Page 1, line 9, delete "REGARDING" and substitute "TO AMEND THE UNIFORM MANAGEMENT OF INSTITUTIONAL FUNDS ACT REGARDING"

AND

Page 1, line 14, delete "REGARDING" and substitute "TO AMEND THE UNIFORM MANAGEMENT OF INSTITUTIONAL FUNDS ACT REGARDING"

AND

Page 2, delete line 15 and substitute the following:  
"an institutional fund.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 28-69-603 is amended to read as follows:

28-69-603. ~~Appropriation of appreciation.~~ Expenditure of endowment funds.

(a) ~~The governing board may appropriate for expenditure for the uses and purposes for which an endowment fund is established so much of the net appreciation, realized and unrealized, in the fair value of the assets of an endowment fund over the historic dollar value of the fund as is expend so much of the endowment fund or an aggregation of the endowment fund as the governing body determines to be prudent under the standard established by § 28-69-607 for the uses and purposes for which an endowment fund is established.~~ This section does not limit the authority of the governing board to expend funds as permitted under other law, the terms of the applicable gift instrument, or the charter of the institution.

(b) Except as otherwise specified, this section applies to endowment funds established and instruments executed or in effect before or after the effective date of this subsection.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 28-69-604 is amended to read as follows:

28-69-604. Rule of construction.

~~Section 28-69-603 does not apply if the applicable gift instrument indicates the donor's intention that net appreciation shall not be expended.~~ (a) A restriction upon the expenditure of ~~net appreciation~~ an endowment fund may not be implied from a designation of a gift as an endowment, or from a direction or authorization in the applicable gift instrument to use only "income," "interest," "dividends," "net appreciation in the fair value of the assets of an endowment fund over the historic dollar value of the endowment," or "rents, issues or profits," or "to preserve the principal intact," or a direction which contains other words of similar import.

(b) This The rule of construction under subsection (a) of this section applies to endowment funds and gift instruments executed or in effect before or after March 20, 1992 the effective date of this subsection.

(c) The provisions of § 28-69-603(a) shall not apply to instruments if the instrument indicates by saying “I direct that the expenditure provisions of Arkansas Code § 28-69-603(a) not apply to this gift” or words of similar import reflecting a donor’s specific intent that § 28-69-603(a) not apply to the gift.

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 28-69-607 is amended to read as follows:  
28-69-607. Standard of conduct.

In the administration of the powers to ~~appropriate appreciation~~ expend endowment funds, to make and retain investments, and to delegate investment management of institutional funds, members of a governing board shall exercise ordinary business care and prudence under the facts and circumstances prevailing at the time of the action or decision. In so doing they shall consider long and short term needs of the institution in carrying out its educational, religious, charitable, or other eleemosynary purposes, its present and anticipated financial requirements, expected total return on its investments, price level trends, ~~and~~ general economic conditions, and the aggregate value of all endowment funds held by the institution.”

Amend [Senate Bill No. 935](#) as originally introduced:

Delete everything after the enacting clause and substitute the following:

“SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 8, Chapter 3, is amended by adding an additional subchapter to read as follows:

8-3-501. Short Title.

This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Arkansas Vapor Recovery System Trust Fund Act".

8-3-502. Legislative Findings and Declarations.

The General Assembly finds and declares that:

(1) The Environmental Protection Agency has promulgated revisions to the Federal Clean Air Act Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standards that make them much more stringent;

(2) Certain areas in Arkansas may violate the new ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standards;

(3) The Environmental Protection Agency may therefore designate one (1) or more areas in Arkansas air nonattainment for the ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard;

(4) A nonattainment designation would impose federal mandates on those areas resulting in an impediment to economic development;

(5) The expeditious reduction of emissions of air pollutants that are ozone precursors is needed for certain areas of Arkansas to avoid a nonattainment designation or minimize the amount of time it takes them to be reclassified as attainment;

(6) The voluntary installation of control equipment at Arkansas motor fuel dispensing facilities to minimize evaporative emissions of volatile organic contaminants will assist in reducing ambient ozone concentrations; and

(7) Providing owners or operators of the motor fuel dispensing facilities the funds to expeditiously install the control equipment to reduce the emissions will benefit the environment, public health, and economic development.

8-3-503. Definitions. For purposes of this subchapter:

(1) "Acquisition" means a transaction under which title to an item is transferred for consideration, or a lease for a period of at least three (3) years, regardless of whether title to the item is transferred at the end of the period;

(2)(A) "Allowable costs" means those costs which are approved by the department and derived directly from the installation and acquisition of a vapor recovery system at a motor fuel dispensing facility.

(B) "Allowable costs" does not include expenditures for land, feasibility studies, equipment used to service the vapor recovery system, service

contracts, sales tax, maintenance, and repair;

(3) "Commission" means the Arkansas Pollution Control and Ecology Commission;

(4) "Department" means the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality;

(5) "Director" means the Director of the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality;

(6) "Distributor" means any person, including the State of Arkansas and its political subdivision, but not including the United States of America or its instrumentalities, except to the extent permitted by the Arkansas Constitution or laws, who is customarily in the wholesale business of offering motor fuels for resale or delivery to dealers, consumers, or others in tanks of two hundred (200) gallons or more that are not connected to motor vehicles and is:

(A) Making the first sale in the State of Arkansas of any motor fuel, imported into the state from any state, territory, or foreign country, after it has been received within this state within the meaning of the Motor Fuel Tax Act, § 26-55-201 et seq.;

(B) Consuming or using in the State of Arkansas any motor fuel imported from out of this state and who has purchased it before it has been received by any other person in this state, within the meaning of the Motor Fuel Tax Law, § 26-55-201 et seq.; or

(C) Producing, refining, preparing, distilling, manufacturing, blending, or compounding motor fuel in this state;

(7) "Fund" means the Vapor Recovery System Fund created by this subchapter;

(8)(A) "Motor fuel dispensing facility" means a stationary facility that dispenses motor fuel to motor vehicles.

(B) "Motor fuel dispensing facility" does not include that portion of a facility or operation that consists of a terminal;

(9) "Operator" means any person in control of, or having responsibility for, the daily operation of the motor fuel dispensing facility;

(10) "Owner" means any person who owns a motor fuel dispensing facility;

(11) "Person" means any individual, corporation, company, firm, partnership, association, trust, joint stock company or trust, venture, municipal, state or federal government or agency, or any other legal entity;

(12) "Reasonable costs" means the costs or a range of costs commensurate with the costs necessary to acquire and install a vapor recovery system at a motor fuel dispensing facility, based upon an evaluation of typical costs expected for the particular vapor recovery system that is being acquired and installed;

(13)(A) "Supplier" means any person who is customarily in the wholesale business of offering distillate special fuels or liquefied gas special fuels for resale or use to any person in this state and who makes bulk sales of fuel.

(B) "Supplier" includes pipeline importers, first receivers, and second receivers;

(14) "Terminal" means a bulk storage facility for storing petroleum products supplied by a pipeline or marine vessels; and

(15) "Vapor recovery system" means equipment used to capture vapors associated with the transfer of motor fuel at a motor fuel dispensing facility and generally denominated by applicable federal or Arkansas regulations as:

(A) Stage one vapor recovery system, which is generally applicable to the transfer of motor fuel from a transport tank into a stationary storage tank; or

(B) Stage two vapor recovery system, which is generally applicable to the transfer of motor fuel from the stationary storage tank into a motor vehicle fuel tank.

8-3-504. Rules and regulations - Powers of department.

(a) The Director of the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality may adopt appropriate rules and regulations not inconsistent with this subchapter as the director may deem necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of and to assure compliance with this subchapter.

(b) The Arkansas Pollution Control and Ecology Commission may adopt appropriate rules and regulations not inconsistent with this subchapter to carry out the intent and purposes of and assure compliance with this subchapter.

(c) The department personnel may enter upon the property of any owner or operator of a motor fuel dispensing facility to obtain information, conduct surveys, or review records for the purpose of determining eligibility for reimbursement for installation of vapor recovery systems at any time.

8-3-505. Vapor Recovery System Trust Fund.

(a) There is created on the books of the Treasurer of State, the Auditor of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a fund to be known as the "Vapor Recovery System Trust Fund".

(b) The fund shall be administered by the Director of the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality, who shall make disbursements from the fund as authorized by this subchapter.

(c) The fund shall consist of gifts, grants, donations, and such other funds as may be made available by the General Assembly, including all interest earned upon money deposited in the fund, fees assessed under this subchapter, and any other moneys legally designed for the fund.

(d) Moneys in the fund may be expended by the director solely for the following purposes:

(1) To pay costs incurred by the Arkansas Pollution Control and Ecology Commission and the director in the performance of their duties under this subchapter; and

(2) To pay reimbursement to owners or operators of motor fuel dispensing facilities for the acquisition and installation of vapor recovery systems at certain motor fuel dispensing facilities as prescribed by this subchapter.

(e) The liability or obligation of the fund is not the liability or obligation of the State of Arkansas.

(f) Nothing in this subchapter shall be construed to abrogate or waive the provisions of the Arkansas Constitution, Article 5 § 20.

(g)(1) Five (5) years after the effective date of this subchapter, the fund shall no longer provide reimbursement for the acquisition and installation of vapor recovery systems as prescribed in § 8-3-507 and the fees collected shall be remitted to the counties in proportion to the rate of collection from the counties to be used for transportation improvements directly related to reducing motor vehicle emissions, including, but not limited to, congestion relief measures, traffic signal coordination, traffic management systems, air pollution reduction credit programs, ride sharing, driver information, incident management, and public transit.

(2) Expenditures shall be based upon a plan agreed upon by the county government, the municipalities in the county, the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department, and in counties in metropolitan statistical areas, the metropolitan planning organization.

8-3-506. Ozone precursor reduction fee.

(a) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, there is authorized an ozone precursor reduction fee of two cents (2¢) to be paid, on each gallon of motor fuel or distillate special fuel purchased in or imported into a county that has adopted an ordinance levying the fee.

(b) The commission may require that the ozone precursor reduction fee be levied in all counties that it deems are contributing to the failure of any county to

meet the air quality standards for ozone as determined by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, if through the normal regulatory process the commission requires the installation of vapor recovery systems at facilities that dispense motor fuel.

(c) The fee shall be paid by the first distributor or supplier receiving fuel from a terminal in this state, or, if the fuel will never be stored in a terminal in this state, then by the distributor or supplier who first imports fuel into this state by tanker truck.

(d) Exchanges of fuels on a gallon for gallon basis within a terminal or fuels exported from this state are exempt from the fee.

(e) Proof of payment shall be provided to the owner or operator.

