The stay of the suspension shall continue until the appeal is complete or until the House of Representatives takes final action on the conviction."

~~(B)(D)~~ In addition, the members of the board shall appoint two (2) ex officio nonvoting members.

(4) Members of the board shall not be compensated for their services, but each member may receive expense reimbursement in accordance with ~~§ 25-16-901 et seq~~ § 25-16-902.

(c)(1) The voting members of the board shall select a chairman and a vice-chairman from among their own number.

(2) The board shall meet annually.

(3) A majority of the voting members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.”

“SECTION 8. Arkansas Code 15-4-1502(a) – (h) are amended to read as follows:

(c) The Governor shall appoint two (2) members from each congressional district as the districts were constituted at the time of the passage of this subchapter.
