Amend **Senate Bill No. 124** as originally introduced:

Page 1, delete lines 9 through 11, and substitute the following:
“AN ACT TO PROVIDE A NEW ANNUITY OPTION FOR PARTICIPANTS OF THE TEACHER DEFERRED RETIREMENT OPTION PLAN; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.”

AND

Page 1, delete lines 14 through 16, and substitute the following:
“TO PROVIDE A NEW ANNUITY OPTION FOR PARTICIPANTS OF THE TEACHER DEFERRED RETIREMENT OPTION PLAN.”

AND

Delete Sections 1. and 2. of the bill and substitute a new section to read as follows:

“SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 24-7-1308(b), concerning the separation from service after participation in the Teacher Deferred Retirement Option Plan, is amended to read as follows:

(b)(1) When the member's participation in the plan ceases, the member may elect to receive the balance in the plan account as a lump sum or as a monthly benefit paid in the form elected by the member for payment of the plan.

(2) The board shall determine factors to be used for the conversion of plan balances to monthly amounts.

(3)(A) The board shall make available an annuity option that provides a level monthly annuity continuing to age sixty-five (65).

(B) The board shall determine factors to be used for the conversion of plan balances to this monthly amount.”

Page 1, lines 10 through 13, delete "IF NO PRIZES, MONEY, OR ANYTHING OF VALUE IS AWARDED TO THE PERSONS PARTICIPATING IN THE CHARITABLE EVENT" and substitute "UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES"

AND

Page 1, lines 18 through 21, delete "IF NO PRIZES, MONEY, OR ANYTHING OF VALUE IS AWARDED TO THE PERSONS PARTICIPATING IN THE CHARITABLE EVENT" and substitute "UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES"

Page 1, delete lines 26 through 28 and substitute the following:

"SECTION 1. (a) An event held by a nonprofit organization that is exempt from taxation under § 26 U.S.C. 501(c)(3) shall be exempt from Arkansas Code § 3-9-236(a)(15), if:

(1) The nonprofit organization registers the event with the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division at least sixty (60) days before the event;

(2) All proceeds of the event are for the benefit of the nonprofit organization;

(3) The games in the event do not use money but may use some form of play money;

(4) No cash is won as a prize; and

(5) The event is for amusement and not for gambling purposes.

(b) This section shall apply to only one (1) event held by the nonprofit organization during a calendar year.

(c)(1) A violation of this section is a misdemeanor and is punishable by a fine of one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

(2) If a nonprofit organization commits a second offense the nonprofit organization shall be ineligible to sponsor an event under this section."

“AN ACT TO PRECLUDE A USER AGENCY OF THE ARKANSAS CRIME INFORMATION SYSTEM FROM DENYING ACCESS TO ANOTHER CRIMINAL JUSTICE AGENCY WHEN USING THE SYSTEM’S RESOURCES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.”

AND

Page 1, delete lines 16 through 20, and substitute the following:
“AN ACT TO PRECLUDE A USER AGENCY OF THE ARKANSAS CRIME INFORMATION SYSTEM FROM DENYING ACCESS TO ANOTHER CRIMINAL JUSTICE AGENCY WHEN USING THE SYSTEM’S RESOURCES.”

AND

Delete Section 1. of the bill and substitute a new section to read as follows:

“SECTION 1. (a) As used in this act, “criminal justice agency” means a law enforcement agency that meets the criteria for and has been assigned an ORI number by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

(b)(1) Notwithstanding any provision of law under Arkansas Code Title 12, Chapter 12, Subchapter 2, if a criminal justice agency meets the criteria for being a criminal justice agency under the Arkansas Crime Information Center’s system regulations, a user agency of the Arkansas Crime Information System shall not deny another criminal justice agency not equipped for direct access to the system from accessing the system’s resources.

(2) Access shall be allowed in the form of radio communications, public service, and in-person use at the user agency.

(c) Any person in a user agency that denies access to another criminal justice agency not equipped for direct access to the system is guilty of a violation of obstructing governmental operations under Arkansas Code § 5-54-102.

(d) This act shall be enforced as a joint effort between the Arkansas Crime Information Center and the Arkansas State Police.”

Delete everything after the enacting clause and substitute:

“SECTION 1. Definitions.

As used in this subchapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

(1) “Department” means the physical location where sessions of court are held; and

(2) “Division” means the subject matter division of the court.

