20-16-1201. Definitions.

As used in this subchapter, "abortion" means the use or prescription of any instrument, medicine, drug, or any other substance or device intentionally to terminate the pregnancy of a woman known to be pregnant for a purpose other than to increase the probability of a live birth, to preserve the life or health of the child after live birth, or to remove a dead fetus.

20-16-1202. Sign posting.

(a) Any private office, free-standing surgical outpatient clinic or other facility, or clinic in which abortions are performed shall conspicuously post in a location defined in subsection (c) of this section so as to be clearly visible to patients a sign reading:

"Notice: By law, we cannot perform an abortion on you unless we have your freely given and voluntary consent. It is against the law to perform an abortion on you against your will.

You have the right to contact any local or state law enforcement agency to receive protection from any actual or threatened physical abuse or violence."

(b) The sign required under subsection (a) of this section shall be printed with lettering that is legible and shall be at least three-quarter inch (3/4") boldface type.

(c)(1) A facility in which abortions are performed that is a private office or a free-standing surgical outpatient clinic shall post the sign required under subsection (a) of this section in each patient waiting room and patient consultation room used by patients on whom abortions are performed.

(2) A hospital or any other facility in which abortions are performed that is not a private office or a free-standing surgical outpatient clinic shall post the sign required under subsection (a) of this section in each patient admission area used by patients on whom abortions are performed.

20-16-1203. Minors.

(a) If the pregnant female is a minor, the attending physician shall inform the female that no one can force her to have an abortion and that an abortion cannot be performed on her unless she provides her freely given, voluntary, and informed consent.

(b)(1) The minor female shall certify in writing, before the performance of the abortion, that she was informed by the attending physician of the information required under subsection (a) of this section.

(2) A copy of the written certification shall be placed in the minor's file and kept for at least seven (7) years or for two (2) years after the minor reaches the age of majority, whichever is greater.

20-16-1204. Administrative remedies and penalties.

(a) The Division of Health of the Department of Health and Human Services shall have the authority to:

(1) Conduct at any time and from time to time such reasonable periodic, special, or other examination of any private office, free-standing surgical outpatient clinic, or other facility or clinic in which abortions are performed to ensure compliance with this subchapter;

(2) Suspend or revoke permits and assess fines under subsection (b) of this section for failure to comply with this subchapter; and

(3) Promulgate rules necessary to enforce this subchapter.

(b) Any facility or clinic that fails to post a sign required under § 20-16-1202 in knowing, reckless, or negligent violation of this subchapter shall be assessed a fine of one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

(c) Each day on which an abortion is performed in a facility or clinic during which the sign required under § 20-16-1202 is not posted during a portion of business hours when patients or prospective patients are present is a separate violation of this subchapter.

20-16-1205. Civil remedies.

(a) An action may be brought by or on behalf of an individual injured by the failure to post the sign required by this subchapter.

(b) A plaintiff in an action under this section may recover damages for emotional distress and other damages allowed by law.

(c) An action may be brought by or on behalf of an individual injured by the failure to inform a minor female of the required information.

(d) The sanctions and actions provided in this section do not displace any sanction applicable under other law.

SECTION 2. Section 1 of this act becomes effective on October 1 of the first October after the effective date of this act."

(2) The Division of Legislative Audit shall submit to the Attorney General the names of any law enforcement agency that fails to comply with subdivision (b)(1) of this section, and the Attorney General shall take such action as may be necessary to enforce this section.

(3) The Division of Legislative Audit shall forward to the Attorney General a copy of each policy received by the division. The Attorney General shall review each policy to ensure that the policy meets the standards required by law.

(c)(1) Each law enforcement agency shall promote public awareness of the law enforcement agency's efforts to comply with the mandates of this section.

(2) In addition, each law enforcement agency shall make available for public inspection a copy of the law enforcement agency's policy written in both English and Spanish.”

(d) If the local pension and relief fund or its sponsoring municipality does not comply with subsection (c) of this section within six (6) months of the notification by the board, then the fund shall develop a written plan of action in conjunction with the board in accordance with rules promulgated by the board.

