(ii) Bids received pursuant to the advertisement shall be opened and read on the date set for receiving the bids in the presence of the mayor or the mayor's duly authorized representative.

(iii) The mayor or the mayor's duly authorized representative shall have exclusive power to award the bid to the lowest responsible bidder, but may reject any and all bids received.

(B) The governing body, by ordinance, may waive the requirements of competitive bidding in exceptional situations where this procedure is deemed not feasible or practical."

(2)(A) Every student in grades one through six (1-6) shall participate in the visual art and music class required in this subsection.

(B) Children with disabilities or other special needs shall be included in the visual art and music programs.

(3) The instruction required by subdivision (b)(1) of this subsection shall be provided by a licensed teacher certified to teach art or music, as applicable.

(4)(A) The department shall provide a stipend of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100) per class to each school for the purchase of necessary supplies or equipment for the classes required by this subsection (b) of this section.