SECTION 2. (a)(1) Each of the following counties shall have one (1) district court and one (1) district judge:

(2) Baxter, Boone, Bradley, Calhoun, Clark, Cleburne, Cleveland, Columbia, Conway, Crawford, Cross, Dallas, Drew, Faulkner, Fulton, Grant, Greene, Hempstead, Hot Spring, Howard, Independence, Izard, Jackson, Johnson, Lawrence, Lafayette, Lee, Lincoln, Little River, Madison, Marion, Miller, Montgomery, Nevada, Newton, Perry, Pike, Poinsett, Polk, Pope, Randolph, Scott, Searcy, Sevier, Sharp, St. Francis, Stone, Union, Van Buren, and Woodruff.

(b) The district court shall be located in the county seat of the counties listed in subdivision (a)(1) (B) of this section.

(c)(1) The judge of any district court located in a county with one (1) district court shall be elected countywide.

(2) If there is only one (1) district court in a county, it shall have countywide jurisdiction.

SECTION 3. Crittenden County shall have the following district courts and judges:

- (1) Marion shall have one (1) district court and one (1) district judge.
- (2) West Memphis shall have one (1) district court and one (1) district judge.
- (3) The jurisdiction of any district court in Crittenden County shall be countywide.
- (4) The judge of any district court in Crittenden County shall be elected countywide.

SECTION 4. (a) Arkansas, Carroll, Franklin, Logan, Mississippi, and Prairie counties, having two (2) judicial districts, shall have one (1) district court in each district and one (1) district judge for each court:

(b) The district court in Arkansas, Carroll, Franklin, Logan, Mississippi, and Prairie counties shall be located in the county seat of each judicial district in the county.

(c) The judge of any district court located in Arkansas, Carroll, Franklin, Logan, Mississippi, and Prairie counties shall be elected by the electors of the judicial district in which the court is located.

(d) In Arkansas, Carroll, Franklin, Logan, Mississippi, and Prairie counties the jurisdiction of the district court shall be limited to the district in which the court sits.

SECTION 5. (a) Sebastian County, having two (2) judicial districts, shall have:

(1) One (1) district court in Ft. Smith with two (2) departments, and one (1) judge for each department; and

(2) One district court in Greenwood with one (1) district judge.

(b) The judge of any district court in Sebastian County shall be elected by the electors of the judicial district in which the court is located.

(c) The jurisdiction of the district court in Sebastian County shall be limited to the district in which the court is located.

SECTION 6. (a) Craighead County, shall have one (1) district court in Jonesboro and one (1) judge.

(b) The judge of the district court in Craighead County shall be elected countywide.

(c) The district court in Craighead County shall have countywide jurisdiction.

Page 54, line 26 add the following:

"SECTION 72. Arkansas Code § 21-5-208, as amended by Act 923 of 2003, is amended to read as follows:

21-5-208. Classification of positions.

(a)(1) There are established for state agencies and institutions of higher education covered by the provisions of this subchapter the following classification titles and grades.

(2) No payment of salaries may be made except in conformity with the maximum annual salary rates assigned to these grades for each year of the fiscal biennium as provided in the appropriation act of the agency or the institution and in this subchapter.

(b) The following classification titles with grades indicated are approved for the state classification plan, subject to the appropriation acts for the various state agencies and various institutions of higher education affected by this subchapter:

(a)(1) It shall be the duty of every person who wishes to avail himself of the provisions of this subchapter to file, with the clerk of the circuit court of the county in which the building, erection, or other improvement to be charged with the lien is situated and within one hundred twenty (120) days after the things specified in this subchapter shall have been furnished or the work or labor done or performed, a just

and true account of the demand due or owing to him after allowing all credits. This account shall contain a correct description of the property to be charged with the lien, verified by affidavit.

(2)(A) The person claiming the lien shall serve a file-marked copy of the account upon the owner of the property at the mailing address contained in the records of the tax assessor for that property owner and the account shall disclose that a claim for lien has been filed.

(B) The service of the account may be made by any form of mail addressed to the person to be served, with a return receipt requested and delivery restricted to the addressee or the agent of the addressee.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 18-44-118 is amended to read as follows:
18-44-118. Filing of bond in contest of lien - Alternative contest .

(a) In the event any person claiming a lien for labor or materials upon any property shall file such a lien, within the time and in the manner required by law with the circuit clerk or other officer provided by law for the filing of such liens and if the owner of the property, any mortgagee or other person having an interest therein, or any contractor, subcontractor, or other person liable for the payment of such liens shall desire to contest the lien, then the person so desiring to contest the lien may file with the circuit clerk or other officer with whom the lien is filed as required by law a bond with surety, to be approved by the officer in double the amount of the lien claimed. The bond shall be conditioned for the payment of the amount of the lien, or so much thereof as may be established by suit, together with interest and the costs of the action, if upon trial it shall be found that the property was subject to the lien.

