Upon motion of Representative R. Smith, **HOUSE BILL NO. 1222** was placed back on second reading for the purpose of amendment.

AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO HOUSE BILL NO. 1222

Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 1222** as originally introduced:

Page 1, delete lines 10 through 13, and substitute the following:

“AN ACT TO PROVIDE STATUTORY AUTHORITY FOR THE ARKANSAS TEACHER RETIREMENT SYSTEM TO MANAGE ITS ASSETS AND LIABILITIES TO MEET ITS PENSION OBLIGATIONS BY UTILIZING A PORTION OF FUNDS UNDER ITS CONTROL TO PROVIDE THE SOURCE OF PAYMENT AND SECURITY FOR ARKANSAS TEACHER RETIREMENT SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.”

AND

Page 1, delete lines 16 through 19, and substitute the following:

“TO PROVIDE STATUTORY AUTHORITY FOR THE TEACHER RETIREMENT SYSTEM TO MEET ITS PENSION OBLIGATIONS BY USING FUNDS UNDER ITS CONTROL TO PAY FOR ARKANSAS TEACHER RETIREMENT SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS.”

AND

Delete Section 1. of the bill and substitute new sections to the bill to read as follows:

“SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 24-7-403 is amended to read as follows:

24-7-403. Restrictions on use of assets.

(a) All assets of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System shall be held for the sole purpose of paying benefits and making disbursements in accordance with the provisions of this act, paying debt service requirements on Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Revenue Bonds, and shall be used for no other purpose whatsoever, unless the assets are used to purchase or construct a building to be used for the permanent offices of the system upon approval of the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System.

(b) Except as to the rights of a member, retirant, or beneficiary, no trustee and no officer or employee of the board shall have any interest, direct or indirect, in the gains or profits of any investment made by the board. Nor shall any of them, directly or indirectly, for himself or as an agent, in any manner use the assets of the system except to make such current and necessary payments as are authorized by the board; nor shall any of them become an endorser or surety or become in any manner an obligor for moneys loaned by or borrowed from the board.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 24-7-405 is amended to read as follows:

24-7-405. Retirement fund assets accounts generally.

All the assets of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System shall be recorded in ~~five (5)~~ six (6) accounts, namely:

- (1) The members' deposit account;
- (2) The employer accumulation account;
- (3) The retirement reserve account;
- (4) The survivor benefit account; ~~and~~
- (5) The income-expense account; and
- (6) The debt service account.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 24-7-406(a)(1), concerning the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System accounts and contributions, is amended to read as follows:

(a)(1) The members' deposit account shall be the account in which shall be accumulated at regular interest the members' contributions to the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System and from which shall be paid refunds of accumulated contributions, ~~and transfers as provided in this act, and any debt service requirement on the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Revenue Bonds.~~ However, employer contributions which are paid by an employee instead of an employer shall be credited to the members' deposit account. Those contributions shall be subject to refund under the same conditions that regular member contributions are refundable.

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 24-7-407 is amended to read as follows:

24-7-407. Retirement fund assets accounts - Employer accumulation account.

(a) The employer accumulation account is the account in which shall be accumulated the employer's contributions to the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System, and from which shall be made transfers for any debt service requirement on the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Revenue Bonds and any other transfers as provided in this act.

(b) Upon the retirement of a member, the difference between his annuity reserve and his accumulated contributions standing to his credit in the members' deposit account at that time shall be transferred from the employer accumulation account to the retirement reserve account.

(c) Upon the death of a member, if survivor benefits become payable on account of his death, the difference between the reserve for the survivor benefits payable and the member's accumulated contributions standing to his credit in the members' deposit account at the time of his death shall be transferred from the employer accumulation account to the survivor benefit account.

SECTION 5. Arkansas Code Title 24, Chapter 7, Subchapter 4 is amended to add additional sections to read as follows:

24-7-412. Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Debt Service Account.

(a)(1) There is created and established an account, designated as a cash fund and held separate and apart from the State Treasury, to be known as the "Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Debt Service Account."

(2) The account shall be used to pay debt service requirements on the Arkansas Teachers Retirement System Revenue Bonds.