(2) "Local real property transfer tax" means a tax levied on real property within the boundaries of the political subdivision that levies such a tax when the real property is sold, granted, assigned, transferred, or otherwise conveyed to, or vested in the purchaser, or any other person by the purchaser's direction.

(3) "Municipality" means:

- (A) A city of the first class;
- (B) A city of the second class; or
- (C) An incorporated town;

(4) "Municipal service agency" means:

(A) Any department, commission, utility, or agency of a municipality, including any municipally owned or controlled corporation;

(B) Any municipal improvement district, consolidated public or municipal utility system improvement district, or municipally owned nonprofit corporation that owns or operates any utility service;

(C) Any municipal water department, waterworks or joint waterworks, or a consolidated waterworks system operating under the Consolidated Waterworks Authorization Act, § 25-20-301 et seq.;

(D) Any municipal wastewater utility or department;

(E) Any municipal public facilities board; or

(F) Any municipal entity described in this subdivision (4) operating with another similar entity under an interlocal agreement in accordance with § 25-20-101 et seq. or § 25-20-201 et seq.; and

(5) "Public facility" means a publicly owned facility that is one (1) or more of the following systems or a portion of those systems:

(A) Water supply, treatment, and distribution for either domestic water or for suppression of fires;

(B) Wastewater treatment and sanitary sewerage;

(C) A storm water drainage;

(D) A road, street, sidewalk, highway, or public transportation;

(E) Library;

(F) A park, open space, or recreation area;

(G) Police or public safety;

(H) Fire protection; or

(I) Ambulance or emergency medical transportation and response.

26-82-103. Call for an election.

(a) A local governing body of any municipality may call an election for the levy of a local real property transfer tax on real property transferred within the municipality to be dedicated to the purchase, construction, improvement, or maintenance of public facilities;

(b)(1) Upon the approval of the qualified electors of the municipality, a local governing body of any municipality may implement either a local real property transfer tax; or

(2) A local governing body of any municipality may enact an ordinance for the levy of a development impact fee under § 14-56-103 to offset the cost to the municipality or to a municipal service agency that is reasonably attributable to providing a necessary public facility to the new development.

(c) Nothing shall prevent a municipality to combine money collected through a local real property transfer tax or development impact fee with a separate capital improvement fund for the purpose of pooling investments or capacity capital improvement expenditures as long as the funds are accounted for separately.

(d) A local governing body of any municipality may only impose either a local real property transfer tax or a development impact fee for the same capacity improvement.

(e) Nothing within this subsection shall prohibit a municipality from enacting or continuing an impact fee for certain types of capital capacity improvements and also imposing a local real property transfer tax for different types of capital capacity improvements.

26-82-104. Local real property transfer tax.

(a) The proceeds of a local real property transfer tax levied under this chapter shall be used only for the public facility designated in the ordinance calling the election under § 26-82-103.

(b) The election shall be held within one hundred twenty (120) days of the ordinance calling the election, but not before sixty (60) days of the ordinance calling the election.

(c) The local governing body of any municipality shall notify its board of election commissioners that the measure has been referred to the vote of the qualified electors of the municipality and shall submit a copy of the ballot title to its board of election commissioners.

(d) The ballot title to be used shall be substantially in the following form:

“ FOR adoption of the local real property transfer tax of (amount of tax) for each one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or fractional part, within.....(Name of municipality).”

“ AGAINST adoption of the local real property transfer tax of (amount of tax) for each one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or fractional part, within(Name of municipality).”

(e) The ballot title shall also include an expiration date for the levy of the local real property transfer tax, and, if adopted in this form, the local real property transfer tax shall cease to be levied on the date noted on the ballot.

(f) An election for the levy of a local real property transfer tax shall be conducted in the manner provided by law for all other municipal elections unless otherwise specified in this subchapter.

(g) After the election results have been certified, the local governing board of the municipality shall immediately issue a proclamation declaring the results of the election and cause the proclamation to be published one (1) time in a newspaper having general circulation within the municipality.

(h) Any person desiring to challenge the results of the election as published in the proclamation shall file the challenge in the circuit court of the county where the municipality is located within thirty (30) days after the date of publication of the proclamation.

