Amend **Senate Bill No. 848** as originally introduced:
Delete everything after the enacting clause and substitute:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 27, Chapter 24, is amended to add an additional subchapter to read as follows:

Subchapter 17 —
Conservation Districts

27-24-1701. Authorization.

The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration shall issue a special license plate for conservation districts in the manner and subject to the conditions provided under this subchapter.

27-24-1702. Design — Cost.

(a) The special motor vehicle license plate for conservation districts shall:

(1) Be designed by the Department of Finance and Administration in consultation with the Arkansas Association of Conservation Districts; and

(2) Be numbered consecutively.

(b) The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration shall determine the amount of the costs for the issuance of the special license plate under this section as follows:

(1) The fee for the cost of initial orders of the new design that shall be based on the cost of the initial order;

(2) The number of applications that must be received to cover the cost of the initial order of the new design; or

(3) The combination of subdivisions (b)(1) and (2) of this section that must be received to cover the cost of the initial order of the new design.

27-24-1703. Issuance — Renewal — Replacement.

(a) A person who owns a motor vehicle and who is a resident of the state may apply for and renew annually a special license plate under this subchapter.

(b) The Department of Finance and Administration shall issue and renew a special license plate under this section upon payment of:

(1) The fee required by law for registration of the motor vehicle;

(2)(A) Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) to cover the design-use contribution.

(B) The design-use contribution shall be remitted monthly to the Arkansas Association of Conservation Districts to be used to provide education and assistance to landowners concerning the conservation, maintenance, improvement, development, and use of land, soil, water, trees, vegetation, fish, wildlife, open-spaces, and other renewable natural resources; and

(3)(A) A handling and administrative fee of ten dollars (\$10.00).

(B) The handling and administrative fee shall be:

(i) Deposited into the State Central Services Fund for the benefit of the Revenue Division of the Department of Finance and Administration; and

(ii) Credited to the division as supplemental and in addition to all other funds that may be deposited for the benefit of the division.

(C) The handling and administrative fee shall not be considered or credited to the division as direct revenue.

(c) To replace a special license plate issued under this subchapter:

(1) The owner of the motor vehicle shall remit the fee stated in subdivision (b)(3) of this section if the registration has not expired; or

(2) The owner of the motor vehicle shall remit all fees stated in subsection (b) of this section if the registration has expired.

(d) The registration of a special license plate under this subchapter may:

(1) Continue from year to year as long as it is renewed each year within the time and manner required by law; and

(2) Be renewed as provided under §§ 27-14-1012 and 27-14-1013.

(e) If an owner of a motor vehicle who was previously issued a special license plate under this subchapter fails to pay the fees required in subsection (b) of this section at the time of renewal, the owner shall be issued a permanent license plate as provided under §§ 27-14-1007 and 27-14-1008.

(f) Upon the expiration of the registration of a special license plate under this subchapter, the owner of the motor vehicle may replace the special license plate with:

(1) A permanent license plate under §§ 27-14-1007 and 27-14-1008;

(2) A personalized license plate; or

(3) Any other special license plate that the person is entitled to receive under this chapter.

27-24-1704. Rules.

The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration may promulgate rules for the administration of this subchapter."

(c)(1) Before the state board approves any revision to a charter for a public charter school, the state board shall study the effect the requested revision will have on the school district or school districts from which the public charter school draws, as listed in the public charter school's application for a charter, by conducting a:

(A) Fiscal impact; and

(B) Adequacy impact.

(2) The adequacy impact shall address how the requested revision will impact the school district's or school districts' ability to afford an equitable opportunity for an adequate education to each student."

Page 7, delete line 22 and substitute the following:

"SECTION 18. Arkansas Code § 6-15-2009(d)(1)(A)-(C), concerning the high-stakes end-of-course assessments for English II , are amended to read as follows:

(d)(1)(A)(i) Beginning with the 2009-2010 school year, all initial high-stakes end-of-course assessments for Algebra I shall be administered by grade ten (10).

(ii) Beginning with the ~~2013-2014~~ 2014-2015 school year, all initial high-stakes end-of-course assessments for English II shall be administered by grade ten (10).

