“SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 5, Chapter 27, Subchapter 2 is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:

5-27-230. Exposure of child to a chemical substance or methamphetamine.

(a) For purposes of this section:

(1)(A) “Chemical substance” means a substance intended to be used as a precursor in the manufacture of methamphetamine, or any other chemical intended to be used in the manufacture of methamphetamine.

(B) Intent may be demonstrated by the substance’s use, quantity, manner of storage, or proximity to other precursors or equipment used to manufacture methamphetamine;

(2) “Child” means any person under the age of eighteen (18) years;
and

(3) “Methamphetamine” has the same meaning as provided in the Uniform Controlled Substances Act, § 5-64-101 et seq.

(b)(1) Any adult who, with the intent to manufacture methamphetamine, knowingly or intentionally causes or permits a child to be exposed to, ingest, inhale, or have any contact with a chemical substance or methamphetamine is guilty of a Class C felony.

(2) Any adult who violates subsection (b)(1) of this section, and a child suffers bodily injury, substantial bodily injury, or serious bodily injury because of the violation, is guilty of a Class B felony.

(B) If the member had acquired fifteen (15) years' actual service, but had not attained age sixty-five (65), the spouse annuity shall commence at the later of either age fifty (50) or his or her age at his or her death and shall be payable until the earlier of his or her remarriage or death. Otherwise, the spouse annuity shall commence at the later of either age sixty-two (62) or his or her age at his or her death and shall be payable until the earlier of either his or her remarriage or death.

(C)(i) If the member is killed while in the official line of duty, the board of trustees may waive the age requirements for a surviving spouse who is otherwise eligible for a survivors' annuity, but whose benefit has been deferred because the member's spouse did not meet the age requirement in effect before July 1, 2003.

(ii) If waived, the members' surviving spouse is eligible to commence the spouse annuity upon the effective date of this subdivision (c)(2)(C) of this section.

SECTION 2. The provisions of this act shall apply retroactively to allow a surviving spouse who did not qualify for a benefit because the member's spouse did not meet the age requirements of Arkansas Code § 24-6-411(c)(2) to begin a benefit if the member was killed while in performance of his or her official duties. The spouse benefit annuity shall be retroactive to June 1, 2002."

SECTION 2. Any person who is delinquent on the payment for water provided by a water system may be held liable, at the court's discretion, for attorney's fees and costs incurred in the collection of the delinquency."

Of the funds distributed based on literacy rate, no administrative unit shall receive funds for any county served above that county's literacy rate cap except for base~~

~~funds received by efficient and effective units. Local administrative costs shall not exceed 10% of the total allocation.
