(B) In addition, if any employee or former employee covered by the city's Administration of Justice fund has transferred service credit, or transfers service credit, to Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System anytime after January 1, 2000, and if the municipality has used general revenue funds to pay the contribution required to fund the transfer, or if the municipality has used the city's Administration of Justice fund to fund the transfer, then in that event the city's Administration of Justice fund shall not be refunded or in the event general funds were used, the city may reimburse the general fund from the city's Administration of Justice fund for the contribution paid on behalf of the employee or former employee.

(C)(i) In addition to paying for the transfer of service credit for the position for which the fund is created, the municipality may also pay from city's Administration of Justice fund on behalf of the employee or former employee for any additional transfer of service credit the employee or former employee elects to make regarding time as city attorney for the municipality.

(ii) The municipality may reimburse itself for any payment from the city's Administration of Justice fund to fund the transfer made from its general fund after January 1, 2000 on behalf of the employee or former employee to purchase city attorney service credit in Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System.

(iii) In the event any payment for the service has been made directly from the city's Administration of Justice fund after January 1, 2000, then the municipality shall not be required to reimburse the city's Administration of Justice fund for those transfers.

(iv) In the event a transfer from the general fund is made to the city's Administration of Justice fund after payment from the city's Administration of Justice fund for the service credit transfers and before the effective date of this subdivision (a)(5), then the municipality is entitled to reimburse the general fund from the city's Administration of Justice fund for the amount of the transfers.

“SECTION 1. Arkansas Code, Title 20, Chapter 10 is amended by adding an additional subchapter to read as follows:

20-10-1901. Title.

This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Fair Care and Treatment Act of 2003".

20-10-1902. Purpose and intent.

(a) The purpose and intent of this subchapter is to provide for the fair care and treatment of persons receiving long-term care in skilled nursing facilities duly licensed to operate in this state.

(b) This subchapter authorizes the creation of a liability insurance pool known as the Patient's Recovery Fund to provide a secure and sustainable source of funds to satisfy personal injury claims by or on behalf of patients of participating facilities.

20-10-1903. Definitions.

As used in this subchapter:

(1) "Affiliate of a skilled nursing facility" means any person or entity controlling, controlled by, or under common control with the facility;

(2) "Board" means the Patient's Recovery Fund Board created by this subchapter;

(3)(A) "Claim" means a demand for recovery of damages from the Patient's Recovery Fund, whether based in tort, contract, or otherwise, on account of an injury to a patient of a participating facility.

(B) The claim may be brought by the patient, or by the guardian, representative, executor, administrator, or person acting on behalf of the patient, including a third party whose right to recover damages is derivative of the legal rights of the patient;

(4) "Claimant" means the person or persons alleging a claim against a skilled nursing facility;

(5) "Injury" means the personal injury or death of a patient of a skilled nursing facility arising out of or sustained in the course of the services rendered to the patient by the facility, its owners, principals, officers, employees, agents, and affiliates, or any person or entity providing management services to the facility, or arising out of or sustained in the course of the relationship between the patient and the facility, its owners, principals, officers, employees, agents, and affiliates, or any person or entity providing management services to the facility;

(6) "Occupied beds" means:

(A) Beds occupied by patients at midnight;

(B) Beds placed on hold during a period of time not to exceed five (5) consecutive calendar days during which a patient is in a hospital bed; and

(C) Beds placed on hold during a period of time not to exceed fourteen (14) consecutive calendar days during which a patient is on therapeutic home leave;

(7)(A) "Participating facility" means a skilled nursing facility that participates in and contributes to the Patient's Recovery Fund, including the owners, principals, officers, employees, agents, and affiliates of the skilled nursing facility.

(B) "Participating facility" does not include any unaffiliated person or entity providing management services to the facility;

(8) "Patient" means a person receiving care or treatment from a skilled nursing facility;

(9) "Skilled nursing facility" means a "long-term care facility" as defined by § 20-10-213; and

(10) "Wrongful act" means any act or conduct, whether by commission or omission, which is a proximate cause of an injury.

20-10-1904. Patient's Recovery Fund – Participation.

(a)(1) The Patient's Recovery Fund is created for the payment of valid claims and judgments against participating facilities.

(2) Each participating facility shall remit monthly assessments to the fund, or make payments to the fund in lieu of assessments, based upon the number of occupied beds as of the first business day of each month.

(3) Assessments may be prepaid upon terms approved by the board.

(4) Assessments and other payments, together with earned income, surplus, and all other moneys accruing to the fund, shall be held in trust by the board for the purposes set forth in this subchapter.

(b)(1) The fund shall not be deposited or maintained in the State Treasury, but shall be a cash fund under the direction and control of the board, as set forth in this subchapter.

(2) The fund shall not be subject to regulation by the State Insurance Department.

(c)(1) Only claims or judgments arising from a wrongful act or acts which occur during a period of participation in the fund shall be covered by the fund.

(2) The fund shall offer tail coverage to participating facilities upon terms approved by the board.

(d)(1)(A) A skilled nursing facility which is certified to provide services under Title XVIII or Title XIX of the Social Security Act shall participate in and contribute to the fund as a condition of maintaining its license to provide long-term care in this state.

(B) A skilled nursing facility which is not certified to provide services under Title XVIII or Title XIX of the Social Security Act, or which receives no reimbursement or other payment under Title XVIII or Title XIX of the Social Security Act for services provided to any of its patients, may elect to participate in the fund, but shall not be required to participate in the fund as a condition of maintaining its license to provide long-term care in this state.

(2)(A) Subject to the rules and regulations of the fund and upon terms approved by the board, a skilled nursing facility which is required to participate in the fund as a condition of maintaining its license to provide long-term care in this state may opt out of participation in the fund by giving notice to the administrator that the facility is owned and operated by a nonprofit, government or church affiliated organization as defined by the board.

(B) Wrongful acts occurring during the facility's prior period or periods of participation shall be covered.

(3)(A) A participating facility shall be dismissed as a participant in the fund for nonpayment of assessments or payments in lieu of assessments, as determined by the rules and regulations of the fund.

(B) The board shall provide by regulation for a grace period for curing a default in the payment of assessments or other payments prior to formal dismissal and may impose a late fee not to exceed five dollars (\$5.00) per occupied bed per event of default.

(C) Upon dismissal of a facility from the fund, wrongful acts occurring during such facility's prior period or periods of participation shall be covered.

20-10-1905. Election by participating facility – Initial assessments and payments.

(a) A participating facility may elect:

(1) To carry a higher deductible, or to retain a higher limit of its risks, by providing evidence satisfactory to the board that it is qualified to fund its risks of loss and that the facility or its affiliate maintains segregated accounts to fund the deductible and self insured retention losses;

(2) To purchase commercial insurance coverage by providing proof of the coverage to the board; or

(3) To accept the insurance coverage provided by the fund and to pay monthly assessments as provided in this subchapter.