(f) The fee shall be remitted to the Director of the Department of Finance and Administration at the time, in the manner, and on forms prescribed by the Director of the Department of Finance and Administration and may be collected and remitted at the same time and in the same manner as the motor fuels tax and special motor fuels tax under the Motor Fuel Tax law, § 26-55-201 et seq. and the Special Motor Fuels Tax Law, § 26-56-101 et seq.

(g) All fees shall be subject to collection and enforcement of collection under the Arkansas Tax Procedure Act, § 26-18-101 et seq.

#### 8-3-507. Payment for acquisition and installation of vapor recovery systems.

The fund shall reimburse an owner or operator of a motor fuel dispensing system the allowable costs and reasonable costs for the acquisition and installation of a vapor recovery system following proof that:

(1) The motor fuels dispensing system was constructed and in operation prior to the effective date of this subchapter; and

(2) The motor fuel dispensing system is located in a county that has levied the fee referenced in § 8-3-506; or

(3) The commission has promulgated a final regulation requiring that motor fuel dispensing facilities install vapor recovery systems.

#### 8-3-508. Procedures.

The procedures of the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality and the Arkansas Pollution Control and Ecology Commission for issuance of rules and regulations, conduct of hearings, notice, power of subpoena, right of appeal, presumptions, finality of actions, and related matters shall be as provided in §§ 8-4-202, 8-4-210, 8-4-214, 8-4-218, 8-4-229 to the extent that those statutes are not in conflict with the revisions of this subchapter.

#### 8-3-509. Audits.

(a) The Director of the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality may cause audits to be performed as necessary to ensure that the costs for which reimbursement is sought or has been paid were incurred and necessary, that the work was performed, and that reimbursement would be or is reasonable and allowable.

(b) The audits may be performed by the department or by any qualified person at the direction of the director.

(c) Moneys in the fund may be expended by the director as necessary to pay the cost of audits performed by persons other than the department.

#### 8-3-510. Cost recovery.

The Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality may initiate proceedings against any owner or operator for recovery of moneys that were solicited or received from the fund, regardless whether it was approved by the director, if the funds were solicited or received through willful or accidental utilization of incorrect information, the work was not performed or was unnecessary, or the equipment is not operable.

8-3-511. Fund liability.

All claims for reimbursement submitted under the provisions of this subchapter are subject to the availability of the moneys in the fund.

8-3-512. Confidential treatment of information.

(a) Any records, reports, or information obtained by the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality or its employees in the administration of this subchapter shall be kept confidential upon a showing satisfactory to the Director of the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality that the records, reports, or information would constitute a trade secret under §§ 4-75-601 through 4-75-607.

(b) As necessary to carry out the provisions of this subchapter, information afforded confidential treatment may be transmitted under a continuing claim of confidentiality to other officers or employees of the state or of the United States if the owner or operator of the facility to which the information pertains is informed of the transmittal and if the information has been acquired by the department under the provisions of this subchapter.

(c) The provisions of this section shall not be construed to limit the department's authority to release confidential information during emergency situations.

(d) Any violation of this section shall constitute an unclassified misdemeanor.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 26-55-209 is amended to read as follows:  
26-55-209. Local taxes prohibited.

Ne Except as provided in the Arkansas Vapor Recovery System Trust Fund Act, §§ 8-3-501 et seq. no city, village, town, county, township, or other subdivision or municipal corporation of this state shall levy or collect any excise tax upon or measured by the sale, receipt, or distribution of motor fuel."

Amend [Senate Bill No. 749](#) as originally introduced:

Delete all language after the enacting clause and substitute the following:

"SECTION 1. Purpose.

The purpose of this act is to clarify that the Adjutant General of Arkansas has the authority, acting in the best interests of the security and defense of the state and of the United States, to convey any estate in military real property of which the Adjutant General is custodian, by any lawful method of conveyance, upon the terms and conditions as he or she may deem appropriate, and subject to the approval of the United States.

SECTION 2. Findings.

The General Assembly finds that:

(1) The Adjutant General is the custodian of the military reservations and military property of the State of Arkansas;

(2) The United States retains a reversionary estate in all of the military reservations, and furthermore the United States retains various regulatory interests in and to other military properties located within the State of Arkansas;

(3) A conveyance of unneeded excess military real properties is subject to the consent of the United States acting by and through the Secretary of the Army or the Secretary of the Air Force;

(4) The disposal of military real properties is presently restricted by law to the disadvantage of the best interests of the people of the State of Arkansas;

(5) The authority of the Adjutant General to convey estates in military real property is unreasonably restricted; and

(6) The restrictions at law should be removed.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 12-63-305 is amended to read as follows:

12-63-305. ~~Sale, lease, rental, etc., of unused property~~ Conveyance or disposal of military real property.

~~(a)(1)(A) In case a National Guard unit stationed in any county shall cease to exist or the location of its headquarters is removed to another county or another location, or if for any other reason an armory, If the Adjutant General determines that any military reservation, armory, landing field, hanger, or any other estate in real property owned or possessed by the State of Arkansas for the use and benefit of the Arkansas National Guard or the armed forces of the United States becomes is no longer useful or necessary for National Guard or for other military purposes, then the Adjutant General shall have authority to sell, convey, or to otherwise dispose of the property. and,~~

(B) The Adjutant General may sell, convey, or otherwise dispose of property under this section by deed, lease, license, permit, or other instrument executed by him or her on behalf of, and in the name and behalf of, the State of Arkansas, to convey to the purchaser thereof, as the Adjutant General may approve, any property, or improvements thereon located, owned by the State of

~~Arkansas for the use and benefit of the Arkansas National Guard.~~

(C) The Adjutant General shall approve the price, consideration, and other terms and conditions related to the sale, conveyance, or other disposal of property under this section.

~~(2) The Adjutant General may also enter into agreements with cities, or counties, school boards, other political subdivisions of the state, or any other public entity, body, board, commission, agency, or governmental corporation to convey an estate in real property or other improvements formerly used for National Guard purposes to such city or county the political subdivision or public entity in the event the Adjutant General determines that the transfer would be in the better interest of the National Guard and the local community, where the city or county furnishes or has furnished land for an armory site subject to any reversionary interest that may exist with respect to the estate in favor of the State of Arkansas or of the United States.~~

(3) Any conveyance under this section is subject to approval of the Secretary of the Army or the Secretary of the Air Force, as the case may be, and in compliance with the applicable regulations and instructions.

(b)(1) When and if, in the judgment of the Adjutant General, the use of any parcel of real property or any armory, warehouse, or other improvements thereon located, owned by or leased to the State of Arkansas for the use and benefit of the Arkansas National Guard or any portion thereof is temporarily not required and not necessary for National Guard purposes, the Adjutant General shall have authority to lease or sublease such real property or portion thereof for such rental, and on such terms and conditions and for such period of time, as the Adjutant General shall deem to the best interest of the National Guard. The lease or sublease contract shall be executed by the Adjutant General, for and in the name and behalf of the State of Arkansas.

(2) Every lease contract shall contain suitable provision for the immediate suspension or termination thereof in the event of the occurrence of an emergency rendering the use of the property by the National Guard of Arkansas necessary for its military purposes and may provide for a refund, out of the Special Military Fund, to the lessee or sublessee, of rental paid in advance for the period covered by the lease during which the lessee or sublessee is by reason of the emergency deprived of the use of said property.

(c)(1)(A) Before the Adjutant General shall lease, rent, sell, convey, or otherwise dispose of any estate in any real such property or improvement on the property, other than a lease or rental for thirty (30) days or less for the use of real property, buildings, armories, airfields, or other improvements that are temporarily not required for military purposes, he shall publish a notice one (1) time in some newspaper published and having a general circulation in the county where the property is located state, at least ten (10) days prior to the date on which the property will be offered for sale, lease, or rent conveyance or disposal.

(B) The notice shall describe such the estate or property and notify all persons interested that the estate or property will be leased, rented, or sold conveyed or disposed, and of the conditions, terms, time, and place at which bids or requests for proposals shall be received therefor.

(2) Bids or proposals for the conveyance, disposal, purchase, or lease, or other disposition of the estate in any real property, substantially on the terms specified in the notice, shall be received by the Adjutant General at the time and place specified in the notice, in the form of open or sealed bids, or requests for proposals or sealed bids, as the Adjutant General may direct.

(3) Subject to the Adjutant General's right to reject all bids and proposals, the property shall be sold or leased conveyed to the person, firm, or corporation submitting the bid or proposal which, in the judgment of the Adjutant General, taking into consideration the amount to be paid and the terms of the lease or sale and conditions of the conveyance, is most advantageous to the security and interests of the State of Arkansas for the use and benefit of the National Guard and

the United States.

(d)(1) The purchase price, rental, or other moneys to be paid for the conveyance of the estate or property, or for the use thereof, for a period of more than thirty (30) days, under the terms, conditions, and consideration of the ~~sale or lease or sublease~~ conveyance shall be deposited in the State Treasury.

(c)(1)(A) The city administration of justice fund of each city may retain an amount equal to the amount which was collected by the city from court costs and filing fees for city administration of justice expense in the calendar year ending December 31, 1994, or the amount appropriated from court costs and filing fees by ordinance enacted prior to December 31, 1994, for city or county administration of justice expense from court costs and filing fees for the calendar year ending December 31, 1995, plus, for calendar years 1995 - 2001, an additional amount based upon the average percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers or its successor, as published by the United States Department of Labor for the two (2) years immediately preceding.

(B) The amount retained during calendar year 2002 and each calendar year thereafter shall be the amount retained during calendar year 2001.

(2) For the calendar year beginning January 1, 1998, the base amount to be retained shall be:

(A) Increased by any increase in the Consumer Price Index, as provided for in subdivision (c)(1) of this section;

(B) Decreased by eighty-five percent (85%) of the total dollar amount which was certified by the city as having been collected during calendar year 1994 for the purpose of funding the office and operation of the public defender and public defender investigator.

(d) Nothing in this act shall prevent the city from funding any additional costs for the administration of justice from other city funds.

Delete Section 1 in its entirety and substitute the following:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 17-87-102 is amended to add additional subdivisions to read as follows:

(9)(A) "Nursing services assignment" means that a registered nurse authorizes a person having no nursing license to perform one or more basic tasks of client care with knowledge that the unlicensed person has been taught the task and is competent in performing the task.

(B) Assignment may require that a licensed nurse periodically supervise and evaluate the unlicensed person performing the basic task of client care.

(C) The need for and intervals of supervision and evaluation is at the discretion of the registered nurse;

(10)(A) "Nursing services delegation" means that a registered nurse authorizes a person having no nursing license to perform special tasks of client care, nursing care, or both, in selected situations and makes that authorization in writing.

