Page 4, delete line 19 and substitute the following:

“over by the Department of Education.

(g)(1) On January 1, 2004, the State Board of Education shall make a determination of the districts not in compliance with subsection (a).

(2) Districts not meeting the standards shall be given until May 1, 2004, to adopt a plan approved by the Department of Education and the State Board of Education to consolidate or annex with a district that meets the standards.

(3) Upon approval the plan shall be implemented in June or after school has been dismissed for the year.

(h) If no plan is presented to the department, the department shall recommend to the State Board of Education in the May meeting, a plan for the districts that do not meet the standards that may include consolidation, annexation, and control of the district by the department, the following shall apply:

(1) Between January 1 2004 and May 1, 2004, the State Board of Education shall develop a plan for the reorganization of all public school districts not in compliance with § 6-13-1602(a)(1)- (a)(9);

(2) Between May 1, 2004 and June 15, 2004, the State Board of Education shall hold no less than four (4) public hearings regarding its proposed reorganization plan to address citizen concerns, comments, and suggestions regarding the plan;

(3) The State Board of Education shall finalize the reorganization plan no later than June 20, 2004, and shall effectuate the reorganization on July 1, 2004, pursuant to the plan developed under subsection (b) of this section; and

(4) The Department of Education and the State Board of Education may take actions prior to July 1, 2004 as necessary for an orderly and efficient transition of personnel, property, and boards of directors on July 1, 2004.”

**AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO HOUSE BILL NO. 1773**

Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 1773** as originally introduced:  
Page 1, line 11, delete "MEDICINE" and substitute "MEDICINE AND TO EXTEND THE TIME TO BEGIN LOAN REPAYMENTS"  
AND  
Page 1, line 16, delete "MEDICINE" and substitute "MEDICINE AND TO EXTEND THE TIME TO BEGIN LOAN REPAYMENTS"  
AND  
Page 1, line 32, add new sections to read as follows:

"SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-81-708(a)(1)(A), concerning the loan contracts for the Rural Medical Practice Loan program, is amended to read as follows;

(1)(A) The recipient of a rural medical practice loan or loans shall bindingly contract that, upon completion of his or her medical internship of one (1) year undertaken immediately following the earning of the degree of doctor of medicine, or upon completion of ~~three (3)~~ four (4) additional years of medical training beyond the internship, if the training has been approved in advance by the board and includes practice experience in a rural community, he or she shall practice medicine full-time in a rural community.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-81-708(d)(4), concerning the loan contracts for the Rural Medical Practice Loan program, is amended to read as follows:

(4)(A) In the event that any rural medical practice loan recipient under this subchapter does not engage in the practice of medicine in accordance with the terms of this section and of his or her loan contract in order to have the loan contract recognized as a scholarship, the recipient shall remain obligated to repay the loan or loans received, together with interest thereon at the maximum rate allowed by Arkansas law or the federal discount rate plus five percent (5%) per annum, whichever is the lesser, the interest to accrue from the date each payment of funds was received by the recipient.

(B) No interest shall accrue, nor obligation to repay the principal sums accrued, during any one (1) period of time that the recipient involuntarily serves on active duty in the United States armed forces.

(C) Repayment of principal, with interest, shall be due and payable in full at the earliest to occur of the following events:

(i) Failure to remain enrolled in a medically underserved and rural practice curriculum;

(ii) Failure to remain in enrollment status continuously to completion of the degree of doctor of medicine for any reason other than temporary personal illness;

(iii) Failure to complete internship;

(iv)(a) Failure to practice medicine on a regularly sustained basis while residing in a rural community in Arkansas, as defined in § 6-81-701.

(b) Provided, however, that the board may waive the residency requirement on a case-by-case basis; and

(v) Failure to establish such practice within six (6) months following either internship or ~~three (3)~~ four (4) additional years of medical education that include practice experience in a rural community beyond his or her internship where approved by the board.

(D) In the event of the death of the recipient, all loans unpaid shall be due and payable.

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-81-716(c)(3), concerning the obligations and conditions of the loans for the Community Match Loan and Scholarship Program, is amended to read as follows;

(3)(A) In the event that any loan recipient from the Community Match Loan and Scholarship Program under this section does not engage in the practice of primary care medicine in accordance with the terms of this section and of his or her loan contract in order to have the loan contract recognized as a scholarship, the recipient shall be obligated to repay the loan or loans received, together with interest

thereon at the maximum rate allowed by Arkansas law or the federal discount rate plus five percent (5%) per annum, whichever is the lesser, the interest to accrue from the date each payment of funds was received by the recipient.

