"(b) Beginning with the 2003-2004 school year, no school district shall pay a teacher with the requisite years of experience and degree level, a salary less than that set forth in this minimum teachers' salary schedule, and no teacher hired by a school district after the effective date of this act shall be paid an amount less than that set forth in the uniform teacher's salary schedule, as updated yearly, under subdivision (c)(1) of this act:"

"AN ACT TO REQUIRE THAT ANY PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT THAT HAS COMMITTED REPORTING FRAUD IN THE ACCREDITATION OR ACCOUNTABILITY PROCESS SHALL NOT BE ENTITLED TO PARTICIPATE IN ANY STATEWIDE ACTIVITIES ADMINISTERED BY THE ARKANSAS ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

SECTION 1. (a)(1) The Department of Education shall report to the Arkansas Activities Association any school district that the department determines has committed fraud with respect to any information required for accreditation or any accountability measures, and that school district shall not be eligible to participate in any statewide activities regulated by the Arkansas Activities Association.

(2) No school district may be a member of the Arkansas Activities Association unless the school district is accredited by the Department of Education.

(b)(1) Any individual making a charge of fraud relating to accreditation or accountability shall do so by providing the Department of Education with a signed, written statement setting forth the allegation.

(2) Any allegation reported by the Department of Education shall be filed by the unit supervisor of Standards Assurance who shall do so by a signed, written statement setting forth the allegation.

(c)(1) Any allegation received by the Department of Education in accordance with subsection (b), shall be reviewed by the Director of the Department of Education or his designee.

(2)(A) If the director or designee determines the charges to be sufficient, Department of Education staff shall be appointed to conduct an investigation.

(B) The investigation shall be conducted pursuant to rules and regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education.

(C) The staff investigating the allegation shall provide a written copy of the results of the investigation to the Director of the Department of Education.

(D) Upon the director's review and approval, the findings will be forwarded to the executive director of the Arkansas Activities Association.

(d) The Arkansas Activities Association may take action based on the investigative reports.

(e) The Department of Education shall develop rules and regulations as necessary to promulgate this act.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that school districts must comply with the standards of accreditation; that school districts making fraudulent reports should have be reprimanded in some manner and that a procedure needs to be in place

prior to the beginning of the next school year; and that this act is immediately

necessary because rules and regulations must be implemented prior to the beginning of the 2003-2004 school year. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2004."

Amend **Senate Bill No. 697** as originally introduced:

Delete Section 1 and substitute the following:

"SECTION 1. (a)(1) For purposes of this section, "parcel" means all contiguous land capable of being conveyed on a single deed, except when the land crosses a taxing unit or section lines.

(2) However, an "improvement only" is considered a separate parcel from the land.

(b) The General Assembly has determined that in order to meet the directives of Arkansas Code § 15-21-501, cooperative methods between state and local governments are necessary to improve electronic public access to land records.

(c)(1) To provide for and maintain the public access to land records, an

annual fee in the amount of one dollar and seventy-five cents (\$1.75) per parcel is levied on the owner of taxable real property in each county of this state.

(2) The fee shall be paid annually in every county where the property owner pays real property taxes, but in no event shall the fee exceed seventeen dollars and fifty cents (\$17.50) per owner per year in any county.

(3) The fee shall be paid to the county tax collector by the property owner at the time of paying property taxes.

(d) Collection of the fee shall begin on January 1, 2004.

(e)(1) Each county shall create within the county treasury a County Technology and Digital Mapping Fund.

(2) The county treasurer shall disburse the monies in the fund for the purpose of acquiring information technology, information technology services, information technology personnel, and information technology training.

(3) Expenditures for information technologies may include:

(A) Computer hardware and software;

(B) Internet connectivity; and

(C) Digital data acquisition and development including but not limited to digital aerial photography, satellite imagery, and digital monumentation and re-monumentation.

(4) The information technologies shall be consistent with Arkansas State Land Information Board standards and the State of Arkansas Shared Technical Architecture.

(f)(1) Fifty-seven percent (57%) of the fees collected in each county shall be deposited into the County Technology and Digital Mapping Fund.

(2) Forty-three percent (43%) of the amount collected shall be transmitted by the county treasurer to the Treasurer of State for deposit into the Geographic Information Systems Fund for the purpose of assisting in land records modernization using current digital data standards, and for the development and distribution of that data to the public.

(g) The Arkansas State Land Information Board shall establish policies to monitor technology progress, and provide for accountability, in the use of the funds collected under this section.

(h) All land records data development shall be coordinated with the Arkansas Geographic Information Office."