(b) A participating facility that elects to self insure or to purchase commercial insurance:

(1) Shall maintain coverage of not less than two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) per claim and an annual aggregate limit of coverage of not less than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000);

(2) Shall pay an administrative fee to the fund in lieu of monthly assessments, as provided in this section; and

(3)(A) Shall participate in the fund upon equal terms with other participating facilities.

(B) However, the fund shall not pay claims or judgments on behalf of the facility, unless, and only to the extent that, the facility acquires coverage from the fund.

(c)(1) Assessments and payments in lieu of assessments shall be paid beginning January 2004, based upon the number of occupied beds as of the first business day of the month.

(2) The initial amount of the aggregate annual assessment, payable monthly, shall be one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per occupied bed and the initial amount of the annual administrative fee in lieu of assessments shall be two hundred dollars (\$200) per occupied bed.

20-10-1906. Initial limits of coverage and deductible.

With respect to participating facilities which elect to accept the insurance coverage provided by the fund, the initial amount of the per claim limit of coverage shall be two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000), the initial amount of the annual aggregate limit of coverage per participating facility shall be five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000), and the initial amount of the deductible shall be ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per claim.

20-10-1907. Patient's Recovery Fund Board – Powers and duties.

(a)(1) The Patient's Recovery Fund Board shall have four (4) directors and shall consist of:

(A) A physician, a registered nurse, and a pharmacist, all of whom shall be licensed in this state; and

(B) A private citizen.

(2) The private citizen director, who shall be a non-voting director, shall have training and experience in risk management or in general business management.

(3) The Governor shall appoint the private citizen director, who shall be the chairman of the board.

(4) The Attorney General shall appoint the physician director, who shall be the vice chairman of the board, from a list of two (2) nominees submitted by the Arkansas Medical Society, or its successor.

(5) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint the nurse director, who shall be the secretary of the board, from a list of two (2) nominees submitted by the Arkansas Nurses Association, or its successor.

(6) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint the pharmacist director from a list of two (2) nominees submitted by the Arkansas Health Care Association, or its successor.

(7) Nominations shall be submitted to the officials responsible for the appointment of the voting directors on or before July 1, 2003.

(8) The initial board shall be appointed on or before August 1, 2003.

(9) The initial terms shall be staggered so that the private citizen director and the pharmacist director shall serve for three (3) years, the physician director shall serve for two (2) years, and the nurse director shall serve for one (1) year.

(10)(A) Subsequent terms shall be three for (3) years.

(B) Directors shall be eligible for reappointment.

(b)(1) A director may be removed for cause by the Governor upon ten (10) days' written notice to the director.

(2) A director whose term expires, or who resigns, is removed, or becomes incapacitated, shall be replaced within forty-five (45) days after the vacancy or expiration of the term by a successor of the same profession or standing, who shall be nominated and appointed as provided in this section.

(3) If a successor is not appointed within the forty-five (45) day period, the remaining directors shall select an interim director of the same profession or standing who shall serve for the new term or the unexpired portion of the term.

(4) Directors whose terms expire shall continue to serve until their successors are appointed.

(c)(1) The board shall supervise the management and activities of the fund.

(2) Each director shall be compensated from the fund at the rate of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150) per hour devoted to official board activities, not to exceed one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) each month, plus out-of-pocket expenses incurred within the state, documented by appropriate receipts.

(3) Directors shall be immune from suit while acting in their official capacities, except for intentional wrongful acts or violation of fiduciary duty.

(d)(1) The board shall have the power and discretion, after notice to the affected participating facilities and a hearing, and based upon accepted risk management practices, to determine:

(A) The amount of the aggregate annual assessment per occupied bed;

(B) The amount of the annual administrative fee in lieu of monthly assessments;

(C) The amount of the per claim limit of coverage;

(D) The amount of the annual aggregate limit of coverage per participating facility; and

(E) The amount of the per claim deductible.

(2) Notice of a change in the amounts, or any of them, shall be given to the affected participating facilities not less than sixty (60) days prior to the effective date of the change.

(e)(1) The board shall determine terms, conditions, and charges for providing tail coverage to participating facilities and may offer supplemental coverage to participating facilities upon terms approved by the board.

(2) However, supplemental coverage shall be not less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) per claim.

(f) The board may:

(1) Enter into contracts, and to sue and be sued, in its own name;

(2) Borrow public or private funds in such amounts and upon such terms as may be negotiated with a creditor or creditors, subject to otherwise applicable laws; and

(3) Assess an annual surcharge upon the assessments of a participating facility, after notice and a hearing, that demonstrates a disproportionately high history of payable claims or judgments, the surcharge not to exceed two hundred dollars (\$200) per occupied bed.

(g) The board shall promulgate rules and regulations to govern:

(1) The terms and conditions of participation in the fund;

(2) The administration of the fund, including the collection, management, and disposition of fund assets; and

(3) The procedures for the timely resolution of claims before the administrator.

20-10-1908. Administrator – Powers and duties.

(a)(1) The board shall employ an administrator of the fund who is a graduate of an accredited four-year college or university with at least ten (10) years' experience in the field of risk management or business administration.

(2) All qualifications, terms, and conditions of employment, including compensation, which shall be paid from the fund, shall be at the sole discretion of the board.

(3) The board shall employ the administrator in sufficient time for the administrator to assume the duties of office on or before January 1, 2004.

(b)(1) The administrator shall conduct and supervise the business affairs of the fund, pursuant to a written business plan approved by the board, which may include a plan for voluntary mediation of claims.

(2) The administrator shall employ appropriate professional personnel to assist with the business affairs of the fund, which shall include a nationally recognized risk management consultant.

(3) With board approval, the administrator may purchase or lease appropriate office space, equipment, and other necessary assets for the use of the fund, and may expend fund moneys for all other necessary and appropriate purposes, subject to the rules and regulations of the fund.

(c) The administrator shall exercise best efforts to locate and approve a list of commercial insurance carriers to offer supplemental insurance coverage in aggregate amounts of up to two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) at negotiable rates.

20-10-1909. Patient's Recovery Fund Advisory Board.

(a)(1) The Patient's Recovery Fund Advisory Board shall have five (5) members and shall consist of the Insurance Commissioner, the Attorney General, the Director of the Department of Human Services, one (1) director appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and one (1) director appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

(2) The directors appointed by the presiding officers of the Senate and the House of Representatives shall serve for terms of two (2) years and shall be eligible for reappointment.

(b)(1) The advisory board shall advise the board and the administrator on the proper execution of the fund and the business plan approved by the board.