(B) The delegation process includes nursing assessment of a client in a specific situation, evaluation of the ability of the unlicensed person, teaching the task, and ensuring supervision;

(11)(A) "Supervision" means that a registered nurse at periodic intervals, assesses and evaluates the condition of the client, reviews the procedures and directions established for the provision of client care, nursing care, or both, or for the administration of noninjectable medications by a person having no nursing license.

(B) The intervals shall be determined by the registered nurse based on the condition of the client, the nursing care task being performed, and the type and amount of medication administered;

(12) "Client care" means procedures that do not require the education or training of a licensed nurse, but that cannot be performed by the client independently, and procedures that may be directed by the client, including activities of daily living and administration of noninjectable medications;

(13) "Administration of medications" means removal of an individual dose from a previously dispensed, properly labeled container, including a unit dose container, verifying it with the physician's or nurse practitioner's order, giving the individual dose to the proper client at the proper time by the proper route, and promptly recording the time and dose given; and

(14)(A) "Stable condition" means a situation where the client's clinical and behavioral state is known, not characterized by rapid changes, and does not require continuous reassessment and evaluation.

(B) "Stable condition" includes situations where the client's deteriorating condition is predictable.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-87-103 is amended to add an additional

subdivision to read as follows:

(11) The assignment, delegation, or both, of nursing services in settings where the regularly scheduled presence of a registered nurse is not required by statute or administrative rule.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 17, Chapter 87, Subchapter 1 is amended to add additional sections to read as follows:

17-87-107. (a) A registered nurse may delegate special tasks of nursing care, including the administration of subcutaneous injectable medications.

(b) A registered nurse may delegate the administration of medications by the intravenous route through a central venous catheter to one unlicensed person, specific to one client, provided the following conditions are met:

(1) The delegation is done by a registered nurse;

(2) The delegation is limited to flushing the line with routine flushing solutions; and

(3) A registered nurse is available on call for consultation, intervention, or both, twenty-four (24) hours each day.

(c)(1) A registered nurse may delegate the administration of a bolus of medication by pushing a button on a preprogrammed pump.

(2) Subdivision (c)(1) applies to any route of administration.

(d) A registered nurse may not delegate the administration of medications by the intramuscular route.

(e) A registered nurse may teach and delegate a task of nursing care to one unlicensed person, specific to one client, under the following conditions:

(1) The client's condition is stable;

(2) The registered nurse considers the nature of the nursing care task to be provided, its complexity, the risks involved, and the necessary skill needed to perform the task;

(3) The registered nurse assesses the client's condition and determines if the person having no nursing license is capable to perform the task in the absence of direct registered nurse supervision;

(4) The registered nurse determines how frequently the client's condition shall be reassessed to determine the appropriateness of the continued delegation of the task to the person having no nursing license;

(5) The registered nurse evaluates the ability of the person having no nursing license to perform the nursing care task;

(6) The registered nurse documents the rationale for deciding that this task can be delegated to the unlicensed person; and

(7) The delegating registered nurse or another registered nurse designated by the delegating registered nurse may be contacted by the person to whom the delegation was made.

(f) A registered nurse may delegate a client specific task of nursing care to additional persons having no nursing license provided that the registered nurse limits the number of unlicensed persons to the number who will remain proficient in performing the task and can be safely supervised by the registered nurse.

(g) A registered nurse shall use the following process to delegate a special task of nursing care:

(1) Assess the client's condition;

(2) Evaluate the skills and ability of the person having no nursing license;

(3) Teach the task of nursing care including:

(A) The proper procedure and technique;

(B) The risks associated with performing the task;

(C) Anticipated side effects; and

(D) The appropriate response to untoward or side effects;

(4) Observe the person having no nursing license performing the task to ensure that the person performs the task safely and accurately;

(5) Leave written instructions for performance of the task for the unlicensed person to use as a reference;

(6) Instruct the unlicensed person that the task is specific to this client only and is not transferable to other clients or taught to other care providers;

(7) Assess the client and supervise the person having no nursing license at least every sixty (60) days;

(8) Document compliance with subdivisions (1)-(7); and

(A) The rationale used to determine that the skill of the person having no nursing license is appropriate to the client's condition;

(B) The teaching process and outcome;

(C) How frequently the client should be reassessed;

(D) The frequency and method by which the person having no nursing license will be supervised; and

(E) That the registered nurse takes responsibility for teaching and delegating the task to an unlicensed person and will ensure that supervision will occur for as long as the registered nurse is supervising the performance of the delegated task.

(h) A registered nurse may rescind an assignment or delegation at any time for cause or without cause by delivery of written notice to the person to whom the delegation was made.

17-87-108. A registered nurse who assigns or delegates care to another person in compliance with this subchapter shall not be subject to licensure action or to an action for civil damages due to the performance of a person to whom care is assigned or delegated unless the person is acting in conformity with specific instructions from the registered nurse or the registered nurse fails to leave instructions when required to do so."

  - (A) Voluntary response actions will protect human health and the environment and be conducted in accordance with applicable federal and state laws; and
  - (B) If the person conducting the voluntary response action fails to complete the necessary response activities, including operation and maintenance or long-term monitoring activities, the necessary response activities are completed;
- (5) Mechanisms for approval of a voluntary response action plan; and
- (6) A requirement for certification or similar documentation from the state to the person conducting the voluntary response action indicating that the response is complete.

(b) The department may establish and administer a revolving loan fund to make secured and unsecured loans or grants to eligible participants for the purpose of financing the assessment, investigation, or remedial actions at abandoned industrial, commercial, or agricultural sites.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that there is an urgent need to return abandoned, idled, and underused industrial, commercial, and agricultural properties,

more than ~~thirty (30)~~ forty-five (45) days after the release of lien by a prior lienholder, as provided in § 27-14-909, or ~~thirty (30)~~ forty-five (45) days after the transfer date if no lien exists, unless a valid registration plate is properly attached thereto.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 27-14-907(a), concerning the transfer of the title to the motor vehicle, is amended to read as follows:

(a)(1) Whenever the title or interest of an owner in or to a registered vehicle shall pass to another by a method other than voluntary transfer, the registration of the vehicle shall expire, and the vehicle shall not be operated upon public streets or highways for more than ~~thirty (30)~~ forty-five (45) days after the transfer date unless a valid registration plate is attached thereto.

“SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 10 is amended to add an additional subchapter to read as follows:

20-10-1901. Title.

This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the “Arkansas Nursing

Home Tort Reform Act of 2003”.

20-10-1902. Purpose and intent.

(a) The purpose and intent of this subchapter is to ensure that persons receiving long-term care in skilled nursing facilities licensed to operate in this state to, when appropriate, receive compensation for their damages.

(b) This subchapter authorizes the creation of a liability insurance pool known as the Patient’s Recovery Fund to provide a secure and sustainable source of funds to satisfy personal injury claims by or on behalf of patients of participating facilities.

20-10-1903. Definitions.

As used in this subchapter:

(1) “Action for injury” means any civil action, whether based in tort, contract, or otherwise, to recover damages on account of an injury to a patient of any skilled nursing facility;

(2) “Affiliate” means any person or entity controlling, controlled by, or under common control with a skilled nursing facility;

(3) “Board” means the Patient’s Recovery Fund Board created by this subchapter;

(4)(A) “Claim” means a demand for recovery of damages from the Patient’s Recovery Fund, whether based in tort, contract, or otherwise, on account of an injury to a patient of a participating facility.

(B) A claim may be brought by the patient, or by the guardian, representative, executor, administrator, or person acting on behalf of the patient, including a third party whose right to recover damages is derivative of the legal rights of the patient;

(5) “Claimant” means the person or persons alleging a claim or action for injury against a skilled nursing facility;

(6) “Injury” means the personal injury or death of a patient of a skilled nursing facility arising out of or sustained in the course of the services rendered to the patient by the facility, its owners, principals, officers, employees, agents, and affiliates, or any person or entity providing management services to the facility, or arising out of, or sustained in the course of, the relationship between the patient and the facility, its owners, principals, officers, employees, agents and affiliates, or person or entity providing management services to the facility;

(7) “Occupied beds” means:

(A) Beds occupied by patients at midnight;

(B) Those beds placed on hold during a period of time not to exceed five (5) consecutive calendar days during which a patient is in a hospital bed; and

(C) Those beds placed on hold during a period of time not to exceed fourteen (14) consecutive calendar days during which a patient is on therapeutic home leave;

(8)(A) “Participating facility” means a skilled nursing facility that participates in and contributes to the Patient’s Recovery Fund, including the owners, principals, officers, employees, agents, medical director and affiliates of the skilled nursing facility.

(B) “Participating facility” does not include any unaffiliated person or entity providing management services to the facility;

(9) “Patient” means a person receiving care or treatment from a skilled nursing facility;

(10) “Skilled nursing facility” means a “long-term care facility” as defined by § 20-10-214(4); and

(11) “Wrongful act” means any act or conduct, whether by commission or omission, which is a proximate cause of an injury.

20-10-1904. Civil Reparations Trust Fund.

If a punitive damages award is adjudged against a skilled nursing facility, fifty

percent (50%) of the punitive damages awarded, after payment of all applicable costs and fees including reasonable attorneys' fees, shall be ordered by the administrator of the Patient's Recovery Fund, administrative law judge, or circuit court to be paid to the claimant, with the remainder of the award to be ordered paid into the Civil Reparations Trust Fund to be administered by the Treasurer of State and to be allocated for payment of Medicaid expenditures, independent living opportunities for seniors, or in home health care as directed by the General Assembly.

20-10-1905. Patient's Recovery Fund – Participation.

(a)(1) The Patient's Recovery Fund is created for the payment of valid claims and judgments against participating facilities.

(2)(A) Each participating facility shall remit monthly assessments to the fund, or make payments to the fund in lieu of assessments, based upon the number of occupied beds as of the first business day of each month.

(B) Assessments may be prepaid upon terms approved by the board.

(C) Assessments and other payments, together with earned income, surplus, and all other moneys accruing to the fund, shall be held in trust by the board for the purposes provided in this subchapter.

(b)(1) The fund shall not be deposited or maintained in the state treasury, but shall be a cash fund under the direction and control of the board, as provided by this subchapter.

(2) The fund shall not be subject to regulation by the State Insurance Department.

(c)(1) Only claims and judgments arising from a wrongful act or acts that occur during a period of participation in the fund shall be covered by the fund.

(2) The fund shall offer tail coverage to participating facilities upon terms approved by the board.

(d)(1) A skilled nursing facility which is certified to provide services under Title XVIII or Title XIX of the Social Security Act shall participate in and contribute to the fund as a condition of maintaining its license to provide long-term care in this state.

(2)(A) A participating facility shall be dismissed as a participant in the fund for nonpayment of assessments or payments in lieu of assessments, as determined by the rules and regulations of the fund.

