**Amendment No. 1 to SENATE BILL NO. 921**

Amend **Senate Bill No. 921** as originally introduced:

Page 1, delete line 5 and substitute the following:  
 "By: Senator Wilkins, Brown"

AND

Delete everything following the enacting clause and substitute the following:

"SECTION 1. Legislative intent.

The General Assembly finds:

(1) Arkansas is the home of approximately fifty-one thousand (51,000) children who have experienced parental incarceration during their childhoods;

(2) An additional estimated thirty-five thousand (35,000) children have a parent under some type of criminal justice sanction;

(3) Children whose parents are incarcerated or sanctioned have a vulnerability toward future incarceration due to the lack of support and services during their parent's absence;

(4) The life events of these children are permeated with risk factors of poverty, low educational attainment, coming from communities of violence, and coping with domestic violence in their homes;

(5) Grief, loss, sadness, anxiety, depression, and post-traumatic stress reactions are pervasive among these children; and

(6) These children are seldom considered in the development of policies concerning, law enforcement, judiciary, parole, probation, public defenders, prosecutors, and child welfare.

SECTION 2. Governor's Commission for Children and Families with Incarcerated Parents.

(a) There is created the "Governor's Commission for Children and Families with Incarcerated Parents."

(b) The commission shall consist of thirteen (13) members appointed by the Governor as follows:

(1)(A) Two (2) members of the commission shall be community leaders or professionals that have served children of the incarcerated and their families for more than twelve (12) years

(B) Members appointed under subdivision (b)(1) of this section shall serve as cochairs of the commission;

(2) Two (2) members shall be adult children of incarcerated or previously incarcerated parents;

(3) Two (2) members shall be parents who have been incarcerated within the past twenty-four (24) months;

(4) Two (2) members shall be kinship caregivers of children of incarcerated parents;

(5) One (1) member shall be a parent educator of incarcerated parents within the Department of Correction;

(6) One (1) member shall be a mental health provider of specific services to children of the incarcerated;

(7) One (1) member shall be a court appointed special advocate volunteer with experience serving foster children of incarcerated parents;

(8) One (1) member shall be a policy analyst of the Governor's office;  
and

(9) One (1) member shall be a member of the State Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Board or the member's designee.

(c)(1) Members appointed under subdivision (b)(1) of this section shall serve as cochairs of the commission.

(2) The commission shall meet as necessary at the determination of the cochairs.

(d) A quorum of the commission shall consist of seven (7) members.

(e) Members shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor.

(f) If a vacancy occurs on the commission, a successor shall be appointed in the same manner as provided in the initial appointment.

(g) The members of the commission shall serve without compensation and shall not receive per diem, mileage, or stipends.

### SECTION 3. Filings with the Governor's Commission for Children and Families with Incarcerated Parents.

On or before October 1, 2008, the following shall provide a written review of their policies and procedures to the Governor's Commission for Children and Families with Incarcerated Parents:

(1) The Department of Correction;

(2) The Department of Community Correction;

(3) The Division of Children and Family Services of the Department of Health and Human Services; and

(4) Representatives of all state and local law enforcement agencies.

### SECTION 4. Powers and duties.

The Governor's Commission for Children and Families with Incarcerated Parents shall:

(1) Review the reports provided under Section 3 of this act;

(2) Consider the impact of the policies and procedures contained in the reports on the children of arrested, incarcerated, or paroled parents and probationers; and

(3) Make recommendations to the entities filing the reports for policy and improvements and changes that will:

(A) Result in improved well-being for children;

(B) Increase family ties between a child and his or her incarcerated parent; and

(C) Lower the risk that the children of incarcerated parents will be incarcerated themselves at some point."

"(c) This section does not authorize the seizure or confiscation of any firearm or ammunition from any individual who is lawfully carrying or possessing the firearm or ammunition.

(d) Any law enforcement officer or member of the militia who seizes or confiscates a firearm or ammunition from an individual under this section shall return the seized or confiscated firearm or ammunition to the individual unless:

(1) The individual is arrested for a criminal offense; or  
(2) The seized firearm or ammunition is needed as evidence in the  
furtherance of an investigation of a criminal offense."

