"COMMISSION; TO ADD A MEMBER TO THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ADVISORY COUNCIL; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

AND

Page 1, delete lines 15 and 16 and substitute the following:

"COMMISSION; TO ADD A MEMBER TO THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ADVISORY COUNCIL."

AND

Add Representatives Judy, Rodgers, Minton, Womack, Pritchard, Dees, Haak, Rackley, Bond, King, Trammell as cosponsors of the bill

AND

Page 1, delete lines 35 and 36 and substitute the following:

"(c)(1) The members of the commission shall serve one (1) two-year term."

AND

Page 2, line 1, delete "(3)" and substitute "(2)"

AND

Page 2, line 3, delete "committee" and substitute "commission"

AND

Page 2, line 5, delete "enacting" and substitute "transacting"

AND

Page 2, delete line 6 and substitute the following:

"any business of the commission.

(e)(1) The Governor or a designee shall call the first meeting within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this act and shall act as chair for the first meeting.

(2) At the first meeting, the commission shall elect a chairperson.

(f) The members of the commission shall be volunteers who shall participate without compensation or reimbursement.

(g) The commission shall expire June 30, 2003."

AND

Page 2, delete lines 21 and 22 and substitute the following:

"facts gleaned from its study and fact-finding to the Legislative Council by November

1, 2002."

AND

Page 2, line 24, add two additional Sections to read as follows:

"SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 20-13-205(a), concerning the membership of the Emergency Medical Services Advisory Council, is amended to read as follows:

(a) There is created the Emergency Medical Services Advisory Council, which shall consist of ~~seventeen (17)~~ eighteen (18) members with a demonstrated interest in emergency medical services, to be appointed by the Governor as follows:

(1) Four (4) members shall be licensed medical doctors of good professional standing. One (1) member shall be appointed representing each of the following areas:

(A) The Arkansas Chapter of the American College of Emergency Physicians;

(B) The Arkansas Academy of Family Physicians;

(C) The Arkansas Medical Society; and

(D) The medical director for a licensed paramedic ambulance service;

(2) One (1) member recommended by the Arkansas Hospital Association;

(3) One (1) member who shall be a member of the Arkansas Emergency Department Nurses Association;

(4) One (1) member who shall be a member of, and recommended by, the Arkansas Ambulance Owners and Operators' Association;

(5) One (1) member who shall be a certified EMT-Paramedic;

(6) One (1) member who shall be a certified EMT-Ambulance driver;

(7) One (1) member representing fire department-based ambulance services;

(8) One (1) member representing EMT training sites who shall have had at least five (5) years' experience associated with EMT training in this state;

(9) One (1) member who shall be a consumer representative who has an interest in public health and emergency medical services. The member shall be appointed by the Governor from the state at large;

(10) One (1) member who shall be sixty-five (65) years of age or more. This member shall be appointed by the Governor from the state at large and shall not belong to any other group specifically addressed in this section, with the exception of the consumer representative;

(11) One (1) member who shall represent city-based or county-based ambulance services;

(12) One (1) member who shall represent the Arkansas Association of Chiefs of Police or the Arkansas Sheriffs Association;

(13) One (1) member representing fire service rescue operations which do not transport patients; ~~and~~

(14) One (1) member licensed as an attorney at law in good professional standing within this state and having a knowledge of medical and legal issues; and

(15) One (1) member appointed from a list of two (2) nominees submitted by the Arkansas Emergency Medical Technician's Association.

SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly that the Health Task force Commission expires June 30, 2003; that the commission must report to the Legislative Council by November 1, 2002; that in order to complete all its assigned task the commission must begin work by July 1, 2001. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2001. "

Page 1, line 32, delete "and"

AND

Page 1, line 34, delete "7401." and substitute "7401; and"

AND

Page 1, line 35, insert an additional subsection to read as follows:

"(4) Net pollution impact statement" means an analysis using accepted traffic and air pollution computer models that will calculate the net air pollution that will be added by the project. Only the pollutant for which the metropolitan area is in violation is to be considered in this analysis. The analysis must consider the net effects on pollution from any infrastructure improvements that will be made in conjunction with the project."

AND

Delete Section 2 and substitute the following:

"SECTION 2. In metropolitan statistical areas in the State of Arkansas that have been declared a non-attainment area, or have violated the NAAQS for one or more pollutants but have not yet been formally declared a non-attainment area, local governments shall require proposed developments of regional significance to produce a net pollution impact statement prior to the issuance of a building permit. A public hearing on the net pollution impact statement shall be required. Building permits for developments of regional significance are required before construction can begin."