(B) The board shall provide by regulation for a grace period for curing a default in the payment of assessments or other payments before formal dismissal and may impose a late fee not to exceed twenty dollars (\$20.00) per occupied bed per event of default.

(C) Upon dismissal of a facility from the fund, wrongful acts occurring during the facility's prior period or periods of participation shall be covered.

(e)(1) A participating facility may be dismissed from the fund and shall not have any of the privileges or benefits of the fund upon a determination by the board or a court that the facility provides a substandard quality of care.

(2) Substandard quality of care is:

(A) Any deficiency in 42 CFR 483.13, Resident Behavior and Facility Practices, 42 CFR 483.15 Quality of Life, or 42 CFR 483.25 Quality of Care, that constitutes immediate jeopardy to resident health or safety;

(B) A pattern of or widespread actual harm that is not immediate jeopardy;

(C) A widespread potential for more than minimal harm that is not immediate jeopardy, with no actual harm; or

(D) A violation of any criminal law while providing care to a resident.

20-10-1906. Election by participating facility – Initial assessments and

payments.

(a) A participating facility may elect:

(1) To carry a higher deductible, or to retain a higher limit of its risk, by providing evidence satisfactory to the board that it is qualified to fund its risks of loss and that the facility or its affiliate maintains segregated accounts to fund the deductible and self insured retention losses;

(2) To purchase commercial insurance coverage by providing proof of the coverage to the board; or

(3) To accept the insurance coverage provided by the Patient's Recovery Fund and to pay monthly assessments as provided in this subchapter.

(b) A participating facility that elects to self insure or to purchase commercial insurance:

(1) Shall maintain coverage of not less than three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000) per claim and an annual aggregate limit of coverage of not less than seven hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000);

(2) Shall pay an administrative fee to the fund in lieu of monthly assessments, as provided in § 20-10-1912(c)(2); and

(3)(A) Shall participate in the fund upon equal terms with other participating facilities.

(B) However, the fund shall not pay claims or judgments on behalf of the facility, unless, and only to the extent that, the facility acquires coverage from the funds;

(c)(1) Assessments and payments in lieu of assessments shall be paid beginning January, 2004, based upon the number of occupied beds as of the first business day of the month.

(2)(A) The initial amount of the aggregate annual assessment, payable monthly, shall be one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per occupied bed.

(B) The initial amount of the annual administrative fee in lieu of assessments shall be two hundred dollars (\$200) per occupied bed.

20-10-1907. Initial limits of coverage and deductible.

With respect to participating facilities which elect to accept the insurance coverage provided by the Patient's Recovery Fund:

(1) The initial amount of the per claim limit of coverage shall be three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000);

(2) The initial amount of the annual aggregate limit of coverage per participating facility shall be seven hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000); and

(3) The initial amount of the deductible shall be ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per claim.

20-10-1908. Patient's Recovery Fund Board – Powers and duties.

(a)(1)(A) There is created the Patient's Recovery Fund Board to consist of the following five (5) members:

(i) A physician licensed in this state;

(ii) A registered nurse licensed in this state;

(iii) A certified public accountant licensed in this state;

(iv) An attorney licensed in this state; and

(v) A private citizen who is a resident of this state.

(B) The initial board shall be appointed on or before August 1, 2003.

(C) The Arkansas Trial Lawyers Association shall submit two (2) nominees for the attorney position from which the Attorney General shall appoint the attorney member of the board.

(D) The Arkansas Health Care Association shall submit two (2) nominees for the physician position from which the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint the physician member of the board.

(E) The Arkansas Health Care Association shall submit two (2)

nominees for the registered nurse position from which the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint the registered nurse member of the board.

(F) The American Association of Retired Persons shall submit two (2) nominees for the private citizen position from which the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint the private citizen member of the board.

(G) The Governor shall appoint the certified public accountant member of the board.

(2)(A) The initial terms shall be staggered so that the certified public accountant and the private citizen members shall serve for three (3) years, the attorney member and the nurse member shall serve for two (2) years, and the physician shall serve for one (1) year.

(B) Subsequent terms shall be three (3) years.

(C) Directors shall be eligible for reappointment for one (1) additional three (3) year term.

(3) The certified public accountant member shall be the chair of the board and the attorney member shall serve as the secretary.

(b)(1)(A) A board member whose term expires, or who resigns, or becomes incapacitated, shall be replaced within forty-five (45) days after the vacancy or expiration of the term from a list of two (2) nominees of the same profession or standing, just as set forth in subsection (a) furnished to the official responsible for the appointment of the position, except that the Governor shall choose his or her appointee as set forth in subsection (a) of this section.

(B) If a successor is not appointed within the forty-five (45) day period, the remaining board members shall select an interim board member of the same profession or standing who shall serve for the new term or the unexpired portion of the term, as the case may be.

(2) A director whose term expires shall continue to serve until his or her successor is appointed.

(c) The board shall supervise the management and activities of the Patient's Recovery Fund.

(d) Each director shall be compensated from the fund at the rate of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150) per hour devoted to official board activities, not to exceed one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) each month, plus out-of-pocket expenses incurred within the state, documented by appropriate receipts.

(e) Board members shall be immune from suit while acting in their official capacities, except for intentional wrongful acts or violation of fiduciary duty.

(f)(1) The board shall have the power and discretion, after notice to the affected participating facilities and a hearing, to determine the amount of:

(A) The aggregate annual assessment per occupied bed and the annual administrative fee in lieu of assessments;

(B) The per claim limit of coverage, so long as it is not lowered below two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000);

(C) The annual aggregate limit of coverage per participating facility so long as it is not lowered below five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000); and

(D) The amount of the per claim deductible.

(2) Notice of a change in the amounts prescribed in subsection (f), or any of them, shall be given to the affected participating facilities not less than sixty (60) days before the effective date of the change.

(g)(1) The board shall determine terms, conditions, and charges for providing tail coverage to participating facilities and shall have the power and discretion to offer supplemental coverage to participating facilities upon terms approved by the board.

(2) However, supplemental coverage shall be not less than two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) per claim.

(h) The board shall have the power to:

(1) Enter into contracts;

- (2) Sue and be sued, in its own name;
- (3) Borrow public or private funds in amounts and upon terms as may be negotiated with a creditor or creditors, subject to otherwise applicable laws; and
- (4)(A) Assess an annual surcharge upon the assessments of a participating facility, after notice and a hearing, which demonstrates a disproportionately high history of payable claims, judgments, or arbitral awards, not to exceed two hundred dollars (\$200) per occupied bed.
  - (i)(1) The board shall promulgate rules and regulations to govern:
    - (A) The terms and conditions of participation in the fund;
    - (B) The administration of the fund, including the collection, management, and disposition of fund assets, and
    - (C) The procedures for resolution of claims.

20-10-1909. Administrator – Powers and duties.

- (a)(1) The board shall employ an administrator of the Patient's Recovery Fund who is a graduate of an accredited four-year college or university with at least ten (10) years experience in the field of risk management or business administration.
- (2) All qualifications, terms, and conditions of employment, including compensation, which shall be paid from the fund, shall be at the sole discretion of the board.
- (3) The board shall employ the administrator in sufficient time for the administrator to assume the duties of office on or before January 1, 2004.
  - (b) The administrator shall conduct and supervise the business affairs of the fund, under a written business plan approved by the board.
  - (c) With board approval, the administrator may purchase or lease appropriate office space, equipment, and other necessary assets for the use of the fund, and may expend fund moneys for all other necessary and appropriate purposes, subject to the rules and regulations of the fund.
  - (d) The administrator shall exercise best efforts to locate and approve a list of commercial insurance carriers to offer supplemental insurance coverage in aggregate amounts of up to two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) at negotiable rates.

20-10-1910. Patient's Recovery Fund Advisory Board.

- (a)(1) There is created the Patient's Recovery Fund Advisory Board to consist of:
  - (A) The State Insurance Commissioner;
  - (B) The Attorney General;
  - (C) The Director of the Department of Human Services;
  - (D) One (1) director appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Arkansas Senate; and
  - (E) One (1) director appointed by the Speaker of the Arkansas House of Representatives.
- (2) The directors appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall serve for terms of two (2) years and shall be eligible for reappointment for one (1) additional three (3) year term.
  - (b)(1) The advisory board shall advise the fund board and the administrator on the proper execution of the Patient's Recovery Fund and the business plan approved by the fund board.
    - (2)(A) The advisory board shall meet not less often than semiannually to review and examine financial statements and progress reports, prepared by the administrator and previously reviewed by the board, and to advise the administrator and the fund board of the sufficiency of the reports.
    - (B) The financial statements shall include a balance sheet and

income statement, prepared according to generally accepted accounting principles.

(C) The financial statements and progress reports shall be subject to public inspection.

(3) The advisory board shall issue an annual financial report prepared and certified by a certified public accountant on the first business day of July of each year, which shall be subject to public inspection.

20-10-1911. Accumulation of fund assets – Disposition.

(a) All moneys held by the Patient Recovery Fund shall be deposited in banks located within the state or shall be invested in obligations which are permitted investments for the board of trustees of any public employee retirement system of any political subdivision of the state.

(b) An accurate inventory of all personal property of the fund shall be maintained at all times.

(c) The fund may be used for the following purposes:

(1) The payment and satisfaction of claims or judgments;

(2) The payment of reasonable fees and expenses incurred by counsel employed by the fund; and

(3) The payment of the costs of operation of the fund, including but not limited to, compensation, fees, and ordinary business expenses.

20-10-1912. Participating facilities – Employment of counsel.

(a) Upon request by a participating facility, other than a participating facility that maintained commercial insurance coverage for the relevant period, the Patient's Recovery Fund shall employ counsel to defend any action for injury against the facility to recover damages on account of an injury to a patient.

(b)(1) Fees and expenses incurred by counsel employed by the fund shall be paid by the fund.

(2) However, the administrator of the Patient's Recovery Fund has the authority to determine the reasonableness of the fees and expenses, subject to the rules and regulations of the fund.

(3) A participating facility shall be able to put the Patient's Recovery Fund on notice of the filing of the civil lawsuit and the fund shall retain counsel on behalf of the participating facility at the expense of the fund.

(4) A claim against a participating facility which accrues during the participation of the facility shall be submitted to the administrator of the Patient's Recovery Fund by the claimant on forms created by the administrator and made readily available to the claimant.

(b) After the participating facility has responded to the claim, the administrator has the sole authority to approve or to settle any claim against a participating facility to the extent of the applicable limit of coverage provided by the fund, including the deductible.

20-10-1913. Payment of claims.

