Amendment No. 1 to SENATE BILL NO. 955

Amend **Senate Bill No. 955** as originally introduced:

Page 1, delete lines 23 through 25 and substitute the following:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 15-4-2703(1), as added by Act 182 of 2003, is amended to read as follows:

(10) "Eligible businesses" means non-retail businesses engaged in commerce for profit or not for profit that meet the eligibility requirements for the applicable incentive offered by this subchapter, and fall into one (1) or more of the following categories:

(A) Manufacturers classified in sectors 31-33 in the North American Industrial Classification System, as in effect January 1, 2003;

(B)(i) Businesses primarily engaged in the design and development of prepackaged software, digital content production and preservation, computer processing and data preparation services, or information retrieval services.

(ii) All businesses in this group shall derive at least seventy-five percent (75%) of their revenue from out-of-state sales;

(C)(i) Businesses primarily engaged in motion picture productions.

(ii) All businesses in this group shall derive at least seventy-five percent (75%) of their revenue from out-of-state sales;

(D) A distribution center;

(E) An office sector business;

(F) A national or regional corporate headquarters;

(G) Firms primarily engaged in commercial, physical and biological research as classified in the North American Industrial Classification System, as in effect January 1, 2003; and

(H)(i) Scientific and technical services business.

(ii)(a) All businesses in this group shall derive at least seventy-five percent (75%) of their revenue from out-of-state sales; and

(b) The average hourly wages paid by businesses in this group shall exceed one hundred fifty percent (150%) of the county or state average hourly wage, whichever is less;

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 15-4-2703(21), as added by Act 182 of 2003, is amended to read as follows:

(21) "Non-retail business" means a for profit business that derives less than ten percent (10%) of its total Arkansas revenue from sales to the general public or a not-for-profit business that derives less than ten percent (10%) of its total revenue from sales to the general public;

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 15-4-2703, as added by Act 182 of 2003, is amended to add an additional subdivision to read as follows:

(39)(A) "Not-for-profit business" means non-retail businesses engaged in commerce not-for-profit.

(B) Businesses in this group may not be hospitals, public or private school, colleges, or universities, or churches or institutions that regularly conduct religious services for the general public on the premises;

(C) All businesses in this group must derive at least seventy-five percent (75%) of their revenue from out-of-state sales and contributions; and

(D) Businesses in this group are only eligible for the sales and use tax refunds under § 15-4-2706(d) and shall not be eligible for the other benefits authorized under this subchapter, nor shall any business transfer or sell any benefit authorized under this subchapter to any other taxpayer.

SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that existing Arkansas not-for-profit businesses must remain competitive in today's global economy; that the tax incentive provided by this act is necessary to provide not-for-profit businesses with the incentive to invest in Arkansas and hire Arkansans; that other states compete with Arkansas for the location or expansion of not-for-profit business activity and this

incentive is also necessary to offer the companies a business environment compatible with other states; that without this incentive, not-for-profit companies considering locations or expansions of their businesses may choose to locate in another state, depriving Arkansans of these jobs and the economic benefit that the jobs bring to the state; that the immediate effectiveness of this is essential to the economic incentives provided in this act. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto.”

“SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 18, Chapter 50, Subchapter 1 is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:

18-50-117. Foreign corporations and other entities.

No person, firm, company, association, fiduciary, or partnership, either domestic or foreign, shall avail themselves of the procedures under this chapter unless authorized to do business in this state.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 18-50-102(a), concerning the qualifications of a trustee acting under Arkansas' statutory foreclosure law, is amended to read as follows:

(a) A trustee of a deed of trust shall be any:

(1) Attorney who is an active licensed member of the Bar of the Supreme Court of the State of Arkansas or law firm among whose members includes such an attorney;

(2) Bank or savings and loan association authorized to do business under the laws of Arkansas or those of the United States; or

(3) ~~Corporation authorized to conduct a trust business in Arkansas or the United States~~ which is an affiliate of a bank or savings and loan association authorized to do business under the laws of Arkansas or those of the United States, which is either an Arkansas bank or a registered out of state bank as the terms are defined under § 23-45-102, which maintains a branch in the State of Arkansas; or

(4) Agency or authority of the State of Arkansas where not otherwise prohibited by law.

SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that foreign entities not authorized to do business in the State of Arkansas are availing themselves to the provisions of the Statutory Foreclosure Act of 1987; that often times it is to the detriment of Arkansas citizens; and that this act is immediately necessary because these entities should be authorized to do business in the State of Arkansas before being able to use the Statutory Foreclosure Act of 1987 aq. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.”

(3) If the voter is assisted by one (1) person named by the voter, he or she may assist the voter in operating the machine so as to vote the ballot in accordance with the wishes of the voter without comment or interpretation, and shall be permitted to keep the curtain closed no longer than five (5) minutes.

(4) The laws of this state with respect to assisting persons with disabilities in the casting of votes upon printed ballots shall govern, insofar as is practicable, the assistance of a voter in casting his ballot by voting machine.

(5) It shall be the duty of the election officials at the polling site to make and maintain a list of the names of all persons assisting voters.

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 7-5-305(a), concerning the procedures for identifying qualified voters, is amended to read as follows:

(1) Request the voter to identify himself in order to verify the existence of his name on the precinct voter registration list;

(6) If the voter's name is not the same as that on the precinct voter registration list, request the voter to complete a voter registration application form for purposes of updating county voter registration record files;

(7) Request the voter, in the presence of the election official, to sign his name, including his given name, his middle name or initial, if any, and his last name in the space provided on the precinct voter registration list. If a person is unable to sign his signature or make his mark or cross, the election official shall enter his initials and the voter's date of birth in the space for the person's signature on the precinct voter registration list; ~~and~~

(8)(A) Request the voter for purposes of identification to provide a valid driver's license, photo identification card issued by a governmental agency, voter card, social security card, birth certificate, United States passport, employee identification card issued by a governmental agency containing a photograph, employee identification card issued in the normal course of business of the employer, student identification card, Arkansas hunting license, or United States military identification card.

(B)(i) If a voter is unable to provide this identification, the election official shall indicate on the precinct voter registration list that the voter did not provide identification.

(ii) Following each election, the county board of election commissioners may review the precinct voter registration lists and may provide the information of the voters not providing identification at the polls to the prosecuting attorney.
