~~(d)~~(c)(1) The Treasurer of State is designated and appointed custodian of all moneys received by the state from the appropriation made by the Congress, and he is authorized to receive and provide for the proper custody of the moneys and to make disbursements in the manner provided by law and for the purpose specified in this section.

(2)(A) Before disbursing any funds under this chapter, the Treasurer of State shall review the plans prepared by the department under this chapter for each county office.

(B)(i) At least quarterly, the Treasurer of State shall review the operations of each county office to ensure that each office operates in accordance with the purposes of the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children.

(ii) The Treasurer of State shall withhold funds from the division in proportion to the regular disbursement to any county office that is not operating in accordance with the purposes of the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children.

~~(e) The allocation of funds under this section shall be made to the respective counties in consecutive order as they make application and qualify for the funds.~~

~~(f)(d)(1)~~ Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this section upon conviction shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined in a sum not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500) at the discretion of the court.

(2) Each day the violation is committed shall constitute a separate offense.

(e) There is created the Women, Infants, and Children Advisory Board.

(f)(1) The advisory board shall consist of five (5) members appointed as follows:

(A) Three (3) members appointed by the Chair of the House Interim Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor; and

(B) Two (2) members appointed by the Chair of the Senate Interim Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor.

(2) The chairs shall cooperate to ensure that at least one (1) member is appointed from each of the four (4) congressional districts of the State of Arkansas.

(3) The appointments to the board shall be approved by the Legislative Council.

(4) Members shall serve two-year terms.

(5) Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as a regular appointment.

(g)(1) Within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this subchapter, the Chair of the House Interim Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor and the Chair of the Senate Interim Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor shall jointly call the first meeting of the advisory board.

(2) At its first meeting, the advisory board shall elect a chair to serve a one-year term.

(3) A majority of the members of the advisory board shall constitute a quorum to transact business.

(4) The advisory board shall meet at least monthly.

(5) Members of the board may receive expense reimbursement and stipends in accordance with § 25-16-902.

(2) Relieve any person using the land of another for municipal water supply purposes from any obligation that he or she may have in the absence of this subchapter to exercise care in his or her use of the land and in his or her activities on the land or relieve any person from the legal consequences of failure to employ such care.

18-11-604. Duty of care.

Except as specifically provided in § 18-11-607, an owner owes no duty of care to keep the land safe for entry or use by others for municipal water supply purposes or to give any warning of a dangerous condition, use, structure, or activity on the land to persons entering for municipal water supply purposes.

18-11-605. Owner's immunity from liability.

Except as specifically provided in § 18-11-607, an owner who, either directly or indirectly, invites or permits any person to use his or her land for municipal water supply purposes does not:

(1) Extend any assurance that the land is safe for any purpose;

(2) Confer upon the person the legal status of an invitee or licensee to whom a duty of care is owed;

(3) Assume responsibility for or incur liability for any injury to person or property caused by an act or omission of the person; or

(4) Assume responsibility for or incur liability for injury to the person or property caused by any natural or artificial condition, structure, or personal property on the land.

18-11-606. Land leased to municipality.

Unless otherwise agreed to in writing, the provisions of §§ 18-11-604 and 18-11-605 shall be deemed the sole source of the duties and liability of an owner who leased or otherwise provided land to a municipality for municipal water supply purposes.

18-11-607. Exceptions to owner's immunity.

Nothing in this subchapter limits in any way liability that otherwise exists for malicious, but not mere negligent, failure to guard or warn against an ultra-hazardous condition, structure, personal property, use, or activity actually known to the owner to be dangerous."

(a)(4) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, each county in the State of Arkansas shall be required to appraise all market value real estate normally assessed by the county assessor at its full and fair market value at a minimum of once every three (3) years.