(a) With respect to a participating facility which maintained coverage from the Patient's Recovery Fund for the relevant period, a claim that has been approved or settled by the administrator of the Patient's Recovery Fund, or a claim that has been adjudicated to a final judgment of a circuit court, shall be paid as follows:

(1) The participating facility shall pay the deductible and the self-insured portion of the award, if any, that were in effect when the claim or action for injury accrued; and

(2) If commercial insurance coverage is inapplicable, the fund shall pay the balance of the award to the claimant, subject to the per claim limit of coverage and the annual aggregate limit of coverage per participating facility in effect when the claim or action for injury, exclusive of fees and expenses, accrued.

(b)(1)(A) Claims and judgments that become final or unappealable during the first six (6) months of the calendar year shall be paid by the fund on the following

August 15.

(B) Claims and judgments that become final or unappealable during the last six (6) months of the calendar year shall be paid by the fund no later than February 15.

(2)(A) If the balance in the fund is insufficient to pay in full all claims and judgments that have become final or unappealable during a six-month period, the award paid to each claimant shall be prorated.

(B) Any amount left unpaid as a result of the proration shall be paid before the payment of claims and judgments that become final or unappealable during any subsequent six-month period.

(c)(1) Prejudgment interest shall not be payable on any claim or judgment.

(2)(A) Simple interest at the rate of six percent (6%) per annum shall be paid on the unpaid balance of a claim or judgment from and after August 15 or February 15, as the case may be.

(B) However, in any action for injury that is tried before a jury, post judgment interest shall be payable as provided by law.

20-10-1914. No provision of this subchapter shall apply to, or alter existing law, with respect to any claim, charge, action, or suit brought or prosecuted by the Attorney General.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 19, Chapter 5, Subchapter 11 is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:

19-5-1123. Civil Reparations Trust Fund.

(a) There is created on the books of the Treasurer of State, Auditor of State, and Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a trust fund to be known as the "Civil Reparations Trust Fund".

(b) The fund shall consist of those moneys collected and used for the purposes provided under § 20-10-1922.

(c)(1) The moneys credited to the fund shall be held as trust funds in interest bearing accounts only.

(2) All interest earned shall be credited to the fund and shall be used only for the purposes of the fund.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 10, Subchapter 1 is amended to add additional sections to read as follows:

20-10-109. Continuous quality improvement programs.

(a)(1) Any provider of long-term medical care in a facility that participates in an insurance pool created for the purpose of accumulating funds to satisfy residents' claims against the provider shall demonstrate a commitment to providing a high degree of quality of care for its residents as a condition for participation in the fund.

(2) The provider shall demonstrate the required commitment through participation in a continuous quality improvement program.

(3) A continuous quality improvement program shall include at least four (4) of the following:

(A) Customer satisfaction surveys;

(B) Physical restraints;

(C) Staff satisfaction surveys;

(D) Pressure ulcers;

(E) Staff turnover;

(F) Office of Long-Term Care survey inspections; and

(G) Nutrition and hydration.

(b) A provider shall demonstrate continuous active participation in a continuous quality improvement program in a manner satisfactory to the governing body of the insurance pool.

(c) The continuous quality improvement program shall be an administrative expense in the Office of Long-Term Care reimbursement manual, and shall be

incurred against each participating facility.

20-10-110. Nurses aide training.

All long-term care facilities eligible to receive Medicaid reimbursements shall require nurse aides to:

(1) Complete a state-approved training and competency evaluation program;

or

(2) Demonstrate competence through satisfactory participation in a state-approved nurses aide training and competency evaluation program that include at least sixteen (16) hours of training in the following subjects before any direct contact with the resident:

(A) Communication and interpersonal skills;

(B) Infection control;

(C) Safety and emergency procedures, two (2) hours of which shall be specific to the facility in which the nurse aide is employed, and including the Heimlich maneuver;

(D) Promoting resident's independence; and

(E) Respecting resident's rights.

SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that adequate commercial insurance coverage at affordable rates is not available for nursing homes in this state; that lawsuits and claims that may become lawsuits threaten the financial stability of nursing homes; that patients of nursing homes do not have recourse to adequate sources of funds to redress legitimate claims for personal injury; and that existing procedures are inadequate to protect the interests of nursing homes and of those persons, primarily the elderly, who are in need of long-term care. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.”

(3)(A) "Gross receipts" means gross receipts paid as compensation for services provided to residents of a ten (10) bed intermediate care for the mentally retarded facility including, but not limited to, client participation.

(B) "Gross receipts" does not mean charitable contributions;

(4) "Medicaid" means the Medical Assistance Program established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, as in effect on January 1, 2003, and administered by the division;

(5) "Midnight census" means the count of:

(A) Each patient occupying a ten (10) bed intermediate care for the mentally retarded facility bed at midnight of each day;

(B) Those beds placed on hold during a period of time not to exceed five (5) consecutive calendar days during which a patient is in a hospital bed; and

(C) Those beds placed on hold during a period of time not to exceed fourteen (14) consecutive calendar days during which a patient is on therapeutic home leave;

(6) "Multiplier" means the fixed dollar amount used to calculate the quality program assessment;

(7) "Resident days" means the number of patients in a ten (10) bed intermediate care for the mentally retarded facility as determined by the midnight census; and

(8)(A) "Ten (10) bed intermediate care for the mentally retarded facility" means a facility licensed by the Office of Long-Term Care and an intermediate care facility for the mentally retarded in the under fifteen (15) bed category;

(B) "Ten (10) bed intermediate care for the mentally retarded facility" does not mean offices of private physicians and surgeons, boarding homes, residential care facilities, intermediate care facilities for the mentally retarded, hospitals, institutions operated by the federal government or licensed by the Division of Developmental Disabilities Services of the Department of Human Services, or any facility which is conducted by and for those who rely exclusively upon treatment by prayer for healing in accordance with tenets or practices of any recognized religious denomination.

SECTION 2. Calculation of quality program assessment.

(a) There is levied a quality program assessment on ten (10) bed intermediate care for the mentally retarded facilities to be calculated in accordance with subsections (b) of this section.

(b)(1) The quality program assessment shall be an amount determined each month by multiplying the patient days as reported by each ten (10) bed intermediate care for the mentally retarded facility for each day of the month by the multiplier.

(2) Each multiplier shall be:

(A) Calculated by the division to produce an aggregate annual quality program assessment payment equal to six percent (6%) of the aggregate annual gross receipts; and

(B) Subject to prospective adjustment as necessary for annual aggregate quality program assessment payments to equal six percent (6%) of the aggregate annual gross receipts.

(c)(1) On and after July 1, 2003, and annually thereafter, the multiplier shall be determined using the patient days and gross receipts reported to the division for a period of at least six (6) months and shall be annualized.

(2) The division shall determine the six-month period to be used in order to calculate the multiplier.

SECTION 3. Reporting and collection.

(a) On the tenth day of the first full month following the effective date of this act, and on the tenth day of each month thereafter, each ten (10) bed intermediate care for the mentally retarded facility shall file a report with the division listing the

patient days for the preceding month.

(b) The quality program assessment shall be due and payable for the previous month by the thirtieth of each month.

(c) The payment of the quality program assessment by the ten (10) bed intermediate care for the mentally retarded facilities shall be reported as an allowable cost for Medicaid reimbursement purposes.

#### SECTION 4. Administration.

(a) The administration of this act shall be exercised by the director and shall be subject to the provisions of the Arkansas Administrative Procedure Act.

(b)(1) The division, in accordance with the Arkansas Administrative Procedure Act, shall promulgate rules and regulations and prescribe forms for:

(A) The proper imposition and collection of the quality program assessment;

(B)(i) The enforcement of this act including, but not limited to, license non renewal, letters of caution, sanctions, or fines.

(ii) The fine shall be at least five hundred dollars (\$500) but no more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

(iii) The fine and outstanding quality program assessments shall accrue interest at the maximum rate permitted by law from the date the quality program assessment is due until payment of the quality program assessment and the fine;

(C) The format for reporting by all ten (10) bed intermediate care for the mentally retarded facilities, the total patient days and gross receipts; and

(D) The administration of the provisions of this act.

(2) The rules and regulations shall not grant any exceptions to, or exceptions from, the quality program assessment.

(c)(1) The quality program assessment charged and collected under this act shall be deposited within a newly established account.

(2) The designated account shall be separate and distinct from the general fund and shall be supplementary to the Arkansas Medicaid Program Trust Fund.

(3) Funds in the account derived from ten (10) bed intermediate care for the mentally retarded facilities that are not operated by a governmental entity shall not be used to replace other general revenues appropriated and funded by the General Assembly or other revenues used to support Medicaid.

(4) This designated account shall be exempt from budgetary cuts, reductions, or eliminations caused by a deficiency of general revenues.

(5) Earnings on investments from this designated account shall remain a part of the designated account and shall not be deposited in the general fund.

(d)(1) Except as necessary to reimburse any funds borrowed to supplement funds in the designated account, the designated account moneys in the trust fund and the matching federal financial participation under Title XIX of the Social Security Act for expenditures from the Arkansas Medicaid Program Trust Fund, shall only be used to reimburse additional costs paid to Medicaid certified ten (10) bed intermediate care for the mentally retarded facilities under Arkansas' State Medicaid Long-Term Care Cost Reimbursement Methodologies.

(2) No ten (10) bed intermediate care for the mentally retarded facility shall be guaranteed, expressly or otherwise, that any additional moneys paid to the facility will equal or exceed the amount of its quality program assessment.

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 20-19-102 is amended to read as follows:

20-19-102. Injuries to domesticated animals by dogs.

(a)(1) "Domesticated animals" includes, but is not limited to, sheep, goats, horses, cattle, swine, and poultry.

(2) Any person owning or having in possession or under control any dog shall be liable in damages to the owner or owners of any domesticated animals killed or injured by the dog in the full value of the domesticated animal killed or injured.

(b)(1) Any person engaged in raising domesticated animals or owning any domesticated animals who shall sustain any loss or damages to his or their domesticated animals by any dog shall have a right of action against the owner, person, or controller of the dog.

(2) Any person knowing that any dog has killed or is about to catch, injure, or kill any domesticated animal shall have the right to kill the dog, without in

any way being liable to the owner of the dog in any courts of this state.

(3) Any person who knows, or has reasonable cause to know, that any animal is stray, abandoned, or diseased and may be a threat to his person or property shall have the legal privilege to kill such animal and shall be immune from judicial action both civil and criminal.

(c) The person sustaining loss or damage as mentioned in this section and desiring remuneration therefor may go before some justice of the peace of the county wherein the loss or damage occurred and make oath of the character of the loss or damage sustained, the value of the loss or damage, the dog or dogs, and the owner, possessor, or controller of the dog and file the same with the justice, who shall issue a summons stating the nature of the plaintiff's claim, the amount claimed, and the cost accrued, which shall be served and returned as in ordinary actions.