(2) The advisory board shall meet at least semiannually to review and examine financial statements and progress reports, prepared by the administrator and previously reviewed by the board, and to advise the administrator and the board of the sufficiency of the reports.

(3) The financial statements shall include a balance sheet and income statement, prepared according to generally accepted accounting principles.

(4) The advisory board shall issue an annual financial report prepared and certified by a certified public accountant on the first business day of July of each year, which shall be subject to public inspection.

20-10-1910. Accumulation of fund assets – Disposition.

(a)(1) All moneys held by the fund shall be deposited in banks located within the state or shall be invested in obligations which are permitted investments for the board of trustees of any public employee retirement system of any political subdivision of the state.

(2) An accurate inventory of all personal property of the fund shall be maintained at all times.

(b) The fund shall be used and expended only for:

(1) The payment and satisfaction of claims and judgments pursuant to this subchapter;

(2) The payment of reasonable fees and expenses incurred by counsel employed by the fund; and

(3) The payment of the costs of operation of the fund including, but not limited to, compensation, fees, and ordinary business expenses.

20-10-1911. Claims – Authority of administrator.

(a)(1) A claim against a participating facility which maintained coverage from the fund for the relevant period shall be filed with the administrator by the claimant on a form created by the administrator.

(2) The claimant shall serve copies of the claim upon the parties.

(3) Claims shall be for compensatory damages only and shall not include punitive damages, costs, or attorney's fees.

(4) Within twenty (20) days after the filing of the claim, the participating facility shall file its response to the claim on a form created by the administrator.

(5) If service of the claim is effected by mail or by electronic means, three (3) days shall be added to the time for filing a response.

(6) The administrator may provide for the submission of copies of affidavits or other exhibits in support of a claim or defense.

(b)(1) The administrator has the sole authority to approve, modify, or settle any claim against a participating facility to the extent of the applicable limit of coverage provided by the fund, including the deductible.

(2) The administrator is without authority to approve, modify, or settle any such claim, or to consent to any award, in an amount greater than the applicable limit of coverage provided by the fund, including the deductible.

2-10-1912. Disposition of claims.

(a)(1)(A) The administrator may make such investigation of the claim as the administrator considers necessary.

(B) Upon application of any party, or on the administrator's own motion, the administrator shall conduct a preliminary conference.

(2) The administrator may enter a written order disposing of the claim without adjudication.

(b) If the administrator determines that a claim should be adjudicated, or if the claimant or participating facility is dissatisfied with the administrator's disposition of the claim, the claim shall be referred to the circuit court.

20-10-1913. Payment of claims.

(a)(1) With respect to a participating facility that maintained coverage from the fund for the relevant period, a claim that has been approved or settled by the administrator, or a claim that has been adjudicated to a final administrative order or a final judgment of a circuit court, shall be paid as follows:

(A) The participating facility shall pay the deductible and the self-insured portion of the award, if any, that were in effect when the claim accrued; and

(B) If commercial insurance coverage is inapplicable, the fund shall pay the balance of the award to the claimant, subject to the per claim limit of coverage and the annual aggregate limit of coverage per participating facility in effect when the claim accrued, exclusive of fees and expenses.

(2) The fund shall not pay punitive damages or costs and attorney's fees incurred by the claimant.

(b)(1)(A) Claims or judgments which become final and unappealable during the first six (6) months of the calendar year shall be paid by the fund on the following August 15.

(B) Claims or judgments which become final and unappealable during the last six (6) months of the calendar year shall be paid by the fund on the following February 15.

(2)(A) If the balance in the fund is insufficient to pay in full all claims and judgments which have become final and unappealable during a six-month period, the award paid to each claimant shall be prorated.

(B) Any amount left unpaid as a result of the proration shall be paid before the payment of claims or judgments which become final and unappealable during any subsequent six-month period.

(c)(1) Pre-judgment interest shall not be payable on any claim or judgment.

(2) Simple interest at the rate of six percent (6%) per annum shall be paid on the unpaid balance of a claim or judgment from and after August 15 or February 15, as the case may be, subject to the judgment or decree of a circuit court.

20-10-1914. Participating facilities – Employment of counsel.

(a) Upon request by a participating facility, other than a participating facility that maintained commercial insurance coverage for the relevant period, the fund shall employ counsel to defend any claim or action against the facility for recovery of damages on account of an injury.

(b)(1) Fees and expenses incurred by counsel employed by the fund shall be paid by the fund.

(2) However, the administrator has the authority to determine the reasonableness of the fees and expenses, subject to the rules and regulations of the fund.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that adequate commercial insurance coverage at affordable rates is not available for nursing homes in this state; that lawsuits and claims which may become lawsuits threaten the financial stability of nursing homes; and that patients of nursing homes do not have recourse to adequate sources of funds to redress legitimate claims for personal injury. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto."

(1) Assure that the air in this state is safe to breathe and meets minimum federal standards established under the federal Clean Air Act, 42 U.S.C. § 7404;

(2) Develop multi-pollutant approaches to solving the state’s environmental problems; and

(3) Adequately fund research and development that will make the state a leader in new technologies that can solve the state’s environmental problems while creating new business and industry in the state.

Subchapter 2

8-14-201. Definitions.

For purposes of this chapter:

(1) “Advisory board” means the Arkansas Air Quality Incentive Plan Advisory Board;

(2) “Affected county” includes:

(A) Pulaski County;

(B) Saline County;

(C) Lonoke County; and

(D) Faulkner County; and

(3) “Department” means the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality.

8-14-202. Arkansas Air Quality Incentive Plan.

(a) The Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality, and the Arkansas Air Quality Incentive Plan Advisory Board shall establish and administer the Arkansas Air Quality Incentive Plan in accordance with this chapter.

(b) Under the plan the department and the advisory board shall provide grants or other funding for:

(1) The Clean Fleet Incentive Plan, including for infrastructure projects established under that subchapter; and

(2) The Motor Vehicle Purchase or Lease Incentive Program established under this chapter.

8-14-203. Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality duties.

(a) In administering the plan established under this chapter and in

accordance with the requirements of this chapter, the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality shall:

- (1) Manage plan funds and oversee the plan;
- (2) Produce guidelines, protocols, and criteria for eligible projects;
- (3) Develop methodologies for evaluating project cost-effectiveness;
- (4) Prepare reports regarding the progress and effectiveness of the plan; and
- (5) Take all appropriate and necessary actions so that emissions reductions achieved through the plan are credited by the United States Environmental Protection Agency to the appropriate emissions reduction objectives in the state implementation plan.