(3) All moneys deposited into the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Debt Service Account are cash funds under § 19-6-103, restricted in their use and to be used solely as provided in this section.

(b)(1) Funds shall be transferred from the members' deposit account or the employer accumulation account to the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Debt Service Account in amounts necessary to meet the debt service requirements of the Arkansas Teachers Retirement System Revenue Bonds as are then outstanding.

(2) Amounts received in the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Debt Service Account shall be held until needed to make payments on debt service requirements.

(3) The Board of Trustees of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System may invest any amounts held in the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Debt Service Account in suitable investments maturing not later than when the moneys are needed to pay debt service requirements, provided that the investment of the moneys may be limited by the provisions of any trust indenture under which bonds are issued or any related non-arbitrage certificate or tax regulatory agreement.

(c)(1) Amounts in the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Debt Service Account shall be transferred to funds and accounts established and held by the trustee for the bonds at the time and manner specified in the trust indenture or funds transfer agreement securing the bonds.

(2) If required by the trust indenture or funds transfer agreement under which the bonds have been issued, amounts deposited to the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Debt Service Account may be immediately deposited into funds or accounts established by the trust indenture and held by the bond trustee.

(3) The board is authorized to execute any funds transfer agreement, consent, pledge, or other document, reasonably required under a trust indenture to affirm the pledge of amounts held in the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Debt Service Account to secure Arkansas Teach Retirement System Revenue Bonds.

(d)(1) Any amounts held in the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Debt Service Account, to the extent those amounts are not needed to pay debt service requirements shall be transferred in the appropriate pro rata proportion to either the members' deposit account or the employer accumulation account.

(2) The pro rata distribution is based upon the source of the funds.

(e)(1) If there are no longer any bonds outstanding, and all debt service requirements and other contractual obligations have been paid in full, any amounts remaining in the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Debt Service Account shall be transferred in the appropriate pro rata proportion to members' deposit account or the employer accumulation account.

(2) The pro rata distribution shall be based upon the source of the funds.

24-7-413. Authority of the system board of trustees.

(a) With respect to the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Debt Service Account, the Board of Trustees of Arkansas Teacher Retirement System is authorized and directed to perform the following duties:

(1) Manage and invest the amounts held in the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Debt Service Account;

(2) Invest and reinvest the moneys in the account;

(3) Hold, purchase, sell, assign, transfer, or dispose of any of the investments and the proceeds of the investments and moneys.

(b) These duties shall be performed in compliance with the prudent investor and other applicable standards under §§ 24-3-408, 24-3-414, 24-3-415, and 24-3-417 through 24-3-425, and § 19-3-518.

24-7-414. Issuance of Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Revenue Bonds by Arkansas Development Finance Authority.

(a)(1) If requested by a resolution of the Board of Trustees of Arkansas Teacher Retirement System, the Arkansas Development Finance Authority is directed and authorized to issue Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Revenue Bonds, the proceeds of which are to be used for financing the pension obligations.

(2) These bonds may be issued in series, and shall be special obligations only of the Arkansas Development Finance Authority, secured solely by the Arkansas Teachers Retirement System Debt Service Account.

(b)(1) Before issuance of any bond series, the Arkansas Development Finance Authority shall adopt a resolution authorizing the issuance of the series of bonds.

(2) The resolution shall contain the terms, covenants, conditions, as deemed desirable and consistent with this section together with provisions of subchapters 1, 2, and 3 of Chapter 5 of Title 15 of the Arkansas Code Annotated, including without limitation, those pertaining to the establishment and maintenance of funds and accounts, deposit and investment of bond proceeds and the rights and obligations of the Arkansas Development Finance Authority and the registered owners of the bonds.

(3) In authorizing, issuing, selling the bonds and in the investment of all funds held under the resolution or indenture securing the bonds, the Arkansas Development Finance Authority shall have the powers and be governed under §§ 15-5-309 and 15-5-310.

(c)(1) The bonds shall be special obligations of the Arkansas Development Finance Authority, secured and payable from deposits in the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Debt Service Account.

