(ii) Facilities constructed after the effective date of this act are required to provide power to air conditioning systems for areas of refuge.

(2) By November 1, 2002, each facility shall either:"

(A) The office shall notify the facility in writing that the plan is unacceptable and shall state the specific deficiencies in the plan; and

(ii) The revised plan shall correct the deficiencies listed in the written notice of the office.

(4)(A) If a facility does not agree with the determination by the office that a plan is unacceptable, the facility may appeal the determination pursuant to § 20-10-103.

(B) However, the filing of an appeal shall not stay the requirements under subdivision (a)(2) of this section."

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly that the lack of emergency generator that will power critical nursing facility systems in the event of power outages, interruptions or loss of power, endanger the health, safety and welfare of nursing home residents, who are among the most vulnerable and physically at-risk citizens of the State of Arkansas. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto."