(b) Appropriate department objectives include:

- (1) Achieving maximum reductions in oxides of nitrogen, particulate matter 2.5, and volatile organic compounds to demonstrate compliance with air quality compliance plans;
- (2) Preventing areas of the state from being in violation of national ambient air quality standards; and
- (3) Achieving cost-saving and multiple benefits by reducing emissions of pollutants.

8-14-204. Guidelines and criteria.

(a) The Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality shall adopt grant guidelines and criteria consistent with the requirements of this chapter.

(b) Guidelines shall include protocols to calculate projected emissions reductions, project cost-effectiveness, and safeguards to ensure that funded projects generate emissions reductions not otherwise required by state or federal law.

(c)(1) The department shall make draft guidelines and criteria available to the public and the United States Environmental Protection Agency before the forty-fifth (45th) day preceding the date of final adoption and shall hold at least one (1) public meeting to consider public comments on the draft guidelines and criteria before final adoption.

(2) The public meeting shall be held in the affected state implementation plan area, and if the guidelines affect more than one (1) state implementation plan area, a public meeting shall be held in each affected state implementation plan area affected by the guidelines.

(d)(1) The department may propose revisions to the guidelines and criteria adopted under this section as necessary to improve the ability of the plan to achieve its goals.

(2) Revisions may include, among other changes, adding additional pollutants or adjusting eligible program categories to ensure that incentives established under this chapter achieve the maximum possible emissions reductions.

(3) The department shall make a proposed revision available to the public before the forty-fifth (45th) day preceding the date of final adoption of the revision and shall hold at least one (1) public meeting to consider public comments on the proposed revision before final adoption.

8-14-205. Monitoring process.

(a)(1) The Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality shall develop procedures for monitoring whether the emissions reductions projected for projects awarded grants under this chapter are actually achieved.

(2) Monitoring procedures may include project reviews and contract requirements that the grant recipient provide information semiannually about the project.

(3) If the department requires an annual report, the report shall contain a minimum amount of information required from a recipient and the report format shall be simple and convenient.

(b) Monitoring and reviewing procedures shall be sufficient to enable

emissions reductions generated by funded projects to be fully credited to air quality plans.

(c) The department may revise monitoring and review procedures from time to time as necessary or appropriate to enhance the effectiveness of the plan.

8-14-206. Availability of emissions reduction credits generally.

(a) A project funded under a program established under this chapter may not be used for credit under any state or federal emissions reduction credit averaging, banking, or trading program.

(b) An emissions reduction generated by a program established under this chapter:

(1) May not be used as a marketable emissions reduction credit or, except as otherwise provided in this chapter, to offset any emissions reduction obligations; and

(2) May be used to demonstrate conformity with the state implementation plan.

(c) A project involving a new emissions reduction measure that would otherwise generate marketable credits under state or federal emissions reduction credit averaging, banking, or trading programs is not eligible for funding under a program established under this chapter unless:

(1) The project includes the transfer of the reductions that would otherwise be marketable credits to the state implementation plan or the owner or operator as provided in this chapter; and

(2) The reductions are permanently retired.

8-14-207. Arkansas Air Quality Incentive Plan Advisory Board.

(a) There is created the Arkansas Air Quality Incentive Plan Advisory Board to consist of fourteen (14) members appointed as provided by this section and seven (7) ex officio members as provided by this section.

(b) The governor shall appoint to the advisory board:

(1) A representative of the trucking industry;

(2) A representative of regional transportation;

(3) A representative of the Arkansas Board on Environmental Technology; and

(4) A representative of the Arkansas Chamber of Commerce.

(c) The lieutenant governor shall appoint to the advisory board:

(1) A representative of the engine manufacturing industry;

(2) A representative of air transportation industry;

(3) A representative of the environmental community;

(4) A representative of the agriculture industry; and

(5) A representative of the Central Arkansas Clean Air Task Force.

(d) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint to the advisory board:

(1) A representative of consumer groups;

(2) A representative of the construction industry;

(3) A representative of the automobile industry;

(4) A representative of Central Arkansas Clean Cities; and

(5) A representative of the fuel industry.

(e)(1) Appointed members of the advisory board serve staggered two-year terms.

(2) Initial terms shall be determined by lot.

(3) Half of the appointed members terms expire February 1 of each even-numbered year and the terms of the other half expire on February 1, of each odd-numbered year.

- (4) An appointed member may be reappointed to a subsequent term.
- (f) Ex officio members of the advisory board are:
- (1) The Chairperson of the Senate standing committee having primary jurisdiction over matters related to natural resources;
- (2) The Chairperson of the House standing committee having primary jurisdiction over matters related to environmental regulation;
- (3) The Director of the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality or the director's designee;
- (4) The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration or the director's designee; and
- (5) A representative of the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Region 6 office, designated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency Region 6 administrator.
- (g) The advisory board annually shall elect a presiding officer.
- (h) The advisory board shall review the plan and shall recommend to the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality changes to revenue sources or financial incentives or any legislative, regulatory, or budgetary changes needed.
- (i) The Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality shall provide necessary staff support to the advisory board.

Subchapter 3.

8-14-301. Definitions.

For purposes of this subchapter:

- (1) "Cost effectiveness" means the total dollar amount expended divided by the total number of tons of oxides of nitrogen, particulate matter 2.5, and volatile organic compound emissions reduction attributable to the expenditure;
- (2) "Fuel cell" means an electrochemical device that uses fuel and oxidant to continuously generate electricity;
- (3) "Heavy-duty vehicle" means a vehicle or piece of equipment, excluding a motor vehicle, that is powered by a non-road engine, including:
- (A) Nonroad, nonrecreational equipment and vehicles;
- (B) Construction equipment;
- (C) Locomotives; and
- (D) Other high emitting diesel engine categories established by the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality;
- (4) "Motor vehicle" means a self-propelled device designed for transporting persons or property on a public highway that is required to be registered under the laws of this state;
- (5) "Nonroad engine" means an internal combustion engine that is:
- (A) In or on a piece of equipment that is self propelled and performs another function, excluding a vehicle that is used solely for competition;
- (B) In or on a piece of equipment that is intended to be propelled while performing its function; or
- (C) Designed to be and capable of being carried or moved from one location to another;
- (7) "Program" means the Clean Fleet Incentive Plan established under this chapter;
- (8) "Qualifying fuel" includes any liquid or gaseous fuel or additives registered or verified by the United States Environmental Protection Agency that is ultimately dispensed into a motor vehicle or on-road or heavy-duty vehicle that provides reductions of emissions of oxides of nitrogen, particulate matter 2.5, and volatile organic compounds beyond reductions required by state or federal law;
- (9) "Repower" means to replace an old engine powering an on-road or heavy-duty vehicle with:
- (A) A new engine that emits at least thirty percent (30%) less than the oxides of nitrogen, particulate matter 2.5, and volatile organic compounds permitted by federal regulation for the current model year for that engine;

(B) An engine manufactured later than 1987 that emits at least thirty percent (30%) less than the oxides of nitrogen, particulate matter 2.5, and volatile organic compounds emitted by a new engine certified to the baseline oxides of nitrogen, particulate matter 2.5, and volatile organic compound emissions standard for that engine; or

(C) An engine manufactured before 1988 that emits not more than fifty percent (50%) of the oxides of nitrogen, particulate matter 2.5, and volatile organic compounds by a new engine certified to the baseline oxides of nitrogen, particulate matter 2.5, and volatile organic compound emissions standard for that engine; and

(10) "Retrofit" means to equip an engine and fuel system with new emissions reducing parts or technology verified by the United States Environmental Protection Agency after manufacture of the original engine and fuel system.