(B) Repayment of principal, with interest and liquidated damages, under subdivision (c)(3)(A) of this section, shall be due and payable in full at the earliest to occur of the following events:

(i) Failure to complete internship;

(ii) Failure to practice primary care medicine on a regularly sustained basis while residing in the contracting qualified rural community in Arkansas. Provided, however, that the board, in conjunction with the qualified rural community, may waive the residency requirement on a case-by-case basis; and

(iii) Failure to establish a primary care practice within six (6) months, unless otherwise deferred by approval of the board, following either internship or ~~three (3)~~ four (4) additional years of medical education continuously beyond his or her internship where approved by the board.

(C) In addition, because of the hardship placed upon the rural community as a result of a breach of contract by the loan recipient and the difficulty in ascertaining or determining damages arising out of a breach of contract by the loan recipient, the loan contract shall provide for liquidated damages in an amount equal to fifty percent (50%) of the principal of the loan, which shall not preclude the board and the qualified rural community from asserting other legal rights as a result of the breach of contract.”

“SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 5-26-306 is amended to read as follows:

5-26-306. Aggravated assault on a family or household member.

(a) A person commits aggravated assault on a family or household member if, under circumstances manifesting extreme indifference to the value of human life, he purposely engages in conduct that creates a substantial danger of death or serious physical injury to a family or household member.

(b)(1) Aggravated assault on a family or household member is a Class D felony.

(2) Aggravated assault on a family or household member is a Class C felony if within the past five (5) years, the person:

(A) Plead guilty or nolo contendere to, or has been found guilty of:

(i) Domestic battering in the first degree;

(ii) Domestic battering in the second degree;

(iii) Domestic battering in the third degree;

(iv) Aggravated assault on a family or household member; or

(v) First degree assault on a family or household member; or

(B) Violated an equivalent penal law of another state or foreign jurisdiction.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 5-26-307 is amended to read as follows:

5-26-307. First degree assault on family or household member.

(a) A person commits first degree assault on a family or household member if he recklessly engages in conduct which creates a substantial risk of death or serious physical injury to a family or household member.

(b)(1) First degree assault on a family or household member is a Class A misdemeanor.

(2) First degree assault on a family or household member is a Class D felony if within the past five (5) years, the person:

(A) Plead guilty or nolo contendere to, or has been found guilty of:

(i) Domestic battering in the first degree;  
(ii) Domestic battering in the second degree;  
(iii) Domestic battering in the third degree;  
(iv) Aggravated assault on a family or household member; or  
(v) First degree assault on a family or household member; or  
(B) Violated an equivalent penal law of another state or foreign jurisdiction.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 5-26-308 is amended to read as follows:

5-26-308. Second degree assault on family or household member.

(a) A person commits second degree assault on a family or household member if he recklessly engages in conduct which creates a substantial risk of physical injury to a family or household member.

(b)(1) Second degree assault on a family or household member is a Class B misdemeanor.

(2) Second degree assault on a family or household member is a Class A misdemeanor if within the past five (5) years, the person:

(A) Plead guilty or nolo contendere to, or has been found guilty of:

(i) Domestic battering in the first degree;  
(ii) Domestic battering in the second degree;  
(iii) Domestic battering in the third degree;  
(iv) Aggravated assault on a family or household member;  
(v) First degree assault on a family or household member;  
(vi) Second degree assault on a family or household member; or  
(vii) Third degree assault on a family or household member; or  
(B) Violated an equivalent penal law of another state or foreign jurisdiction.

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 5-26-309 is amended to read as follows:

5-26-309. Third degree assault on a family or household member.

(a) A person commits third degree assault on a family or household member if he purposely creates apprehension of imminent physical injury to a family or household member.

(b)(1) Third degree assault on a family or household member is a Class C misdemeanor.

(2) Third degree assault on a family or household member is a Class B misdemeanor if within the past five (5) years, the person:

(A) Plead guilty or nolo contendere to, or has been found guilty

of:

(i) Domestic battering in the first degree;

(ii) Domestic battering in the second degree;

(iii) Domestic battering in the third degree;

(iv) Aggravated assault on a family or household

member;

(v) First degree assault on a family or household

member;

(vi) Second degree assault on a family or household

member; or

(vii) Third degree assault on a family or household

member; or

(B) Violated an equivalent penal law of another state or foreign

jurisdiction.”
