It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that increasing the number of Arkansans who obtain postsecondary credentials is critical to the economic health of the state and its citizens; that the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery provides the opportunity for tens of thousands of Arkansans to obtain postsecondary education; that the deadline for scholarship applications is June 1; that the financial integrity of the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery is critical to the continued existence of the scholarships; that the reporting and research provisions of this act are critical for timely decisions by the General Assembly on scholarship awards; and that this act is immediately necessary because the Department of Higher Education must promulgate rules to implement this act well before June 1, 2011, in order to provide eligible Arkansans the opportunity to apply for the scholarship. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.

(2)(A) ~~Four (4)~~ Two (2) members shall be appointed from the state at large from the towing industry and shall be licensed by the board to engage in nonconsent towing, ~~with one (1) each of the members being a resident of each of the four (4) congressional districts.~~

(B) Two (2) members who are permitted to engage in the consent-only business shall be appointed from the state at large.

(C) ~~Two (2)~~ Three (3) members who are not and have not been associated with the towing industry shall be appointed from the state at large.

(D) ~~One (1) member~~ Two (2) members shall be appointed from the insurance industry.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 27-50-1208(d)(1), concerning possessory liens and notice to owners and lienholders of motor vehicles that have been removed, is amended to read as follows:

(d)(1)(A) If within forty-eight (48) hours the ownership and lienholder information has not been received from the law enforcement agency requesting the removal of a vehicle pursuant to this subchapter, the towing and storage firm shall obtain information concerning the last known registered owner or owners and lienholder or lienholders as provided from the records of the:

~~(A)(i)~~ (i) Office of Motor Vehicle;

~~(B)(ii)~~ (ii) Arkansas Crime Information Center; or

~~(C)(iii)~~ (iii) If known, motor vehicle records of any other state where the vehicle's registration indicates the name and address of the last registered owner and the name and address of the holder of any recorded lien, if any, on the vehicle.

(B) If the owner or a registered lienholder cannot be determined, the towing and storage firm shall register the vehicle with the National Insurance Crime Bureau.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 27-50-1209(e), regarding foreclosure of liens on removed vehicles, is amended to read as follows:

(e)(1) Notice of the sale shall be sent at least fifteen (15) days before the date of the sale by certified mail, ~~no~~ return receipt requested, to the registered owner and lienholder, if any.

(2) If the data records of the Office of Motor Vehicle or the office of motor vehicles for the state where the vehicle is registered do not contain any information as to the last known registered owner or owners or lienholders, ~~the notice required under subdivision (e)(1) of this section is not required~~ the towing and storage firm shall register the vehicle with the National Insurance Crime Bureau.

(3) ~~Nothing in this subsection removes~~ This subsection does not remove the requirement of notice of sale by publication under subsection (f) of this section."

"SECTION 1. The Arkansas Constitution is amended to read as follows:
Sales Tax Anticipated Revenue Bonds.

(a) A city or county may form one (1) or more districts for the purpose of financing sales tax anticipated revenue bond projects within the district as provided by this amendment.

(b)(1) A city or county which has formed a district under this amendment may issue bonds for the purpose of financing certain costs related to a sales tax anticipated revenue bond project within the district, as determined by the General Assembly.

(2) The bonds may be secured by and be payable from all or a portion of the division of state sales and use taxes collected within the district under subsection (e) of this amendment.

(3) The bonds shall not be:

(A) Considered in calculating debt limits for bonds issued pursuant to Article XII, § 4, of the Arkansas Constitution; or

(B) Subject to the provisions of Article XVI, § 1, of the Arkansas Constitution or Amendments 62 or 65 to the Arkansas Constitution.

(c) For purposes of this amendment, the term "sales tax anticipated revenue bond project" means an undertaking, including without limitation the acquisition, development, redevelopment, and revitalization of land within the district, for eliminating or preventing the development or spread of slums or blighted, deteriorated, or deteriorating areas, for discouraging the loss of commerce, industry, or employment, for increasing employment, or any combination thereof, as may be defined by the General Assembly.

(d) Prior to a city or county's issuance of bonds for a sales tax anticipated revenue bond project under subsection (b) of this section, the sales tax anticipated revenue bond project shall be approved by an appropriate state agency as may be determined by the General Assembly.

(e) The General Assembly may provide that all or a portion of the state sales and use tax collected within a district may be divided so that all or part of the increase in state sales and use tax collected by taxpayers within the district after the date on which the project plan has been approved by an appropriate state agency shall be used to pay any indebtedness incurred for the sales tax anticipated revenue bond project.

(f) Any provision of the Constitution of the State of Arkansas in conflict with this section is repealed insofar as it is in conflict with this amendment.

(g) The General Assembly shall provide for the implementation of this amendment by law."