~~(2) Approximately one-third (1/3) of the state's counties shall complete reappraisal in the year 2002, approximately one-third (1/3) of the state's counties shall complete reappraisal in the year 2003, and approximately one-third (1/3) of the state's counties shall complete reappraisal in the year 2004, as set forth in § 26-26-1903.~~

(b)(1) Except as provided in subdivision (b)(2) of this section, any county that has completed a reappraisal under subsection (a) of this section or completed a reappraisal between the years 2002 through 2004 shall not be required to commence or complete an additional reappraisal under the three-year cycle but shall be required to appraise all real property normally assessed by the county assessor at its full and fair market value at a minimum of once every five (5) years from the previous assessment.

(2)(A) If, as a result of a three-year reappraisal cycle, the new market value real estate assessment is greater than fifteen percent (15%) from the ~~previous~~ market value real estate assessment in the county in the year preceding the beginning of the reappraisal cycle, the county shall be required to complete its next reappraisal at a minimum of once every three (3) years from the previous assessment until the new market value real estate assessment is less than fifteen percent (15%) from the ~~previous~~ market value real estate assessment in the year preceding the beginning of the reappraisal cycle, at which point the county shall be placed into a five-year reappraisal cycle.

(B) If a county in a five-year reappraisal cycle has a new market value real estate assessment that is twenty-five percent (25%) greater than the ~~previous~~ market value real estate assessment in the county in the year preceding the beginning of the reappraisal cycle, the county shall be required to complete its next reappraisal at a minimum of once every three (3) years from the previous assessment until the new market value real estate assessment is less than fifteen percent (15%) from the ~~previous~~ market value real estate assessment in the year preceding the beginning of the reappraisal cycle, at which point the county shall be placed into a five-year reappraisal cycle.

(C) The market value real estate assessments shall be calculated by comparing the total values, unadjusted for the assessment increase limitations required under Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 79.

(3)(A) A county may, at the time that it submits its market value real estate assessments to the Assessment Coordination Department, appeal its new or continued placement into a three-year reappraisal cycle if the increased market value real estate assessment is a result of a single property improvement.

(B)(i) The department shall place a county in a five-year reappraisal cycle if the department concludes that the increase in the new real estate market value assessment is a result of a single property improvement in the county.

(ii) This decision by the department shall be made within thirty (30) calendar days after receiving the appeal.

(4) Each county shall provide the department with the previous and new market value real estate assessments on or before ~~August 1~~ October 1 of the year in which it is required to have completed reappraisal.

(c)(1) The county assessor or other official or officials designated by law shall compare the assessed value of each parcel under a reappraisal or reassessment which is completed in 1999 or later to the assessed value of the parcel for the previous year.

(2) In the first county-wide reappraisal performed after January 1, 2001, by counties subject to Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 79, § 2:

(A) If the assessed value of the parcel increased, then the assessed value of the parcel for the year in which the parcel is reappraised or reassessed shall be adjusted by adding one-third (1/3) of the increase to the assessed value for the year prior to the reappraisal or reassessment; and

(B) An additional one-third (1/3) of the increase shall be added in each of the next two (2) years."

(e) A wholesaler with a distribution center in Arkansas shall be exempt from Schedule V requirements for the storage and distribution of ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, and phenylpropanolamine if the wholesaler:

(1) Is engaged in interstate business with a retail distributor or wholesaler located in a state in which ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, and phenylpropanolamine may be sold legally; and

(2) Possesses a limited Schedule V license issued under § 20-64-501 et seq.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 5-64-1101(a)(4) as amended by Act 256 of 2005 and pertaining to possession limitations for ephedrine and pseudoephedrine, is amended to read as follows:

(4)(A) Any manufacturer, wholesaler, or distributor licensed by the Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy who meets one (1) of the requirements in subdivision (a)(4)(B) of this section and sells, transfers, or otherwise furnishes ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine or their salts, optical isomers, and salts of optical isomers to:

(i) A licensed pharmacy, physician, dentist, podiatrist, veterinarian, or other healthcare professional with prescriptive authority, ~~or any~~;

(ii) Any person who possesses a sales and use tax permit issued by the department who is permitted to sell products described in § 5-64-1103(b)(1) and (2); or

(iii) A retail distributor or wholesaler located in a state in which ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, and phenylpropanolamine may be sold legally.

