(A) If a municipality or county where the offense occurs is a certified affiliate of Keep Arkansas Beautiful or Keep America Beautiful, Inc., and participates in litter control programs conducted by these organizations, then the monies from fines collected for offenses in that jurisdiction shall be deposited to the city or county general fund to be used for the purpose of community improvement as determined by the municipal or county governing body; or

(B) If the municipality or county where the offense occurs is not a certified affiliate of Keep Arkansas Beautiful or Keep America Beautiful, Inc., or does not participate in litter control programs conducted by these organizations, then the monies from fines collected for offenses in those jurisdictions shall be deposited as special revenues in the State Treasury and credited to the Keep Arkansas Beautiful Fund Account to be used by the Keep Arkansas Beautiful Commission as appropriated by the General Assembly for the purpose of encouraging litter prevention and anti-litter education and increasing awareness of litter law enforcement statewide."