SECTION 2. The purpose of this section is to amend the Arkansas Constitution to authorize governmental units to issue bonds and levy a sales tax for the purpose of retiring unfunded liabilities of closed local police and fire pension plans.

SECTION 3. Section 2 of Amendment 78 to the Arkansas Constitution is amended to read as follows:

§ 2. [Short-term financing obligations].

(a) For the purpose of acquiring, constructing, installing or renting real property or tangible personal property having an expected useful life of more than one (1) year, municipalities and counties may incur short-term financing obligations maturing over a period of, or having a term, not to exceed five (5) years. Such obligations may bear interest at either:

(1) a fixed rate throughout the term thereof, including a fixed interest rate which is to be determined by reference to an index or other formula, but not to exceed the maximum lawful rate of interest for fixed rate obligations, or

(2) a rate which may vary at such times and under such circumstances as the parties may agree, whether or not the interest rate in fact varies, but not to exceed the maximum lawful rate of interest for variable rate obligations. The maximum lawful rate of interest for fixed rate obligations is the formula rate in effect on the date the obligation is incurred, regardless of when such interest is to begin to accrue. The maximum lawful rate of interest for variable rate obligations is the formula rate in effect on the date such interest accrues. The

aggregate principal amount of short-term financing obligations incurred by a municipality or a county pursuant to this section shall not exceed five percent (5%) of the assessed value of taxable property located within the municipality or two and one half percent (2.5%) of the assessed value of taxable property located within the county, as determined by the last tax assessment completed before the last obligation was incurred by the city or county. The ~~total~~ annual principal and interest payments in each fiscal year on ~~all~~ outstanding obligations of a municipality or a county pursuant to this section shall be charged against and paid from ~~the~~ general revenues for such fiscal year, ~~which may include road fund revenues. Tax revenues earmarked for solid waste disposal purposes may be used to pay printing and other costs associated with bonds issued under this amendment for solid waste disposal purposes or special revenues authorized to be used for the property financed.~~

(b) As used here:

(1) "Short-term financing obligation" means a debt, a note, an installment purchase agreement, a lease, a lease-purchase contract, or any other similar agreement, whether secured or unsecured; provided, that the obligation shall mature over a period of, or have a term, not to exceed five (5) years;

(2) "Formula rate" means that rate of interest which is five percentage points (5%) above the equivalent bond yield of one year United States Treasury Bills offered by the United States Treasury at the last auction during the immediately preceding calendar quarter, calculated by rounding up to the nearest one-fourth of one percentage point (0.25%) (unless the equivalent bond yield is already by a multiple of one-fourth of one percentage point), and announced by the State Bank Commissioner (or such successor official who may be performing substantially the same duties) from information available from the Federal Reserve System of the United States. The calculation of the formula rate shall be made on or before the tenth (10th) day of each calendar quarter. The formula rate so calculated shall be effective on the eleventh (11th) day of the calendar quarter and shall continue in effect until the formula rate for the succeeding calendar quarter shall have been calculated and becomes effective. If, for any reason, the United States ceases to issue one year Treasury Bills, such calculation shall be made using a debt instrument of the United States having substantially the same general character and maturity. The calculation and announcement of the formula rate by the State Bank Commissioner shall be final.

(c) The provisions of this section shall be self-executing."

(i) Mineral interests in the land are held by one (1) or more persons that are different from the person or persons holding the fee simple interest; and

(ii) County assessor is advised of the separate holdings by the recording of a deed in the county recorder's office.

(2)(B) In such case When subdivision (a)(2) of this section applies, a sale of the mineral rights interests for nonpayment of taxes shall not affect the title to the land itself, nor shall a sale of the land for nonpayment of taxes affect the title to the mineral rights interests.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 26-26-1110, concerning mineral rights, is amended to add an additional subsection to read as follows:

(d)(1)(A) If the Assessment Coordination Department determines that a county assessor has failed to assess mineral interests as required under this section, the department shall notify the county assessor by certified mail with copies to the:

- (i) County equalization board;
- (ii) County judge;
- (iii) County quorum court; and
- (iv) Reappraisal contractor, if applicable.

(B) In addition, the notice may provide that state reappraisal reimbursement funds to the county may be withheld pending the outcome of a hearing if a hearing is requested by the county assessor within thirty (30) days from the date of the notice.

(2)(A) The county assessor may waive the right to a hearing and within thirty (30) days from the date of the notice agree to complete corrective action as required by the department and return a signed and dated compliance verification form to the department.

(B) Upon receipt of the signed and dated compliance verification form, the department shall release any withheld state reappraisal reimbursement funds and resume regular payments.

(3) Termination of state reappraisal reimbursement funds may occur if the county assessor fails to:

(A) Either request a hearing or return the signed and dated compliance verification form within thirty (30) days from the date of the notice; or

(B) Complete the corrective action within the time provided in the compliance verification form."
