WHEREAS, Ms. Woodridge credits Eleanor Roosevelt, with whom she had corresponded, as being the prime mover in persuading the Eighty-First Congress to pass a Joint Resolution in 1953 designating the first Tuesday in March as National Teachers' Day; and

WHEREAS, in 1980, Ms. Woodridge witnessed the signing into law, by then Governor Bill Clinton, the first Tuesday in March as Arkansas Teachers' Day; and

WHEREAS, this day continued to be observed until 1985 when the National Education Association and the National PTA established Teacher Appreciation Week as the first full week in May, and later voted to make the Tuesday of that week National Teacher Day; and

WHEREAS, in 1985, Ms. Woodridge was honored at the National Education Association’s Human and Civil Rights Banquet in Washington, D.C., with a special award for her “tireless efforts to promote a positive image of the teaching profession through national, state, and local teacher’s day celebration”,

“honor and recognize Ms. Mattye Maye Whyte Woodridge’s diligence in working for the creation of a national day to celebrate teachers, the creation of a time for honoring teachers, and the recognition of the lasting contribution that teachers make to our lives.”

“SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 23, Chapter 79, Subchapter 1 is amended to add a new section to read as follows:

23-79-151. Notice Requirements for professional liability, including medical malpractice and workers compensation insurance prior to expiration of the policy.

(a)(1) When an insurer writing workers’ compensation insurance, employers’ liability insurance, or professional liability insurance, including, but not limited to, medical malpractice insurance, revises its rates or rules and the revision results in a premium increase equal to or greater than twenty-five percent (25%) on any renewal policy issued for a term of twelve (12) months or less, the insurer shall mail or deliver to the insured’s agent not less than sixty (60) days prior to the effective date of renewal, and to the insured not less than thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of renewal, notice specifically stating the insurer’s intention to increase the premium by

an amount equal to or greater than twenty-five percent (25%).

(2) If the notice is not given as stated in subdivision (a)(1) of this section, the insurer is required to extend the existing policy sixty (60) days from the date such notice is mailed or delivered. The premium for the policy as extended in such circumstances shall be no more than the pro rata premium of the existing policy.

(b) Except in the case of nonpayment of premium, an insurer shall renew a policy, unless a written notice of nonrenewal is mailed at least sixty (60) days prior to the expiration date of the policy or, for a policy for a term longer than one (1) year and not having a fixed expiration date, sixty (60) days prior to the anniversary date.”

(B) The monthly benefit that is credited to the member’s plan account is ninety percent (90%) of the amount credited during the second five (5) years of participation;

(C) The continued employment shall last until age sixty-five (65) or five (5) additional years, whichever is earlier;

(D) The interest rate credited to the plan account is the same as in the second five (5) years of participation;

(E) The employer contributions continue and are credited to the pension and relief fund; and

(F) The sponsoring municipality has population of less than one hundred thousand (100,000) according to the latest federal decennial census."

AND

Page 2, delete line 22, and substitute the following:

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 24-11-830(c)(2), concerning the deferred retirement option plan for fire pension and relief funds, is amended to read as follows:

(c)(1) The duration of participation in the plan for active full-paid fire fighters shall not exceed five (5) years.

(2)(A) At Except under subdivision (c)(2)(B) of this section, at the conclusion of a member's participation in the plan, the member shall terminate employment with all participating municipalities as a fire fighter and shall start receiving the member's accrued monthly retirement benefit from the firemen's pension and relief fund.

(B) If a member is at the conclusion of a member's participation in the plan, then the member may continue employment by a municipality participating in the plan under the following conditions:

(i) The continued employment is approved by a majority vote of the governing body of the sponsoring municipality available to all members after receiving approval for an increase in benefits under § 24-11-102;

(ii) The monthly benefit that is credited to the member's plan account is seventy percent (70%) of the monthly benefits that would have been payable had the member elected to cease employment and receive a service retirement benefit;

(iii) The continued employment shall last until age sixty-five (65) or five (5) additional years, whichever is earlier; and

(iv) The interest rate credited to the plan account is the rate under subdivision (e)(2) of this section, except the minimum rate is zero percent (0%)."

(3) If a member is at the conclusion of a member's participation in the plan and the member is employed by a municipality with population of more than one hundred thousand (100,000) according to the latest federal decennial census, then the member may continue employment by a municipality under the following conditions:

(A) The continued employment is approved by a majority vote of the governing body of the sponsoring municipality available to all members after receiving approval for an increase in benefits as defined under § 24-11-102;

(B) The monthly benefit that is credited to the member's plan account will be discontinued and the member will not begin receiving monthly benefits until the member actually ceases employment;

(C) The continued employment would last until age sixty-five (65) or five (5) additional years, whichever is earlier;

(D) The interest rate credited to the plan account would be the same as in the second five (5) years of participation;

(E) The employer contributions continue and are credited to the pension and relief fund; and

(F) The employee contributions of six percent (6%) would be discontinued."

(B) Employer responsibilities, including the right of direction and control of the employees, are shared by the professional employer organization and the recipient.

