**AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO HOUSE BILL NO. 2749**

Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 2749** as originally introduced:

Page I, line 9, delete "PROCEDURE" and substitute "PURPOSE"

AND

Page 1, line 13, delete "PROCEDURE" and substitute "PURPOSE"

AND

Delete Section 1. of the bill and substitute new sections to the bill to read as follows:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 3-9-202(10), as amended by Act 369 of 2003, concerning the definition of a private club under on-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages law, is amended to read follows

(10)(A)(i) "Private club" means a nonprofit corporation organized and existing under the laws of this state no part of the net revenues of which shall inure directly or indirectly to the benefit of any of its members or any other individual except for the payment of bona fide expenses of the club's operations and which is conducted for some common recreational, social, patriotic, political, national, benevolent, athletic, community hospitality, professional association, entertainment, or other nonprofit object or purpose other than the consumption of alcoholic beverages.

(ii) The nonprofit corporation shall have been in existence for a period of not less than one (1) year before application for a permit, as prescribed in this subchapter.

(iii) At the time of application for the permit, the nonprofit corporation must have not fewer than one hundred (100) members and at the time of application must own or lease, be the holder of a buy-sell agreement or offer and acceptance, or have an option to lease a building, property, or space therein for the reasonable comfort and accommodation of its members and their families and guests and restrict the use of club facilities to such persons.

(B) For purposes of this subdivision (10), a person shall be required to become a member of the private club in any wet area of the state only upon ordering an alcoholic beverage as defined under subdivision (3) of this section.

(C) Furthermore, where such business entity that holds a private club permit additionally holds a retail beer permit, retail wine for consumption on the premises permit, or cafe or restaurant wine permit, the hours of operation authorized for the private club shall likewise apply to all permits of such business entity;

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 3-9-221(a), concerning the purposes of organizing private clubs for serving alcoholic beverages, is amended to read as follows:

(a)(1) The General Assembly recognizes that many individuals in this state serve mixed drinks containing alcoholic beverages to their friends and guests in the privacy of their homes and, in addition, that many individuals associated together in private nonprofit ~~associations~~ or corporations established for fraternal, patriotic, recreational, political, social, or other mutual purposes as authorized by law, established not for pecuniary gain, have, for their mutual convenience, provided for the preparation and serving to themselves and their guests of mixed drinks prepared from alcoholic beverages owned by the members individually or in common under a so-called "locker", "pool", or "revolving fund" system.

(2) Further, the General Assembly recognizes that many individuals travel to this state to assemble at regional meetings and conventions to associate with other individuals who are members of professional and social organizations; that many of the restaurants and entertainment facilities used for the meetings and conventions promote the hospitality of the host communities where the restaurants, convention, and entertainment facilities are located; that many of the host organizations plan to serve mixed drinks containing alcoholic beverages to their friends and guests at these meetings and while entertaining and dining during these conventions; and many of the host communities have individuals who have associated together in private nonprofit corporations established for recreational, social, community hospitality, professional association, entertainment, or other mutual purposes established, not for pecuniary gain, but for their mutual convenience and to provide for the preparation and serving to themselves and their guests of mixed drinks prepared from alcoholic beverages owned by the members individually or in common under a so-called "locker", "pool", or "revolving fund" system.

Upon motion of Representative Bright, **HOUSE BILL NO. 2449** was placed back on second reading for the purpose of amendment.

**AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO HOUSE BILL NO. 2449**

Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 2449** as originally introduced:

Delete everything following the enacting clause and substitute the following:

"SECTION 1. For purposes of this act:

(1) "Academic year" means the time period specified by each participating institution;

(2) "Board" means the board of directors of the Arkansas Prepaid Affordable College Tuition Trust Fund;

(3) "Fund" means the prepaid tuition payment fund created in section 2 of this act and known as the "Arkansas Prepaid Affordable College Tuition Trust Fund";

(4) "Office" means division of the office of the Treasurer of State that is responsible for administering the prepaid tuition accounts;

(5) "Participating institution" means any Arkansas public four-year institution or two-year community college or technical college that grants a postsecondary education credential, all of which are required to participate, and any Arkansas private college or university that is accredited by a national or regional accrediting agency, recognized by the United States Department of Education, that voluntarily requests to participate and is accepted for participation in the program by the board of directors created in section 3 of this act;

(6) "Prepaid tuition" means the amount of tuition estimated by the board for the standard tuition plans and for each participating institution for the academic year specified in the prepaid tuition contract;

(7) "Prepaid tuition academic year conversion" means the difference between the amount of prepaid tuition required in the original prepaid tuition contract and the amount of prepaid tuition required in an amended prepaid tuition contract as the result of the change in the academic year;