(d)(1) If the defendant shall pay to the officer serving the summons the amount of damages claimed, the costs endorsed, and a further fee to the officer of twenty-five cents (25¢) for making the return, the summons shall be returned satisfied, and no further proceedings had.

(2) If the defendant fails, neglects, or refuses to pay that amount, the justice shall try the cause as in other ordinary actions and give judgment in favor of plaintiff for the amount proved in the cause, for which the defendant may be liable by the provisions of this section.

(e) In a second suit and recovery by any plaintiff against the same defendant on account of killing or injury done by the same dog, the justice shall render judgment for double the amount of damages proven.

(3) "Cigarettes" means and includes any roll for smoking made wholly or in part of tobacco, irrespective of size or shape and whether or not the tobacco is flavored, adulterated, or mixed with any other ingredient, the wrapper or cover of which is made of paper or any other substance or material, except tobacco;

(4)(A) "Cost to the retailer" means the basic cost of the cigarettes involved to the retailer plus the cost of doing business by the retailer as evidenced by the standards and methods of accounting regularly employed by him or her and must include, without limitation, labor including salaries of executives and officers, rent, depreciation, selling costs, maintenance of equipment, delivery costs, all types of licenses, taxes, insurance, and advertising.

(B) In the absence of proof of a lesser or higher cost of doing business by the retailer making the sale, the cost of doing business by the retailer shall be presumed to be six percent (6%) of the basic cost of cigarettes to the retailer.

(C) In the case of any retail dealer who in connection with the retail dealer's purchase of any cigarettes shall receive not only the discounts ordinarily allowed upon purchases by a retail dealer but also in whole or in part the discounts ordinarily allowed upon purchases by a wholesale dealer, the cost of doing business by the retail dealer with respect to the said cigarettes shall be, in the absence of proof of a lesser or higher cost of doing business by the retail dealer, the sum of the cost of doing business by the retail dealer and, ~~to the extent that he or she shall have received the full amount of the discounts ordinarily allowed to a wholesale dealer which are received by the retailer, the cost of doing business by a wholesale dealer as defined in subdivision (5)(B) of this section.~~

~~(8)(7) "Retailer" means and includes any person who is engaged in this state in the business of selling cigarettes at retail and includes any group of persons, cooperative organizations, buying pools, and any other person or group of retailers purchasing cigarettes on a cooperative basis from licensed distributors or wholesalers. Any person placing a cigarette vending machine at, on, or in any premises shall be deemed to be a retailer for each such vending machine;~~

~~(9) (8) "Sale" or "sell" means any transfer for a consideration, exchange, barter, gift, offer for sale, advertising for sale, soliciting an order for cigarettes, and distribution in any manner or by any means whatsoever; and~~

~~(10) (9) "Sell at retail", "sale at retail", or "retail sales" means and includes any sale for consumption or use made in the ordinary course of trade or usual conduct of the seller's business;~~

~~(11) "Sell at wholesale", "sale at wholesale", and "wholesale sales" mean and include any sale made in the ordinary course of trade or usual conduct of the wholesaler's business to a retailer for the purpose of resale; and~~

~~(12)(A) "Wholesaler" means and includes:~~

~~(A) Any person other than a buying pool as defined in subdivision (2) of this section, wherever resident or located, who brings or causes to be brought into this state unstamped cigarettes purchased directly from the manufacturer thereof and who maintains an established place of business where substantially all of the business is the sale of cigarettes and related merchandise at wholesale to cigarette licensees and where at all times a substantial stock of cigarettes and related merchandise is available for resale, if seventy five percent (75%) thereof are sold to retailers or other wholesalers not connected with the wholesaler by reason of any business connection or otherwise; and~~

~~(B) Any person retailing cigarettes to consumers, if at least seventy five percent (75%) of his or her purchases are made directly from the manufacturers thereof; and~~

~~(C) Any person in this state other than a buying pool, as defined in subdivision (2) of this section, who purchases cigarettes from any other person who purchases from a manufacturer, at least seventy five percent (75%) of which are for purposes of resale to retailers in this state not connected with the wholesaler by reason of any business connection or otherwise and who maintains an established place of business where cigarettes and related merchandise are sold at wholesale to persons licensed under this subchapter, and where at all times a substantial stock of cigarettes and related merchandise is available to all retailers for resale; and~~

~~(D) Any person in this state who acquires cigarettes solely for the purpose of resale in cigarette vending machines, provided the person operates~~

~~thirty (30) or more machines.~~

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 4-75-703 is amended to read as follows:

4-75-703. Sales excepted from subchapter.

The provisions of this subchapter shall not apply to a any sale at wholesale, ~~or nor shall they apply to~~ a sale at retail that is made:

(1) In an isolated transaction and not in the usual course of business;

(2) Where cigarettes are advertised, offered for sale, or sold in a bona fide clearance sale for the purpose of discontinuing trade in such cigarettes, and the advertising, offer to sell, or sale shall state the reason therefor and the quantity of such cigarettes advertised, offered for sale, or to be sold;

(3) Where cigarettes are advertised, offered for sale, or sold as imperfect or damaged, and the advertising, offer to sell, or sale shall state the reason therefor and the quantity of the cigarettes advertised, offered for sale, or to be sold;

(4) Where cigarettes are sold upon the final liquidation of a business;

or

(5) Where cigarettes are advertised, offered for sale, or sold by any fiduciary or other officer acting under the order or direction of any court.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 4-75-704 is amended to read as follows:

4-75-704. Transactions permitted to meet lawful competition.

~~(a)(1) Any wholesaler may advertise, offer to sell, or sell cigarettes at a price made in good faith to meet the price of a competitor who is rendering the same type of service and is selling the same article at cost to the competing wholesaler as defined by this subchapter.~~

~~(2) Any retailer may advertise, offer to sell, or sell cigarettes at a price made in good faith to meet the price of a competitor who is selling the same article at cost to the competing retailer as defined in this subchapter.~~

(b) The price of cigarettes advertised, offered for sale, or sold under the exceptions specified in § 4-75-703 shall not be considered the price of a competitor and shall not be used as a basis for establishing prices below cost, nor shall the price established at a bankrupt sale be considered the price of a competitor within the purview of this section.

(c) In the absence of proof of the actual cost to the competing ~~wholesaler or to the competing~~ retailer, ~~as the case may be~~, the cost may be presumed to be the lowest cost to ~~wholesalers or the lowest cost to~~ retailers, ~~as the case may be~~, within the same trading area as determined by a cost survey made pursuant to § 4-75-711(b).

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 4-75-708 is amended to read as follows:

4-75-708. Sales at less than cost, rebates, concessions, etc. - Penalty.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any ~~wholesaler or~~ retailer, with intent to injure competitors or destroy or substantially lessen competition, to advertise, offer to sell, or sell, at retail ~~or wholesale~~, cigarettes at less than cost to the ~~wholesaler or retailer~~, ~~as the case may be~~.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any ~~wholesaler or~~ retailer, with intent to injure competitors or destroy or substantially lessen competition, to offer a rebate in price, to give a rebate in price, to offer a concession of any kind, or to give a concession of any kind or nature whatsoever in connection with the sale of cigarettes.

~~(c)(1) It shall be unlawful for any retail dealer to induce or attempt to induce or to procure or attempt to procure the purchase of cigarettes at a price less than cost to the wholesaler.~~

~~(2) It shall be unlawful for any retail dealer to induce or attempt to induce or to procure or attempt to procure any rebate or concession of any kind or nature whatsoever in connection with the purchase of cigarettes.~~

~~(d)(c)~~ Any ~~wholesaler or~~ retailer who violates the provisions of this section

shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and be punishable by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500).

~~(e)~~(d) Evidence of advertisement, offering to sell, or sale of cigarettes by any wholesaler or retailer at less than cost to him or her, or evidence of any offer of a rebate in price or the giving of a rebate in price or an offer of a concession or the giving of a concession of any kind or nature whatsoever in connection with the sale of cigarettes, or the inducing or attempt to induce or the procuring or the attempt to procure the purchase of cigarettes at a price less than cost to the wholesaler or the retailer shall be prima facie evidence of intent to injure competitors and destroy or substantially lessen competition.

SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 4-75-709 is amended to read as follows:

4-75-709. Combination sales.

In all advertisements, offers for sale, or sales involving two (2) or more items, at least one (1) of which items is cigarettes, at a combined price, and in all advertisements, offers for sale, or sales involving the giving of any gift or concession of any kind, whether coupons or otherwise, the wholesaler's or retailer's combined selling price shall not be below the cost to the wholesaler or the cost to the retailer, respectively, of the total of all articles, products, commodities, gifts, and concessions included in the transactions; but if any such articles, products, commodities, gifts, or concessions shall not be cigarettes, the basic cost thereof shall be determined in the manner provided in § 4-75-702(1).

SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 4-75-710 is repealed.

~~4-75-710. Sales by a wholesaler to a wholesaler.~~

~~When one wholesaler sells cigarettes to any other wholesaler, the former shall not be required to include in his or her selling price to the latter the cost to the wholesaler, as provided by § 4-75-702, but the latter wholesaler, upon resale to a retailer, shall be subject to the provisions of that section.~~

SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 4-75-711 is amended to read as follows:

4-75-711. Determination of cost generally - Cost surveys.

(a) In determining cost to the wholesaler and cost to the retailer, the court shall receive, and consider as bearing on the bona fides of the cost, evidence tending to show that any person complained against under any of the provisions of this subchapter purchased the cigarettes involved in the complaint before the court at a fictitious price or upon terms or in such manner or under such invoices as to conceal the true cost, discounts, or terms of purchase, and shall also receive and consider as bearing on the bona fides of the costs, evidence of the normal, customary, and prevailing terms and discounts in connection with other sales of a similar nature in the trade area or state.

(b) Where a cost survey pursuant to recognized statistical and cost accounting practices has been made for the trading area in which a violation of this subchapter is committed or charged to determine and establish on the basis of actual existing conditions the lowest cost to wholesalers or the lowest cost to retailers within the area, the cost survey shall be deemed competent evidence in any action or proceeding under this subchapter as tending to prove actual cost to the wholesaler or actual cost to the retailer complained against, but any party against whom any such cost survey may be introduced in evidence shall have the right to offer evidence tending to prove any inaccuracy of the cost survey or any state of facts which would impair its probative value.

SECTION 8. Arkansas Code § 4-75-712 is amended to read as follows:

4-75-712. Determination of cost - Sales outside ordinary channels of business.

In establishing the basic cost of cigarettes to a wholesaler or a retailer, it shall not be permissible to use the invoice cost or the actual cost of any cigarettes

purchased at a forced, bankrupt, or closeout sale, or other sale outside of the ordinary channels of trade.

