(2) The remaining revenues shall go to the Athletic Department of the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville, from which it shall pay to Arkansas State University an amount that equals the average amount of guarantees paid to out-of-state football opponents from the previous year.

SECTION 2. (a) There is established an annual basketball tournament to be known and cited as the "Arkansas Meals-On-Wheels Basketball Tournament."

(b) The tournament shall:

(1) Annually be held on the fourth Friday and Saturday of November;

(2) Include, but not be limited to, the men's and women's basketball teams from:

(A) The University of Arkansas, Fayetteville;

(B) The University of Arkansas at Little Rock;

(C) The University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff; and

(D) Arkansas State University; and

(3) Be held at Alltel Arena in North Little Rock.

(c) After the expenses of the universities and Alltel Arena, proceeds from the tournament shall be deposited in the State Treasury to the credit of the Aging and Adult Services Fund Account, to be used exclusively for the Meals-on-Wheels Program.

(d) The Major Sports Association of Arkansas shall be responsible for determining the pairings, however:

(1) The winners of the basketball games on Friday shall play a championship game on Saturday; and

(2) The losers of the basketball games on Friday shall play a consolation game on Saturday.”
