(a)(1) It is declared a misdemeanor for any person to:

(A) Injure, damage, or destroy any public sewer; or

(B) Fail or refuse to connect with or tap the sewers of a municipality,

within the time prescribed by an ordinance of the municipality."

"(a)(1) Municipal corporations are empowered and authorized to ~~buy~~, sell, convey, lease, rent, or let any real estate or personal property owned or controlled by the municipal corporations. This power and authorization shall extend and apply to all such real estate and personal property, including that which is held by the municipal corporation for public or governmental uses and purposes.

(2) Municipal corporations are empowered and authorized to buy any real estate or personal property."