(2) In pledging revenues to secure the bonds, the provisions of § 15-5-313 shall apply.

(d) Each bond shall state plainly on the face that it has been issued under this section, and subchapters 1, 2, and 3 of Chapter 5 of Title 15 of the Arkansas Code Annotated, that the bond is an obligation only of the Arkansas Development Finance Authority secured as specified in this section, and that, in no event, shall the bonds constitute an indebtedness of the State of Arkansas or an indebtedness for which the faith and credit of the State of Arkansas or any of its revenues are pledged or an indebtedness secured by lien, or security interest in any property of the State.

(e)(1) The bonds may be issued in one (1) or more series, as determined by the Arkansas Development Finance Authority.

(2) Additional bonds may be issued in one (1) or more series to fund additional pension obligations, so long as the Arkansas Development Finance Authority determines that revenues transferred to the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Debt Service Account, in combination with other revenues available to secure the bonds, are sufficient to meet all debt service requirements on the additional bonds and any other bonds then outstanding.

(f)(1) Any funds remaining and available to the Arkansas Development Finance Authority or the trustees under any indenture or resolution after the retirement of all bonds outstanding under the indenture or resolution, and the satisfaction of all contractual obligations related thereto and all current expenses of the Arkansas Development Finance Authority related thereto, shall be transferred to the members' deposit account or the employer accumulation account in the appropriate pro rata proportion.

(2) The pro rata distribution shall be based upon the source of the funds.

(g) The Arkansas Development Finance Authority may issue bonds for the purpose of refunding bonds previously issued under section, and in doing so shall be governed by the provisions of § 15-5-314.

(h)(1) Bonds and interest on the bonds are exempt from all taxes of the state of Arkansas, including income, inheritance, and property taxes.

(2) The bonds shall be eligible to secure deposits of all public funds, and shall be legal for investment of municipal, county, bank, fiduciary, insurance company and trust funds.

(i) The State of Arkansas pledges to and agrees with the holders of any Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Revenue Bonds issued under this section that the State shall not:

(1) Limit or alter the distribution of the members' contributions or the employers' contributions to the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Debt Service Fund if the action would materially impair the rights of the holders of the Bonds;

(2) Limit or alter the rights vested in the Arkansas Development Finance Authority to fulfill the terms of any agreements made with the holders of the bonds; or

(3) Impair the rights and remedies of the holders of the bonds, unless and until all bonds issued under this section, together with interest on the bonds, and all costs and expenses in connection with any action or proceeding by or on behalf of the holders of the bonds, have been paid, fully met, and discharged.

(j) The Arkansas Development Finance Authority is authorized to include the pledge and agreement of subsection (i) of this section in any agreement with the holders of the bonds.”

AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO HOUSE BILL NO. 2179

Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 2179** as engrossed, H3/14/03:

Delete everything after the enacting clause and substitute the following:

“SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 19-4-1414 is amended to read as follows:

19-4-1414. Performance-based efficiency contracts.

(a) For purposes of this section:

(1) "Agency" means any state board, commission, agency, department, ~~and institution of higher education, city, county, school district, or other~~ political subdivision of the State of Arkansas;

(2) "Bond" means any surety company bond issued by a surety company that is licensed to do business in the State of Arkansas; ~~(2)(3)~~

"Efficiency savings" means cost savings which result from utility, operational, and cost avoidance measures that do not degrade the level of service or working conditions ~~changes that do not degrade the level of service or working conditions and which are verifiable by comparing expenditures that occur after the improvements with the same type or expenditures occurring before the improvements are made;~~

(4) "Energy conservation measures" means the improvement, installation, repair, or alteration of any equipment, fixture, furnishing, or other improvement to be added to or used in any building or facility, or any maintenance or operational strategy that is designed to reduce utility consumption or lower operating costs, and may include, but is not limited to:

(A) Insulation of the building structure or system within the building;

(B) Windows or doors, caulking or weather stripping, multi-glazed windows or doors, heat absorbing or heat reflective glazed and coated window or door systems, additional glazing, reductions in glass area, or other window and door system modifications that reduce energy consumption;

