**REMARKS OF
SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE BILL STOVALL
JANUARY 10, 2005**

Thank you. Thank you so much. First let me thank everyone particularly the citizens of District 59 who elected me the past four years, without them I would not be here today. I owe them a debt of gratitude. Certainly my family and friends, I owe a debt of gratitude. They sacrificed so much to allow me to be here today, not just as a state representative, but as the speaker. My vocabulary is not sufficient to express my appreciation other than thank you.

I have made a lot of good friends old and new over the term in office. I would like to thank the 84th Arkansas General Assembly for electing me as the Speaker-designate, and the 85th Arkansas General Assembly for confirming me as Speaker today. I appreciate it. Thank you.

I hope I will make you proud, and we'll do everything we can to make this session a success. My focus will be to make this session a success, and also to be fair and just in our activities with the Speaker's office. We'll strive to make this successful for all of us.

This is an exciting time. Let's make good on it. Be true to your fundamentals. I would like to remind you of what I said a couple of years ago. I encourage you to remember the three C's, Commitment, Conviction and Courage. I carry them with me everywhere I go. The challenges and pursuits we are faced with can best be answered with sticking to our fundamentals.

We have some pursuits and challenges ahead of us, and I ask for your patience. I know that patience and perseverance have a magical effect before which difficulties disappear and obstacles may vanish.

The responsibilities we are faced with are some of the more significant that we could ever face. But with time, patience and perseverance, many things can be accomplished.

None of us can be successful in these pursuits and responsibilities alone. It will take all of us working together. It will take an exceptional effort on all of our parts to answer our conflicts with civility, to answer the critics with kindness and to answer

the doubters and naysayers with wisdom that results in a product for all of us to be proud of.

For any of you who are concerned about the atmosphere between the chambers and our executive branch. Please don't be. It's time for us to be mature and responsible in our activities. Let me say it is time for all of us to prove to our constituency that politics and government are not synonymous.

If liberty and equality, as is thought by some, are chiefly to be found in democracy, they will be best attained when all persons alike share in the government to the utmost. We must be inclusive, and we will be respectful of each member. Their individual journey has led them to this time and place. I encourage you to get acquainted with each other and build relationships. Find out why each walk of life has brought you here. It will make you a better person and more respectful when your seatmate does not vote the way you want them to.

As for our agenda, it is certainly over shadowed by the budget difficulties we have faced the last four years. In the future, our needs outstrip our resources. The school facilities issue is hanging over our heads. We still have some challenges ahead to ensure that we attain constitutionality for our educational system, as well as adequate and equitable for our school facilities.

I'm hopeful that we can do something innovative this session. Our state has 400,000 to 500,000 people who are uninsured. Their uncompensated care is driving up the costs of health insurance premiums, and driving up the costs of Medicaid reimbursements as well.

I hope that we can take these challenges and make a productive answer for each of them.

I'm not going to be lengthy with my remarks. Later on today we are going to announce some chairmanships and vice chairmanships. I want each of you to know that I have done everything I know to do to maintain my commitment to each of you. In my appointments, I wanted to make sure that, given the playing field we have today, the right people are in the right place.

I want to read something to you. This became pretty special to me a couple of months ago. Some of you who have been in my office may have noticed it on my desk, but it is pretty lengthy and not many people have picked it up to read it.

So I will read for you. It is entitled "What Will Matter" by Michael Josephson.

Ready or not, some day it will all come to an end. There will be no more sunrises, no minutes, hours or days. All the things you collected, whether treasured or forgotten, will pass to someone else.

Your wealth, fame and temporal power will shrivel to irrelevance. It will not matter what you owned or what you were owed. Your grudges, resentments, frustrations and jealousies will finally disappear. So too, your hopes, ambitions, plans and to-do lists will expire. The wins and losses that once seemed so important will fade away. It won't matter where you came from or what side of the tracks you lived on at the end.

It won't matter whether you were beautiful or brilliant. Even your gender and skin color will be irrelevant.

So what will matter? How will the value of your days be measured?

What will matter is not what you bought, but what you built; not what you got, but what you gave.

What will matter is not your success, but your significance.

What will matter is not what you learned, but what you taught.

What will matter is every act of integrity, compassion, courage or sacrifice that enriched, empowered or encouraged others to emulate your example.

What will matter is not your competence, but your character.

What will matter is not how many people you knew, but how many will feel a lasting loss when you're gone.

What will matter is not your memories, but the memories that live in those who loved you.

What will matter is how long you will be remembered, by whom and for what.

Living a life that matters doesn't happen by accident.

It's not a matter of circumstance but of choice.

Choose to live a life that matters.

Thank you very much. Thank you everybody.