Amend Senate Bill No. 774 as engrossed S3/22/07:

Page 2, delete lines 20 through 36 and substitute the following:

"(b)(c) Beginning in the 2004-2005 2007-2008 school year and each school year thereafter, a teacher licensed by the state board who teaches enters into a teaching contract and who completes the entire current school year teaching in a school in a high-priority district shall at the end of the school year and upon completion of his or her contracted teaching obligations be entitled to receive in addition to all other contracted salary and benefits:

(1) For a newly hired teacher who has not previously taught in a high-priority district, a one (1) time signing bonus of four thousand dollars (\$4,000) for the first year of service in the district to be paid upon completion of the full year of teaching;

(2) For a newly hired teacher who meets the requirements of subdivision (c)(1) of this section, who continues to teach in the same high-priority district, and who completes the second full year of contracted teaching obligations, a new teacher bonus in the amount of three thousand dollars (\$3,000) in addition to all other contracted salary and benefits;

(3) For a teacher who meets the requirements of subdivisions (c)(1) and (2) of this section, who continues to teach in the same high-priority district, and who completes a third year of contracted teaching obligations, a new teacher bonus of three thousand dollars (\$3,000) in addition to all other contracted salary and benefits;

(4) For a teacher who meets the requirements of subdivisions (c)(1)-(3) of this section, who enters his or her fourth or subsequent year of service with the same high-priority district or begins employment with a high-priority district other than the high-priority district where he or she was employed at the time he or she received a new teacher bonus under subdivisions (c)(1)-(3) of this section, a retention bonus in the amount of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) for the fourth and each subsequent complete year of service in the high-priority district to be paid at the end of the school year after completing all contractual obligations; and

(5) For a teacher employed in a high-priority district who does not meet the requirements of subdivisions (c)(1)-(3) of this section, a retention bonus in the amount of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) for each complete year of service in the high-priority district to be paid at the end of the school year after completing all contractual obligations.

(c)(1) No teacher shall be entitled to a bonus provided under this section unless the teacher has fulfilled his or her contractual obligations for the current school year.

(2) The superintendent of the high-priority district where the teacher is employed shall certify in writing to the department that the teacher has completed all contractual obligations for the school year.

~~(1)(A) For new teachers, a one-time signing bonus to work in any high-priority district to be paid as follows:~~

~~(i) Four thousand dollars (\$4,000) at the time a teacher not currently employed by the district signs a new contract to teach in a high-priority district; and~~

~~(ii) Three thousand dollars (\$3,000) at the beginning of each of the next two (2) subsequent years if the teacher continues teaching in the same high-priority district.~~

~~(B)(i) If a teacher has received bonus pay under subdivision (b)(1)(A) of this section and leaves the high-priority district before the end of the three-year bonus pay period, the teacher shall pay back the amount of the bonus received in the previous year.~~

~~(ii) If the teacher leaves the district during the school year, the teacher shall pay back the previous year's bonus and the current year's bonus; and~~

~~(2)(A) For all teachers not newly signed to work in the district, a retention bonus of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) shall be paid:~~

~~(i) For the 2004-2005 school year; and~~

~~(ii) At the beginning of each of the next two (2) subsequent years if the teacher continues to work in a high-priority district.~~

~~(B)(i) If a teacher has received bonus pay under subdivision (b)(2)(A) of this section and voluntarily leaves the high-priority district before the end of the three-year bonus pay period, the teacher shall pay back on a pro-rata basis the amount of the bonus received in the previous years.~~

~~(ii) If the teacher voluntarily leaves the district during the school year, the teacher shall pay back the previous year's bonus and the current year's bonus.~~

~~(iii)(a) If a full-time-equivalent teacher is reassigned involuntarily to a position that is not eligible for bonus pay under this section or is dismissed involuntarily by a school district, the teacher shall not be required to repay the applicable bonus pay.~~

~~(b) The school district shall provide documentation to the Department of Education of the involuntary assignment or dismissal.~~

~~(iv) If a teacher qualified to receive bonus pay under this section leaves the district due to a serious medical emergency, the teacher shall not be obligated to repay the bonus if the teacher provides a written statement from a licensed physician stating that the teacher is unable to work and must terminate his or her employment."~~

Page 4, delete lines 1 through 3 and substitute the following:  
"of this section and in order to provide equity in teacher compensation, a high-priority district shall supplement the salary of each teacher employed by the high-priority district with a bonus in an amount that will bring the teacher's total compensation to within one thousand"

"(i) Continue to fund the bonus provided under subdivision (d)(1)(A) in the 2008-2009 school year to bring each teacher's total compensation to within one"

"(2) A bonus under this subsection (d) shall be based"

AND

Page 5, delete lines 1 through 4 and substitute the following:

"(3) A high-priority district shall elect to pay teacher bonuses under either this subsection (d) or under subsection (c) of this section, but not both."

