

(b) A person conducting, promoting, or administering bingo commits an offense if the person conducts, promotes, or administers bingo other than:

(1) Under a license issued under this chapter;

(2) Within the confines of a home for purposes of amusement or recreation when:

(A) No player or other person furnishes anything of more than nominal value for the opportunity to participate;

(B) Participation in the game does not exceed fifteen (15)

players; and

(C) The prizes awarded or to be awarded are nominal;

(3) On behalf of an organization of individuals sixty (60) years of age or over, a senior citizens' association, a senior citizens' community center program operated or funded by a governmental entity, the patients in a hospital or nursing home, residents of a retirement home, or the patients in a Veteran's Administration

medical center or a military hospital, solely for the purpose of amusement and recreation of its members, residents, or patients, when:

(A) No player or other person furnishes anything of more than nominal value for the opportunity to participate; and

(B) The prizes awarded or to be awarded are nominal; or

(4) On behalf of a business conducting the game for promotional or advertising purposes if:

(A) The game is conducted by or through a newspaper or a radio or television station;

(B) Participation in the game is open to the general public and is not limited to customers of the business;

(C) Playing materials are furnished without charge to a person on request; and

(D) No player is required to furnish anything of value for the opportunity to participate.

(c) A violation of subsection (b) of this section is a Class A misdemeanor.

23-114-802. Fraudulent award of prizes -- Offense.

(a) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly participates in the award of a prize to a bingo player in a manner that disregards, to any extent, the random selection of numbers or symbols.

(b) It is a defense to prosecution under this section that no participant in the game furnished anything of value for the opportunity to participate in the game.

(c) A violation of subsection (b) of this section is a Class A misdemeanor.

23-114-803. Other offenses -- Revocation of License.

(a) A person commits an offense and the person's license is subject to revocation under this chapter if the person:

(1) Makes a false statement or material omission in an application for a license under this chapter;

(2) Fails to maintain records that fully and accurately record each transaction connected with the conducting of bingo, the leasing of premises to be used for bingo, or the manufacture, sale, or distribution of bingo supplies or equipment;

(3) Falsifies or makes a false entry in a book or record if the entry relates to bingo, the disposition of bingo proceeds, the application of rent received by a licensed authorized organization, or the gross receipts from the manufacture, sale, or distribution of bingo supplies or equipment;

(4) Diverts or pays a portion of the net proceeds of bingo to a person except in furtherance of one or more of the lawful purposes provided by this chapter;

(5) Violates this chapter or a term of a license issued under this chapter; or

(6) A person whose license is revoked under this section may not apply for another license under this chapter before the first anniversary of the date of revocation.

(b) A violation of subsection (b) of this section is a Class A misdemeanor.

23-114-804. Exemption from prosecution.

(a) A person lawfully conducting or participating in bingo or permitting the conduct of bingo on premises owned or leased by the person under a license issued under this chapter is not subject to prosecution or conviction for a violation of a provision of any other law or ordinance to the extent that the person's action is specifically authorized by this chapter.

(b) The immunity granted under this section does not extend to a person:

(1) Knowingly conducting or participating in bingo under a license obtained by a false pretense, false statement, or material omission made in an application for license or otherwise; or

(2) Knowingly permitting the conduct of bingo on premises owned or leased by the person under a license known to the person to have been obtained by a false pretense or statement.

(c) A license holder under this chapter may possess paraphernalia or equipment that is required to conduct bingo.

23-114-805. Inspection of premises.

The Department of Finance and Administration, its officers or agents, or a state, municipal, or county peace officer may enter and inspect the contents of premises where:

(1) Bingo is being conducted or intended to be conducted; or

(2) Equipment used or intended for use in bingo is found.

23-114-806. Injunction -- Civil penalty.

(a) If the Department of Finance and Administration has reason to believe that this chapter has been or is about to be violated, the department may petition a court for injunctive relief to restrain the violation.

(b) Venue for an action seeking injunctive relief is in a Pulaski County circuit court.

(c) If the court finds that this chapter has been violated or is about to be violated, the court shall issue a temporary restraining order and, after due notice and hearing, a temporary injunction, and after a final trial, a permanent injunction to restrain the violation.