(8) "Prepaid tuition academic year conversion shortfall" means the amount by which the prepaid tuition required in an amended prepaid tuition contract as the result of the change in the academic year exceeds the amount of prepaid tuition required in the original prepaid tuition contract;

(9) "Prepaid tuition account" means the account for a qualified beneficiary as specified in the prepaid tuition contract;

(10) "Prepaid tuition contract" means the contract entered into by the board and the purchaser for the purchase of prepaid tuition for a qualified beneficiary to attend any participating institution as provided in sections 1 through 7 of this act;

(11) "Prepaid tuition conversion" means the difference between the prepaid tuition of a standard plan and the prepaid tuition at a participating institution or the difference between the prepaid tuition at one (1) participating institution and the prepaid tuition at another participating institution;

(12) "Prepaid tuition conversion shortfall" means the amount by which the prepaid tuition at a participating institution exceeds the amount of the prepaid tuition of a standard plan or the amount by which the prepaid tuition at a participating institution exceeds the amount of the prepaid tuition at another participating institution;

(13) "Purchaser" means a person, corporation, association, partnership, or other legal entity who enters into a prepaid tuition contract;

(14) "Qualified beneficiary" means any resident of Arkansas at the time a purchaser enters into a prepaid tuition contract on behalf of the resident or any nonresident who intends to attend a participating institution in Arkansas;

(15) "Standard tuition plan" means the average of the estimated tuition for:

- (A) Arkansas' community colleges;
- (B) Technical colleges;
- (C) Four-year universities; or
- (D) Private colleges or universities;

(16) "Tuition" means the actual charges and all mandatory fees required as a condition of full-time enrollment in an undergraduate program for an academic year for a qualified beneficiary to attend a participating institution. Tuition for a private college or university is calculated on the current year tuition rate, increased by the same percentage that the University of Arkansas tuition is increased on a per year basis;

(17) "Tuition credit" means the discounted net present value of a unit equal to one twenty-fourth (1/24) of the prepaid tuition; and

(18) "Tuition shortfall" means the amount by which tuition exceeds the prepaid tuition adjusted in proportion to the number of tuition credits purchased.

SECTION 2. (a)(1) There is hereby created an instrumentality of the state to be known as the "Arkansas Prepaid Affordable College Tuition Trust Fund".

(2) The fund shall be governed by a board of directors and administered by the Treasurer of State.

(3) The fund shall consist of payments received from prepaid tuition contracts under sections 1 through 7 of this act.

(4) Income earned from the investment of the fund shall remain in the fund and be credited to it.

(5) The fund shall not constitute an investment company.

(b) The purposes of the fund are:

(1) To provide affordable access to participating institutions for the qualified beneficiaries; and

(2) To provide students and their parents economic protection against rising tuition costs;

(c)(1) The office and the facilities of the Treasurer of State shall be used and employed in the administration of the fund including, but not limited to:

- (A) The keeping of records;
- (B) The employment of staff to assist in the administration of the fund;
- (C) The management of accounts and other investments;

(D) The transfer of funds; and

(E) The safekeeping of securities evidencing investments.

(2) The office of the Treasurer of State and the board of the Arkansas Higher Education Assistance Authority, shall work together to jointly market, as appropriate, the Arkansas Prepaid Tuition Plan and the Savings Plan.

(d) Assets of the fund shall constitute public funds of the state and may be invested in any instrument, obligation, security, or property that constitutes legal investments for the investment of public funds in the state that are deemed most appropriate by the board and may be pooled for investment purposes with any other investment of the state that is eligible for asset pooling.

(e) The fund, through the Treasurer of State, may receive and deposit into the fund gifts made by any individual or agency as deemed acceptable by the board.

(f) There is created a separate account within the Treasurer of State's office to be known as the Prepaid Postsecondary Tuition Administrative Account for the purposes of implementing and maintaining the Arkansas Prepaid Affordable College Tuition Trust Fund. Funds may be transferred from the unclaimed property fund to the administrative account and shall be repaid to the abandoned property fund no later than three (3) years after the transfer. The board may establish administrative fees for handling prepaid tuition contracts and deposit the money in this account.

(g) Four (4) years after the effective date of this Act, the administration of the fund shall be transferred from the office of the Treasurer of State to the Arkansas Higher Education Assistance Authority unless the General Assembly shall decide that the administration of the fund shall remain in the office of the Treasurer of State.

SECTION 3. (a) The fund shall be governed by an eleven (11) member board of directors.

(1) The board shall have five (5) ex officio voting members including the Treasurer of State, the President of the Council on Postsecondary Education or designee, the Secretary of the Finance Cabinet or designee, the Secretary of the Revenue Cabinet or designee, the Chair of the Association of Arkansas Independent Colleges and Universities or designee, three (3) members appointed by the Treasurer of State, and three (3) members appointed by the Governor.