AND

Page 2, delete lines 16 through 18 and substitute the following:

"(2) A proposed shopping center encompassing more than five hundred thousand (500,000) square feet of floor space;

(3) A business establishment employing more than one thousand (1,000) persons per work shift, or an office building intended to house more than one thousand (1,000) persons;"

AND

Page 2, line 19, eliminate "(3)" and substitute "(4)"

AND

Page 2, line 21, delete "(4)" and substitute "(5)"

AND

Page 2, line 25, delete "(5)" and substitute "(6)"

AND

Page 2, line 29, delete "(6)" and substitute "(7)"

AND

Insert an additional section immediately following SECTION 3 to read as follows:

"SECTION 4. The requirement to conduct a net pollution impact statement for developments of regional significance shall apply only to non-attainment areas whose boundaries are solely within the State of Arkansas."

AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO HOUSE BILL NO. 2475

Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 2475** as engrossed H3/19/01:

Page 6, delete lines 30 through 36, and page 7, delete lines 1 through 10, and substitute the following:

"(k) 'General assets' includes all property, real, personal or otherwise, not specifically mortgaged, pledged, deposited or otherwise encumbered for the security or benefit of specified persons or classes of persons. As to specifically encumbered property, "general assets" includes all such property or its proceeds in excess of the amount necessary to discharge the sum or sums secured thereby. Assets held in trust and in deposit for the security or benefit of all policyholders or all policyholders and creditors, in more than a single state, shall be treated as general assets."

AND

Page 12, line 31, insert the following:

"(g) Except as provided at § 23-68-105(c)(1), and except as to claims filed against the estate pursuant to § 23-68-139, nothing in this Chapter shall deprive a person of any contractual right to pursue arbitration of any dispute under any law."

AND

On Page 13, delete lines 25 through 36, and page 14, delete line 1, and substitute "and their insurers. "

AND

Page 14, delete lines 35 through 36, and page 15, delete lines 1 and 2, and substitute the following:

“(4) All matters involving the interpretation or operation of this section shall remain within the jurisdiction of the domiciliary receivership court.”

AND

Page 19, delete lines 24 through 28 and substitute the following:

“Every proceeding commenced under the laws in effect before the effective date of this act shall be deemed to have commenced under this act for the purpose of conducting the proceeding henceforth, except that in the discretion of the commissioner the proceeding may be continued as it would have been continued had this act not been enacted.”

AND

Page 39, delete lines 4 through 16 and substitute the following:

“(f) The rehabilitator shall have the power under §§ 23-68-129 and 23-68-131 to avoid fraudulent transfers, and may exercise any of the powers under § 23-68-124, as necessary or appropriate, except that in the case of a life insurer, the rehabilitator of an insurer may, as part of a court approved plan of rehabilitation, modify or restructure, the policies of insurance. In the event the rehabilitator proposes to modify or restructure the policies of insurance, the rehabilitator may, with the concurrence of the court, approve payment of certain expenses incurred by an advisory committee appointed pursuant to § 23-68-118(a), the expenses to be limited to the reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in obtaining an expert evaluation of the effect upon policyholders of any proposed modification or restructuring of policies of insurance.”

AND

Page 43, delete lines 10 through 12 and substitute the following:

“(c) Original books, records, documents and papers, or certified copies thereof, when received in evidence shall be evidence of the facts disclosed.”

AND

Page 47, delete lines 24 through 26 and substitute the following:

“(13) To enter into such contracts as are necessary to carry out the order to liquidate, and to affirm or disaffirm any executory contract or unexpired lease to which the insurer is a party. This subsection shall not apply to an insurance policy or reinsurance contract whether or not it is executory.”

AND

Page 50, delete lines 12 through 18 and substitute the following:

“(4) By first class mail to all persons or entities known or reasonably

expected to have claims against the insurer, including all policyholders, at their last known address as indicated by the records of the insurer;

(5) By first-class mail to all known reinsurers of the insurer at their last known address as indicated by the records of the insurer; and

(6) By publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the county in which the insurer has its principal place of business and in such other locations as the liquidator deems appropriate."

