Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 2181** as originally introduced:

Delete everything after the enacting clause and substitute:

“SECTION 1. Intent.

(a) Ethnic minorities appear to be over represented in the population of persons who are involved in the criminal justice system, charged as defendants, convicted, and incarcerated throughout the United States criminal justice systems.

(b) It is the responsibility of criminal justice agencies and the courts in the State of Arkansas to ensure that all actions taken are based upon reasons other than the race of the defendant.

(c) In order to allow the General Assembly to conduct a thorough review of the Arkansas criminal justice process, information on actions taken by criminal justice agencies and the courts must be reported in a timely, uniform, and consistent manner.

SECTION 2. (a) Beginning July 31, 2003, and on July 31st of each year thereafter, the Arkansas Crime Information Center shall submit an annual report to the Arkansas Legislative Council and the Commission on Disparity in Sentencing showing the number of persons arrested for each criminal offense classification, comparing the state and each individual reporting agency.

(b) The report shall include a breakdown by race of all persons arrested in each criminal offense classification.

SECTION 3. (a) Beginning July 31, 2003, and on July 31st of each year thereafter, the Administrative Office of the Courts shall submit an annual report to the Arkansas Legislative Council and the Commission on Disparity in Sentencing showing the number of persons charged in circuit court for each criminal offense classification, comparing the state and each judicial district.

(b) The report shall include a breakdown by race of all persons charged in each criminal offense classification.

(c) The report shall include the same data for those cases in which a final disposition has been entered by the court.

SECTION 4. (a)(1) Beginning July 31, 2003, and on July 31st of each year thereafter, the Department of Community Correction shall submit an annual report to the Arkansas Legislative Council and the Commission on Disparity in Sentencing showing the number of persons sentenced or transferred to the department during the fiscal year for each criminal offense classification.

(2) Persons sentenced or transferred for multiple offenses shall be noted in the report.

(b) The report shall include a breakdown by race of all persons sentenced in each criminal offense classification.

(c) The Department of Community Correction shall cooperate with, and upon request, make presentations and provide various reports, to the extent the agency's budget will allow, to the Arkansas Legislative Council and the Commission on Disparity in Sentencing concerning department policy and criteria on discretionary offender programs and services.

SECTION 5. (a)(1) Beginning July 31, 2003, and on July 31st of each year thereafter, the Department of Correction shall submit an annual report to the Arkansas Legislative Council and the Commission on Disparity in Sentencing showing the number of persons sentenced to the department during the fiscal year for each criminal offense classification.

(2) Persons sentenced for multiple offenses shall be noted in the report.

(b) The report shall include a breakdown by race of all persons sentenced in each criminal offense classification.

(c) The Department of Correction shall cooperate with, and on request, make presentations and provide various reports, to the extent the agency's budget will allow, to the Arkansas Legislative Council and the Commission on Disparity in Sentencing concerning department policy and criteria on discretionary offender programs and services.

SECTION 6. (a)(1) Beginning July 31, 2003, and on July 31st of each year thereafter, the Post Prison Transfer Board shall submit an annual report to the Arkansas Legislative Council and the Commission on Disparity in Sentencing showing the number of persons who make application for parole, and those who are granted or denied parole during the fiscal year for each criminal offense classification.

(2) The report shall include a breakdown by race of all persons sentenced in each criminal offense classification.

(b) The Post Prison Transfer Board shall cooperate with, and on request, make presentations and provide various reports, to the extent the agency's budget will allow, to the Arkansas Legislative Council and the Commission on Disparity in Sentencing concerning board policy and criteria on discretionary offender programs and services.

SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the "Task Force to Study the

Disparity in Sentencing for Persons Convicted of Non-violent Crimes" has found that it appears that some Arkansas citizens do not receive equitable sentences under the law; that it is necessary to compile statistical sentencing information in order to determine if disparities exist; and that this act is immediately necessary to allow the compiling of the needed statistical information in the first quarter of 2003. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

- (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
- (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or
- (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.

“SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 26-51-205 is amended to read as follows:

26-51-205. Corporations - Work Force 2000 Development Fund.

(a) ~~Every~~ Except as provided in subdivision (a)(1) of this section, every corporation organized under the laws of this state shall pay annually an income tax with respect to carrying on or doing business on the entire net income of the corporation, as now defined by the laws of the State of Arkansas, received by such corporation during the income year, on the following basis:

- (1) On the first \$3,000 of net income or any part thereof 1 %
- On the second \$3,000 net income or any part thereof 2 %
- On the next \$5,000 of net income or any part thereof 3 %
- On the next \$14,000 of net income or any part thereof 5 %
- On the next \$75,000 of net income or any part thereof,
but not exceeding \$100,000 6 %

(2) ~~On net income exceeding \$100,000, a flat rate of six and one-half (6 1/2 %) percent shall be applied to the entire net income.~~ If the total net income of a corporation exceeds one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), then instead of the tax imposed by § 26-51-205(a)(1), there is imposed a tax of six and one-half percent (6.5%) on the entire net income of the corporation.