SECTION 9. Arkansas Code Title 26, Chapter 57, Subchapter 8, is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:

26-57-804.

(a) In addition to the excise or privilege taxes levied under §§ 26-57-208, 26-57-802, 26-57-803, or other statute of this state, there is levied a wholesale cigarette tax of four dollars and twenty-five cents (\$4.25) per one thousand (1,000) cigarettes for cigarettes sold at wholesale that are stamped pursuant to § 26-57-235 or that are otherwise sold for retail sale within this state.

(b) The additional tax levied under this section shall apply to all sales of cigarettes at wholesale in this state, including cigarettes sold in Arkansas within three hundred feet (300') of a state line or in any city which adjoins a state line.

(c) Any exemption or waiver allowed under the Arkansas Tobacco Products Tax Act of 1977, § 26-57-201 et seq., applies to this section.

(d) The additional tax levied under this section shall be reported and remitted in the same manner and at the same time as other taxes levied on cigarettes by the Arkansas Tobacco Products Tax Act of 1997, § 26-57-201 et seq.

(e) The moneys collected under this section shall be deposited in the State Treasury as special revenues to the credit of the Arkansas Medicaid Program Trust Fund, created by § 19-5-985.

(f) The tax levied by this section shall not apply to cigarette package tax stamps held by a wholesaler on the date this section becomes effective or the sale of cigarettes that are in a wholesaler's warehouse inventory on the date this section becomes effective.

SECTION 10. Arkansas Code § 19-5-985 is amended to read as follows:  
19-5-985. Arkansas Medicaid Program Trust Fund.

(a) There is hereby established on the books of the Treasurer of the State, Auditor of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a fund to be known as the Arkansas Medicaid Program Trust Fund.

(b)(1) This fund shall consist of all revenues derived from taxes levied on soft drinks sold or offered for sale in Arkansas as provided for in § 26-57-901 et seq. and all revenues derived from the wholesale tobacco tax as provided for in Title 26, Chapter 27, Subchapter 8, there to be used exclusively for the state match of federal funds participation under the Arkansas Medicaid Program; the additional ambulance annual fees as set out in § 20-13-212 and those special revenues as specified in subdivision (156) of § 19-6-301.

(2) If the Arkansas Medicaid Program should be discontinued for any reason, the revenues derived from the soft drink tax levied in the Arkansas Soft Drink Tax Act, § 26-57-901 et seq. and from the wholesale tobacco tax levied in Title 26, Chapter 27, Subchapter 8 shall be used exclusively to provide services to Arkansas residents comparable to the services now provided under the Arkansas Medicaid Program.

SECTION 11. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the Eighty-Fourth General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the purpose of the Arkansas Unfair Cigarette Sales Act, § 4-75-701 et seq., is fair and lawful competition in the sale of cigarettes in the State of Arkansas; that application of the Unfair Cigarette Sale Act to sales at wholesale has resulted in unnecessary price maintenance that bestows on wholesalers excess profits which are used in part to further promote the sale of cigarettes and smoking; that the policy of the State of Arkansas is to discourage smoking; that there no longer exists circumstances that requires price protection in the sale of cigarettes at wholesale; that the Arkansas Medicaid Programs provides services to recipients that are smokers of cigarettes; and that the services provided by the Arkansas Medicaid Program to smokers of

cigarettes have caused a strain on the finances of the Arkansas Medicaid Program. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

- (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
- (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or
- (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.”

Amend **Senate Bill No. 731** as originally introduced:

Delete all language after the enacting clause and substitute the following:

SECTION 1. Title.

This subchapter may be referred to as the "Arkansas Soldiers' and Airmen's Civil Relief Act".

SECTION 2. Findings.

(a) Soldiers and airmen of the Arkansas National Guard who are called into active military service for the State of Arkansas are ineligible for civil relief under the federal law, namely, the Soldiers and Sailors Civil Relief Act of 1941, 50 App. U.S.C. § 501 et seq.

(b) Relief should be provided to the soldiers and airmen when they are called into extended active military service for the State of Arkansas.

SECTION 3. Purpose.

The purpose of this act is to provide civil relief to soldiers and airmen of the Arkansas National Guard who are called into extended active military service of the state of Arkansas.

SECTION 4. Applicability.

This act and the benefits of this act apply to and may be claimed by a soldier, airman, or the spouse of a soldier or airman of the Arkansas National Guard who meets one of the following requirements:

(1) The soldier or airmen is ordered into active military service of the State of Arkansas by the Governor under state law for a period of more than one hundred eighty (180) continuous days; or

(2) The soldier or airman is ordered into active military service of the State of Arkansas by the Governor under the provisions of Title 32, United States Code, for a period of more than one hundred eighty (180) continuous days.

SECTION 5. Residential Leases.

When a soldier or airman is ordered to active military service of the State of Arkansas for more than one hundred and eighty (180) days under section 4 of this act, the soldier, airman, or the spouse of the soldier or airman is entitled to terminate and cancel the lease for the primary residence of the soldier, airman, or spouse of the soldier or airman as follows:

(1) The airman, soldier, spouse of the soldier or airman, attorney-in-fact, or lawfully appointed agent shall deliver a written notice to the lessor or the lessor's agent by any manner of mail, courier, or personal delivery accompanied by a written receipt as evidence of delivery;

(2) The notice shall state:

(A) The beginning date, and the ending date, if known, that the soldier or airman has been ordered into the military service of the state;

(B) The unit name, address, and telephone number of the soldier's or airman's commanding officer or military superior who may verify the authenticity of the orders and where the soldier, airman, or spouse may be written; and

(C) That the soldier, airman, or spouse of the soldier or airman claims the benefits of the Arkansas Soldiers' and Airmen's Civil Relief Act and gives notice that his or her residential lease will be terminated as provided by this act; and

(3)(A) The notice shall be accompanied by:

(i) Payment of the current month's rent and any monthly charges regularly assessed as a monthly consideration of the lease; and

(ii) Payment of the next month's rent and any monthly charges regularly assessed as a monthly consideration of the lease that shall accrue through the last day of the next month following the month during which the notice was mailed or delivered.

(B) Any prepaid monthly consideration, security deposit, or other sums held by the lessor may be deducted from the payment amounts.

#### SECTION 6. Reopening Default Judgments.

(a) A default judgment rendered in any civil action against a service member during a period of military service or within thirty (30) days after termination of the military service may be set aside if:

(1) The person was prejudiced by reason of his or her military service in making a defense to the action;

(2) Application by the person or his or her legal representative is made to the court rendering the judgment not later than sixty (60) days after the termination of the military service; and

(3) The application provides enough facts that it appears that the person has a meritorious or legal defense to the action or some part of the action.

(b) Vacating, setting aside, or reversing any judgment because of any of the provisions of this subchapter may not impair any right or title acquired by any bona fide purchaser for value under the judgment.

#### SECTION 7. Stay of proceedings.

(a) If at any point during an action or proceeding it appears that a plaintiff or defendant is a service member, and in the conduct of the proceedings, may be adversely affected by his or her military service, the court may, on its own motion, stay the proceedings.

(b) The court may stay the proceedings if the service member or another person on his or her behalf makes a request in writing to the court, unless the court determines on the record that the ability of the plaintiff to pursue the action or the defendant to conduct his or her defense is not materially affected by reason of his or her military service.

#### SECTION 8. Fines and penalties on contracts.

(a) If compliance with the terms of a contract is stayed under this subchapter, a fine or penalty may not accrue by reason of failure to comply during the period of the stay.

(b) If a service member has not obtained a stay and a fine or penalty is imposed for nonperformance of an obligation, a court may relieve enforcement if the service member was in military service when the penalty was incurred and his or her ability to pay or perform was materially impaired.

#### SECTION 9. Exercise of rights not to affect future financial transactions.

Application by a service member in military service for, or receipt of, a stay, postponement, or suspension under this subchapter in the payment of any fine, penalty, insurance premium, or other civil obligation or liability may not be used for any of the following:

(1) A determination by any lender or other person that the service member is unable to pay any civil obligation or liability in accordance with its terms;

(2) With respect to a credit transaction between a creditor and a service member:

(A) A denial or revocation of credit by the creditor;

(B) A change by the creditor in the terms of an existing credit arrangement; or

(C) A refusal by the creditor to grant credit to the service member in substantially the amount or on substantially the terms requested; or

(3) An adverse report relating to the creditworthiness of the service member by or to any person or entity engaged in the practice of assembling or evaluating consumer credit information.

#### SECTION 10. Stay of execution of judgment.

Unless the court determines on the record that the ability of the service member to comply with the judgment or order entered or sought is not materially affected by reason of his or her military service, the court may, on its own motion, or upon application to it by the service member or another person on his or her behalf:

(1) Stay the execution of any judgment or order entered against the service member, as provided in this subchapter; and

(2) Vacate or stay any attachment or garnishment of property, money, or debts in the hands of another, whether before or after judgment as provided in this subchapter.

#### SECTION 11. Duration of stays.

(a) Any stay of an action, proceeding, attachment, or execution ordered by any court under this subchapter may be ordered for the period of military service, plus sixty (60) days after its termination or any part of that time period.

(b) Where the service member in military service is a codefendant with others, the plaintiff may, with leave of the court, proceed against the others.

#### SECTION 12. Statutes of limitations affected by military service.

The period of military service is not included in computing any period limited by law, rule, or order for bringing an action or proceeding in any court, board, bureau, commission, department, or other agency of government by or against any person in military service or by or against his or her heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, whether the cause of action or the right or privilege to institute the action or proceeding has accrued before or during the period of military service.

#### SECTION 13. Maximum rate of interest for state active military service.

(a) An obligation or liability bearing interest at a rate in excess of six percent (6%) per year incurred by a service member in military service before his or her entry into state active military service may not, during any part of the period of military service, bear interest at a rate in excess of six percent (6%) per year unless, in the opinion of the court and upon application to the court by the obligee, the ability of the service member to pay interest on the obligation or liability at a rate in excess of six percent (6%) per year is not materially affected by reason of his or her service.

(b) The court may make any order in the action that, in its opinion, is just.

#### SECTION 14. Eviction or distress of dependents of state active military service members.

(a)(1) Except as provided in subsection (a)(2) of this section, a landlord may not evict or take and hold property of a service member or his or her dependents for nonpayment of rent during the period of military service if the rent on the premises occupied by the service member or his or her dependents is less than one thousand two hundred dollars (\$1,200) per month.

(2) If the landlord petitions the court for an order affecting the service member or his or her dependent's right of possession, then a court may allow the landlord to evict and hold the property of a service member or his or her dependents under this subsection.