(b) Upon the filing of the bond, if the circuit clerk or other officer before whom it is filed approves the surety, he shall give to the person claiming the lien, at his last known address, three (3) days' notice of the filing of the bond. The notice shall be in writing sent by certified mail with return receipt requested. Within that time, the person claiming the lien may appear and question the sufficiency of the surety or form of the bond. At the expiration of three (3) days, if the person claiming the lien shall not have questioned the sufficiency of the bond or surety or if the clerk finds the same to be sufficient, the clerk shall note the filing of the bond upon the margin of the lien record; the lien thereof shall thereupon be discharged and the claimant shall have recourse only against the principal and surety upon the bond.

(c) If no action to enforce the lien shall be filed within the time prescribed by law for the enforcement of liens against the surety, the bond shall be null and void, but, if any action shall be timely commenced, the surety shall be liable in like manner as the principal.

(d) If the clerk shall determine that the bond tendered is insufficient, the person tendering the bond shall have twenty-four (24) hours within which to tender a sufficient bond, and, unless a sufficient bond shall be so tendered, the lien shall remain in full force and effect.

(e) Any party aggrieved by the acceptance or rejection of the bond may apply to any court of competent jurisdiction by an action which is appropriate. The court shall have jurisdiction to enter an interlocutory order, upon notice as required by law, as may be necessary for the protection of the parties by requiring additional security for the bond, by reinstating the lien in default thereof, pending trial and hearing, or by requiring acceptance of the bond as may be necessary for the protection of the parties.

(f)(1) As an alternative procedure, if an owner of residential property or that owner's agent receives notice of the filing of a lien against residential property and believes that the lien is a fraudulent claim, that the claim is being pursued purely to extort money, or that the lien is being filed solely to gain a superior bargaining position on a worthless or near-worthless claim, the owner of the residential property or owner's agent may file a petition objecting to the lien with the circuit court of the

county in which the property is located and shall receive an expedited hearing before the court within thirty (30) days of the service of the petition upon the person claiming the lien.

(2) After obtaining service of the petition objecting to the lien upon the person claiming the lien, the owner or owner's agent shall obtain a date for the hearing on the owner's challenge of the validity of the lien and shall give notice of the date, time, and place of the hearing by certified mail, postage prepaid, either to the person claiming the lien or the person's legal counsel of record.

(3)(A) If the court decides for the petitioner at a hearing, then the court shall order the clerk to discharge the lien.

(B) If the court decides for the lien claimant, then court may assess the costs for the expedited hearing and attorney's fees against the owner or the owner's agent and the lien shall remain intact.

SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that owners and developers of commercial real estate are knowledgeable and sophisticated in construction law and know how to protect themselves against the imposition of mechanics' and materialmen's liens; that consumers who construct or improve residential real estate containing four (4) or fewer units do not possess that same level of knowledge and awareness; that materialmen's lien procedures are used to secure payment for work done by contractors and construction workers on homes; that the lien procedures are being abused by certain individuals; that new protections against the abuse of the lien procedures must be instituted for the benefit of honest homeowners; that these new protections cannot wait to be implemented; and that this act is immediately necessary because any delay in implementing may harm another innocent homeowner. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto."

"SECTION 1. (a) Under current circumstances there is a need to restructure the financing mechanism pursuant to which Arkansas public schools are presently funded.

(b)(1) To support public schools the state is authorized to levy a statewide ad valorem property tax. The General Assembly may increase or decrease the uniform rate of ad valorem property tax to be levied on the assessed value of all taxable real, personal and regulated carrier property in the state to be used solely for maintenance and operation of the public schools within the state, which shall be in addition to and exclusive of any ad valorem property tax levied by the state for the purposes of funding debt service or debt retirement, by a two-thirds (2/3rds) vote of the total membership of each house of the General Assembly and proper enactment thereof; provided, however, that the uniform rate of ad valorem property tax for maintenance and operation of the public schools shall initially be set at and may not be less than twenty-five (25) mills.

(2) Except as provided in this subsection, the uniform rate of ad valorem property tax for maintenance and operation shall not be an additional levy for maintenance and operation of the schools but shall replace the existing rate of tax levied by each school district available for maintenance and operation of schools in the school district which shall be in addition to and exclusive of any ad valorem property tax levied by the state for the purposes of funding debt service or debt retirement.

(3) The uniform rate of ad valorem property tax for maintenance and operation shall be assessed and collected in the same manner as other school property taxes, but the net revenues from the uniform rate of ad valorem property tax for maintenance and operation shall be remitted to the State Treasurer and distributed by the state to the school districts as provided by law. The revenues so distributed shall be used solely for maintenance and operation of schools pursuant to law.