8-14-302. Program.

(a)(1) The Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality shall establish and administer a program to be known as the Clean Fleet Incentive Plan.

(2) Under the program, the department shall provide grants for eligible projects to offset the incremental cost of projects that reduce emissions of oxides of nitrogen, particulate matter 2.5, and volatile organic compounds from high emitting diesel sources in no attainment areas and affected counties of the state.

(3) The department shall determine the eligibility of projects.

(b) Projects that may be considered for a grant under the program include:

(1) Purchase or lease of heavy-duty vehicles;

(2) Emissions reducing retrofit projects for on-road or heavy-duty vehicles;

(3) Emissions reducing repower projects for on-road or heavy-duty vehicles;

(4) Purchase and use of emissions reducing add on equipment for on-road or heavy-duty vehicles;

(5) Development and demonstration of practical, low emissions retrofit technologies, repower options, and advanced technologies for on-road or heavy-duty vehicles with lower emissions of oxides of nitrogen, particulate matter 2.5, and volatile organic compounds;

(6) Use of qualifying fuel; and

(7) Implementation of infrastructure projects.

(c)(1) A project listed in subsection (b) is not eligible if it is required by any state or federal law, rule, or regulation, memorandum of agreement, or other legally binding document.

(2) This subsection does not apply to:

(A) An otherwise qualified project, regardless of the fact that the state implementation plan assumes that the change in equipment, vehicles, or operations will occur, if on the date the grant is awarded, the change is not required by any state or federal law, rule or regulation, memorandum of agreement, or other legally binding document; or

(B) The purchase of a heavy-duty vehicle or equipment required only by local law or regulation, or by corporate or controlling board policy of a public or private entity.

8-14-303. Application for grant.

(a) Any person that owns one (1) or more on-road or heavy-duty vehicles that operate primarily within a nonattainment area or affected county of this state or that otherwise contributes to the state inventory of emissions of oxides of nitrogen, particulate matter 2.5, and volatile organic compounds may apply for a grant under the program.

(b) An application for a grant under this subchapter shall be made on an application provided by the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality and shall contain information required by the department, including:

(1) A detailed description of the proposed project;
(2) Information necessary for the department to determine whether the project meets eligibility requirements for the type of project proposed, including a statement of the amounts of any other public financial assistance the project will receive; and

(3) Other information the department may require.

8-14-304. Eligibility requirements.

(a)(1) The Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality shall establish criteria for setting priorities for projects eligible to receive grants under this subchapter.

(2) The department shall review and may modify the criteria and priorities as appropriate.

(b) A proposed project shall meet the requirements of this section to be eligible for a grant under the program.

(c) For a proposed project, not less than seventy-five percent (75%) of vehicle miles traveled or hours of operation projected for the five (5) years immediately following the award of a grant shall be projected to take place in a nonattainment area or affected county of this state.

(d) Each proposed project shall meet the cost effectiveness requirements of this chapter.

(e) A proposed repower project shall exceed the department requirements relating to baseline emissions levels of the engines being replaced under the project.

(f)(1) A proposed retrofit, repower, or add on equipment project shall document, in a manner acceptable to the department, a reduction in emissions of oxides of nitrogen, particulate matter 2.5, and volatile organic compounds of at least thirty percent (30%) compared with the baseline emissions adopted by the department for the relevant engine year and application.

(2) After study of available emissions reduction technologies, after public notice and comment, and after consultation with the Arkansas Air Quality Incentive Plan Advisory Board, the department may revise the minimum percentage reduction in emissions of oxides of nitrogen required by this subsection to improve the ability of the program to achieve its goals.

(g) If a baseline emissions standard does not exist for on-road or heavy-duty vehicles in a particular category, the department shall establish an appropriate baseline emissions level for comparison purposes.

(h)(1) The department may approve payments to offset the incremental cost, over the expected lifetime of the motor vehicle or on-road or heavy-duty vehicle, of the use of qualifying fuel in a motor vehicle or on-road or heavy-duty vehicle if the proposed project as a whole, including the incremental fuel cost, meets the requirements of this subchapter.

(2) The department shall develop an appropriate method for converting incremental fuel costs over the lifetime of the motor vehicle or on-road or heavy-duty vehicle into an initial cost for purposes of determining cost effectiveness as required by this subchapter.

8-14-305. Calculation of cost effectiveness.

(a) In calculating cost effectiveness, one time grants of money at the beginning of a project shall be annualized using a time value of public funds or discount rate determined for each project by the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality, taking into account the interest rate on bonds, interest earned by state funds, and other factors that the department considers appropriate.

(b) The department shall establish reasonable methodologies for evaluating project cost effectiveness consistent with subsection (a) and with accepted methods.

(c) The department shall develop protocols for calculating oxides of nitrogen, particulate matter 2.5, and volatile organic compounds emissions reductions not otherwise required by state or federal law in non-attainment areas and affected counties of this state from representative project types over the life of the projects.

(d) The department may include in cost effectiveness determinations only reductions in oxides of nitrogen, particulate matter 2.5, and volatile organic compounds emissions that are achieved in nonattainment areas and affected counties of this state.

8-14-306. Cost effectiveness criteria - Determination of grant amount.

(a)(1) Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality may not award a grant for a proposed project the cost effectiveness of which, calculated in accordance with this subchapter and criteria developed under that subchapter, exceeds thirteen thousand dollars (\$13,000) per ton of oxides of nitrogen, particulate matter 2.5, and volatile organic compound emissions reduced in the nonattainment area or affected county for which the project is proposed.

(2) This subsection does not restrict the department's authority under other law to require emissions reductions with a cost effectiveness that exceeds thirteen thousand dollars (\$13,000) per ton.

(b) The department may not award a grant that, net of taxes, provides an amount that exceeds the incremental cost of the proposed project.