(C) Automated or computerized energy control systems;

(D) Heating, ventilating, or air conditioning system modifications, replacements, or conversions;

(E) Replacements, retrofits, or modifications of lighting fixtures to increase the energy efficiency of the lighting system that conform to the Illuminating Engineers Society standards, or comparable successors thereto;

(F) Indoor air quality improvements to increase air

quality that conforms to the applicable state building code requirements;

(G) Any additional building infrastructure improvement, cost saving, life safety, or any other improvement that provides long term operating cost reductions and are in compliance with the state building code;

(H) Equipment used to produce electricity; and

(I) Any facility operation, administration, or management program that reduces operating costs.

~~(3)(5)~~ "Performance-based efficiency contract" means a contract with a qualified provider for: the construction, installation, and implementation of energy conservation measures that may or may not include provisions in the contract, or in an accompanying agreement, under which the costs associated with the construction, installation, and implementation of energy conservation measures may be financed and paid over a specified period of time with interest;

~~(A) The design and implementation of any improvement, repair, or alteration;~~

~~(B) The betterment of any building or facility owned or operated by an agency; and~~

~~(C) Any equipment, fixture, or furnishing to be added to or used in any building or facility, or any maintenance or operational strategy that is designed to reduce utility consumption or lower operating costs, and may include, but is not limited to:~~

~~(i) Automated or computerized energy control systems;~~

~~(ii) Heating, ventilating, or air conditioning system modifications or replacements;~~

~~(iii) Replacements or modifications of lighting fixtures to increase the energy efficiency of the lighting system;~~

~~(5)(7)~~ "Request for proposals" means a negotiated procurement for a qualified provider to provide services.

(b)(1) Any agency may enter into performance-based efficiency contracts ~~for professional services contracts~~ with a qualified provider and may finance the costs associated with the purchase of equipment, labor, and services associated with the implementation of the energy conservation measures provided for in the performance based efficiency contracts or otherwise through the agency's execution either in favor of a qualified provider or third party financing source of any installment contract or lease purchase agreement possessing a financing term not to exceed twenty (20) years, provided that all utility costs, operational costs, cost avoidance, and other savings associated with the installation of the energy conservation measures provided in the performance based efficiency contract along with any other available and lawful funds that the agency might designate shall be sufficient to offset the annual debt service and other costs of the performance based efficiency contract.

~~(d)(1) State agencies Agencies shall give a notice of the request for proposals.~~

advantageous to the state, taking into consideration price and the evaluation factors set forth in the request for proposals.

(2) Discussions shall not disclose any information derived from proposals submitted by competing offerers.

(3) The contract shall be awarded to the responsible offerer whose proposal, following negotiations, is determined to be the most advantageous to the state considering the guaranteed savings and other evaluation factors set forth in the request for proposals.

(g)(1) To obtain the best final offers, the agency may allow proposal revisions after submissions and before the award of the contract.

(2) State agencies shall select the provider deemed best qualified and capable of performing the desired work and negotiate a contract for the project.

(h)(1) State agencies may enter into a performance-based efficiency contract with a qualified provider if the agency finds that the amount it would spend on the measures recommended in the proposal would not exceed the amount to be saved in either utility, or operational, or other related costs, ~~or both~~, within a twenty-year period after the date of installation if the recommendations in the proposal are followed.

(2) The qualified provider shall guarantee the annual energy use savings to the agency every year during the term of the contract and shall reconcile the guaranteed energy use savings on an annual basis.

(3)(A) ~~The qualified provider shall reimburse the agency for any shortfall of guaranteed savings~~ The qualified provider shall guarantee the annual dollar or cost savings, when compared with an established baseline for previous fuel and utility costs, to the agency every year during the term of the performance based efficiency contract and shall reconcile the guaranteed savings on an annual basis.

(B) All calculations of cost savings shall be conducted in accordance with Federal Energy Management Policy or the International Performance, Measurement and Verification Protocol, or successor comparables thereto.