(d) If the court finds that this chapter has been knowingly violated, the court shall order all proceeds from the illegal bingo to be forfeited to the department as a civil penalty.

23-114-807. Remedies not exclusive.

The Department of Finance and Administration may suspend or revoke a license under this subchapter or impose an administrative penalty under this subchapter, or both, depending on the severity of the violation.

23-114-808. Examination of records -- Disclosure of information.

(a) The Department of Finance and Administration or a person authorized in writing by the department may examine the books, papers, records, equipment, and place of business of a license holder and may investigate the character of the license holder's business to verify the accuracy of a return, statement, or report made, or, if no return is made by the license holder, to ascertain and determine the amount required to be paid.

(b) The department may set and charge to the license holder a fee in an amount reasonably necessary to recover the cost of an authorized investigation or audit authorized under this chapter.

(c) If the department determines that a person is not complying with this chapter, the department shall notify the Attorney General and the governing body of the appropriate political subdivision.

SUBCHAPTER 9 ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY

23-114-901. Imposition of penalty.

The Department of Finance and Administration may impose an administrative penalty against a person who violates this chapter or a rule or order adopted by the Charitable Bingo and Raffle Oversight Commission under this chapter.

23-114-902. Amount of penalty.

(a) The amount of the administrative penalty may not exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each violation. Each day a violation continues or occurs may be considered a separate violation for purposes of imposing a penalty.

(b) In determining the amount of the penalty, the Director of Bingo Operations shall consider:

(1) The seriousness of the violation, including the nature, circumstances, extent, and gravity of the prohibited acts;

(2) The history of previous violations;

(3) The amount necessary to deter future violations;

(4) Efforts to correct the violation; and

(5) Any other matter that justice may require.

23-114-903. Notice of violation and penalty.

(a) If after investigating a possible violation and the facts surrounding that possible violation the Director of Bingo Operations determines that a violation has occurred, the director may issue a violation report stating the facts on which the conclusion that a violation occurred is based, recommending that an administrative penalty be imposed on the person alleged to have committed the violation, and recommending the amount of the proposed penalty. The director shall base the recommended amount of the proposed penalty on the seriousness of the violation determined by consideration of the factors set out in § 23-114-902(b).

(b) Not later than the fourteenth day after the date on which the report is issued, the director shall give written notice of the report to the person alleged to have committed the violation.

(c) The notice shall:

(1) Include a brief summary of the alleged violation;

(2) State the amount of the administrative penalty recommended; and

(3) Inform the person of the person's right to a hearing on the occurrence of the violation or the amount of the penalty, or both.

23-114-904. Penalty to be paid or hearing requested.

(a) Not later than the twentieth day after the date the person receives the notice, the person may:

(1) Accept the recommendation of the Director of Bingo Operations, including the recommended administrative penalty; or

(2) Make a written request for a hearing on the determination.

(b) If the person accepts the determination of the director, the director by order shall approve the determination and impose the proposed penalty.

23-114-905. Hearing.

(a) If the person timely requests a hearing or does not respond to the notice in the time allowed, the Director of Bingo Operations shall set a hearing and give notice of the hearing to the person.

(b) The hearings examiner shall make findings of fact and conclusions of law and promptly issue to the Department of Finance and Administration a proposal for decision as to the occurrence of the violation and the amount of the proposed penalty, if a penalty is warranted.

23-114-906. Decision by Director of Bingo Operations.

(a) Based on the findings of fact and conclusions of law and the recommendations of the hearings examiner, the Director of Bingo Operations by order:

(1) May find that a violation has occurred and may impose an administrative penalty; or

(2) May find that a violation has not occurred.

(b) The director shall give notice of the order to the person. The notice shall include:

(1) Separate statements of the findings of fact and conclusions of law;

(2) The amount of any penalty imposed;

(3) A statement of the right of the person to judicial review of the order; and

(4) Other information required by law.

23-114-907. Options following decision -- Pay or appeal.

(a) Not later than the thirtieth day after the date on which the order becomes final, the person shall:

(1) Pay the administrative penalty;

(2) Pay the penalty and file a petition for judicial review contesting the finding that a violation occurred, the amount of the penalty, or both; or

(3) Without paying the penalty, file a petition for judicial review contesting the finding that a violation occurred or the amount of the penalty, or both.