(2) School districts with insufficient bonding capacity were accommodated by the passage of Acts 22 and 23 of the First Extraordinary Session of 2006, which removed the bonded debt ratio, thus removing the cap on bond issuance;

(3) School districts with declining enrollment were addressed by Act 2206 of 2005 by allowing a three-year average to be used in determining the school district's facilities wealth index and by Act 21 of the First Extraordinary Session of 2006, which provided additional funding for declining enrollment based on the previous two (2) years' average daily membership. No evidence was presented during the hearings held in 2006 pursuant to Act 57 of any school district suffering from a problem related to this;

(4) The General Assembly researched a school district with a low assessed property valuation and a low facilities wealth index and determined that it is treated the same as a school district with high property valuation and a high facilities wealth index. The research indicated, for example, that Poyen is required to use the same amount of mills to build facilities for ten percent (10%) of its students as Bryant, which is in the middle, and as Bentonville, which is on top. No evidence was presented during the hearings held in 2006 pursuant to Act 57 of any school district suffering from a problem related to this; and

(5) School districts at or above the 95th percentile are addressed through SB962 of the 86<sup>th</sup> General Assembly. It provides that every school district at 100% of the facilities wealth index or above is adjusted to the same amount as the first district below one hundred percent (100%) on the facilities wealth index, unless that would exceed five thousandths (.005). In that case, the amount is capped at five thousandths (.005). No evidence was presented during the hearings held in 2006 pursuant to Act 57 of any school district suffering from a problem related to this.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-21-811 is amended to read as follows:

6-21-811. Academic Facilities Distress Program.

(a) ~~The Division of~~ Commission for Arkansas Public School Academic Facilities and Transportation shall identify a public school or school district as being in academic facilities distress if the division ~~determines~~ recommends and the commission concurs that the public school or school district has engaged in actions or inactions that result in any of the following:

(1) Any act or violation determined by the division to jeopardize any academic facility used by a public school or school district, including, but not limited to:

(A) Material failure to properly maintain academic facilities in accordance with this subchapter and rules adopted by the Commission for Arkansas Public School Academic Facilities and Transportation;

(B) Material violation of local, state, or federal fire, health, or safety code provisions or laws;

(C) Material violation of applicable building code provisions or law;

(D) Material failure to provide timely and accurate facilities master plans to the division;

(E) Material failure to comply with state law governing purchasing or bid requirements in relation to academic facilities projects; or

(F) Material default on any school district debt obligation; or

(G) Material failure to plan and progress satisfactorily toward accomplishing the priorities established by the division and the approved school district master plan; and

(2) Any other condition of an academic facility or facilities in a public school or school district that is determined by the division to have a detrimental impact on educational services provided by that public school or school district.

(b) The division shall provide written notice, via certified mail, return receipt requested, to the president of the school board and the superintendent of the public school or school district identified as being in facilities distress.

(c)(1) A public school or school district identified as being in facilities distress shall develop a facilities improvement plan within thirty (30) days from the date of receipt of the notice and promptly submit the facilities improvement plan to the division for review and approval.

(2) A public school or school district shall review and revise its facilities improvement plan on a periodic basis as determined by the division and submit the updated facilities improvement plan to the division in order for the division to determine whether the public school or school district is correcting its deficient areas of practice regarding academic facilities.

(3) A school district shall use facilities improvement plans as necessary to supplement and update its facilities master plan.

(d)(1) Every two (2) years beginning February 1, 2009, the division shall determine whether the progress of each school district complies with the school district's facilities master plan and shall notify the school district of any noncompliance.

(2) Beginning on February 1, 2008 and each biennium thereafter, the division shall review the applications made for the Academic Facilities Partnership Program established under § 6-20-2507, to identify any school district that did not apply for state funding for necessary facilities to meet adequacy requirements and shall notify the school district of any deficiencies.