AND

Page 55, delete lines 8 through 14 and substitute the following:

"Unless the otherwise applicable stay provisions or injunctive"

AND

Page 58, delete lines 31 through 34 and substitute the following:

"(d) In the event a reinsurance transaction is avoided under subsection (c):

(1) The receiver shall tender to the reinsurer the value of any consideration transferred to the insurer in connection with such transaction less the amount of matured and liquidated liabilities owing by the reinsurer to the estate; and

(2) The parties shall be returned to their relative positions prior to the implementation of the transaction avoided.

(e) Every person receiving any property from the insurer or any benefit thereof, which is a fraudulent transfer under subsection (a), shall be personally liable therefor and shall be bound to account to the liquidator."

AND

Page 63, line 31 delete "or" and substitute "and"

AND

Page 69, delete lines 25 through 36, and delete page 70, and page 71, delete lines 1 through 3, and substitute the following:

"(a) Mutual debts or mutual credits whether arising out of one or more contracts between an insurer that is subject to a receivership proceeding under this Chapter and another person shall be setoff and the balance only shall be allowed or paid except as provided in subsection (b) of this section and in § 23-96-110(f)(4).

(b) No setoff shall be allowed in favor of any person when:

(1) The obligation of the insurer to the person would not at the date of the filing of a petition for receivership entitle the person to share as a claimant in the assets of the insurer;

(2) The obligation of the insurer to the person was purchased by or transferred to the person with a view to its being used as a setoff;

(3) The obligation of the insurer is owed to an affiliate of such person or any other entity or association other than the person;

(4) The obligation of the person is owed to an affiliate of the insurer or any other entity or association other than the insurer;

(5) The obligation of the person is to pay an assessment levied against the members or subscribers of the insurer, is to pay a balance upon a subscription to the capital stock of the insurer, or is in any other way in the nature of a capital contribution; or

(6) The obligations between the person and the insurer arise out of transactions by which either the person or the insurer has assumed risks and obligations from the other party and then has ceded back to that party substantially the same risks and obligations. Notwithstanding the provisions of this subsection, the receiver may permit setoffs if in his or her discretion a setoff is appropriate because of specific circumstances relating to a transaction.

(c) The provisions of subdivision (b)(6) of this section shall apply to all contracts entered into, renewed, extended, or amended on or after the effective date of this act, and to debts or credits arising from any business written after such date pursuant to any such contract. For purposes of this subsection, any change in the terms of or consideration for any such contract shall be deemed an amendment of the contract.”

AND

Page 72, delete lines 20 through 36, and page 73, delete lines 1 through 21, and substitute the following:

“(b) Reinsurance shall be payable under a contract or contracts reinsured by the assuming insurer on the basis of reported claims allowed by the liquidation court, without diminution because of the insolvency of the ceding insurer. Such payments shall be made directly to the ceding insurer or to its domiciliary liquidator except:

(1) Where the contract or other written agreement specifically provides another payee of such reinsurance in the event of the insolvency of the ceding insurer; or

(2) Where the assuming insurer, with the consent of the direct insured or insureds, has assumed such policy obligations of the ceding insurer as direct obligations of the assuming insurer to the payees under such policies and in substitution for the obligations of the ceding insurer to such payees.

(c) Notwithstanding subsection (b), in the event that a life and health insurance guaranty association has made the election to succeed to the rights and obligations of the insolvent insurer under the contract of reinsurance, then the reinsurer’s liability to pay covered reinsured claims shall continue under the contract of reinsurance, subject to the payment to the reinsurer of the reinsurance premiums for such coverage. Payment for such reinsured claims shall only be made by the

reinsurer pursuant to the direction of the guaranty association or its designated successor. Any payment made at the direction of the guaranty association or its designated successor by the reinsurer will discharge the reinsurer of all further liability to any other party for said claim payment.

Page 80, delete lines 22 through 25 and substitute the following:

(4) If the claim was immature as of the date established under §23-68-120, it shall be discounted at the higher of the legal rate of interest accruing on judgments or the rate of interest available on United States Treasury securities of approximately the same maturity.

AND

Page 104, line 3 delete "~~(2)~~(1)" and substitute "(2)"

AND

Page 104, line 6 delete "(3)~~(2)~~" and substitute "(3)"

AND

Page 104, line 18 delete "~~(2)~~(1)" and substitute "(2)"

AND

Page 104, line 27 delete "(3)(2)" and substitute "(3)"

AND

Page 106, delete "§ 23-86-116(f)" and substitute "§ 23-68-116(f)"

"SECTION 56. Emergency Clause: It is found and determined by the 83rd General Assembly that this act is necessary in order to promote more uniformity, certainty and efficiency in the conservation, rehabilitation and liquidation of insolvent insurers. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by the governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto."

AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO HOUSE BILL NO. 2601

Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 2601** as originally introduced:

~~"(2)(A)~~ For purposes of subdivision (a)(1) of this section, ~~the disapproval shall be deemed unreasonable if it is not based solely on reasonable standards, uniformly applied, which relate to the extent of coverage required, or the financial soundness, or services of an insurer. These standards shall not discriminate against any particular type of insurer, nor shall the standards call for the disapproval of an insurance policy or binder because the policy or binder contains coverage in addition to that required~~ a rejection shall not be deemed unreasonable if it is based on reasonable standards, uniformly applied, relating to the extent of coverage required and the financial soundness and the services of an insurer.

~~(3)(4)~~ The Insurance Commissioner may investigate the affairs of any person to whom this subsection applies to determine whether the person has violated this subsection. If a violation of this subsection is found, the person in violation shall be subject to the same procedures and penalties as are applicable to §§ 23-66-203, 23-66-206, 23-66-207, and 23-66-209 - 23-66-213 and shall be liable for actual or compensatory damages resulting from an unreasonable disapproval of an insurance policy or binder;

~~(4)(5)~~ Once a binder has been issued, the insurer must issue a policy within ninety (90) days.

~~(5)(6)~~ All information given on the binder must be without material change when the policy is issued."

Insert additional sections immediately following Section 1 to read as follows:

"SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 23-66-315 is amended to read as follows:

23-66-315. Confidential information.

(a)(1) When a borrower is required to ~~keep real estate insured~~ maintain insurance and to furnish evidence of the insurance to a depository institution, an

affiliate of a depository institution, creditor, mortgagee, assignee, or lender as a condition for obtaining or keeping the loan, the lender, mortgagee, assignee, or creditor is prohibited from disclosing to other persons or parties, directly or indirectly, information with respect to the expiration dates of the insurance or other insurance policy information so as to enable any person or party to solicit the insurance or any renewal thereof, without first obtaining the written consent of the policyholder for such disclosure to be made.

(2) Nor shall any other person or party request the disclosure of the information, so as to facilitate solicitations of the insurance or any renewal thereof, without first obtaining the written consent of the policyholder.

(3) Nor shall any lender, mortgagee, assignee, or creditor use any of the information contained in a policy of insurance for the purpose of soliciting insurance business with respect to the insured real property from the borrower.

(b) These prohibitions do not apply to disclosure of insurance information of a customer to any officer, director, employee, agent or affiliate of the depository institution for the purpose of soliciting or selling insurance or when the depository institution, an affiliate of a depository institution, lender, mortgagee, assignee, or creditor has been advised in writing by the insurer or its agent that the insurance on the property will be cancelled or will not be renewed.

(c) Willful violation of this section by any depository institution, an affiliate of a depository institution, lender, mortgagee, assignee, or creditor or by any other person or party who may request the disclosure of the information from the lender, mortgagee, assignee, or creditor shall be punishable as a Class C misdemeanor.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 23, Chapter 66, Subchapter 6 is amended to read as follows:

Subchapter 6. Insurance Sales Consumer Protection Act.

23-66-601. Short title.

This subchapter may be cited as the "Insurance Sales Consumer Protection Act".

23-66-602. Purpose.

The purpose of this subchapter is to regulate the business of insurance and protect the interests of insurance consumers.

23-66-603. Definitions.

For the purpose of this subchapter:

(1) ~~The terms "lending institution", "subsidiary", and "affiliate" shall have the meanings ascribed to them in § 23-64-202(b)(4)~~ term "affiliate" means any company that controls, is controlled by, or is under common control with another company;

(2) The term "customer" means a person who obtains, applies for, or is

solicited to obtain insurance;

(3) The term "depository institution" means a bank or savings association;

(4) "Insurance" means all policies or products defined or regulated as insurance pursuant to § 23-60-101 et seq., except:

(A) Credit life, credit accident and health credit property, credit casualty, credit involuntary unemployment, mortgagor's decreasing term life, and mortgagor's accident and health and sickness insurance;

(B) Insurance placed by a financial institution in connection with collateral pledged as security for a loan when the debtor breaches the contractual obligation to provide that insurance; and

(C) Private mortgage insurance;

(5) The term "insurance information" means information concerning the premiums, terms, and conditions of insurance coverage, including expiration dates and rates, and insurance claims of a customer contained in the records of a depository institution or an affiliate of a depository institution; and

(6) The term "person" means any natural or artificial entity, including but not limited to, individuals, partnerships, associations, trusts or corporations.

