Thoroughbred Rule 1211 Mark Up LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH

1211. A thoroughbred horse, starting in a race, shall not be shod with ordinary or training shoes or turn down shoes, or be allowed to start a race without shoes, unless the Stewards grant permission to run without shoes prior to the race. Horses entered to race or training at Oaklawn Park are prohibited from wearing toe grabs with a height greater than four millimeters, bends, jar caulks, stickers or any other appliance worn on the front shoes.