(B)(i) The manufacturer, wholesaler, or distributor must hold or store the substances in facilities that meet the packaging requirements of § 5-64-1005(d)(1)-(3);

(ii) The manufacturer, wholesaler, or distributor must sell, transfer, or otherwise furnish only to healthcare professionals identified in

subdivisions (a)(1) and (3) of this section; or

(iii) The wholesaler or distributor:

(a) Sells, transfers, or otherwise furnishes ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine only to a retail distributor or wholesaler who is located in a state in which ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, and phenylpropanolamine may be sold legally; and

(b) Holds or stores ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine in facilities that meet the packaging requirements of § 5-64-1005(d)(1) and (2).

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 64, Subchapter 5, is amended to add a new section as follows:

20-64-514. Limited Schedule V license for wholesale distributors.

(a)(1) As used in this section, "ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, and phenylpropanolamine" means any product containing ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine or any of their salts, isomers, or salts of isomers, alone or in a mixture.

(2) "Ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, and phenylpropanolamine" does not mean:

(A) Exempt products described in § 5-64-1103(b)(1); or

(B) Any ephedrine or pseudoephedrine in liquid, liquid capsule, or liquid gel capsule form described in § 5-64-1103(b)(2).

(b) A wholesaler with a distribution center located in Arkansas who makes interstate sales of goods into a state in which ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, and phenylpropanolamine may be sold legally may apply to the Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy for a license limited to ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, and phenylpropanolamine.

(c) The board may consider the following conditions for license eligibility:

(1) That the applicant is actively engaged in the interstate sale of grocery or pharmaceutical items;

(2) That the applicant holds a List I chemical registration in good standing issued by the Drug Enforcement Administration;

(3) That the applicant's sales are not predominately ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine either separately or in conjunction with other items associated with the illegal manufacture of methamphetamine or other controlled substances;

(4)(A) That the applicant or the applicant's customers do not have a history of diverting, or failing to guard against the diversion of, ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine or other products used in manufacturing

illegal drugs.

(B) The diversion history may include settlements with or without admission of liability or violation of law or rules with any federal or state authority concerning alleged violations of law or rules applicable to controlled substances or chemicals contained on List I of the Drug Enforcement Administration;

(5) That the applicant:

(A) Meets the security conditions for the storage of ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, and phenylpropanolamine as determined by the board;

(B) Has a program of effective controls against the diversion of ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, and phenylpropanolamine; and

(C) Has a system for recording and retention of records concerning the acquisition and disposition of ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, and phenylpropanolamine; and

(6) Any other factors or conditions relevant to public health and safety as determined on a case-by-case basis by the board.

(d) Each applicant shall appear before the board during a formal meeting for consideration of its application.

(e) The board shall adopt rules for the limited wholesale distribution of ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine by a wholesaler licensed under this section.

(f) A license issued under this section shall entitle the wholesaler to:

(1) Possess and distribute only ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine; and

(2) Distribute ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine only to customers in other states.

(g) A wholesaler licensed under this section shall not surrender possession of ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine to any person in this state other than a carrier for delivery to locations outside of this state.

(h)(1) The Department of Arkansas State Police may investigate any violations of this section, § 20-64-501 et seq., or board rules and may coordinate enforcement of the law or rules with the board.

(2) The Department of Arkansas State Police and the board shall exchange information gathered or received by either agency under the provisions of this section.

(3) A wholesaler licensed under this section shall report the theft or loss of any ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine to the board and the Department of Arkansas State Police within three (3) days after discovering the theft or loss.

(i) The provisions of § 20-64-501 et seq. and rules promulgated under § 20-64-501 that are not inconsistent with this section are applicable to a wholesaler licensed under this section."