(C)(i) Beginning January 1, 2004, and every year thereafter, all existing and reelected board members shall obtain a minimum of nine (9) hours training and instruction by December 31 of each calendar year.

(ii) The training and instruction of the board of directors shall include topics relevant to school laws, school operations and the member's powers, duties, and responsibilities as board of directors' members, including, but not limited to, legal requirements, role differentiation, financial management, and improving student achievement.

(D) Hours of training and instruction obtained in excess of the minimum requirements may cumulate and be carried over from year to year.

(2) This instruction may be received from an institution of higher learning in this state, from instruction sponsored by the Department of Education, or by an in-service training program conducted by the Arkansas School Boards Association.

(3) Any school board member completing a course of instruction shall

receive a certification of completion, and a copy shall be entered into the minutes of the local school board on which he or she serves, and forwarded by the local school board to the Department of Education within five (5) days of receipt by the board.

~~(4) Upon having completed the course of instruction meeting the minimum requirements of this section, it shall not be necessary for a school board member to take an additional course of instruction upon being reelected to the school board.~~

(4)(A)(i) Should any member of a school district board of directors elected for an initial or non-continuous term, fail to obtain the required training under subdivision (a)(1)(A)(i), by March 1 and fails to correct the deficiency with ninety (90) days from the date of receiving notice of the deficiency, a vacancy shall exist on the board of directors by operation of law from the date of receipt of notification by the superintendent.

(ii) On or before March 10 of each year, the Department of Education shall notify, by certified mail, return receipt requested, any school board member that is deficient on any training requirement under subdivision (a)(1)(A)(i).

(iii) No vacancy shall exist if a members is granted and extension due to military service of the member or illness as provided under subdivision (a)(5).

(B) The Department of Education shall immediately notify the superintendent by certified mail, return receipt requested, with a copy to the board president, of the existence of a vacancy on the board of directors, and the resulting vacancy may be filled by appointment by a majority of the remaining members of the board of directors, as is provided by law.

(5) Should any member of a school district board of directors, fail to obtain the required training under subdivisions (a)(1)(B) or (a)(1)(C), the member shall receive a citation from the Department of Education noting the deficiency with a copy mailed to the superintendent and the local school board.

(6)(A) If a member of a school district board of directors is unable to obtain the required training because of military service of the member, or illness of the member verified by a written sworn statement from the member's attending physician, the Department of Education shall grant a time extension permitting the member additional time to obtain required training.

(B) The issuance of a time extension shall not operate to remove a member of a school district board of directors from office.

(b) Local school district boards of directors are authorized to pay per diem and other necessary expenses from funds belonging to the school district and to reimburse school board directors for expenses incurred in attending in-service

workshops, conferences, and other courses of training and instruction required in completing ~~a minimum of six (6) hours~~ the training and of instruction as required in subsection (a) of this section.

(c) It shall be the responsibility of the Department of Education to receive and maintain records of instructional hours obtained by members of school district boards of directors.

(b) The Organ Donor Awareness Education Trust Fund shall consist of all moneys donated or collected for the purpose of educating or informing the public of the need for organ donations, all interest earned from the investment of fund balances, and any remaining fund balances carried forward from year to year.

(c) The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to accept any gifts, grants, bequests, devises, and donations made to the State of Arkansas for the purposes of organ donor awareness education. Funds received for the purposes stated in this section shall be deposited in the Organ Donor Awareness Education Trust Fund.

(d) The Department of Finance and Administration shall administer the fund.

(e) The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration shall grant funds available and appropriated from the Organ Donor Awareness Education Trust Fund to the Arkansas Regional Organ Recovery Agency, or its successor agency, to be used for educational or informational materials and other related costs associated with informing or educating the public about organ donations and organ donation awareness.

(f) The Arkansas Regional Organ Recovery Agency, or its successor agency, shall annually provide to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State documentation evidencing that granted funds have been used in accordance with the purposes of this act.

SECTION 2. Organ Donor Awareness License Plate.

(a) The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration shall issue special "Organ Donor Awareness" motor vehicle license plates in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in this section.