(i) If no election challenge is timely filed, there shall be levied, effective on the first day of the first month of the calendar quarter after the expiration of the thirty-day challenge period, a local real property transfer tax to be collected in the amount decided by the qualified electors and for the purpose decided by the qualified electors.

(j)(1) In the event of an election challenge, the local real property transfer tax shall be collected as prescribed in this section unless enjoined by court order.

(2) Hearings involving an election challenge under this section shall be advanced on the docket of the court and disposed at the earliest feasible time.

(k) When the submission of the levy of a local real property transfer tax is submitted to the qualified electors and the measure is defeated, the measure shall not again be submitted to the electors by ordinance of the local governing body of the municipality at a special or general election for a period of one (1) year from the date the measure was last voted upon.

26-82-105. Collection of local real property transfer tax funds.

(a) The municipality shall design documentary stamps in appropriate denominations and shall make the documentary stamps available for purchase at the appropriate municipal office or by consignment with a bank, a savings and loan association, or a title company located in the municipality.

(b) The municipality may rely upon the local real property transfer tax affidavit of compliance as provided in § 26-60-108 for the purpose of establishing the consideration for the transaction.

(c) A grantee or buyer, or his or her agent, shall furnish proof of payment of the local real property transfer tax as provided in this chapter before the real estate transfer instrument may be accepted by the county recorder of deeds for recordation.

(d) The county recorder shall not record any instrument evidencing a transfer of title subject to this chapter unless:

(1)(A) The instrument shall have attached thereto or be accompanied by an affidavit in the form provided in this chapter containing the information required in this chapter and have documentary stamps attached to the face of the instrument evidencing full payment of the local real property transfer tax on the transaction.

(B) The instrument shall contain a notation on its face, which shall be recorded as part of the instrument, that the affidavit was completed; or

(2)(A) Either stamped or attached to the instrument in a manner which will cause it to be recorded as part of the instrument the following statement:

"I certify under penalty of false swearing that the legally correct amount of documentary stamps have been placed on this instrument."

(B) This statement shall be signed by the grantee or his or her agent, and the grantee's address shall be clearly shown on the instrument.

(e) The recorder of deeds shall not record any instrument where documentary stamps are attached in such a manner that the amount printed on each stamp is not visible.

26-82-106. Exempt transactions.

(a) The local real property transfer tax imposed by this chapter shall not apply to a transfer of the following:

(1) A transfer to or from the United States, the State of Arkansas, or any of the instrumentalities, agencies, or political subdivisions of the United States or the State of Arkansas;

(2) Any instrument or writing given solely to secure a debt;

(3) Any instrument solely for the purpose of correcting or replacing an instrument that has been previously recorded with full payment of the tax having been paid at the time of the previous recordation;

(4) An instrument conveying land sold for delinquent taxes;

(5) An instrument conveying a leasehold interest in land only;

(6) An instrument, including a timber deed, that conveys or grants the right to remove timber from land if the instrument grants or conveys the right to remove the timber for a period of not to exceed twenty-four (24) months;

(7) An instrument given by one (1) party in a divorce action to the other party in the divorce action as a division of marital property whether by agreement or order of the court;

(8) An instrument given in any judicial proceeding to enforce any security interest in real estate when the instrument transfers the property to the same person who is seeking to enforce the security interest;

(9) An instrument given to a secured party in lieu of or to avoid a judicial proceeding to enforce a security interest in real estate;

(10) An instrument conveying a home financed by the Federal Housing Administration, Department of Veterans Affairs, or United States Department of Agriculture Rural Development if the sale price of the home is sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) or less and the seller files with the county recorder a sworn statement by the buyer stating that:

(A) Neither the buyer nor the spouse of the buyer has owned a home within three (3) years of the date of closing; and

(B) The sale price of the home; and

(11) An instrument conveying land between corporations, partnerships, limited liability companies, or other business entities or between a business entity and its shareholders, partners, or members incident to the organization, reorganization, merger, consolidation, capitalization, asset distribution or the liquidation of a corporation, partnership, limited liability company, or other business entity.

26-82-107. Distribution of local real property transfer tax funds.