(b) In any action affecting the right of possession, the court may, on its own motion, stay the proceedings for not longer than three (3) months, or make any order the court determines to be reasonable and just under the circumstances, unless the court finds that the ability of the tenant to pay the agreed rent is not materially affected by reason of the service member's military service.

(c) When a stay is granted or other order is made by the court, the owner of the premises shall be entitled, upon application, to relief with respect to the premises to the extent and for any period as the court determines to be just and reasonable under the circumstances.

(d) Any person who knowingly takes part in any eviction or distress otherwise than as provided in subsection (a), or attempts to do so, is guilty of an unclassified misdemeanor.

(e) The Governor may order an allotment of the pay of a service member in military service in reasonable proportion to discharge the rent of premises occupied for dwelling purposes by any dependents of the service member.

#### SECTION 15. Installment contracts.

(a) The creditor of a service member who, before entry into military service, has entered into an installment contract for the purchase of real or personal property shall not terminate the contract or repossess the property for nonpayment or any breach occurring during military service without an order from a court of competent jurisdiction.

(b) The court, upon application to it under this section, may, unless the court finds on the record that the ability of the service member to comply with the terms of the contract is not materially affected by reason of his or her military service:

(1) Order repayment of any prior installments or deposits as a condition of terminating the contract and resuming possession of the property;

(2) Order a stay of the proceedings on its own motion, or on a motion by the service member or another person on his or her behalf; or

(3) Make any other disposition of the case it considers to be equitable to conserve the interests of all parties.

(c) Any person who knowingly repossesses property that is the subject of this section other than as provided in subsection (a) is guilty of an unclassified misdemeanor.

#### SECTION 16. Mortgage foreclosures.

(a) The creditor of a service member who, before entry into military service, has entered into a mortgage contract with the service member or his or her dependent for the purchase of real or personal property may not foreclose on the mortgage or repossess the property for nonpayment or any breach occurring during military service without an order from a court of competent jurisdiction.

(b) The court, upon application under this section, may, unless the court finds on the record that the ability of the service member to comply with the terms of the mortgage is not materially affected by reason of his or her military service:

(1) Order repayment of any prior installments or deposits as a condition of terminating the contract and resuming possession of the property;

(2) Order a stay of the proceedings on its own motion, or on motion by the service member or another person on his or her behalf; or

(3) Make any other disposition of the case as it considers to be equitable to conserve the interests of all parties.

(c) In order to come within the provisions of this section, the service member or dependent shall establish the following:

(1) The relief is sought on an obligation secured by a mortgage, trust deed, or other security in the nature of a mortgage on either real or personal property;

(2) The obligation originated before the service member's entry into military service;

(3) The property was owned by the service member or his or her dependent before the commencement of military service; and

(4) The property is still owned by the service member or his or her dependent at the time relief is sought.

(d) Any person who knowingly forecloses on property which is the subject of this section other than as provided in subsection (a) is guilty of an unclassified misdemeanor.

#### SECTION 17. Application for relief.

(a) A person may, at any time during his or her period of military service or within sixty (60) days after discharge or termination, apply to a court for relief in respect of any obligation or liability incurred by the person before his or her period of military service.

(b) The court, after appropriate notice and hearing, unless in its opinion the ability of the applicant to comply with the terms of the obligation or liability has not been materially affected by reason of his or her military service, may grant the following relief:

(1) In the case of an obligation payable under its terms in installments under a contract for the purchase of real estate or secured by a mortgage or other instrument in the nature of a mortgage upon real estate, a stay of the enforcement of the obligation during the applicant's period of military service, and from the date of termination of the period of military service or from the date of application if made after termination of military service, for a period equal to the period of the remaining life of the installment contract or other instrument plus a period of time equal to the period of military service of the applicant, or any part of the combined period, subject to payment of the balance of principal and accumulated interest due and unpaid at the date of termination of the period of military service or from the date of application, in equal installments during the combined period at the rate of interest on the unpaid balance as is prescribed in the contract, or other instrument evidencing the obligation, for installments paid when due, and subject to any other terms as the court may consider just.

(2) In the case of any other obligation or liability, a stay of the enforcement during the applicant's period of military service, and from the date of termination of the period of military service or from the date of application, if made after termination of the period of military service, for a period of time equal to the period of military service of the applicant, or any part of that period, subject to payment of the balance of principal and accumulated interest due and unpaid at the date of termination of the period of military service or the date of application, in equal periodic installments during the extended period at the rate of interest prescribed for the obligation or liability, if paid when due, and subject to other terms the court considers to be reasonable and just.

(c) When any court has granted a stay as provided in this section, a fine or penalty may not be accrued for failure to comply with the terms or conditions of the obligation or liability for which the stay was granted during the period the terms and conditions of the stay are complied with.

#### SECTION 18. Storage liens.

(a)(1) A person may not exercise any right to foreclose or enforce any lien for storage of household goods, furniture, or personal effects of a service member in military service during the service member's period of military service and for sixty (60) days after termination or discharge, except upon an order previously granted by a court upon application and a return to the court made and approved by the court.

(2) In the proceeding the court may, after hearing the matter, on its own motion, and shall, on application to it by the service member in military service or another person on his or her behalf, unless in the opinion of the court the ability of the service member to pay the storage charges due is not materially affected by reason of his or her military service:

(A) Stay the proceedings as provided in this subchapter; or

(B) Make any other disposition the court considers to be equitable to conserve the interest of all the parties.

(b) Any person who knowingly takes any action contrary to the provisions of this section, or attempts to do so, is guilty of a misdemeanor.”

(a)(1) A police officer appointed pursuant to the authority contained in under this subchapter shall, except to the extent otherwise limited by the Adjutant General;

~~(B) preserve~~ Preserve and maintain proper order and decorum;

executing who perform the duties delegated to them pursuant to under this subchapter, shall are not be personally liable for injuries to persons or for damages damage to property dealt with that occurs while acting within the scope of their authorized authority on behalf of the State of Arkansas and on the military reservation.

(b) A police officer appointed and designated under this subchapter, and any other employees authorized under this subchapter, who perform the duties under this subchapter are not personally liable for injuries to persons or for damage to property that occurs while acting within the scope of their authority on behalf of the State of Arkansas on other real property that has all of the following characteristics:

(1) Adjoins a military reservation;

(2) Is owned, leased, or otherwise under the legal control of an instrumentality of the United States or an instrumentality of the State of Arkansas; and

(3) Upon which the Adjutant General has undertaken to provide police or security services.

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 12-63-206(a), regarding the jurisdiction of military law enforcement officers, is amended to read as follows:

(a) The appointment or designation of any police officer or officers under the authority of this subchapter shall not be deemed to supersede in any way the present authority of the state police, that of the county sheriffs, or that of the peace officers of the jurisdiction in which the military reservation, or portions thereof, shall be located, and on other real property that meets all of the following characteristics:

(1) Adjoins a military reservation;

(2) Is owned, leased, or otherwise under the legal control of an instrumentality of the United States or an instrumentality of the State of Arkansas; and

(3) Upon which the Adjutant General has undertaken to provide police or security services.

SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Adjutant General has been tasked by the United States and agencies of the State of Arkansas with the responsibility of providing security services and police protection to real properties adjoining military reservations that are owned by or under the control of instrumentalities of the United States and of the State of Arkansas; and that this act is immediately necessary to preserve domestic peace and provide security in the State of Arkansas due to the increased threats of terrorism in our country since September 11, 2001. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.”

(6)(A) Everything of value furnished, or intended to be furnished in exchange for violation of § 17-50-104, or all profits, proceeds, or property, excluding real property, traceable to such an exchange.

(B) It may be presumed that the property described in subdivision (a)(6)(A) was acquired with proceeds gained from the violation of § 17-50-104 and is subject to forfeiture; and

(7) Property used in the violation of § 17-50-104 which has title of ownership with two (2) parties on the title or a cosigner is subject to forfeiture if one (1) party on the title uses the property in violation of § 17-50-104 or receives titled property as the proceeds of the violation, even if the second party claims that he or she did not have knowledge or involvement in the violation.

(a)(1) The prosecuting attorney of the judicial district within whose jurisdiction the property sought to be forfeited is seized shall promptly proceed against the property by filing in the circuit court having jurisdiction of such property a petition for an order to show cause why the court should not order forfeiture of such property.

(A) A statement that the action is brought pursuant to § 17-50-404;

(B) The law enforcement agency bringing the action;

(C) A description of the property sought to be forfeited;

(D) A statement that on or about a date certain the property was used or intended to be used in a criminal act constituting violation of § 17-50-104 or that the property was purchased or otherwise obtained as a result of commission of the violation;

(E) A statement detailing the facts in support of forfeiture; and

(F) A list of all persons known to the law enforcement agency, after diligent search and inquiry, who may claim an ownership interest in the property by title or registration or by virtue of a lien allegedly perfected in the manner prescribed by law.

(b)(1) Upon receipt of a petition complying with the requirements of subsection (a) of this section, the circuit judge of the court having jurisdiction shall issue an order to show cause setting forth a statement that this subchapter is the controlling law.

(2) In addition, the order shall set a date at least forty-one (41) days after the date of first publication of the order pursuant to subsection (c) of this section for all persons claiming an interest in the property to file the pleadings as they desire as to why the court should not order the forfeiture of the property to the law enforcement agency seeking forfeiture of the property.

(3) The court shall further order that all persons who do not appear on that date are deemed to have defaulted and waived any claim to the subject property.

(c)(1) The prosecuting attorney shall give notice of the forfeiture proceedings by:

(A) Causing to be published a copy of the order to show cause twice each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper having general circulation in the county where the property is located, with the last publication being not less than five (5) days before the show cause hearing; and

(B) Sending a copy of the petition and order to show cause by certified mail, return receipt requested, to each person having ownership of or a security interest in the property, or in the manner provided in Rule 4 of the Arkansas Rules of Civil Procedure, if:

(i) The property is of a type for which title or registration is required by law;

(ii) The owner of the property is known in fact to the law enforcement agency at the time of seizure; or

(iii) The property is subject to a security interest perfected in accordance with the Uniform Commercial Code, § 4-1-101 et seq.

(2) The law enforcement agency shall be obligated only to make diligent search and inquiry as to the owner of the property and if, after diligent search and inquiry, the agency is unable to ascertain the owner, the requirement of actual notice by mail with respect to persons having perfected security interests in the property shall not be applicable.

(d) At the hearing on the matter, the petitioner shall by a preponderance of the evidence establish that the property is subject to forfeiture as provided in § 17-50-404.

(e) The final order of forfeiture by the circuit court shall perfect in the law enforcement agency all rights, title, and interest in and to the property and shall relate back to the date of the seizure.

(f) Physical seizure of property shall not be necessary in order to allege in a petition under this section that property is forfeitable.