(c) The department shall adopt guidelines for capitalizing incremental lease costs so those costs may be offset by a grant under this subchapter.

(d) In determining the amount of a grant under this subchapter, the department shall reduce the incremental cost of a proposed new purchase, lease, retrofit, repower, or add on equipment project by the value of any existing financial incentive that directly reduces the cost of the proposed project, including tax credits or deductions, other grants, or any other public financial assistance.

8-14-307. Adjustment to maximum cost effectiveness amount and award amount.

After study of available emissions reduction technologies and costs and after public notice and comment, the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality, in consultation with the Arkansas Air Quality Incentive Plan Advisory Board, may change the values of the maximum grant award criteria to account for inflation or to improve the ability of the program to achieve its goals.

8-14-308. Infrastructure projects.

(a) The Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality shall provide funding under § 8-14-309 for infrastructure projects.

(b) To implement the requirement of subsection (a), the department shall:

(1) Solicit applications for a balanced mix of projects involving fueling and electrification infrastructure that is linked to motor vehicle and on-road and heavy-duty vehicle projects and consistent with program goals;

(2) Coordinate infrastructure projects with motor vehicle and on-road and heavy-duty vehicle projects representing a broad range of fuels, technologies, and applications as appropriate and consistent with the goals of this subchapter;

(3) Adopt guidelines and criteria for infrastructure projects to be funded under the program; and

(4) Oversee, monitor, and evaluate the use of grants awarded under this program and report on the effectiveness of this grant program in relation to the purposes and goals of this subchapter.

8-14-309. Eligible infrastructure projects.

The Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality may consider for funding under this subchapter:

(1) The purchase and installation at a site of equipment that is designed primarily to dispense qualifying fuel, other than standard gasoline or diesel, or the purchase of onsite mobile fueling equipment;

(2) Infrastructure projects, including auxiliary power units, designed to dispense electricity to motor vehicles and on-road and heavy-duty vehicles; and

(3) A project that involves a technology that allows a vehicle to replace with electric power, while the vehicle is parked, the power normally supplied by the vehicle's internal combustion engine.

8-14-310. Heavy-duty purchase or lease incentive schedule.

A new heavy-duty vehicle is eligible for reimbursement of incremental costs according to the following schedule:

8-14-311. Modification of incentive emissions standards.

After evaluating new technologies and after public notice and comment, the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality, in consultation with the Arkansas Air Quality Incentive Plan Advisory Board, may change the incentive emissions standards established under this subchapter to improve the ability of the program to achieve its goals.

Subchapter 4.

8-14-401. Definitions.

For purposes of this subchapter:

(1) "Bin" means a set of emissions standards applicable to exhaust pollutants measured on the Federal Test Procedure according to 40 C.F.R. § 86.1811-04;

(2) "Light-duty motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of less than ten thousand (10,000) pounds; and

(3) "Motor vehicle" means a self-propelled device designed for transporting persons or property on a public highway that is required to be registered under the laws of this state.

8-14-402. Regulations necessary to implement the program.

(a) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality shall develop a purchase or lease incentive program for new light-duty motor vehicles and shall adopt rules necessary to implement the program.

(b) The program shall authorize statewide incentives for the purchase or lease, according to the schedule provided by this chapter, of new light-duty motor vehicles that are certified by the United States Environmental Protection Agency to meet an emissions standard that is at least as stringent as those provided by this chapter for a purchaser or lessee who agrees to register the vehicle in this state, and to operate the vehicle in this state for not less than seventy-five percent (75%) of the vehicle's annual mileage.

(c)(1) Only one (1) incentive may be provided for each new light-duty motor vehicle.

(2) The incentive shall be provided to the lessee and not to the purchaser if the motor vehicle is purchased for the purpose of leasing the vehicle to another person.

8-14-403. Light duty motor vehicle purchase or lease incentive schedule.
A new light-duty motor vehicle is eligible for an incentive according to the following schedule:

8-14-404. Modification of incentive emissions standards.

Delete all language after the enacting clause and substitute the following:

“26-52-433. Food and food ingredients.

(a) As provided in this section, the gross receipts derived from the sale of food and food ingredients are exempt from the Arkansas Gross Receipts Act of 1941, § 26-52-101 et seq.

(b) DEFINITIONS. As used in this section:

(1)(A) “Candy” means a preparation of sugar, honey, or other natural or artificial sweeteners in combination with chocolate, fruits, nuts, or other ingredients or flavorings in the form of bars, drops, or pieces.

(B) “Candy” shall not include any preparation containing flour and shall require no refrigeration;

(2) “Dietary supplement” means any product, other than tobacco, intended to supplement the diet that:

(A) Contains one or more of the following dietary ingredients:

(i) A vitamin;

(ii) A mineral;

(iii) An herb or other botanical;

(iv) An amino acid;

(v) A dietary substance for use by humans to

supplement the diet by increasing the total dietary intake; or

(vi) A concentrate, metabolite, constituent, extract, or combination of any ingredient as described in this subdivision (2)(A);

(B) Is intended for ingestion in tablet, capsule, powder, softgel, gelcap, or liquid form, or if not intended for ingestion in this form, is not represented as conventional food and is not represented for use as a sole item of a meal or of the diet; and

(C) Is required to be labeled as a dietary supplement, identifiable by the “Supplemental Facts” box found on the label and as required under 21 C.F.R. § 101.36 as in effect on January 1, 2003;

(3)(A) “Food and food ingredients” means:

(i) Substances, whether in liquid, concentrated, solid, frozen, dried, or dehydrated form, that are sold for ingestion or chewing by humans and are consumed for their taste or nutritional value;

(ii) Candy and soft drinks;

(iii) Food sold in an unheated state by weight or volume as a single item; and

(iv) Bakery items, including bread, rolls, buns, biscuits, bagels, croissants, pastries, donuts, danish, cakes, tortes, pies, tarts, muffins, bars, cookies, and tortillas.

(B) “Food and food ingredients” does not include alcoholic beverages, dietary supplements, prepared foods, food sold through vending machines, or tobacco;

(4) “Food sold through vending machines” means food dispensed from a machine or other mechanical device that accepts payment;

(5) "Gross receipts tax rate" means the sum of the state gross receipts taxes levied by §§ 26-52-301 and 26-52-302, Amendment 75 to the Arkansas Constitution, and any other state gross receipts taxes enacted beginning on January 1, 2003;

(6)(A) "Prepared food" means:

(i) Food sold in a heated state or heated by the seller;
(ii) Two or more food ingredients mixed or combined by the seller for sale as a single item; or

(iii)(a) Food sold with eating utensils provided by the seller, including plates, knives, forks, spoons, glasses, cups, napkins, or straws.

