"AN ACT TO PROVIDE PHYSICAL EDUCATION COURSE CREDIT FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE ARKANSAS NATIONAL GUARD OR RESERVES BASIC COMBAT TRAINING COURSE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

AND

Delete the subtitle in its entirety and substitute:

"AN ACT TO PROVIDE PHYSICAL EDUCATION COURSE CREDIT FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE ARKANSAS NATIONAL GUARD OR RESERVES BASIC COMBAT TRAINING COURSE."

AND

Delete everything following the enacting clause entirely and substitute:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 16, Subchapter 1 is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:

6-17-137. Physical education credit for participation in the Arkansas National Guard or Reserves basic combat training course.

(a) For the purpose of this section:

(1) "Content standards" means those curriculum course content standards identified and set out in the Department of Education Curriculum Frameworks;

(2) "Curriculum frameworks" means those content-specific requirements identified and mandated pursuant to § 6-15-1501 et seq. and the Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools;

(3) "Basic Combat Training Course" means the basic combat training course required by the Arkansas National Guard or Reserves for membership and is a course that involves body movement produced by skeletal muscles resulting in energy expenditures through organized group or class activities; and

(4) "Statement of assurance" means a written statement which ensures that the basic combat training course is in compliance with the physical education course content standards and curriculum frameworks as required pursuant to § 6-15-1505 and the requirements of subdivision (b) of this section to be filed with the Department of Education by October 1 of each year by:

(A) The Adjutant General or his or her designee for a basic combat training course offered by the Arkansas National Guard; and

(B) The Reserves Senior Commanding Officer or his or her designee for a basic combat training course offered by the Reserves.

(b) Beginning in the 2005-2006 school year, a student in grades ten through twelve (10-12) participating in and successfully completing a basic combat training course shall be eligible to receive one-half (1/2) unit of physical education credit required for graduation if the basic combat training course is equivalent to the Department of Education's physical education course content standards and curriculum frameworks.

(c) A student is limited to only the one-half (1/2) unit of physical education credit for graduation for the basic combat training course, and the student shall not be allowed any other credit toward graduation for the same course.

(d) A student must provide written documentation verifying the successful completion of the basic combat training course to receive the one-half (1/2) unit of physical education credit required for graduation.

(e) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, it is recognized that a basic combat training course as set forth under subsection (b) of this section is not a requirement for an adequate education and shall not be considered a core academic requirement of the State of Arkansas or public school districts.

(f) The State Board of Education may promulgate rules necessary to implement this section."