(2) The Executive Director of the Higher Education Assistance Authority or designee shall serve as a nonvoting member. The gubernatorial and Treasurer of State appointees shall have experience in finance, accounting, or investment management.

(b)(1) Of the members to be appointed initially by the Treasurer of State, one (1) shall be appointed for a three (3) year term, and two (2) shall be appointed for a four (4) year term.

(2) Of the members to be appointed by the Governor, two (2) shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years, and one (1) for a term of three (3) years.

(3) Thereafter, all appointments shall be for terms of four (4) years, except that appointments to fill vacancies shall be for the unexpired terms.

(4) No person shall be appointed to serve for more than two (2) successive four-year terms. No person holding a full-time office or position of employment with the state, any county or city, or any educational institution shall be eligible for gubernatorial appointment to the board.

(c) Members of the board shall receive no compensation, but shall be reimbursed expenses incurred in the performance of their duties at the same per diem and travel rate as is paid the employees of the state.

(d)(1) The Treasurer of State shall be the chair and presiding officer of the board.

(2) The Treasurer of State may appoint other officers as the board may deem advisable or necessary.

(3) A majority of the members of the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of the business of the fund.

(e) The initial board appointments shall be made by October 1, 2003.

SECTION 4. The board shall:

(1) Promulgate administrative regulations, set fees, and adopt procedures as are necessary to implement the provisions of sections 1 through 7 of this act;

(2) Enter into contractual agreements, including contracts for legal, actuarial, financial, and consulting services;

(3) Invest moneys in the fund in any instruments, obligations, securities, or property as permitted by law and deemed appropriate by the board;

(4) Procure insurance to protect against any loss in connection with the fund's property, assets, or activities and to indemnify board members from personal loss or accountability from liability arising from any action or inaction as a board member;

(5) Make arrangements with participating institutions in the state to fulfill obligations under prepaid tuition contracts including, but not limited to, payment from the fund of the tuition cost on behalf of a qualified beneficiary to attend a participating institution in which the beneficiary is admitted and enrolled;

(6) Develop requirements, procedures, and guidelines regarding prepaid tuition contracts including, but not limited to:

(A) The termination, withdrawal, or transfer of payments under a prepaid tuition contract;

(B) Tuition shortfalls;

(C) Number of participants;

(D) Time limitations for prepaid tuition contracts and the use of tuition benefits;

(E) Tuition conversions;

(F) Payment schedules;

(G) Payroll deductions;

(H) Penalties for failure of purchasers to adhere to contracts; and

(I) Transfer of prepaid tuition credits towards private education in the state or for out-of-state institutions;

(7) Obtain appropriate actuarial assistance to establish, maintain, and certify a fund sufficient to:

(A) Defray the obligation of the fund;

(B) Annually evaluate or cause to be evaluated, the actuarial soundness of the fund; and

(C) Determine prior to each academic year:

(i) The amount of prepaid tuition for each standard tuition plan and for each participating institution for specific academic years;

(ii) The corresponding required amount of tuition credits;

(iii) The amount of prepaid tuition conversion; and

(iv) The amount of prepaid tuition academic year conversion;

(8) Make an annual report each year to the Legislative Council showing the fund's condition; and

(9) Market and promote participation in the fund.

SECTION 5. (a)(1) The prepaid tuition contract entered into by the purchaser and the board shall constitute an irrevocable pledge and guarantee by the fund to pay for the tuition of a qualified beneficiary upon acceptance and enrollment at a participating institution in proportion to the number of tuition credits purchased.

(2) The fund shall pay this amount to the participating institution on behalf of the qualified beneficiary.

(b) The fund shall pay the amount of any tuition shortfall to the participating institution on behalf of the qualified beneficiary.

(c) The purchaser or qualified beneficiary shall pay to the participating institution the amount of any prepaid tuition academic year conversion shortfall and the amount of any prepaid tuition conversion shortfall.

(d) A qualified beneficiary attending a participating institution may apply tuition credits to a specific academic year at the maximum course load or maximum number of credit hours generally permitted to full-time undergraduates at that institution.

(e)(1) The board and participating institutions may agree that tuition credits remaining in a prepaid tuition account after tuition is paid may be converted into other educational expense credits under administrative regulations promulgated by the board in compliance with Section 529 of the Internal Revenue Code.

(2) The board may permit the use of tuition credits for part-time undergraduate enrollment or graduate programs at participating institutions, after an appropriate conversion.

(3) Any prepaid tuition remaining in a prepaid tuition account, for reasons other than termination of the account as provided for in section 7 of this act, shall be refunded to the purchaser or the purchaser's designee.