(b) A plate does not include a container or packaging used to transport the food.

(B) "Prepared food" under subdivision (6)(A)(ii) of this section does not include:

(i) Food that is only cut, repackaged, or pasteurized by the seller; or

(ii) Eggs, fish, meat, poultry, and foods containing these raw animal foods that require cooking by the consumer as recommended by the Food and Drug Administration in Chapter 3, Part 401.11 of its Food Code, as in effect on January 1, 2003, so as to prevent food borne illnesses;

(7)(A) "Soft drinks" mean non-alcoholic beverages that contain natural or artificial sweeteners.

(B) "Soft drinks" do not include beverages that contain milk or milk products, soy, rice, or similar milk substitutes, or greater than fifty percent (50%) of vegetable or fruit juice by volume; and

(8) "Tobacco" means cigarettes, cigars, chewing tobacco, pipe tobacco, or any other item that contains tobacco.

(c) The gross receipts derived from the sale of food and food ingredients shall not be exempt from municipal or county gross receipts taxes.

(d) TAX RATES. The gross receipts tax imposed by the Arkansas Gross Receipts Act of 1941, § 26-52-101 et. seq., on the sale of food and food ingredients shall be phased out as follows:

(1) Beginning July 1, 2006, the gross receipts tax rate shall be reduced by one percent (1%) and the revenue distributed as provided in subsection (e) of this section;

(2) Beginning July 1, 2007, the gross receipts tax rate shall be reduced by an additional one percent (1%) and the revenue distributed as provided in subsection (e) of this section;

(3) Beginning July 1, 2008, the gross receipts tax rate shall be reduced by an additional one percent (1%) and the revenue distributed as provided in subsection (e) of this section;

(4) Beginning July 1, 2009, the gross receipts tax rate shall be reduced by an additional one percent (1%) and the revenue distributed as provided in subsection (e) of this section; and

(5) Beginning July 1, 2010, food and food ingredients shall be fully exempt from all state gross receipts taxes, including any additional gross receipts taxes that may be levied between July 1, 2006, and July 1, 2010, and shall be exempt from the gross receipts tax levied by Amendment 75 to the Arkansas Constitution.

(e) REVENUE DISTRIBUTION.

(1)(A) On the last day of each month, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall certify to the State Treasurer the amount of gross receipts and compensating tax attributable to the sale of food and food ingredients that was:

(i) Deposited to the Revenue Holding Fund Account of the State Apportionment Fund under § 19-6-484(a); and

(ii) Derived from the levy of all state gross receipts and compensating taxes in effect on January 1, 2003, including Amendment 75 to the Arkansas Constitution.

(B) The remainder of gross receipts and compensating tax deposited to the Revenue Holding Fund Account of the State Apportionment Fund shall be distributed under § 19-6-484(b).

(2) The amount of tax certified under § 26-52-433(e)(1)(A) shall be distributed as follows:

(A)(i) That percentage of tax equal to a fraction in which the denominator is the reduced gross receipts tax rate and the numerator is one-eighth of one percent (1/8 of 1%) shall be transferred to the Special Revenue Fund Account of the State Apportionment Fund for subsequent distribution to the Conservation Tax Fund under § 19-6-484.

(ii) "Reduced gross receipts tax rate" means the total rate of state gross receipts tax in effect during the month in which the sale of food and food ingredients occurred, as provided in § 26-52-433(d), including the gross receipts tax levied by Amendment 75 to the Arkansas Constitution; and

(B) The State Treasurer shall credit the remaining tax as follows:

(i) Ninety percent (90%) to the General Revenue Fund Account of the State Apportionment Fund; and

(ii) Ten percent (10%) to the Property Tax Relief Trust Fund."

SECTION 2. It is the purpose of this act to better serve the citizens of Arkansas by providing for the construction and equipping of a modern public health laboratory.

SECTION 3. As used in this act:

(1) "Authority" means the Arkansas Development Finance Authority;

(2) "Authorizing resolution" means the resolution or resolutions adopted by the board authorizing the loan;

(3) "Board" means the State Board of Health;

(4) "Building" means the State Department of Health Building, located on West Markham Street in Little Rock, Arkansas;

(5) "Construction Fund" means the State Department of Health Public Health Laboratory Fund created by this act;

(6) "Construct" means to acquire, construct, reconstruct, remodel, install, and equip any lands, building, structures, improvements, or other property whether real, personal, or mixed, useful in connection with the expansion, by any method and manner as may be authorized by law, and in the case of the acquisition of equipment and other property of a medical, laboratory, or technical nature by any method as the board or the director determines to be necessary or desirable to accomplish the power, purposes, and authorities set forth in this act, and without regard to the provisions of other laws pertaining to the construction and acquisition of property by state agencies;

(7) "Director" means the Director of the Department of Health;

(8) "Renovation" means the renovation and improvement of the building, including the renovation and alteration of existing properties whether real, personal, or mixed;

(9) "Fees" means the fees generated under this act that represent an increase to the allowable fees set forth in Arkansas Code § 20-7-123;

(10) "Fee revenues" means all revenues derived from the fees;

(11) "Laboratory" means a public health laboratory that is a modern stand alone public health laboratory to be constructed on the existing Department of Health site located on West Markham Street in Little Rock, Arkansas;

(12) "Loan" means the loan which the board is authorized to effect, from the authority, by the terms of this act;

(13) "Revenue fund" means the State Board of Health Laboratory Revenue Fund created by this act; and

(14) "Revenue loan fund" means the State Board of Health Laboratory Revenue Loan Fund created by this act.

SECTION 4. (a)(1) The laboratory shall be constructed subject to approval by the State Board of Health.

(2) The board may take such action as may be appropriate for the renovation of the building and any facilities necessarily related to the building.

(b) Subject to the approval of the board, the plans, specifications, and estimates of cost for the laboratory and renovation of the building shall be developed by the Director of the Department of Health, and the director is authorized to employ architects and other like professional and technical assistance as determined to be necessary for the construction of the laboratory and renovation of the building.

(c) The board and the director may take such action as may be appropriate for the construction of the laboratory and renovation of the building and to accomplish the purposes of this act and may engage legal, technical, and other assistance as necessary.

SECTION 5. (a)(1) To finance the construction of the laboratory and renovation of the building, the State Board of Health is authorized to enter into a loan, from the Arkansas Development Finance Authority, in the principal amount of not more than twenty-six million dollars (\$26,000,000), under Chapter 5 of Title 15 of the Arkansas Code.

(2) The amount and purpose of the loan shall be approved by the board in an authorizing resolution, copies of which shall be maintained in the records of the board and of the authority.