(b) Within the thirty-day period, a person who acts under subdivision (a)(3) of this section may:

(1) Stay enforcement of the penalty by:

(A) Paying the penalty to the court for placement in an escrow account; or

(B) Giving to the court a supersedeas bond approved by the court for the amount of the penalty that is effective until all judicial review of the order is final; or

(2) Request the court to stay enforcement of the penalty by:

(A) Filing with the court a sworn affidavit of the person stating that the person is financially unable to pay the penalty and is financially unable to give the supersedeas bond; and

(B) Giving a copy of the affidavit to the Director of Bingo Operations by certified mail.

(c) On receipt of a copy of the affidavit as provided by subdivision (b)(2) of this section, the director may file with the court, not later than the fifth day after the date the copy is received, a contest to the affidavit. The court shall hold a hearing on the facts alleged in the affidavit as soon as practicable and shall stay the enforcement of the penalty on finding that the alleged facts are true. The person who files an affidavit has the burden of proving that the person is financially unable to pay the penalty and to give a supersedeas bond.

23-114-908. Collection of penalty.

If the person does not pay the administrative penalty and the enforcement of the penalty is not stayed, the Director of Bingo Operations may refer the matter to the Attorney General for collection of the penalty.

23-114-909. Determination by court.

(a) If the court sustains the finding that a violation occurred, the court may uphold or reduce the amount of the administrative penalty and order the person to pay the full or reduced amount.

(b) If the court does not sustain the finding that a violation occurred, the court shall order that a penalty is not owed.

23-114-910. Remittance of penalty and interest.

(a) If after judicial review the administrative penalty is reduced or not upheld by the court, the court, after the judgment becomes final, shall:

(1) Order the appropriate amount, plus accrued interest, be remitted to the person if the person paid the penalty; or

(2) If the person posted a supersedeas bond, order the release of the bond:

(A) If the penalty is not upheld; or

(B) After the person pays the reduced penalty, if the amount of the penalty is reduced.

(b) The interest paid under subdivision (a)(1) of this section is accrued at the rate charged on loans to depository institutions by the Federal Reserve Bank of New York. The interest shall be paid for the period beginning on the date the penalty is paid and ending on the date the penalty is remitted.”

(2) To operate machinery and equipment required to prevent or reduce air or water pollution or contamination as described in § 26-52-402(a)(3).

(c) If fuel and energy is delivered through a single meter used for both an exempt purpose and a taxable purpose during a regular billing period, the eligibility for the exemption under this section is determined by the predominant use of the fuel and energy delivery measured by the single meter.

(d) The Department of Finance and Administration shall promulgate rules to implement this section.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the sales and use taxes that Arkansas imposes on fuel and energy used in manufacturing and processing far exceed the taxes imposed by competing states; that competing states have reduced or eliminated their taxes on fuel and energy used in manufacturing and processing; that Arkansas has suffered a significant job loss in the manufacturing sector in the last two (2) years; that Arkansas has failed to attract new manufacturing projects due in part to the tax advantages of competing states; and that manufacturing jobs are a crucial part of the Arkansas economy and must be preserved and expanded in order

to provide citizens the opportunity to maintain a reasonable standard of living, retain young workers, and provide and promote quality education throughout the state. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2007."

~~(4)(5)~~ "Chiropractic aide" means an unlicensed member of the chiropractic team who may assist a chiropractic physician in the performance of those procedures and techniques constituting the practice of chiropractic as defined in this chapter with the exception of spinal manipulation and adjustment, provided that such assistance shall be performed under the direct supervision of a licensed chiropractic physician;

(6)(A) "Mobilization" means a non-thrust, manual therapy that involves passive movement of a joint within its physiologic range of motion.

(B) "Mobilization" involves the approximate equivalent of the normal range of motion a joint can be taken through by intrinsic musculature.

(C) "Mobilization" is passive movement within the physiologic joint space administered by a clinician for the purpose of increasing overall range of motion.

(D)(i) Mobilization and manipulation are externally applied mechanical measures.