(c)(1) In addition to, and not in replacement of, the uniform rate of ad valorem property tax for maintenance and operation provided in subsection (b), school districts are authorized to levy, by a vote of the qualified electors respectively thereof, an additional annual ad valorem property tax on the assessed value of taxable real, personal, and regulated carrier property within the district for the further maintenance and operation of district schools. The maximum revenue generated by the additional, annual ad valorem property tax which may be levied by a school district for maintenance and operation of the school shall be determined by a majority vote of both houses of the General Assembly and proper enactment thereof.

(2) The Board of Directors shall submit the proposed tax at the annual school election or at such other time as may be provided by law. If a majority of the qualified voters in the school district voting in the school election approve the additional ad valorem districtwide property tax proposed by the Board of Directors, then the additional ad valorem districtwide property tax at the rate approved plus the uniform rate of ad valorem property tax for maintenance and operation authorized in subsection (a) shall be collected as provided by law. In the event a majority of the qualified electors voting in the school election disapprove the proposed additional ad valorem property tax, then the ad valorem property tax shall be collected at the established uniform rate of ad valorem property tax for maintenance and operation together with any additional ad valorem districtwide property tax for maintenance and operation previously approved pursuant to this subsection (c).

(3) A district may continue to collect an additional, districtwide annual ad valorem property tax at the rate which was validly levied under prior law until the General Assembly takes appropriate action to set the maximum revenue which may be generated by the additional, districtwide annual ad valorem property tax. In the event a majority of the qualified electors do not approve an additional, districtwide annual ad valorem property tax pursuant to subsection (c)(2) hereof after the General Assembly has set the maximum revenue which may be generated by the additional, districtwide annual ad valorem property tax pursuant to (c)(1), then the additional, districtwide ad valorem property tax shall be levied at the rate which was validly levied under prior law or if such rate generates revenue in excess of the maximum provided for by the General Assembly, then such rate shall be decreased to be in compliance with the maximum revenue established by the General Assembly.

(4) For the purposes of this section, "maintenance and operation" means such expenses for the general maintenance and operation of schools as shall be defined by law.

(d)(1) The General Assembly shall establish, increase or decrease the uniform rate of ad valorem property tax to be levied on the assessed value of all taxable real, personal, and regulated carrier property in the state to be used solely for debt service related to capital improvement projects and the retirement of bonded indebtedness which is issued for the purpose of benefiting the public schools within the state by a two-thirds (2/3rds) vote of the total membership of each house of the General Assembly and proper enactment thereof. Provided, however, no reduction in the uniform rate of ad valorem property tax for debt service shall be approved so long as bonded indebtedness is outstanding to which the existing uniform rate of ad valorem property tax is pledged.

(2) As determined by the General Assembly, the state or an agency of the state may issue bonded indebtedness or tax anticipation notes for the purpose of financing capital improvements for the public schools of the state. Such indebtedness shall be secured by a pledge of the uniform rate of ad valorem property tax for debt service. For the purposes of this section, "capital improvement projects" means such capital improvement projects for schools as shall be defined by law. The General Assembly shall adopt implementing legislation which shall govern the issuance of such indebtedness and the expenditure of bond proceeds.

(e) Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 12 of Article 12 of the Constitution of the State of Arkansas, the State is given specific authority to assume the bonded indebtedness of local school districts. The State of Arkansas shall assume the outstanding bonded indebtedness of all school districts within the state to which ad valorem property taxes are pledged. The state or a state agency, as determined by the General Assembly, is authorized to issue bonded indebtedness, which shall be secured by a pledge of the general obligation of the state, for the purpose of assuming this indebtedness. The bonds hereby authorized shall be in such amounts as are necessary to assume the outstanding bonded indebtedness of all school districts to which ad valorem property taxes are pledged as of the date this amendment is adopted together with a reasonably required reserve and the costs of issuing the bonds. The General Assembly shall designate a specific source of revenue by which this bonded indebtedness shall be secured. The approval herein granted is intended to and hereby does satisfy the requirements of Article 20 of the Constitution of the State of Arkansas. The General Assembly shall adopt legislation which implements these provisions.

(f) While state bonded indebtedness which is secured by an ad valorem property tax herein authorized is outstanding, the state-based ad valorem property tax pledged thereto shall remain in place.

SECTION 2. Amendment 47, State Ad Valorem Tax Prohibition, of the Arkansas Constitution is amended to read as follows:

§1. State ad valorem tax prohibited.

Except as provided by Section 3 of Article 14, as amended, no ad valorem tax shall be levied upon property by the State.