(B) The State Geographic Information Coordinator will:

(i) Assist the board in developing a comprehensive plan and evaluation procedures on how the state should implement tactical and strategic geographic information systems and land information systems planning;

(ii) Implement informational and educational programs; and

(iii) Coordinate intrastate geographic information systems and land information systems efforts.

(C) The State Geographic Information Coordinator shall report directly to the ~~Executive Chief Information Officer~~ Director of the Department of Information Systems.

(d)(1) The State Geographic Information Coordinator shall administer daily operations of the Arkansas Geographic Information Office with direction from the board.

(2) This may include liaison between the board and the Governor, the ~~Executive Chief Information Officer~~ Director of the Department of Information Systems, and public or private sector entities involved in spatial data and land records modernization, project management in the preparation of the strategic planning documents related to spatial data and land records modernization, developing policy and procedures for land records modernization, and developing policy and procedures for the activities of the board.

(3) Additional requirements are the implementation of educational programs, coordinating vendor exhibits, and facilitating technical assistance and consulting.

(e) The board may conduct meetings at such places and such times as it may deem necessary or convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and accomplish its objectives and purposes.

(f) Members of the board shall receive no compensation for their services.

(i) The board shall seek the review and advice of the Joint Committee on Advanced Communications and Information Technology prior to issuing guidelines, proposed legislation, and strategic plans.

(F)(i) The request for proposal may provide that the agency and the vendor may negotiate an amount or baseline upon which the increase in taxes or fees is measured.

(ii) Any contract other than a fixed fee contract shall include a factor in the baseline calculation to account for an increase in taxes or fees due solely to economic factors and not to the use of the technology.

(3) The agency procurement official or procurement agent and the vendor shall negotiate the contract, with the oversight of ~~the office of the Executive Chief Information Officer~~ and the department to assist in negotiating an advantageous contract.

(4)(A) The agency director shall submit the proposed contract and a request for new appropriation to the Governor or his or her designee.

(10)(9) "Information technology resources" means the procedures, equipment, and software that are designed, built, operated, and maintained to collect, record, process, store, retrieve, display, and transmit information, and the associated personnel, including consultants and contractors;

(11)(10) "Network infrastructure" means the shared portions of the state's telecommunications transmission facilities, including all transmission lines and all associated equipment and software components necessary for the management and control of the state network;

(12)(11) "Nongovernmental first responder entity" means state and law enforcement personnel, fire department personnel, and emergency medical personnel who will be deployed to bioterrorism attacks, terrorist attacks, catastrophic or natural disasters, and other emergencies;

(B) The same rate or fee structure will apply to all customers receiving services;

(5)(A) Establishing estimated billing rates to be developed for a two-year period to coincide with the budgeting process.

(B) The department shall have the authority to adjust billing as necessary to effect compliance with applicable state and federal statutory and regulatory provisions.

(C) Billing adjustments shall be subject to the approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and review by the Legislative Council;

(6) Acquiring information technology on behalf of state agencies, the cost of which shall be recovered through customer billings or through direct funding;

(7) Promulgating rules and regulations that are necessary for efficient administration and enforcement of the powers, functions, and duties of the department as provided in this chapter;

(8) Developing a departmental plan to support the goals and objectives set forth for it in the state information technology plans and strategies. ~~The department shall seek the advice of the Executive Chief Information Officer in the development of its plan;~~

(9) Implementing systems to ensure the security of state data and state data processing assets, to provide for disaster recovery and continuity of operations to the state agencies served, and to recover its costs from the customers benefited; ~~and~~

(10) Performing any additional powers, functions, and duties which are necessary and appropriate for the proper administration of the provisions of this chapter;

(11) Monitoring information resource security issues, coordinating all security measures which could be used to protect resources by more than one (1) governmental entity, and acting as an information technology resource to other state agencies;

(12) Assisting in the development of an information technology security policy for state agencies; and

(13) Developing the information technology security policy for state agencies;

(14) Advising agencies in acquiring information technology service;

(15) Developing the information technology standards and specifications for state agencies when requested;

(16) Participating in the development of information technology state contracts as requested by a state agency, including without limitation the identification of requirements, contract negotiation, and vendor evaluation;

(17) With respect to their technology functions and applications, all state departments, boards, commissions, and public institutions of higher education shall consult and cooperate with the Department of Information Systems in the formation and implementation of security policies for the state core information technology infrastructure; and

(18) Assisting in the development of a state information technology plan that shall establish a state-level mission, goals, and objectives for the use of information technology.