(ii) Mobilization ends where manipulation begins;

~~(5)(7)~~ "Physician" means a person authorized or licensed to practice medicine pursuant to the Arkansas Medical Practices Act, §§ 17-95-201 — 17-95-207, 17-95-301 — 17-95-305, and 17-95-401 — 17-95-411, a person authorized or licensed to practice chiropractic pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, and a person authorized to practice osteopathy pursuant to § 17-91-101 et seq.;

~~(6)(A)(8)(A)(i)~~ "Practice of chiropractic" means the engagement in the diagnosis and analysis of any ~~interference with normal nerve transmission and expression, and~~ health condition, including the procedure preparatory to and complementary to the correction thereof by an adjustment of the articulations of the vertebral column, its immediate articulations, including spinal adjustments, spinal manipulations, and spinal mobilizations, such as any type of pressure, force, thrust, or passive movement, singular or plural, applied to the spinal vertebrae or their adjacent articulations by hand or mechanical device or by other incidental adjustments, for the restoration and maintenance of health.

(ii) The practice of chiropractic includes, without limitation, physiotherapy, physical therapy, naturopathic therapy, exercise therapy, nutritional therapy, the normal regimen, and rehabilitation of the patient for the purpose of removing any injury, deformity, or abnormality of human beings without the use of drugs or surgery.

(B) The practice of chiropractic, as authorized under the provisions of this chapter, shall not include the performance of the duties of a midwife or obstetrician, therapy by the use of ionizing radiation, incisive surgery, prescribing for or administering to any person any drug to be taken internally, or puncturing the skin for the purpose of introducing any substance into the body. Nothing herein shall prevent puncturing the skin for routine blood analysis, including red blood count, white blood count, differential and serology, in the practice of chiropractic for diagnostic purposes; ~~and,~~

- (C) A person who is licensed under this chapter may:
- (i) Practice chiropractic as taught in chiropractic schools or colleges; and
- (ii) Use all necessary mechanical, hygienic, and sanitary measures incident to the care of the body.
- (D) The practice of chiropractic includes the practice of acupuncture as defined in § 17-102-102.
- (E) Nothing restricts a chiropractic physician from supervising the use of over-the-counter products; and
- ~~(7)(9)(A)~~ "Spinal and extraspinal orthopedic manipulation", also referred to as "manipulation," and "adjustment" mean the skillful or dexterous treatment whereby a corrective force or passive movement of the joint is made to realign vertebrae or articulations to their normal juxtaposition. a passively applied movement of low amplitude and low-or high-velocity thrust that moves the joint into the parapsychological range.
- (B) Manipulation is a passive dynamic thrust that causes cavitation or gapping and attempts to restore the manipulated joint's range of motion and neurophysiological function.
- (C)(i) Manipulation and mobilization are externally applied mechanical measures.
- (ii) Manipulation begins where mobilization ends.

The practice of the following professions, as defined by the laws of this state, that this chapter is not intended to limit, restrict, enlarge, or alter the privileges and practice of, as provided by the laws of this state:

- (A) Dentistry;
- (B) Podiatry;
- (C) Optometry;
- (D) Medicine and surgery;
- (E) Osteopathy; or
- (F) Cosmetology; or

(4) As defined and limited by the laws of this state, the performance of the duties of a:

- (A) Physical therapist; or
- (B) Massage therapist.

SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 17-81-303(c)(1), regarding unlawful acts under the Arkansas Chiropractic Practices Act, is amended to read as follows:

(c)(1) It is unlawful for any person other than a physician licensed to practice chiropractic under the provisions of the Arkansas Chiropractic Practices Act, § 17-81-101 et seq., or a physician licensed to practice medicine under the Arkansas Medical Practices Act, §§ 17-95-201 et seq., 17-95-301 et seq., and 17-95-401 et seq., to perform spinal and extraspinal orthopedic manipulation, adjustment, and spinal mobilizations, ~~spinal adjustments, or spinal manipulations~~ as those terms are defined in ~~§ 17-81-102(7)~~ § 17-81-102.

SECTION 6. Arkansas Code §§ 17-81-304 — 17-81-306 are amended to read as follows:

17-81-304. Application — Fees.

(a)(1) Applications for license to practice chiropractic in the State of Arkansas shall be made to the Executive Director of the Arkansas State Board of Chiropractic Examiners in writing on forms furnished by the board. The application shall be signed by the applicant in his or her own handwriting and acknowledged before an officer authorized to administer oaths.