(3) Within thirty (30) days of receiving the notice provided under subdivision (d)(1) or (2) of this section, the school district shall submit a facilities improvement plan to the division for its review and approval that states how the school district will address the noncompliance issues contained in the notice.

(4) If the division does not approve the facilities improvement plan submitted by the school district, it shall identify the school district as being in facilities distress.

(5) A school district may appeal the decision of the division under this subsection (d) to the commission pursuant to the procedures established by the commission;

(e)(1)(A) Within ten (10) days of a school district's failure to pass a millage required to fulfill its obligations under the school district's facilities master plan, the division shall provide written notice to the school district of the date, time, and place for a conference with the school district at which the division will:

(i) Determine whether as a result of the failed millage there are facilities issues relating to:

(a) Immediate repairs under § 6-20-2504(b)(4);

(b) The presence and number of suitability needs of public school academic facilities, which shall be defined by rule; or

(c) Immediate need for academic facilities to meet student growth; and

(ii) Thoroughly discuss and explain the sanctions and requirements that are available to the commission if the school district is identified as being in facilities distress under this section and § 6-21-812.

(B) The written notice shall be provided via certified mail to the president of the school board and the superintendent of the school district.

(C) The commission shall establish rules for the implementation of this subdivision (e)(1).

(2)(A) If the commission determines that there are immediate repairs, growth, or suitability issues that require expedited attention, the commission may direct the school district to conduct a special election to vote on a millage increase.

(B)(i) The division and the school district shall agree upon the issues to be submitted for a vote in the special election.

(ii) The special election may not include any issues other than the issues that are mutually agreed upon.

(C) The special election shall be held on a date that is:

(i) Mutually agreed upon by the division and the school district; and

(ii) Not later than seven (7) months from the date of the election at which the millage failed, unless it is necessary to extend the date beyond seven (7) months because of restrictions on the number of elections that may be held within a calendar year.

(D) If within ninety (90) days from the notice provided to the school district under subdivision (d)(1)(A) the school district has not set an election date, the division shall identify the school district as being in facilities distress.

Funding Act of 2003, § 6-20-2301 et seq.;

(C) A state-funded prekindergarten program operated by a public school or an education service cooperative;

(D) The Arkansas School for the Blind;

(E) The Arkansas School for the Deaf;

(F) The Arkansas School for Mathematics, Sciences, and the

Arts;

(G) An educational facility of the Division of Youth Services of the Department of Health and Human Services or contracting with the Division of Youth Services; or

(H) An educational facility of the Division of Developmental Disabilities Services of the Department of Health and Human Services.

(b) It is unlawful for a sex offender who is required to register under the Sex Offender Registration Act of 1997, § 12-12-901 et seq., and who has been assessed as a Level 3 or Level 4 offender to knowingly enter upon the campus of a public school.

(c) It is not a violation of this section if the sex offender:

(1) Is a minor and is a student;

(2) Enters upon the campus for the purpose of attending a school-sponsored event for which an admission fee is charged or tickets are sold or distributed, a graduation ceremony, or a baccalaureate ceremony;

(3) Enters upon the campus on a day that is not designated a student contact day by the school district's calendar or on day in which no school-sponsored event is taking place upon the campus; or

(4) Is the parent or guardian of a student enrolled in a public school district and enters upon the campus where the student is enrolled for the purpose of:

(A) Delivering to the student medicine, food, or personal items, provided that the items are delivered directly to the school office; or

(B) Attending a scheduled parent-teacher conference, provided the sex offender is escorted to and from the conference by a designated school official or employee.

(d)(1) A sex offender who is the parent or guardian of a child enrolled in a public school district and wishes to enter upon the campus in which the student is enrolled for any other purpose must give reasonable notice to the school principal or his or her designee.

(2)(A) The school principal or his or her designee may allow the parent sex offender to enter upon the campus as long as there is a designated school official or employee available to escort and supervise the sex offender while they remain on campus.

(B) If a designated school official or employee is not available at the time the parent sex offender wishes to enter upon the campus, the parent sex offender shall not enter upon the campus until he or she is notified that a designated school official or employee is available.