(2) "Professional employer services" does not include services performed by temporary employees or by persons determined to be independent contractors with respect to the recipient;

(n)(1) "Temporary help services" means services consisting of a person:

(A) Recruiting and hiring its own employees;

(B) Finding other organizations that need the services of those employees;

(C) Assigning those employees to perform work at or for the other organizations to support or supplement the other organizations' workforces, or to provide assistance in special work situations such as, but not limited to, employee

absences, skill shortages, seasonal workloads, or to perform special assignments or projects; and

(D) Customarily attempting to reassign the employees to other organizations when they finish each assignment.

(2) "Temporary help services" shall not be deemed professional employer services;

Page 8, line 11 delete "22-92-408(a)(2)" and substitute "23-92-408(a)(2)"

AND

Page 9, line 16 delete "(d)(3)(ii)(a)" and substitute "(d)(3)(B)(ii)(a)"

"(b)(1) A person or entity that seeks to purchase or acquire control of an entity licensed under this subchapter shall first apply to the commissioner for a certificate of approval for the proposed change of ownership unless the licensed entity to be acquired is a publicly-traded entity, in which event the acquiring entity shall apply to the commissioner for a certificate of approval for the proposed change of ownership at the time the licensed entity publishes public notice of the intended purchase or acquisition of control."

Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 2893** as originally introduced:

Add Representatives Mahony, C. Johnson, White, Bradford, Dangeau, Pickett, Elliott as cosponsors of the bill

AND

Add Senator Gullett as a cosponsor of the bill

AND

Delete everything after the Enacting clause and substitute the following:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 36, is amended to add an additional subchapter to read as follows:

20-36-101. Findings - Purpose.

(a) The General Assembly finds that:

(1) Adequate health care for school age children is an important component in maximizing their educational opportunities and classroom performance so that children may obtain an adequate education; and

(2) There is a need for a study to be conducted to evaluate health care for school age children and to develop a strategic statewide plan regarding the needs and solutions to health problems of school age children.

(b) The purposes of this subchapter are to:

(1) Create a committee to conduct a study to evaluate health care for school age children; and

(2) Develop findings and make recommendations to the Joint Committee on Educational Adequacy, the House and Senate Interim Committees on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor, the General Assembly, and the Governor.

20-36-102. Health Adequacy Advisory Committee.

(a)(1) There is established the Health Adequacy Committee consisting of twenty-one (21) members.

(2) The following members shall be appointed by the Joint Committee on Educational Adequacy by a majority of a quorum:

(A) One (1) member who is a pediatrician;

(B) One (1) member who is a school nurse who is currently working in a public elementary school in this state;

(C) One (1) school nurse who is currently working in a public junior or high school in this state;

(D) One (1) member currently working as a principal in a public

elementary school in this state:

(E) One (1) member currently working as a classroom teacher in a public elementary school in this state;

(F) One (1) member to represent the Arkansas Minority Health Commission; and

(G) One (1) member to represent the community health agencies.

(3) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one (1) member currently working as a principal of a public elementary school.

(4) The Present Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint one (1) member currently working as a teacher in a public elementary school.

(5) The chairperson of the House Interim Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor shall appoint one (1) member who has a child in a public school in this state.

(6) The chairperson of the Senate Interim Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor shall appoint one (1) member who has a child in a public school in this state.

(7) The Director of the Department of Health shall appoint:

(A) One (1) member to represent the Department of Health;

(B) One (1) member to represent the Arkansas Academy of Pediatrics;

(C) One (1) member to represent the Arkansas Academy of Family Practice;

(D) One (1) member to represent the Arkansas School of Public Health of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences;

(E) One (1) member to represent the Arkansas Center for Health Improvement; and

(F) One (1) member to represent the Arkansas Advocates for Children and Families.

(8) The Director of the Department of Education shall appoint:

(A) One (1) member to represent the Department of Education;

(B) One (1) member to represent the Arkansas School Nurses Association;

(C) One (1) member to represent the Arkansas Association of Education Administrators; and

(D) One (1) member to represent the Arkansas Parent Teacher Association.

(b)(1) The Joint Committee on Educational Adequacy shall appoint a

chairperson for the Health Adequacy Advisory Committee.

(2) The chairperson shall call the first meeting within thirty (30) days of the appointments by the Joint Committee on Educational Adequacy.

(3) The committee shall select from their membership a secretary and treasurer.

(c)(1) A majority of the membership appointed by May 31, 2003, shall constitute a quorum.

(2) A majority vote of those members present shall be required for any action of the commission.

(d) Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term in the same manner as is provided in this section for initial appointments.

(e) The committee shall meet at least monthly.

(f) Members of the committee shall serve with pay, but may receive expense reimbursement in accordance with section § 25-16-902, if funds are available for that purpose.

20-36-103. Duties.

(a) The Health Adequacy Committee shall:

(c) If the Joint Committee on Educational Adequacy ceases to exist before the expiration of the Health Adequacy Committee, the committee shall report further

findings to the House and Senate Interim Committees on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor, and the Governor.

20-36-104. Funding.

(a)(1) The committee's funding shall be from grants, donations, and any other funds that may be made available through appropriations by the General Assembly.

(2) Moneys received by the committee shall be used solely for the support of the functions of the committee.