(iii) A student from an Arkansas public school who completed and received academic credit on an end-of-course assessment for Algebra I before the 2009-2010 school year or for English II before the ~~2013-2014~~ 2014-2015 school year is not required to participate in and receive academic credit from a high-stakes end-of-course assessment on or after the 2009-2010 school year for Algebra I or on or after the ~~2013-2014~~ 2014-2015 school year for English II.

(iv) A student transferring into an Arkansas public school on or after 2009-2010 for Algebra I or ~~2013-2014~~ 2014-2015 for English II who can demonstrate by official transcript from an out-of-state public, private, or home school or an Arkansas private or home school that he or she has previously obtained academic credit for Algebra I or English II is not required to participate in and receive academic credit from an initial high-stakes end-of-course assessment unless the public school district assesses the student's educational status and determines the student does not possess the requisite passing knowledge of Algebra I or English II.

(B)(i) Beginning with the 2009-2010 school year, an Arkansas public school student who is not in grade ten (10), grade eleven (11), or grade twelve (12) in an Arkansas public school and has not previously received proper academic credit on his or her transcript for Algebra I but has successfully completed an Algebra I course is required to complete and successfully meet the requisite scale score on a high-stakes end-of-course assessment before the student is entitled to receive academic credit on his or her transcript for Algebra I.

(ii) Only a student who is in grade ten (10), grade eleven (11), or grade twelve (12) in an Arkansas public school in the 2009-2010 school year is exempt from the requirement of taking a high-stakes Algebra I end-of-course assessment, but the student shall meet any general end-of-course assessment requirements for Algebra I.

(iii) Any other student, regardless of the school year or the grade level in which he or she completes an Algebra I course or, beginning with the ~~2013-2014~~ 2014-2015 school year, the English II course, shall successfully complete an Algebra I and English II high-stakes end-of-course assessment and meet the requisite scale score in order to be entitled to receive academic credit for

Algebra I or English II on the student's transcript, unless exempted under an individualized education program.

(iv) A student transferring into an Arkansas public school district without having obtained academic credit on his or her transcript in or after the 2009-2010 school year for Algebra I and in or after the ~~2013-2014~~ 2014-2015 school year for English II is not exempt from the requirements of subdivision (d)(1)(B)(iii) of this section.

(C) Beginning with the ~~2013-2014~~ 2014-2015 school year, an Arkansas public school student who is in grade ten (10) and who has not previously received academic credit under (d)(1)(A) for English II shall successfully complete the course and meet the requisite scale score on the English II high-stakes end-of-course assessment in order for the student to be entitled to receive academic credit for English II on the student's transcript.

SECTION 19. Arkansas Code § 6-15-2009(e)(1), concerning high-stakes end-of-course assessments for English II, is amended to read as follows:

(e)(1) Beginning with the 2009-2010 school year for Algebra I and the ~~2013-2014~~ 2014-2015 school year for English II, a student identified as not passing an initial high-stakes end-of-course assessment shall not receive academic credit on his or her transcript for the course related to the end-of-course assessment and is not entitled to graduate from an Arkansas public high school until:

(A) The student is identified as meeting the requisite scale score on a subsequent high-stakes end-of-course assessment; or

(B)(i) The student is identified as meeting the requisite score established by state board rule on an alternative assessment.

(ii) An alternative assessment shall be an ACT assessment, SAT assessment, advanced placement test, or International Baccalaureate test.

SECTION 20. Arkansas Code § 6-15-2009(f)(1)(A), concerning high-stakes end-of-course assessments for English II, is amended to read as follows:

(f)(1)(A) The state board shall establish the high-stakes end-of-course assessment program required in subsection (d) of this section for Algebra I beginning in the 2009-2010 school year and for English II beginning in the ~~2013-2014~~ 2014-2015 school year.

SECTION 21. Arkansas Code § 6-15-2107(c), concerning the Arkansas"

(b) The Department of Health shall develop and disseminate the required materials under subsection (a) of this section to hospitals and free-standing birthing clinics in the state.

(c)(1) The department may adopt rules to implement this section.

(2) The rules adopted under subdivision (c)(1) of this section shall include without limitation rules establishing procedures for reporting compliance with this section."