23-66-604. Exemption.

The provisions of § 23-66-606 shall not apply to or affect in any way a broker-dealer licensed by the State of Arkansas when such broker-dealer is conducting insurance sales activities on premises other than ~~lending~~ depository institution or an affiliate of a depository institution premises.

23-66-605. Insurance in connection with a loan.

(a) The following shall apply when insurance is required as a condition of obtaining a loan or extension of credit:

~~(1) Solicitation for the purchase or sale of insurance shall be conducted only by individuals who are not primarily responsible for making a loan or extension of credit when the insurance solicitation is in connection with the specific loan or extension of credit~~ No person or depository institution, or affiliate of a depository institution may require as a condition precedent to the lending of money or extension of credit, or any renewal thereof, that the person to whom such money or credit is extended or whose obligation a creditor is to acquire or finance, negotiate any policy or renewal thereof through a particular insurer or group of insurers or agent or broker or group of agents or brokers. Further, no person or depository institution, or affiliate of a depository institution, may reject an insurance policy solely because the policy has been issued or underwritten by a person who is not associated with the depository institution or affiliate when insurance is required in connection with a loan or extension of credit;

(2) The loan or extension of credit and related insurance transactions shall be completed ~~independently and~~ through separate documentation; and

(3) A loan for premiums on required insurance shall not be included in the primary credit without the written consent of the customer.

(b)(1) As a condition for extending credit or offering any product or service that is equivalent to an extension of credit, no person or depository institution, or affiliate of a depository institution may require that a customer obtain insurance from a depository institution or an affiliate of a depository institution, or a particular insurer or producer. Nothing in this subchapter or § 23-60-101 et seq., shall be construed to prohibit ~~lending depository institution or affiliate of a depository institution~~ personnel from informing customers that insurance is required in order to obtain a loan or extension of credit or that loan or extension of credit approval is contingent upon the customers' obtaining acceptable insurance.

(2) ~~Lending~~ Depository institution or affiliate of a depository institution personnel may also inform customers that insurance is available from the ~~lending depository institution, its subsidiary,~~ an affiliate of a depository institution, or particular unaffiliated third parties, and indicate how to obtain additional information.

23-66-606. ~~Lending~~ Depository institution or affiliates of a depository institution sales practices.

The following requirements shall apply to insurance sales activities conducted by ~~lending depository institutions, their employees, subsidiaries,~~ affiliates of a depository institution, and unaffiliated third parties conducting the insurance sales activities on behalf of a ~~lending depository institution or affiliate of a depository institution~~ which involves the use of a ~~lending depository institution or affiliate of a depository institution~~ brand name or on ~~lending depository institution or affiliate of a depository institution's~~ premises:

(1)(A) Disclosures. The following disclosures are required with respect to the solicitation of life insurance products or policies ~~and annuities~~ and shall be made in writing, where practicable, during the initial customer contact, including communication by telephone or other electronic means in a clear and conspicuous manner prior to the sale:

(i) That ~~an~~ the insurance product or policy is not FDIC insured;

(ii) That ~~an~~ the insurance product or policy is not a deposit or obligation of, or guaranteed by, the ~~lending depository institution or affiliate of a depository institution;~~ and

(iii) Where appropriate, that certain insurance products involve investment risks, including the possible loss of principal.

~~(B) For related credit and insurance transactions, the following~~

~~disclosures shall be made in writing and signed by the customer, at or prior to the closing of the insurance sale, acknowledging that the customer has received, has read, and understands that:~~

~~(i) The customer need not purchase insurance from the lending institution, its subsidiary, an affiliate, or any particular unaffiliated third party; and~~

~~(ii) The insurance is available through other licensed brokers or agents; and~~

(B) When an application by a customer for a loan or other extension of credit from a depository institution or an affiliate of a depository institution is pending, and insurance is offered or sold to the customer or is required in connection with the loan or extension of credit by the depository institution or affiliate of a depository institution, a written disclosure shall be provided to the customer indicating that the customer's choice of insurer or producer shall not affect the credit decision or credit terms in any way, except that the depository institution or an affiliate of a depository institution may impose reasonable requirements concerning the credit worthiness of the insurer and the scope of coverage chosen. A rejection of a policy furnished by the customer shall not be deemed unreasonable if it is based on reasonable standards, uniformly applied, relating to the extent of coverage required and the financial soundness and the services of an insurer. Such standards shall not discriminate against any particular type of insurer, nor shall such standards call for rejection of a policy because it contains coverage in addition to that required in the credit transaction; and