(b) ~~Every~~ Except as provided in subdivision (a)(2) of this section, every foreign corporation doing business within the jurisdiction of this state shall pay annually an income tax on the proportion of its entire net income as now determined by the income tax laws of Arkansas, on the following basis:

(1) On the first \$3,000 of net income or any part thereof	1 %
On the second \$3,000 of net income or any part thereof	2 %
On the next \$5,000 of net income or any part thereof	3 %
On the next \$14,000 of net income or any part thereof	5 %
On the next \$75,000 of net income or any part thereof, but not exceeding \$100,000	6 %

(2) ~~On net income exceeding \$100,000, a flat rate of six and one half percent (6 1/2%) shall be applied to the entire net income. If the total net income of a corporation exceeds one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), then instead of the tax imposed by § 26-51-205(b)(1), there is imposed a tax of six and one-half percent (6.5%) on the entire net income of the corporation.~~

(c)(1) There is hereby created on the books of the Treasurer of State, the Auditor of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a fund to be known as the "Work Force 2000 Development Fund." This fund shall consist of those special revenues as specified in § 26-51-205(c)(2) and all other revenues as may be authorized by law.

(2)(A) The Revenue Services Division of the Department of Finance and Administration shall deposit the funds collected under the provisions of this section for corporate income tax into the State Treasury, there to be credited to the Revenue Holding Fund Account of the State Apportionment Fund.

~~(B)(i) For each of the state's fiscal years, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall determine as an annual allocation available under the provisions of this section an amount based on the total net revenues, as enumerated in § 26-51-205(a) and (b), which were collected in the immediate past year, multiplied by a factor of six hundred seventy eight ten thousandths (.0678). On the last day of each month of the respective fiscal year, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall certify to the Treasurer of State an amount based on one twelfth (1/12) of the annual allocation provided in this section for transfer as specified in § 26-51-205(c)(2)(B)(ii).~~

(ii) (B)(i) ~~The~~ On the last day of each month, the Treasurer of State shall then transfer ~~the amount so certified~~ one million dollars (\$1,000,000) to the Special Revenue Fund Account as part of the gross special revenues.

(iii)(ii) After the deductions as set out in § 19-5-203 have been made, the remaining amount shall be credited to the "Work Force 2000 Development Fund."

(iv)(iii) The remaining corporate income tax collections remaining in the Revenue Holding Fund Account shall be credited to the General Revenue Fund Account of the State Apportionment Fund, there to be distributed with the other gross general revenue collections for that month in accordance with the provisions of the Revenue Stabilization Law § 19-5-201 et seq.

(d)(1) All proceeds ~~derived from the additional tax levied by this section transferred to the Work Force 2000 Development Fund~~ shall be used exclusively for the authorized educational activities of:

(A) Any postsecondary vocational-technical school, technical institute, comprehensive lifelong learning center, technical college, community college; or

(B) Any postsecondary vocational-technical school, technical institute, comprehensive lifelong learning center, or technical college that merges with a two-year branch of a four-year institution, a four-year institution, a technical college, or a community college.

(2) The distribution of the proceeds shall be supervised by the State Board of Workforce Education and Career Opportunities for the postsecondary vocational-technical schools, technical institutes, and comprehensive lifelong learning centers. The distribution of the proceeds for technical colleges, community colleges, or any postsecondary vocational-technical school, technical institute, comprehensive lifelong learning center, or technical college that merges with a two-year branch of a four-year institution, a four-year institution, a technical college, or a community college shall continue at the same proportion as those distributions made in fiscal year 1996-97, excluding one-time capital disbursements and professional development disbursements made in fiscal year 1996-97 equal to the amount of funds distributed in fiscal year 1998-99. Any increase in the amount of funds in the Work Force 2000 Development Fund above the amount distributed in fiscal year 1998-99 shall be supervised by the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board and shall be distributed after a review of needs including, but not limited to, equity considerations and workforce development and after consultation with the presidents and chancellors of the technical and former technical colleges.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective for tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2003."

AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO HOUSE BILL NO. 2634

Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 2634** as originally introduced:

Delete everything after the enacting clause and substitute the following:

“SECTION 1. For purposes of this act:

(1) “Director” means the Director of the Department of Finance and Administration;

(2)(A) “Gross receipts” means all of the revenues of a qualified business that are attributable to proceeds from all sales of the qualified business in this state during the tax period of the utilities or services designated in this section, without any deductions for the cost of any services or property sold, losses, or any expenses whatsoever.

(B) For purposes of calculating the tax imposed by this act, the “gross receipts” of sellers of propane or butane means the proceeds from all sales in the state of propane or butane in containers exceeding five (5) gallons;

(3) “Qualified business” means every corporation, joint stock company, association, limited or general partnership, joint venture, limited liability company, cooperative, or other entity or individual formed for, or engaged in the business of:

(A) Selling electricity in the state;

(B) Selling natural gas in the state;

(C) Selling cable or satellite television services in the state;

(D) Selling telecommunications services in the state; or

(E) Selling propane or butane in the state; and

(4) “Telecommunications” services means those services that are taxable pursuant to Arkansas Code § 26-52-301.

SECTION 2. (a)(1) Beginning July 1, 2003, there is levied and there shall be collected from every qualified business in this state a privilege tax for the privilege of doing business in the state that constitutes part of the operating overhead of the business.

(2) The tax shall be computed by multiplying the gross receipts of the qualified business for the tax period by four percent (4%).

(b) The tax levied in this section shall be in addition to all other taxes currently imposed, except as stated in subsection (c) of this section.

(c)(1) Any qualified business subject to the tax levied in this act shall be exempt from the corporation income tax levied by Arkansas Code § 26-51-205 on

and after July 1, 2003, with respect to the gross receipts taxed by this act.

(2) Corporations that derive taxable Arkansas income from sources other than gross receipts for its sales of the utilities or services listed in section 1 shall continue to report and remit corporation income tax on that taxable income.

(3) No credits, losses, or any other amount that would otherwise be allowable to reduce the corporation income tax liability of a qualified business shall be allowed to reduce the taxable gross receipts of a qualified business.

SECTION 3. (a) The tax levied in this act shall be due and payable on the twentieth day of each month for the previous calendar month.

(b)(1) Each taxpayer subject to the tax imposed by this act shall file a return under oath upon forms prescribed and furnished by the director stating the amount of its gross receipts for the previous calendar month.

(2) The return shall show such further information as the Director of the Department of Finance and Administration may require to enable him or her to correctly compute and collect the tax levied.

SECTION 4. (a)(1) Any qualified business whose corporation income tax liability ends on June 30, 2003, as a result of this act, but whose fiscal year ends after June 30, 2003, shall file a short year return.

(2) The final short year corporation income tax return shall be filed no later than October 15, 2003.

(b) The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration may allow further time for filing returns and assess interest under the provisions for extension in Arkansas Code § 26-18-505.

SECTION 5. The administration of this act is vested in and shall be exercised by the Director of the Department of Finance and Administration.

SECTION 6. The Arkansas Tax Procedure Act, § 26-18-101 et seq., is applicable to this act.

SECTION 7. (a) The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration shall promulgate rules and regulations and prescribe forms for the proper enforcement of this act.

(b) The rules, regulations, and forms shall be dated and issued under a systematic method of numbering, and copies shall be made available to any person requesting them.

SECTION 8. The gross receipts of qualified businesses providing telecommunications services shall be apportioned to this state where the customer's primary place of use, as determined in accordance with the Mobile Telecommunications Sourcing Act, 4 U.S.C. § 116 – 126, is within this state.

SECTION 9. The revenues derived from the additional tax imposed by this

act shall be credited to the General Revenue Fund Account of the State Apportionment Fund, there to be distributed with the other gross general revenue collections for that month in accordance with the Revenue Stabilization Law.

SECTION 10. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2003.

(iv) (iii) The remaining corporate income tax collections remaining in the Revenue Holding Fund Account shall be credited to the General Revenue Fund Account of the State Apportionment Fund, there to be distributed with the other gross general revenue collections for that month in accordance with the provisions of Revenue Stabilization Law § 19-5-201 et seq.

(d)(1) All proceeds ~~derived from the additional tax levied by this section~~ transferred to the Work Force 2000 Development Fund shall be used exclusively for the authorized educational activities of:

(A) Any postsecondary vocational-technical school, technical institute, comprehensive lifelong learning center, technical college, community college; or

(B) Any postsecondary vocational-technical school, technical institute, comprehensive lifelong learning center, or technical college that merges with a two-year branch of a four-year institution, a four-year institution, a technical college, or a community college.