(b) The loan shall bear interest at a rate determined by the rate of interest on funds borrowed by the authority to fund the loan, but not to exceed the lesser of ten percent (10%) per annum or the maximum rate of interest permitted by the Arkansas Constitution.

(c) The loan shall mature over a period of not more than thirty (30) years.

(d) The board and the Director of the Department of Health may execute and deliver such agreements, instruments, and other undertakings and writings, and to take such action as may be appropriate to evidence the loan and the security for the loan, and to carry out the purposes of this act.

SECTION 6. (a) The payment and other obligations of the State Board of Health under and with respect to the loan shall be secured by a pledge of the fee revenues, subject to the terms of this act and the reserved power to release fee revenues as set forth in this act.

(b) The loan shall be an obligation of the board only and shall not constitute an indebtedness for which the faith and credit of the State of Arkansas or any of its revenues are pledged.

(c) The loan shall not be secured by a lien on any land, building, or other property belonging to the State of Arkansas.

(d) The loan shall not constitute an indebtedness within the meaning of any constitutional or statutory limitation.

SECTION 7. (a)(1) Commencing July 1, 2003, and so long as the loan is outstanding, all fee revenues shall be treated as cash funds and shall not be deposited in the State Treasury, except as set forth in this act, but shall be deposited, as and when received, in a bank or banks approved by the State Board of Health or the Director of the Department of Health, in an account or accounts of the board designated "State Board of Health Laboratory Revenue Fund".

(2) All moneys in the revenue fund shall, commencing on July 1, 2003, and so long as the loan is outstanding, not be subject to the provisions of Arkansas Code §§ 19-4-801 through 19-4-806 and shall be deposited, handled, and disbursed as set forth in this act.

(b) Moneys held in the revenue fund shall, no less frequently than bimonthly, be withdrawn and deposited as follows and in the following order of priority:

(1) An annual amount sufficient to provide for principal, interest, servicing fees, and reserve requirements with respect to the loan, but not to exceed the sum of two million six hundred thousand dollars (\$2,600,000) per fiscal year:

(A) Prior to the commencement of the loan, in the construction fund; or

(B) Beginning upon commencement of the loan, in an account or accounts of the board, in a bank or banks approved by the board or the director, designated "State Board of Health Laboratory Revenue Loan Fund";

(2) The sum of nine hundred thousand dollars (\$900,000) per fiscal year to the Public Health Fund;

(3) The sum of six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) per fiscal year to the State Health Department Building and Local Grant Trust Fund; and

(4) Any balance remaining shall be distributed fifty percent (50%) to the Public Health Fund and fifty percent (50%) to the State Health Department Building and Local Grant Trust Fund.

(c)(1) Commencing July 1, 2003, and so long as the loan shall be outstanding, all funds held in the revenue fund, the revenue loan fund, and the construction fund shall be deemed to be cash funds, shall not be deposited in the State Treasury and shall be transferred, deposited, and applied, as set forth in this act, without the necessity of appropriation.

(2) All transfers from the revenue fund and the construction fund shall be made by the director.

(3) All transfers from the revenue loan fund shall be made by the director, or with the approval of the director of the board, or the Arkansas Development Finance Authority.

(d) So long as the loan is outstanding, funds held in the revenue loan fund shall be used solely for the purpose of paying and providing for principal of, interest on, and servicing fees, if any, in connection with the loan and providing for the creation and maintenance of necessary reserves.

(e)(1) So long as the loan is outstanding, all fees shall be imposed and all fee revenues shall be collected and applied as provided in this act.

(2) However, particular fees may be reduced or eliminated if remaining fees are increased or new fees are added to the end that the aggregate annual amount of fee revenues shall always equal at least three million dollars (\$3,000,000).

SECTION 8. The proceeds of the loan, other than amounts required to establish required reserves, to pay interest on the loan for a period not to exceed one (1) year, or to pay costs of the loan, all of which shall be set forth in written directions executed by the Director of the Department of Health, shall be deposited as cash funds in an account of the board designated "State Board of Health Public Health Laboratory Construction Fund", and disbursed by the director for the construction of the expansion.

SECTION 9. All moneys held at any time in the revenue fund, the revenue loan fund, and the construction fund shall to the extent feasible be invested and reinvested, as directed by the Director of the Department of Health, in direct obligations of or obligations fully guaranteed by the United States of America, or with the approval of the authority, in mutual funds composed entirely of direct obligations of or obligations fully guaranteed by the United States of America.

SECTION 10. (a) The authorizing resolution, and each agreement or other writing executed and delivered pursuant to it or this act, together with this act, shall constitute a contract between the State Board of Health and the Arkansas Development Finance Authority, and the obligations of the board may be enforced by mandamus or other equitable or legal remedy.

(b) The obligations of the board shall be freely assignable by the authority, provided that the board is notified in writing of the assignment.

SECTION 11. Neither the Director of the Department of Health nor any member of the State Board of Health shall be personally liable on the loan or on account of any of the obligations or actions undertaken in connection with the loan, or for any damages sustained by anyone with respect to the obligations or actions, unless he or she shall have acted with a corrupt intent.

SECTION 12. Arkansas Code § 20-7-123(b)(1)(H) through (b)(1)(J), regarding fees credited to the Public Health Fund, are amended to read as follows:

(H)(i) A fee of ~~eight dollars (\$8.00)~~ ten dollars (\$10.00) collected by the state registrar for the making and certification of any certificate or record other than a death certificate;

(ii) A fee of ~~five dollars (\$5.00)~~ six dollars (\$6.00) collected for the making and certification of each additional copy of a certificate or record other than a death certificate;

(I)(i) A fee of ~~eight dollars (\$8.00)~~ ten dollars (\$10.00) collected by the state registrar for the making and certification of a single copy of a death certificate; and

(ii) A fee of ~~three dollars (\$3.00)~~ ten dollars (\$10.00) collected by the state registrar for the making and certification of each additional copy of a death certificate;

(J)(i) A fee of ~~eight dollars (\$8.00)~~ ten dollars (\$10.00) collected by the state registrar for an examination and search of the files for any birth, marriage, divorce, or death record.

(ii) The fee shall be paid prior to searching the record; and

SECTION 13. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the Eighty-fourth General Assembly that there is a pressing and immediate need for the construction of a modern public health laboratory; that the Eighty-third General Assembly increased vital record fees and dedicated those fees to upgrade the Department of Health's computer system; that those fees, pursuant to Arkansas Code § 20-7-123(b)(1)(L), will sunset when one million eight hundred thousand dollars (\$1,800,000) has been deposited in the Health Department Technology fund; that this act must become effective immediately upon the implementation of Arkansas Code § 20-7-123(b)(1)(L). Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.”

The General Assembly has determined that Great Rivers Technical Institute could be operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that agency.