(C) The person, depository institution, or affiliate of the depository institution shall obtain written acknowledgement of the receipt of the disclosure required by this subsection from the customer at the time the customer receives the disclosure or at the time of the initial purchase of the insurance policy. If the solicitation is conducted by telephone, the person, depository institution or affiliate of the depository institution shall obtain an oral acknowledgement of receipt of the disclosure, maintain sufficient documentation to show that the acknowledgment was given by the customer, and make reasonable efforts to obtain a written acknowledgment from the customer. If a customer affirmatively consents to receiving the disclosures electronically and if the disclosures are provided in a format that the customer may retain or obtain later, the person, depository institution, or affiliate of the depository institution may provide the disclosure and obtain acknowledgement of the receipt of the disclosure from the customer using electronic media.

(2) Physical location of insurance activities. Insurance sales activities on lending depository institution or affiliate of a depository institution premises shall be

conducted in a manner so as to minimize customer confusion by:

(A) Conducting the activities to the extent practicable in a location separate and distinct from the area where retail deposit, ~~loan making, or extension of credit activities~~ occurs; and

(B) ~~Identifying~~ Where practicable, identifying the area where insurance activities are conducted with appropriate signage as to be easily distinguishable by the public as separate and distinct from deposit and lending activities of the lending depository institution or affiliate of a depository institution.

23-66-607. Customer privacy.

~~(a)(1) No person, or depository institution, or affiliate of a depository institution, who lends money or extends credit may release, without the express consent of the customer, borrower, mortgagor or purchaser: shall utilize nonpublic customer information in connection with the solicitation or sale of insurance products to individuals unless it is clearly disclosed to the individual that the nonpublic customer information may be so utilized.~~

(1) Insurance information of a customer relative to a policy which is required by the credit transaction, for the purpose of soliciting, selling or replacing such insurance. This provision does not apply in case of a transfer of insurance information to an unaffiliated insurer in connection with transferring insurance in force on an existing customer of the depository institution, or an affiliate thereof, or in connection with a merger with or acquisition of an unaffiliated insurer, or the release of information as otherwise authorized by state or federal law. Further, this provision does not apply to use or disclosure of insurance information to an officer, director, employee, agent, or affiliate of a depository institution; or

~~(2) Provided, however, when the disclosure is made to an individual, the individual must also be instructed how and given the opportunity to indicate that he or she does not want the nonpublic customer information disclosed or utilized for the marketing of insurance.~~

~~(b)(1) For purposes of this subsection, "nonpublic customer information" means information regarding an individual that has been derived from the record of a lending institution relating to its operation other than insurance activities.~~

~~(2) Provided, however, that "nonpublic customer information" shall not include information regarding an individual that may be obtained by lending institutions or shared with their affiliates or unaffiliated third parties subject to the provisions of the Fair Credit Reporting Act. Health information obtained from the insurance records of a customer for any purpose other than for its activities as a licensed producer.~~

23-66-608. Authorization to promulgate regulations.

The ~~Insurance Commissioner~~ commissioner may promulgate regulations to effectuate the purposes of ~~§ 23-66-601 et seq~~ this subchapter.

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code 23-101-112(a) regarding commission allowed to appropriately licensed depository institution, or an affiliate of a depository institution, is amended to read as follows:

(a)(1) The entire amount of the premium due from a creditor shall be remitted to the insurer or its producer in accordance with the insurer's requirements.

SECTION 3. Regulation of Manufactured Homes.

(a) No political subdivision of this state shall establish or continue in effect any ordinance or regulation which is more stringent than federal and state laws and regulations pertaining to the standards for manufactured home construction, safety and installation.

(b) No political subdivision of this state shall establish or continue in effect any ordinance or regulation that totally prohibits the placement of manufactured homes in residential districts or zones established primarily for single-family site built homes.

(c) No political subdivision shall impose conditions or restrictions on the placement of manufactured homes unless those conditions or restrictions are generally applicable to other forms of single-family housing permitted within the political subdivision.

(d) The provisions of this section shall apply to manufactured homes which are previously uninhabited or constructed within five (5) years of the date of application for placement.

SECTION 4. Regulation of Mobile Homes.