(f) The value of the prepaid tuition credits shall not be used in calculating personal asset contribution for determining eligibility and need for student loan programs, student grant programs, or other student aid programs administered by any agency of the state, except as otherwise may be provided by federal law.

SECTION 6. (a)(1) Purchasers buying tuition credits for a qualified beneficiary shall enter into prepaid tuition contracts with the board.

(2) These contracts shall be in a form as shall be determined by the office.

(3) The contract shall provide for the purchase of tuition credits for prepaid tuition for the qualified beneficiary from one (1) to four (4) specific academic years.

(b) Upon written notification to the office, a purchaser may amend the prepaid tuition contract to change:

(1) The qualified beneficiary;

(2) The academic year or years for which tuition credits are purchased;

(3) A standard plan designation to a participating institution designation;

(4) A standard plan designation to another standard plan designation;

or

(5) One (1) participating institution designation to another participating institution designation. The value of the tuition credit shall be adjusted under requirements of administrative regulations promulgated by the board.

(c) A prepaid tuition account shall not be subject to attachment, levy, or execution by any creditor of a purchaser or qualified beneficiary and shall be exempt from all state and local taxes including, but not limited to, the intangible personal property tax levied, the individual income tax levied, and the inheritance tax levied.

(d) Nothing in sections 1 through 7 of this act or in a prepaid tuition contract shall be construed as a promise or guarantee that a qualified beneficiary shall be admitted to a participating institution, be allowed to continue to attend a participating institution after having been admitted, or graduate from a participating institution.

(e)(1) Prepaid tuition contract payments shall not be made in real or personal property other than cash and shall not exceed the prepaid tuition.

(2) Prepaid tuition contract payments may be made in lump sum installments.

(f)(1) The purchaser shall designate the qualified beneficiary at the time the purchaser enters into a prepaid tuition contract.

(2) In the case of gifts made to the fund, the board shall designate a qualified beneficiary at the time of the gift.

(g)(1) The prepaid tuition contract shall provide that the purchaser and the qualified beneficiary shall not directly or indirectly or otherwise control the investment of the prepaid tuition account or earnings on the account.

(2) Payments made for prepaid tuition shall be accounted for separately for each qualified beneficiary.

(3) No interest or earnings on a prepaid tuition contract of the purchaser or qualified beneficiary shall be pledged or otherwise encumbered as security of a debt.

(h) A prepaid tuition contract does not constitute a security.

SECTION 7. (a) Upon termination of a prepaid tuition contract, the office shall pay from the fund to the purchaser or the purchaser's designee the value of the tuition credits if the contract is terminated for any of the following:

(1) The death of the qualified beneficiary;

(2) The disability of the qualified beneficiary that, in the opinion of the office, would make attendance by the beneficiary at a participating institution impossible or unreasonably burdensome;

(3) The purchase price of the tuition credits if the contract is terminated for any of the following:

(A) Failure of the qualified beneficiary who, in the opinion of the office, has made a good faith attempt to gain admission to a participating or nonparticipating institution within the time limits imposed by the board; or

(B) The movement of a family of a qualified beneficiary from Arkansas to another state with a savings plan.

(b)(1) Upon termination of a prepaid tuition account as a result of a decision by the qualified beneficiary to attend a nonparticipating institution, the office at the direction of the beneficiary and upon presentation of proof of the beneficiary's acceptance by and enrollment in the nonparticipating institution, shall pay from the fund to the institution the value of the tuition credits as determined by the board of directors for the postsecondary education prepaid tuition program.

(2) If the cost of tuition exceeds the value of the tuition credits, it shall be the responsibility of the beneficiary to pay the difference.

(3) If the value of the tuition credits exceeds the cost of tuition, the beneficiary shall be given a refund equal to the difference.

(c) At the option of the purchaser or the purchaser's designee, the purchase price of any unused tuition credits may be carried forward to another academic year or refunded by the office from the fund.

(d) Upon termination of a tuition account as a result of a decision by the qualified beneficiary not to attend a participating or nonparticipating institution, within time limits determined by the board, the purchaser or purchaser's designee shall receive the purchase price of the tuition credits.

(e) The office may impose a fee upon termination of the account for administrative costs and deduct the fee from the amount otherwise payable under this section.

(f) If a qualified beneficiary is awarded a scholarship that covers tuition costs included in a prepaid tuition contract, the purchaser or the purchaser's designee shall receive a refund from the fund by the office consisting of the amount of the prepaid tuition for the number of tuition credits purchased for that academic year.

