(c) The Department of Human Services shall keep records of every adult adoptee and birth parent reunited through the use of the mutual consent voluntary adoption registry."

Page 1, delete lines 10, 11, and 12 in the Title and substitute the following: "TITLE 27, CHAPTER 15, SUBCHAPTER 3 TO ENHANCE THE PENALTY FOR PARKING IN A DISABLED PARKING SPACE AND TO REDUCE THE TIME PERIOD FOR ISSUANCE OF DISABLED PARKING CERTIFICATES AND PLATES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.";

AND

Page 1, delete lines 15, 16, and 17 in the Subtitle and substitute the following: "TO ENHANCE THE PENALTY FOR PARKING IN A DISABLED PARKING SPACE AND REDUCE THE TIME PERIOD FOR ISSUANCE OF DISABLED PARKING CERTIFICATES.";

AND

Page 1, line 21, add a new SECTION 1 to the bill as follows:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 27-15-305(b), concerning penalties for parking in disabled parking spaces, is amended to read as follows:

(b) Any vehicle found to be parked in an area designated for the exclusive use of any person with a disability, including the access aisle, as provided in this subchapter, on which is not displayed a special license plate, a special certificate, or

an official designation of another state as authorized in this subchapter or which is found to be parked in an area designated for the exclusive use of any person with a disability, if operated by a person who is not a person with a disability, while not being used for the actual transporting of a person with a disability, shall be subject to impoundment by the appropriate law enforcement agency. In addition thereto, the owner of the vehicle shall upon conviction be subject to a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500) for the first offense and not less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) nor more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for the second and subsequent offense, plus applicable towing, impoundment, and related fees as well as court costs, and suspension of the driver's license for up to six (6) months.";

Page 1, line 22, delete the first number "1" between "SECTION" and the period "." and substitute the number "2";

AND

Page 2, line 18, delete the first number "2" between "SECTION" and the period "." and substitute the number "3";

AND

Page 2 , line 26, add an additional SECTION 4 to the bill as follows:

"SECTION 4. Arkansas Code 27-15-308(c), concerning special license plates and certificates for persons with disabilities, is amended to add an additional subdivision to read as follows:

(5)(A) If a person to whom a special certificate or license plate has been issued moves to another state, the person shall surrender the special certificate or plate to the office.

(B) If a person to whom a special certificate or license plate has been issued dies, the special certificate or license plate shall be returned to the office within thirty (30) days after the death of the person to whom the special certificate or plate was issued.";

Page 3, delete lines 7 through 12.

~~(3)(C)~~ One (1) member representing the County Judges Association, to be recommended by the County Judges Association and appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

~~(4)(D)~~ One (1) member representing the Arkansas Rural Fire Fighters Association, to be recommended by the Arkansas Rural Fire Fighters Association and appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

~~(5)(E)~~ One (1) member representing the Arkansas Council of Professional Fire Fighters, to be recommended by the Arkansas Council of Professional Fire Fighters and appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

~~(6)(F)~~ One (1) member representing the Arkansas Municipal League, to be recommended by the Arkansas Municipal League and appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

~~(7)(G)~~ One (1) member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives to represent the Arkansas State Firefighters' Association;

(H) The Director of the Arkansas Forest Commission or the director's designee; and

(I) The Director of the Department of Rural Services or the director's designee.

(2) If an ex officio non-voting member no longer represents the organization from which he or she was selected, a vacancy shall exist and the vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment."
