(a) The Department of Arkansas State Police may issue a license under this subchapter to a person who:

(1) Is currently serving as a federally recognized commissioned or noncommissioned officer of the Arkansas National Guard;

(2) Submits the following documents:

(A) A completed concealed handgun license application as prescribed by the Department of Arkansas State Police;

(B) A form specified by the Director of the Department of Arkansas State Police reflecting the fingerprints of the soldier or airman;

(C) A dated letter personally signed by a commanding officer or his or her designee stating that the soldier or airman:

(i) Is a current member of the Arkansas National Guard;

(ii) Is of good character and sound judgment;

(iii) Is not disqualified by state or federal law from possessing a firearm;

(iv) Has met the military qualification requirements for issuance and operation of a handgun within one (1) year of the application date; and

(v) Has been a resident of the State of Arkansas for the twelve-month period preceding the application date according to the military and pay records of the soldier or airman;

(D) A copy of the military range qualification score card signed and dated within one (1) year of the application date by a range officer or noncommissioned officer in charge of the range; and

(E) A copy of the face or photograph side of a current United States Uniformed Services military identification card for members of the armed services; and

(3) Submits the required application fee or fees.

(b)(1) A license issued under this section shall expire four (4) years from the date of issuance or upon the expiration date of the military identification card of the soldier or airman, whichever occurs first.

(2) A license issued under this section shall be renewable under the provisions of § 5-73-313 upon satisfaction of the requirements described in subsection (a) of this section.

(c) Except as otherwise specifically stated in this section, the license issued under this section shall be subject to the provisions of §§ 5-73-301 – 5-73-319 and any rules promulgated under § 5-73-317."

(2) The mental health provider shall communicate the ninety-day review, update, and discharge plans to the primary care physician.

(3) The mental health provider shall notify the primary care physician of the following:

(A) Treatment failure or material interruption;

(B) Leave against medical advice; and

(C) Adverse outcomes if the child moves from ambulatory into residential or acute inpatient care.

(c)(1) If a mental health provider receives a referral of a Medicaid-eligible child that is not from a primary care physician, the mental health provider shall conduct an early periodic screening and diagnosis test as standardized and approved by the Division of Behavioral Health and the Division of Medical Services of the Department of Human Services.

(2) The mental health provider shall inform the primary care physician of the screening results, including the diagnosis and treatment plan, and determine the level of involvement desired by the primary care physician.

(3) If the Medicaid-eligible child has no primary care physician, the mental health provider shall assist the family or legal guardian in obtaining a primary care physician.

(d) The Arkansas Medicaid program shall not deny a Medicaid claim for mental health services for an eligible child due solely to the lack of a primary care physician referral.”

(B) Auxiliary areas include garages, carports, porches and other similar areas as determined by the Division of Sanitarian Services of the Department of Health.”