(g) If the purchaser wishes to transfer funds from the prepaid tuition account to the Arkansas Higher Educational Savings Plan Trust, the purchaser may do so under administrative regulations promulgated by the board of directors of the Arkansas Prepaid Affordable College Tuition Trust Fund and the board of the Arkansas Higher Education Assistance Authority.

SECTION 8. The office of the Treasurer of State for the purpose of implementing and administering the prepaid tuition account program established in sections 1 through 7 of this act. The program shall provide for the purchase of tuition credits for a beneficiary to attend a participating postsecondary institution.

SECTION 9. If the current prepaid contract obligations of the program exceed the market value of the program assets, at the request of the board, the Governor shall include in the annual budget requests submitted to the General Assembly an appropriation in the amount equal to the difference between the current prepaid contract obligations and the market value of the program assets."

(b) For the purposes of this act there shall be five (5) classifications of classified personnel as provided for in Section 3 of this subchapter.

(c) For purposes of this act, a classified employee shall be an employee of a public school who is not required to hold a teaching license issued by the State Board of Education.

SECTION 2. The provisions of this act shall not apply if the district chooses to officially recognize in its policies an organization representing the majority of the classified personnel of the district for the purposes of negotiating personnel policies, salaries, and educational matters of mutual concern under a written policy agreement.

SECTION 3. (a)(1) Each school district shall have a committee on personnel policies for classified personnel which consists of at least one (1) nonmanagement representative from each of the following five (5) classifications:

- (A) Maintenance and operation;
- (B) Transportation;
- (C) Food service;
- (D) Secretarial and clerical; and
- (E) Aids and paraprofessionals.

(2) Any classification of support personnel not identified in the five (5) classifications may be added as an additional representative.

(b) There shall be no more than three (3) administrators on the committee, one (1) of which may be the superintendent of schools.

(c) The classified personnel members of the committee on personnel shall be elected by a majority of the classified personnel voting by secret ballot.

(d) The election shall be solely and exclusively conducted by the classified personnel including distribution of ballots to all classified personnel.

(e) The election shall be conducted by mid-October.

SECTION 4. (a) The personnel policies of the school district in effect at the time a classified employee's contract is entered into or renewed shall be considered to be incorporated as terms of the contract and shall be binding upon both parties unless changed by mutual consent.

(b) Any amendments to personnel policies adopted during the term of such contract shall become effective the following July 1. However, these amendments may take place immediately with mutual consent.

SECTION 5. (a) The school district's committee on the personnel policies for classified personnel shall organize itself in October, elect a chairman and secretary, and develop a calendar of meetings throughout the year to review the district's personnel policies to determine if additional policies or amendments to existing policies are needed.

(b) Minutes of the committee meeting shall be promptly reported and distributed to members of the board and posted in the worksites of the district including administrative offices.

(c) Either the committee or the board of directors may propose new personnel policies or amendments to existing policies, if the proposals by the board have been submitted to the committee at least ten (10) working days prior to presentation to the board.

(d) The committee shall present its proposed policies or amendments to existing policies to the board of directors.

(e) After presentation to the board, final action shall be taken no later than the next regular board meeting.

(f) The board of directors shall have the authority to adopt, reject, or refer back the committee on personnel policies for further study and revision, any proposed policies or amendments to existing policies that are submitted to the board for consideration.

SECTION 6. (a) Each classified employee being employed by a school district for the first time shall be given a copy of the district's personnel policies in effect at the time of his or her employment.

(b) Each classified employee or administrator who was employed before the adoption of this policy shall be given a copy of the district's personnel policies at the time his or her contract is renewed or extended.

(c) Each classified employee or administrator shall be furnished a copy of any amendments to the personnel policies within thirty (30) days after approval of the amendments by the board of directors of the district.

(c) On January 1, 2004, the appropriate state officials are directed to transfer all funds, appropriations, credits, and equities belonging to the Arkansas School for Mathematics and Sciences and its board of trustees so that the same shall be credited to and made available for the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas for use on its Arkansas School for Mathematics, Sciences, and the Arts campus.

(d) The Board of Trustees of the Arkansas School for Mathematics and Sciences shall, on January 1, 2004, relinquish all responsibility, control, and supervision concerning the Arkansas School for Mathematics and Sciences, and by delivery of the assets, books of accounts, and files of that institution to the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas shall be divested of all obligations and duties applicable to the Arkansas School for Mathematics and Sciences.

SECTION 2. Purpose – Location – Funding – Tuition.

(a) The Arkansas School for Mathematics, Sciences, and the Arts shall be a residential school for eleventh and twelfth grade students who exhibit outstanding academic credentials and who have the ability to undertake course work in an environment and with demands similar to those of a university.

(b)(1) The purposes of the school shall be to educate the gifted and talented math, science, and fine and performing arts students of the state and to develop curricula and materials to improve instruction in mathematics, sciences, and fine and performing arts for all students in the state.

