AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO HOUSE BILL NO. 1679

Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 1679** as originally introduced:

Insert an additional section immediately following Section 1 to read as follows:

"SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the current law enforcement training standards do not require adequate training concerning sexual assault; that this bill requires such additional training; and that this bill is immediately necessary in order to provide the necessary training to our law enforcement officers as soon as possible. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

- (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
- (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or
- (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto."
