To Amend Senate Rule 16. To Provide That The Senate Is Not Required To Resolve Itself Into A Committee Of The Whole When Considering A Tax Bill Or An Appropriation Bill.

Rule 16 of the Senate shall be amended to read as follows:

RULE 16

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

~~16.01 All motions and propositions involving a tax or charge upon the people and all proceedings involving appropriations of money or authorizing payments out of appropriations already made shall be first considered in the Committee of the Whole, and a point of order under this Rule shall be good at any time before the consideration of any such bill has commenced.~~

~~(a) At any time after the reading of the Journal, it shall be in order to move that the Senate resolve itself into the Committee of the Whole Senate for the purpose of considering bills raising revenues, or bills to appropriate funds.~~

16.01 When the Senate resolves itself into the Committee of the Whole, persons who are to participate in the matters to be discussed may be invited into the Senate chamber by the proponents or the opponents of the proposal to be discussed, but all such persons shall leave at the time the Committee arises.

~~(b)~~ **(a)** In forming a Committee of the Whole the President shall leave his chair after appointing a Senator to preside, who shall have the same power as the President to preserve order.

~~(d)~~ **(b)** The rules of proceedings of the Senate shall be observed in the Committee of the Whole, so far as they may be applicable. Decisions may be made by voice and standing votes, but the yeas and nays cannot be ordered in the Committee of the Whole.

~~(e)~~ **(c)** The presence of a quorum is not necessary for a motion that the Committee of the Whole rise; but when the Committee rises without a quorum, it may not report the bills it has acted on, and such bills as have been laid aside to be reported remain in the Committee until the next occasion when the Committee rises without question as to a quorum.

~~(f)~~ **(d)** A majority of those voting shall prevail in the Committee of the Whole, provided a quorum is present.

(a) Reports, correspondence, memoranda, case histories, medical records, or other materials compiled or gathered during an investigation of a suspected case of child abuse or neglect by a children's advocacy center, hospital, or clinic shall be confidential and shall not be released or otherwise made available except:

(1) To the attorney representing the abused child in a custody or juvenile case with an order of appointment or an order recognizing entry of appearance;

(2) For any audit or similar activity conducted with the administration of any plan or program by any governmental agency which is authorized by law to conduct the audit or activity;

(3) To law enforcement agencies, a prosecuting attorney, or the Attorney General;

(4) To any licensing or registering authority to the extent necessary to carry out its official responsibilities, but the information shall be maintained as confidential;

(5) To a grand jury or court upon a finding that:

(A) Information in the record is necessary for the determination of a civil, criminal, or administrative issue before the court or grand jury; and

(B) The information cannot be obtained from a person or entity described in subdivision (b)(2) of this section;

(6) To the Department of Human Services;

(7) To a court-appointed special advocate volunteer with a valid court order;

(8) Images of a child's breast, genitals, or anus shall not be released except as provided under subsection (c) of this section;

(9) All records may be released to an attorney in any criminal, civil, or administrative proceeding or to a party in a criminal, civil, or administrative proceeding if the party is not represented by an attorney as permitted under criminal, civil, or administrative discovery rules upon a finding by the court that:

(A) Information in the record is necessary for the determination of a criminal, civil, or administrative issue before a court or grand jury; and

(B) The information cannot be obtained from a person or entity described in subdivision (b)(2) of this section; ~~and~~

(10) Medical records may be released to a person providing medical or psychiatric care or services to the abused child; and

(11) For bona fide instructional purposes at Arkansas Childrens' Hospital and/or the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the care, detection, treatment, and management of suspected child abuse and neglect."