(2) The school's curriculum, faculty, and admissions policies shall reflect the purposes described by this act.

(c) While the emphasis of the school shall be dedicated to the academic teaching of mathematics, sciences, and fine and performing arts, emphasis may also be placed upon other areas of the arts and humanities as deemed appropriate by the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas.

(d) The board of trustees shall maintain the Arkansas School for Mathematics, Sciences and the Arts in Hot Springs as a campus of the University of Arkansas offering at that location the highest possible quality of educational programs as set forth in this act.

SECTION 3. Board of Visitors.

(a)(1) There is established a Board of Visitors for the Arkansas School for Mathematics, Sciences, and the Arts.

(2) The persons serving on December 31, 2003 as members of the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas School for Mathematics and Sciences shall be members of the Board of Visitors for the Arkansas School for Mathematics, Sciences, and the Arts and shall continue to serve for a term equal to the unexpired portion of his or her term as a member of the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas School for Mathematics and Sciences.

(3) The board of visitors shall consist of seven (7) members appointed by the Governor for seven-year terms.

(4) As initial terms expire, and when vacancies occur, the Governor shall appoint persons to fill each vacancy for the remaining portion of the unexpired term.

(5) Appointments shall be for terms of seven (7) years or for the remaining portion of an unexpired term.

(b)(1) Members of the board of visitors appointed by the Governor, in addition to possessing the qualifications of an elector, shall reside in the State of Arkansas.

(2) One (1) member shall be appointed from each congressional district and the remaining members shall be appointed from the state at large.

(3) In addition to appointed members of the board of visitors, six (6) ex-officio non-voting members shall also serve on the board as follows:

(A) The Director of the Department of Education;

(B) The Director of the Department of Higher Education;

(C) The President of the Arkansas Science and Technology

Authority;

(D) The Director of the Department of Arkansas Heritage;

(E) The President of the Parent Association of the school; and

(F) The President of the Student Government of the school.

(4) The terms of office of an ex-officio non-voting member shall continue so long as he or she occupies the position or office.

(c)(1) The board of visitors shall meet quarterly and shall elect from its voting members a chair, a vice chair, and a secretary.

(2) Regular minutes of its meetings shall be preserved.

#### SECTION 4. Board of visitors – Purposes.

(a)(1) The general purpose of the Board of Visitors for the Arkansas School for Mathematics, Sciences, and the Arts is to perform a liaison function between the school, parents, and other constituents, through the administrator of the school and the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas.

(2) The board of visitors shall assist in securing financial support for the institution, advise the administrator and the President and the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas as to the educational and service needs of the school, to aid in the orderly transition of the school as it becomes a campus of the University of Arkansas, and to furnish counsel and guidance, by advice and recommendations, for the school and its administrator.

(3) Without limiting the generality of the purposes described in this section, the board of visitors shall:

(C) Keep informed on such matters as are necessary to promote the educational aims of the school for the benefit of the student;

(D) Study plans submitted by the administrator for furthering the growth and insuring the quality of the school;

(E) Transmit their views for consideration by the administrator and the President and the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas;

(F) Participate in securing the continued financial support for the school;

(G) Accept and execute specific assignments made by the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas and the President of the University of Arkansas;

(H) Review and provide recommendations to the administrator regarding the school's operating budget priorities; and

(I) Promote, in diverse ways, the growth and development in excellence of the school and the University of Arkansas in general.

(4) Communications, including advice and recommendations, from the board of visitors shall be transmitted through the administrator of the school and by him or her through the President of the University of Arkansas to the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas.

(b) The school shall be funded by monies appropriated by the General Assembly for the operation of the school and by grants, contributions, or donations which may be received for the support of the school.

(c) Students selected to attend the school shall not be required to pay tuition, fees, or room and board.

(d) Any student who is a senior at the school shall have the option of participating in activities and events with, and in the same manner as, other members of the graduating class in his or her home school district, including, but not limited to, the following:

(1) The prom or banquet;

(2) Class day activities;

(3) Graduation activities;

(4) Recognition as a honor graduate, except as valedictorian or salutatorian; and

(5) Class pictures, including yearbook and composite pictures.

SECTION 5. Administrator—Staff.

(a)(1) The Administrator of the Arkansas School for Mathematics, Sciences, and the Arts shall be the chief administrative officer of the school and shall administer the school in accordance with policies established by the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas.

(2) The administrator shall be employed by the board of trustees after appropriate advice and counsel of the Board of Visitors of the Arkansas School for Mathematics, Sciences, and the Arts.

(b) Upon recommendation of the administrator, the board of trustees shall employ such other personnel as it deems necessary for the operation of the school.