(B) ~~To obtain a~~ Obtaining any permit from the Health Services Permit Agency ~~and or the Health Services Permit Commission to operate at the capacity licensed by the board as of March 1, 2003-;~~ and

(C) Obtaining any permit from the Health Services Permit Agency or the Health Services Permit Commission to operate any future expanded capacity serving only non Arkansas residents unless a permit is required by federal law or regulation.

(4) Any further expansion of capacity by a licensee of the board shall require a license or permit from the Office of Long Term Care of the Division of Medicaid Services or the Department of Human Services and the Health Services Permit Agency unless the bed expansion is exempted under subdivisions (a)(3)(A), (B), and (C) of this section.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 20-8-107, concerning approval of expansion or services at health care facilities by the Health Services Permit Commission, is amended to add an additional subsection to read as follows:

(c) In no event shall the requirements of this subchapter apply to any facility licensed or approved as of March 1, 2003, by the Child Welfare Agency Review Board, pursuant to § 9-28-401 and as specifically exempted by § 9-28-407(a)(3)."

(c) The purpose of this section is to allow the private care agencies defined herein to be eligible to provide Medicaid reimbursed personal care services ~~on Saturdays and Sundays only~~ seven days a week, and does not supercede Department of Human Services rules establishing monthly benefit limits and prior authorization requirements.

(d) The availability of providers shall not require the Department of Human Services to reimburse for 24 hours per day of personal care services.

(e) The Arkansas Department of Human Services, Medical Services Division shall take such action as required by the ~~Health Care Financing Administration Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services~~ to amend the Arkansas Medicaid manual to include, private care agencies ~~defined herein~~, as qualified entities to provide Medicaid reimbursed personal care services.

(f) The private care agencies ~~defined herein~~ shall comply with rules and regulations promulgated by the Arkansas Department of Health which shall establish a separate licensure category for the private care agencies ~~defined herein~~ for the provision of Medicaid reimbursable personal care services ~~on weekends~~ seven days a week.

(g) The Arkansas Department of Health shall supervise the conduct of the private care agencies defined herein.

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code 21-5-1101 is amended as follows:

§ 21-5-1101. Competency-based promotions and salary adjustments.

(a) The Department of Finance and Administration is hereby authorized to develop and implement a career ladder incentive program for employees of all state agencies, boards, commissions, and institutions of higher education covered by the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, § 21-5-201 et seq.

(b) For the purpose of this subchapter, a "career ladder incentive program" means a competency-based pay system which incorporates pay and performance standards and establishes criteria for competency-based promotions and salary adjustments for employees who exhibit effective performance and support the key agency or institution's goals and objectives.

(c) "Career ladder classification series" means a cluster of hierarchical classes with similar duties and functions that is grouped for professional promotion purposes.

~~(d) Bonus payments of up to eight percent (8%) may be awarded to employees who satisfy competency-based criteria developed by agencies and institutions and approved by the Office of Personnel Management of the Division of Management Services of the Department of Finance and Administration after review by the Legislative Council. — The Chief Fiscal Office of the State, at the end of each fiscal year, shall determine the percentage amount not to exceed eight percent (8%) for bonus payments that may be awarded to employees who satisfy competency based criteria developed by agencies and institutions and approved by the Office of Personnel Management of the Department of Finance and Administration after review by the Legislative Council.~~

(e) The payments shall be awarded as a lump-sum payment, and the payment shall not be construed as exceeding the maximum salary.

(f) The lump-sum payments in this section shall not be considered as salary for the purposes of retirement eligibility.

(g) Management or supervisory personnel who fail to complete an annual evaluation of employees under their administrative control shall not be eligible for promotion or salary adjustment bonus payments themselves.

SECTION 5 . Arkansas Code 21-5-1002 is amended to read as follows:

There are hereby established the following uniform performance evaluation categories for use in determining incentive pay award eligibility. As used in this section:

(1) "Unsatisfactory" means an overall performance of duties that is consistently unacceptable in quality, accuracy, and timeliness;

(2) "Satisfactory" means an overall evaluation which demonstrates competency in the performance of the duties and responsibilities of the job;

(3) "Above Average" means an overall evaluation which demonstrates performance of the duties and responsibilities of the job at a level which is above the "Satisfactory" level of performance; and

~~(3)~~ (4) "Exceeds standards" means an overall evaluation which demonstrates performance of the duties and responsibilities of the job and productivity at a level exceeding that of a satisfactory an above average evaluation.

SECTION 6 . Arkansas Code 21-5-1003 is amended as follows:

(a) Any agency, board, commission, or institution of higher education may revise or develop an evaluation process suited to the mission of the agency, board, commission, or institution, provided:

(1) The evaluation process identifies performance which is "unsatisfactory", "satisfactory", "above average" and "exceeds standards", and

(2) The evaluation system complies with the guidelines established by the Office of Personnel Management of the Division of Management Services of the Department of Finance and Administration.