(b) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to deprive, transfer, limit, or in any way alter or change any of the powers vested in the board of trustees of any institution of higher education under existing constitutional and statutory provisions.

(3) Consideration of a variety of information technologies, including those that help transcend geographic locations, standard business hours, economic conditions of users, and disabilities;

- (e) Plans developed or updated shall be submitted to the ~~office~~ Department of Finance and Administration. - (f) Plans developed or updated by public instrumentalities shall be submitted for review to the Joint Committee on Advanced Communications and Information Technology. The election can only be held when all members are present to vote By secret ballot and when the Secretary of the Senate has the absent member's sealed ballot in hand.

The body may give leave of a Senator who unexpectedly has to be absent.

Any member interested in running for the position of Senate President Pro Tempore Designee for the 87th General Assembly, needs to inform the Secretary of the Senate of his or her intention of running for the position no later than one day prior to the recess of the 86th General Assembly.

The Secretary of the Senate shall prepare ballots with the names of all Senators who informed the Secretary of the Senate of their intention to be a candidate for the position of Senate President Pro Tempore Designee for the 87th General Assembly.

Each candidate shall designate a fellow Senator to be his or her counter of the ballots. The folded ballots will be handed out to all Senators by the Secretary of the Senate and collected by the Secretary of the Senate. The ballots will be turned over to the

Senate Rules Committee Chairman who will then give the ballots to the designated counters. The designated counters shall count the ballots in private, and upon agreement of the vote totals, shall shred all ballots.

(a) Regardless of any provision of law to the contrary, beginning with the 2007-2008 school year, no school district shall receive state funding for those students in the district's prior year three quarter average daily membership who were enrolled and attending a public school with an internet, long-distance or virtual technology curriculum based program which was not part of a public school district and the public school program was funded by a federal voluntary public school choice grant administered by the Department of Education.

(b) Prior to July 1, 2007, the Department of Education shall notify the Arkansas State Board of Education of the maximum number of students that the State Board of Education shall allow to enroll and attend any open-enrollment charter school that uses internet, long-distance or virtual technology as the primary method of teaching. It is the intent of this language that the Department shall not establish and certify a number of students to the State Board of Education that exceeds the number of students for which school districts were not able to receive state funding because of the requirements of paragraph (a). However, to the extent there are any revenue savings caused by the closure of any open-enrollment charter school in existence on July 1, 2006, the State Board of Education may increase the maximum number of students allowed to enroll and attend an internet, long-distance or virtual technology open-enrollment charter school to the extent the maximum number of students does not exceed five hundred (500) students.

(a)(1) In lieu of terminating employment and accepting a service retirement pension pursuant to ~~§ 24-11-401 et seq.~~ under this subchapter, any police officer who is a member of a policemen's pension and relief fund who has not less than twenty (20) years of credited service and who is eligible to receive a service retirement pension may elect to participate in the Arkansas Police Officers' Deferred Option Plan and defer the receipt of benefits in accordance with the provisions of this section, provided that the board of trustees of the local policemen's pension and relief fund approves the participation in the plan.

(2) For purposes of this section, credited service shall include service credit recognized pursuant to this subchapter.

(b)(1) The duration of participation in the plan for active police officers shall not exceed five (5) years.

(2) The five-year limit may be extended if:

(A) The extension does not cause the limit to exceed ten (10) years;

(B) The extension applies to all active members and all members on the plan;

(C) The extension is approved by a majority of votes of the board of trustees of the pension and relief fund or of the Arkansas Local Police and Fire Retirement System for funds whose administrative responsibility has been assigned to the system as provided in § 24-11-406(b);

(D) The interest credited after the first five (5) years on the plan shall be two (2) percentage points below the rate of return of the investment portfolio of the fund and shall not be determined under subdivision (e)(2) of this section, but in no event shall the interest rate credited be less than zero percent (0%); and

(E) The extension is approved by a majority vote of the governing body of the sponsoring municipality.