(c)(1) Instructors shall be employed by the board of trustees and shall have such rights, privileges, and obligations as the board of trustees shall determine, provided that they shall not be eligible for tenure nor carry professional rank.

(2) In the event policies of the board of trustees conflict with existing law with respect to terms and conditions of employment of instructors and staff the policies shall control.

(d) Instructors and staff of the school shall continue to be eligible for membership in the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System and earn credited service for employment at the school or at their election shall be eligible to participate in the retirement system of the University of Arkansas.

SECTION 6. Department of Education regulations.

15-4-2801. Legislative Intent.

(a) The General Assembly of this state finds and declares that there exists in this state a continuing need for programs to assist certain local governmental units in encouraging economic development, the consequent job creation and retention, and ancillary economic growth in this state.

(b) To achieve the purposes described in this section, it is necessary to assist and encourage the creation of diamond zones and to provide temporary relief from certain taxes within the diamond zones.

15-4-2802. As used in this subchapter:

- (1) "County executive" means the judge of a county court;
- (2) "Department" means the Arkansas Department of Economic Development;
- (3) "Development plan" means a written plan that addresses the criteria in § 15-4-2806 and includes all of the following:
- (A) A map of the proposed diamond zone that indicates the geographic boundaries, the total area, and the present use and conditions generally of the land and structures within those boundaries;
- (B) Evidence of community support and commitment from residential and business interests;
- (C) A description of the methods proposed to increase economic opportunity and expansion, facilitate infrastructure improvement, and identify job training opportunities;
- (D) Current social, economic, and demographic characteristics of the proposed diamond zone and anticipated improvements in education, health, human services, public safety, and employment if the diamond zone is created;
- (E) Efforts by the local government to attract jobs which provide health care benefits, retirement benefits, and other employee benefits; and
- (F) Any other information required by the department;
- (4) "Diamond zone" means a contiguous geographic area designated under this subchapter;
- (5) "Distressed area" means an area that, on the date of application for designation as a diamond zone, either qualifies as a Tier IV county or is located within a Tier IV county as defined in § 15-4-2704;
- (6) "Local governmental unit" means a county, city of the first class, city of the second class, or incorporated town;
- (7) "Person" means an individual, partnership, corporation, association, limited liability company, governmental entity, or other legal entity;
- (8) "Qualified local governmental unit" means a county, city of the first class, city of the second class, or incorporated town that contains an eligible distressed area;
- (9) "Review board" means the diamond zone review board created in § 15-4-2804;
- (10) "Rural area" means an area that lies outside of the boundaries of an urban area; and

(11) "Urban area" means an urbanized area as determined by the Economics and Statistics Administration, United States Bureau of the Census according to the most recent census.

15-4-2803. (a) One (1) or more qualified local governmental units may apply to the Diamond Zone Review Board to designate the qualified local governmental unit or units as a diamond zone if all of the following criteria are met:

(1) The geographic area of the proposed diamond zone is located within the boundaries of the qualified local governmental unit or units that apply;

(2) The application includes a development plan;

(3) The proposed diamond zone is not larger than one county in size;

(4) The application includes the proposed duration of diamond zone status, not to exceed fifteen (15) years;

(5) If the qualified local governmental unit is a county, the county executive's written approval of the application; and

(6) If the qualified local governmental unit is a city or town, written approval of the application by the city's or town's mayor or manager.

(b)(1) A qualified local governmental unit may submit not more than one (1) application to the review board for designation as a diamond zone.

(2) A resolution provided by a local governmental unit under § 15-4-2806 does not constitute an application of a local governmental unit for a diamond zone under this subchapter.

15-4-2804. (a)(1) The Diamond Zone Review Board is created. The review board shall consist of:

(A) The Director of the Department of Economic Development, or the director's designee;

(B) The Director of the Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration, or the director's designee;

(C) The Director of the Arkansas Employment Security Department, or the director's designee;

(D) Two (2) members appointed by the Governor of the State of Arkansas for terms of two (2) years;

(E) One (1) member appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Arkansas Senate for a term of two (2) years; and

(F) One (1) member appointed by the Speaker of the Arkansas House of Representatives for a term of two (2) years.

(2) The appointments of members to the review board shall be made within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this subchapter.

(b) The review board shall review all applications submitted by qualified local governmental units and make recommendations to the Governor based on the criteria contained in § 15-4-2806.

(c) Members of the review board shall serve without compensation for their membership on the review board, but members of the review board may receive reasonable reimbursement for necessary travel and expenses.

15-4-2805. (a) The Governor shall review all recommendations submitted by the Diamond Zone Review Board and determine which applications meet the criteria contained in § 15-4-2806.