(b)(1)(A) The Arkansas Regional Organ Recovery Agency may submit a design for the special Organ Donor Awareness motor vehicle license plates.

(B) The design shall be submitted to the director for design approval.

(2) The Arkansas Regional Organ Recovery Agency may periodically submit newly designed license plates for approval and issuance by the director, but not more than (1) license plate design shall be issued per calendar year.

(c)(1) Upon approval of the design by the director, there shall be remitted to the Department of Finance and Administration a fee in the amount of six thousand dollars (\$6,000.00) to cover the cost of the initial order of each newly designed license plate.

(2) The fee for the cost of initial orders shall be deposited to the State Central Services Fund for the benefit of the Revenue Division of the Department of Finance and Administration, and shall be credited as supplemental and in addition to all other funds as may be deposited for the benefit of the division.

(3) The fee for the cost of initial orders shall not be considered or credited to the division as "direct revenues".

(d)(1) Upon payment of the fee required by law for the registration of the vehicle, payment of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) to cover the design use contribution, and payment of an additional ten dollars (\$10.00) handling and administrative fee for the issuance of the special organ Donor Awareness plate, the department shall issue to the vehicle owner an Organ Donor Awareness license plate which shall bear the approved design.

(2) The handling and administrative fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) shall be deposited to the State Central Services Fund for the benefit of the division and shall not be considered or credited to the Revenue Division as "direct revenues".

(3) The design use contribution of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall be deposited in the Organ Donor Awareness Education Trust Fund to be used as provided in section 1 of this act.

(e)(1) Organ Donor Awareness license plates issued under this act may be

renewed annually in accordance with the procedures set out in this section and pursuant to Arkansas Code §§ 27-14-1012 and 27-14-1013.

(2) Registration may continue from year to year as long as it is renewed each year within the time and manner required by law.

(3) A motor vehicle owner who was previously issued a plate with the Organ Donor Awareness design authorized by this act and who does not pay a design use contribution of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) to the subsequent time of registration shall be issued a new plate which does not bear the Organ Donor Awareness design.

(4) Upon expiration, or if the special Organ Donor Awareness license plate is lost, it may be replaced with a regular license plate at the fee specified in § 27-14-602(b)(6).

(5) If the special Organ Donor Awareness license plate is replaced with a new Organ Donor Awareness license plate, the owner shall be required to additionally pay the administrative cost and design use contribution as set forth in this section.

(f) Organ Donor Awareness license plates issued under this act may be transferred from one vehicle to another pursuant to Arkansas Code § 27-14-914.

(g) The person applying for Organ Donor Awareness license plates shall comply with all other state motor vehicle laws relating to registration and licensing of motor vehicles, unless specifically provided otherwise in this act.

(h) The director shall promulgate such reasonable rules and regulations, and prescribe such forms as he determines to be necessary for effectively and efficiently carrying out the intent and purpose of this act.

SECTION 3. Voluntary Contributions.

(a)(1) The Revenue Division of the Department of Finance and Administration shall include on the Arkansas individual income tax forms, including those forms on which a husband and wife file separately on the same form and on all corporate income tax forms, the opportunity to allow taxpayers to voluntarily apply any amount of their tax refund for Organ Donor Awareness Education.

(2) Funds collected pursuant to this section shall be credited to the Organ Donor Education Awareness Trust Fund.

(b) The Director of the Department of Finance & Administration shall promulgate all rules and regulations and all income tax forms, returns, schedules, or other materials necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.

SECTION 4. Informational or Educational Booklets.

(a) If booklets or other information sources on the importance of organ donations are provided through the grant program established under section 1 of this act, the Revenue Division of the Department of Finance and Administration shall make the materials available to the public through the various offices of the Revenue Division.

(b) The booklets or other information sources shall be approved by the Department of Health.”

That flexibility is being accomplished by providing pool positions in subsection (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the agency broad powers under the pool position concept, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization of the pool positions by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council in the utilization of the growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, the entire section is void. If the agency requests continuation of this pool of positions as established herein during the next biennium, the positions must be requested as new positions in the agency's biennial budget request.