The distribution of the proceeds for technical colleges, community colleges, or any postsecondary vocational-technical school, technical institute, comprehensive lifelong learning center, or technical college that merges with a two-year branch of a four-year institution, a four-year institution, a technical college, or a community college shall continue at the same proportion as those distributions made in fiscal year 1996-97, excluding one-time capital disbursements and professional development disbursements made in fiscal year 1996-97 equal to the amount of funds distributed in fiscal year 1998-99. Any increase in the amount of funds in the Work Force 2000 Development Fund above the amount distributed in fiscal year 1998-99 shall be supervised by the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board and shall be distributed after a review of needs including, but not limited to, equity considerations and workforce development and after consultation with the presidents and chancellors of the technical and former technical colleges.

(c)(1)(A) If the defendant is apprehended and brought before the circuit court within seventy-five (75) days of the date notification is sent under subdivision (b)(2)(A) of this section, then no judgment of forfeiture may be entered against the surety.

(B) The surety shall be liable for the cost of returning the defendant to the circuit court in an amount not to exceed the face amount of the bond.

(2)(a) If the defendant is apprehended and brought before the circuit court after the seventy-five (75) day period under subsection (c)(1) of this section, the circuit court may exonerate the amount of the surety's liability under the bail bond as the circuit court determines in its discretion, and, if the surety does not object, enter judgment accordingly against the surety.

(b) In determining the extent of liability of the surety on the

bond, the circuit court may take into consideration the actions taken and the expenses incurred by the surety to locate the defendant, the expenses incurred by law enforcement officers to locate and return the defendant, and any other factors the circuit court finds relevant.

(d)(1) If the surety does not consent to the entry of judgment in the amount determined under subsection (c) of this section, or if the defendant has not surrendered or been brought into custody, then at the time of the show cause hearing, unless continued to a subsequent time, the circuit court shall determine the surety's liability and enter judgment on the forfeited bond.

(2) The circuit court may exercise its discretion in determining the amount of the judgment and may consider the factors listed in subsection (c) of this section.

(e)(1) No pleading on the part of the state shall be required in order to enforce a bond under this section.

(2) The summons required under subsection (b) of this section shall be made returnable and shall be executed as in civil actions, and the action shall be docketed and shall proceed as an ordinary civil action.

(3) The summons may be directed to and served on an agent of the surety, and the surety's appearance pursuant to the summons shall be in person and not by filing an answer or other pleading.

(f) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, a circuit court may suspend a bail bond company's or agent's ability to issue bail bonds in its court if the bail bond company or agent fails to comply with an order of the circuit court, or fails to pay forfeited bonds in accordance with a circuit court's order.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 16-84-201 is amended to read as follows:

16-84-201. Action on bond in district courts.

(a)(1)(A) If the defendant fails to appear for trial or judgment, or at any other time when his presence in district court may be lawfully required, or to surrender himself in execution of the judgment, the district court may direct the fact to be entered on the minutes, and shall promptly issue an order requiring the surety to appear, on a date set by the district court not more than one hundred twenty (120) days after the issuance of the order, to show cause why the sum specified in the bail bond or the money deposited in lieu of bail should not be forfeited.

(B) The one hundred twenty-day period in which the defendant must be surrendered or apprehended pursuant to subdivision (c)(2) of this section begins to run from the date notice is sent by certified mail to the surety company at the address shown on the bond, whether or not it is received by the surety.

(2) The order shall also require the officer who was responsible for

taking of bail to appear, unless:

- (A) The surety is a bail bondsman; or
- (B) The officer accepted cash in the amount of bail.

(b) The appropriate law enforcement agencies shall make every reasonable effort to apprehend the defendant.

(c)(1) If the defendant is surrendered or arrested, or good cause is shown for his failure to appear before judgment is entered against the surety, the district court shall exonerate a reasonable amount of the surety's liability under the bail bond.

(2) However, if the surety causes the apprehension of the defendant or the defendant is apprehended within one hundred twenty (120) days from the date of receipt of written notification to the surety of the defendant's failure to appear, no judgment or forfeiture of bond may be entered against the surety, except as provided in subsection (e) of this section.

(d) If, after one hundred twenty (120) days, the defendant has not surrendered or been arrested, prior to judgment against the surety, the bail bond or money deposited in lieu of bail may be forfeited.

(e) If, before judgment is entered against the surety, the defendant is located in another state, and the location is known, the appropriate law enforcement officers shall cause the arrest of the defendant and the surety shall be liable for the cost of returning the defendant to the district court in an amount not to exceed the face value of the bail bond.

(f) In determining the extent of liability of the surety on a bond forfeiture, the district court may take into consideration the expenses incurred by the surety in attempting to locate the defendant and may allow the surety credit for the expenses incurred.
