SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that school districts are currently entering into contracts for the professional development programs to be offered during the 2005-2006 school year; that school districts need sufficient time to plan and schedule professional development programs for certified personnel; and that this act is immediately necessary because a delay in its enactment may cause some districts to enter into unnecessary contracts for professional development programs. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto."

To the extent federal funding is not available to the Arkansas Crime Information Center during the 2005-2007 biennium for the Computerized Criminal History Program or the JusticeXchange Program, the Contingency Appropriation authorized herein may be used for regular salaries, personal services matching and maintenance and general operation line item appropriations authorized for such programs in this Act.
