(d) Subsection (b) and (c) of this section shall not apply to:

(1) Currently binding contractual obligations;

(2) Enforceable court-ordered mandates;

(3) Contracts entered into in connection with a bond issuance or a project financed with an issuance of bonds previously approved by the State Board of Education as required by law, or

(4) Regularly scheduled maintenance projects."