(c)(1) Except under ~~subdivision~~ subdivisions (c)(2) and (c)(3) of this section, at the conclusion of a member's participation in the plan, the member shall terminate employment with all participating municipalities as a police officer and shall start receiving the member's accrued monthly retirement benefit from the policemen's pension and relief fund.

(2) If a member is at the conclusion of a member's participation in the plan, the member may continue employment by a municipality under the following conditions:

(A) The municipality makes continued employment available to all similarly situated members.

(B) The availability of continued employment is approved by a majority vote of the governing body of the sponsoring municipality after receiving approval for an increase in benefits under § 24-11-102;

(C) The monthly benefit that is credited to the member's plan account is discontinued and the member shall not receive a monthly benefit until the member actually ceases employment;

(D) The interest rate credited to the plan account is the same paid as under subdivision (e)(2) of this section, except that the minimum rate is zero percent (0%);

(E) The employer's matching contribution of six percent (6%) shall cease, but all other employer contributions shall continue and be credited to the pension and relief fund; and

(F) The employee contributions of six percent (6%) shall discontinue.

(3) A member may enter into employment with a participating municipality other than the municipality he or she was employed by at the time of retirement so long as the member has a break of service from his or her previous employer of at least thirty (30) days.

(d)(1) When a member begins participation in the plan, the contribution of the police officer and the employer contribution shall continue to be paid.

(2)(A) In a municipality having a population of over twenty thousand (20,000) persons, municipal matching contributions for employees who elect the plan shall be credited equally to the policemen's pension and relief fund and to the plan, or at the option of the local pension and relief fund board of trustees, credited in the manner provided in subdivision (d)(2)(B) of this section.

(B) In a municipality having a population of twenty thousand (20,000) persons or less, municipal matching contributions for employees who elect the plan shall be credited in full to the policemen's pension and relief fund, and the contribution of the employee shall be credited to the member's plan account.

(3) The monthly retirement benefits that would have been payable had the member elected to cease employment and receive service retirement and pension supplement payments made by the Policemen's Pension Supplement Program shall be paid into the plan account.

(e)(1) The member's monthly retirement benefit shall not change unless the plan receives a benefit increase.

(2)(A) A member who participates in this plan shall earn interest at a rate of two (2) percentage points below the rate of return of the investment portfolio of the policemen's pension and relief fund as certified by the actuary under contract with the Arkansas Fire and Police Pension Review Board in accordance with generally accepted actuarial practices and § 24-11-207 but no less than the actuarial assumed interest rate as certified by the actuary.

(B) The interest shall be credited to the individual account balance of the member on an annual basis.

(f)(1) At the option of the participant, a participant in the plan shall receive a lump-sum payment from the account equal to the payments to the account or a true annuity based upon the account of the participant or may elect any other method of payment if approved by the board of trustees.

(2) If approved by a majority vote of the governing body of the sponsoring municipality and the board of trustees, a participant in the deferred retirement option plan may defer receiving payment of the participant's account and continue with the funds deposited in the plan.

(3)(A) Interest credited to the continuing deposit of funds in the plan under subdivision (f)(2) of this section shall be calculated in the same manner as interest under subdivision (e)(2) of this section.

(B) However, the minimum interest rate shall not be less than zero percent (0%).

(4) The payment of funds accumulated while participating in the deferred retirement option plan may be deferred only one (1) time. These funds must be distributed or annuitized by December 31 of the year a member attains age seventy and one-half (70 1/2).

(g) If the participant dies during the period of participation in the plan, a lump-sum payment equal to the account balance of the participant shall be paid.

(h) A participant in the plan shall not receive any benefits under the plan unless he or she participates in the plan for a minimum of one (1) year, absent death or disability.

(i) The Arkansas Fire and Police Pension Review Board may promulgate regulations to make the plan under this section comply with the requirements of this section and with the applicable portions of the federal Internal Revenue Code, as it existed on January 1, 2003.

(j) Although the police officer may remain employed by the participating municipality, any member who opts to participate in the plan shall be considered to be retired for all retirement purposes, including, but not limited to, benefit increase purposes and the extension of benefits to the spouses of deceased members.”