(b) After the Governor notifies the review board that applications meet the criteria contained in § 15-4-2806, the review board shall do all of the following:

(1) Designate diamond zones;

(2) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, approve or reject the duration of diamond zone status; and

(3) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, approve or reject the geographic boundaries and the total area of the diamond zone as submitted in the application.

(c) The review board shall not alter the geographic boundaries of the diamond zone or the duration of diamond zone status described in the application unless the qualified local governmental unit or units and the local governmental unit or units in which the diamond zone is to be located consent by resolution to the alteration.

(d) The designation of a diamond zone under this subchapter shall take effect on January 1 of the year following designation.

15-4-2806. (a) In order to designate a geographic area as a diamond zone, the Diamond Zone Review Board shall determine that the proposed diamond zone is a distressed area.

(b) The review board shall also consider the following criteria in designating a diamond zone:

(1) Shall give priority to applications that include new business activity;

(2) The viability of the development plan;

(3) Whether the development plan is creative and innovative;

(4) Public and private commitment to and other resources available for the proposed diamond zone;

(5) How diamond zone designation would relate to a broader plan for the community as a whole;

(6) The level of demonstrated cooperation from surrounding communities;

(7) How the local regulatory burden will be eased for businesses operating in the proposed diamond zone;

(8) Public and private commitment to improving abandoned real property; and

(9) Any other information required by the review board.

(c) The review board shall not designate an area as a diamond zone unless each local governmental unit within which the proposed diamond zone is to be located provides a resolution from its governing body that states if the diamond zone designation is granted.

15-4-2807. (a) The Diamond Zone Review Board shall not designate more than nine (9) diamond zones within this state.

(b) Not more than six (6) of the diamond zones shall be located in urban areas and not more than four (4) of the diamond zones shall be located in rural areas.

(c) For purposes of determining whether a diamond zone is located in an urban area or rural area under this section, if any part of a diamond zone is located within an urban area, the entire diamond zone shall be considered to be located in an urban area.

15-4-2808. (a) Except as otherwise provided in § 15-4-2809, and subject to the limitations contained in subsection (b) and (c) of this section, an individual who is a resident of a diamond zone or a business that is located and conducts business activity within a diamond zone shall be exempt from state and local income taxes during the duration of the diamond zone status.

(b)(1) The income tax exemption provided by this section shall first be available for tax years beginning on or after January 1 of the year following the designation of a geographic area as a diamond zone.

(2) An individual is not eligible for the income tax exemption provided by this section unless the diamond zone is the individual's primary place of residence during each year for which the exemption is claimed.

15-4-2809. (a) During the last three (3) years that the taxpayer is eligible for the exemption provided in § 15-4-2808, the exemption shall be reduced by the following percentages:

(1) For the tax year that is two (2) years before the final year of designation as a diamond zone, the percentage shall be twenty-five percent (25%);

(2) For the tax year immediately preceding the final year of designation as a diamond zone, the percentage shall be fifty percent (50%); and

(3) For the tax year that is the final year of designation as a diamond zone, the percentage shall be seventy-five percent (75%).

(b) An individual who is a resident of a diamond zone or a business that is located and conducts business activity within a diamond zone is not eligible for the exemption provided in § 15-4-2808 if the taxpayer is delinquent on the payment of any state and local income taxes during the ten-year period immediately preceding the designation as a diamond zone.

(c) An individual who is a resident of a diamond zone is eligible for the exemption provided in § 15-4-2808 until the Department of Finance and Administration determines that the aggregate state and local tax revenue forgone as a result of the exemption granted under this subchapter to that individual reaches two million dollars (\$2,000,000).

(d) With respect to businesses located and conducting business activity within a diamond zone, the exemption from state and local income taxes shall only apply to income derived from the business activities conducted within a diamond zone.

15-4-2810. (a) The form of the application for a diamond zone designation shall be as specified by the Department of Economic Development.

(b) The Diamond Zone Review Board may request any information from an applicant, in addition to that contained in an application, as may be needed to permit the review board to discharge its responsibilities under this subchapter.

15-4-2811. This subchapter shall be construed liberally to effectuate the legislative intent and the purposes of this subchapter and as complete and independent authority for the performance of each and every act and thing authorized by this subchapter, and all powers granted by this subchapter shall be broadly interpreted to effectuate the intent and purposes of this subchapter and not as a limitation of powers.

15-4-2812. (a) The Department of Economic Development shall annually report to the General Assembly on the economic effects of this subchapter in each diamond zone.

(b) The report shall include, but is not limited to, all of the following for each diamond zone:

(1) Number of new jobs created;

(2) Average hourly wage of new jobs created; and

(3) Annual percentage change of adjusted gross income of residents of diamond zones."
