“SECTION 1. Official state tartans.

The Scottish immigrants have greatly contributed to the culture, customs, music, and dance native to the State of Arkansas; therefore, it is appropriate that we honor them by adopting official state tartans.

SECTION 2. The Natural State Tartan.

(a) There is established an official state tartan to be known as “The Natural State Tartan”.

(b) The colors present in the tartan shall be made up of:

- (1) A green background to represent the Natural State;
- (2) Stripes of red to represent the original settlers;
- (3) Stripes of white to represent diamonds; and
- (4) Stripes of black to represent oil.

(c) The Natural State Tartan shall be described by the following thread count:

- (1) Green, eight (8) thread count;
- (2) Black, twelve (12) thread count;
- (3) Green, twelve (12) thread count;
- (4) Red, twenty-four (24) thread count;
- (5) Green, forty-eight (48) thread count;
- (6) White, four (4) thread count; and
- (7) Green, twelve (12) thread count.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Traveler Tartan.

(a) There is established an official state tartan to be known as the “Arkansas Traveler Tartan”.

(b) The colors present in the tartan design represent the State of Arkansas in the following ways:

(1) Green for the beautiful forests and trees of the Ozark Mountains where many of the Scottish immigrants settled;

(2) Blue for Arkansas' beautiful lakes, rivers, and streams;

(3) Yellow for the bright rays of sunshine during the spring and summer seasons; and

(4) Red for the blood of our strong family ties to Scotland and within the State of Arkansas.

(c) The Arkansas Traveler Tartan was designed and woven by Jason Emory Nickerson, a resident of Hot Springs, Arkansas.

(d) The Arkansas Traveler Tartan shall be described by the following thread count:

(1) Yellow, two (2) thread count;

(2) Green, thirty-six (36) thread count;

(3) Red, ten (10) thread count;

(4) Yellow, eighteen (18) thread count;

(5) Green, twelve (12) thread count;

(6) Blue, sixteen (16) thread count;

(7) Green, eight (8) thread count;

(8) Blue, ten (10) thread count; and

(9) Green, eighteen (18) thread count.

SECTION 4. Tartan Day.

April 6 of every year shall be designated as “Tartan Day” to honor Arkansans of Scottish descent.”
