SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 14-25-112, concerning accounting responsibilities of a sheriff under the Arkansas County Accounting Law of 1973, is amended to add additional subsections to read as follows:

(f) The sheriff shall provide a copy of the reconciled cash disbursements journal and a copy of the reconciled cash receipts journal to the county treasurer by the tenth day of each calendar month for the county sheriff's communications facility and equipment fund or other fund that may not be on the books of the county treasurer.

(g) The Division of Legislative Audit shall establish procedures to ensure compliance with this section.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 21-6-307(b)(2)(C), concerning sheriff fees, is amended to read as follows:

(C) All sums paid into the communications facility and equipment fund by the sheriff may accumulate as to principal and interest until such time as the deposits or a portion thereof are needed by the sheriff to:

- (i) Train operations staff;
- (ii) Operate, equip, repair, or replace existing communications equipment;
- (iii) Purchase additional communications equipment; ~~or~~
- (iv) Otherwise improve a communications facility or system for the sheriff's department; or
- (v) Purchase vehicles, weapons, or other equipment for the sheriff's department.

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 21-6-310(a)(2), concerning disposition of funds, is amended to read as follows:

(2) Inmate commissary trust accounts account balances belonging to the inmate and held by the county sheriff are not deemed county funds and are not subject to this section.

SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 26-39-201(a)(2), concerning the time for payment, is amended to read as follows:

(2) Inmate commissary trust ~~accounts~~ account balances belonging to the inmate and held by the county sheriff are not deemed county funds and are not subject to this section.