(2) The applicant must submit proof satisfactory to the board of graduation from a chartered school or college of chiropractic as herein described and file with his or her application the affidavits of at least two (2) licensed and reputable doctors of chiropractic showing him or her to be possessed of good moral character.

(b) If the applicant is approved, the applicant shall be admitted for examination, orientation, and licensure. ~~Should the applicant pass the examination, no part of the fee shall be returned, and he or she shall be issued a license to practice chiropractic in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.~~

(c) If the applicant is not approved;

- (1) he He or she shall be notified of the reasons for the disapproval;

and

(2) The fifty-dollar orientation fee required under subdivision (a)(3) of this section shall be refunded to the applicant.

(d) Should an applicant be approved but fail to appear for the examination or orientation, no part of his or her fee shall be returned, but he or she shall be eligible for examination or orientation at a later date upon at least thirty (30) days' prior notice to the board.

(e) Should the approved applicant fail the examination, no part of his or her fee shall be returned, and he or she shall be eligible for reexamination at a later date, at the discretion of the board, and upon paying an examination fee of ~~twenty-five dollars (\$25.00)~~ up to seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) per failed subject.

(a) To qualify ~~to take the~~ for examination, orientation, and licensure, an applicant ~~must~~ shall:

- (1) Be at least twenty-one (21) years of age;
- (2) Have successfully completed not less than a minimum of sixty (60) semester credit hours of college education, to include a minimum of thirty (30) semester credit hours in the field of science;
- (3) Not have had a license to practice chiropractic in any other state suspended or revoked nor have been placed on probation for any cause;
- (4) Possess a valid "doctor of chiropractic" degree from a chiropractic institution whose requirements include a course of instruction of not fewer than four (4) years of nine (9) academic months each or not fewer than four thousand four hundred (4,400) fifty-minute resident class hours and include one hundred twenty (120) classroom hours of physiological therapeutics;
- (5) Possess a valid National Chiropractic Board certificate, to include Parts I, II, and III, and the physiological therapeutics section; credentials as follows:

 - (B) If an applicant graduated on or after January 1, 1989 but before January 1, 2002, Part I, Part II, Part III, and Physiotherapy; or
 - (C) If the applicant graduated on or after January 1, 2002, Part I, Part II, Part III, Part IV with a score of 375 or greater, and Physiotherapy;
- (6) Be of good moral character;
- (7) Not have been convicted of a felony;
- (8) Not be an habitual user of intoxicants, drugs, or hallucinatory preparations;
- (9) Pay the application fee as provided in § 17-81-304; and
- (10) Cause a certified chiropractic college transcript ~~or~~ and National Board transcript to be submitted directly from the respective institutions.

(b) An applicant ~~graduated, as of July 19, 1971, graduating before 1970~~ from a school or college of chiropractic, the requirements and course of instruction of which were equal and comparable to other recognized schools or colleges of chiropractic at the time of his or her attendance, may be acceptable.

(c) For ~~students~~ graduates who are enrolled in any Council on Chiropractic Education-approved chiropractic school or college which may not, at the passage date of this act, meet the requirements as set forth in subdivision (a)(4) of this section, the Arkansas State Board of Chiropractic Examiners may waive the requirement, in individual cases, at its discretion.

(d) ~~In lieu of the practical examination set out in § 17-81-306, with the exception of subdivision (a)(1)(A) in that section, the applicant may present the board with evidence of passing the National Board Part IV with a minimum score of 375 which shall be accepted by the board as a passing grade. (b) The Arkansas State Board of Chiropractic Examiners shall grade all papers and notify all applicants of the results within ~~forty-five (45)~~ five (5) days of the examination.

(c)~~(1)~~ Each applicant failing the examination shall be furnished a ~~list of~~ his or her grades.

~~(2) He or she~~ Each failing applicant shall be eligible for reexamination, as ~~put forth~~ permitted in the rules and regulations of the board, upon request and the payment of the required ~~fee~~ fees.

(d) All examination papers shall be retained by the board for a minimum period of two (2) years and shall be available for inspection, by appointment, by any aggrieved applicant.