(a) A person commits sexual indecency with a child if:

(1) Being eighteen (18) years of age or older, the person solicits another person who is less than fifteen (15) years of age or who is represented to be less than fifteen (15) years of age to engage in:

- (A) Sexual intercourse;
- (B) Deviate sexual activity; or
- (C) Sexual contact;

(2)(A) With the purpose to arouse or gratify a sexual desire of himself or herself or a sexual desire of any other person, the person purposely exposes his or her sex organs to another person who is less than fifteen (15) years of age.

(B) It is an affirmative defense to a prosecution under subdivision (a)(2)(A) of this section if the person is within three (3) years of age of the victim; or

(3) With the purpose to arouse or gratify a sexual desire of himself or herself or a sexual desire of any other person, the person purposely exposes his or her sex organs to a minor, and the actor is:

(A) Employed with the Department of Correction, Department of Community Correction, any city or county jail, or any juvenile detention facility, and the minor is in custody at a facility operated by the agency or contractor employing the actor;

(B) A mandated reporter under § 12-18-402(b) and is in a position of trust or authority over the minor; or

(C) The minor's guardian, an employee in the minor's school or school district, a temporary caretaker, or a person in a position of trust and authority over the minor;

(4) With the purpose to arouse or gratify his or her sexual desire or a sexual desire of another person, a person who is eighteen (18) years of age or older causes or coerces a minor to expose his or her sex organs to another person, and the actor is:

(A) Employed with the Department of Correction, the Department of Community Correction, any city or county jail, or any juvenile detention facility, and the minor is in custody at a facility operated by the agency or contractor employing the actor;

(B) A mandated reporter under § 12-18-402(b) and is in a position of trust or authority over the minor; or

(C) The minor's guardian, an employee in the minor's school or school district, a temporary caretaker, or a person in a position of trust or authority over the minor; or

Subchapter 6 — Personal Possession of Primates

20-19-601. Permit for personal possession.

(a) A person may possess a primate only if the person:

(1) Was in possession of the primate and was the legal possessor of the primate on or before August 12, 2011; and

(2) Not more than ninety (90) days after the effective date of this subchapter, applies for and is granted a permit for personal possession for each primate in the person's possession under this subchapter.

(b)(1) A person who holds a permit for personal possession of a primate under subsection (a) of this section shall renew annually the permit for personal possession.

(2) Beginning ninety (90) days after the effective date of this subchapter, a permit shall not be issued for personal possession of a primate if the primate was not previously the subject of a permit under this subsection.

(c)(1) An applicant shall file on forms provided by the sheriff's department an application to receive a permit for personal possession of a primate with the sheriff's department of the county in which the primate is kept.

(2) The application shall include:

(A) The name, address, and telephone number of the applicant;

(B) A description of the primate, including without limitation the scientific classification, name, gender, age, color, weight, and distinguishing marks or coloration that would aid in the identification of the primate;

(C) A photograph of the primate;

(D) The location at which the primate is kept and a photograph of the location; and

(E) The name, address, and telephone number of the person from whom the applicant obtained the primate, if known.

(3) The application shall be signed by the veterinarian who is expected to provide veterinary care to the primate and shall include the veterinarian's name, address, and telephone number.

(d) The county sheriff's department shall not grant a permit unless:

(1) An annual permit fee of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) for each primate accompanies the application;

(2) The applicant is eighteen (18) years of age or older;

(3) The applicant has not pleaded nolo contendere or guilty to or been found guilty of in the past ten (10) years:

(A) A violation of a law prohibiting animal cruelty; or

(B) A felony offense for possession, sale, or use of a controlled substance;

(4) The facility and the conditions in which the primate is kept complies with this subchapter; and

(5) The applicant has obtained the liability insurance coverage for the primate required under this subchapter.

(e)(1) The county sheriff's department shall keep records of persons issued a permit for personal possession of a primate and shall provide a copy of the record to the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission when each permit is issued.

(2) A permit holder shall notify the county sheriff's department of a change of the permit holder's information, including without limitation the death of the primate.

(f)(1) A primate possessed in this state shall be spayed, neutered, or sterilized before a permit is issued to the possessor unless a veterinarian confirms that spaying and neutering or sterilization would endanger the primate.

(2) The permit holder shall keep a record of the primate's being spayed, neutered or sterilized by a veterinarian.

(g) Fees levied and collected for permits of personal possession of a primate under this section shall be deposited into the county treasury to be used by the county sheriff's department to offset the cost of issuing permits of personal possession of a primate, for any costs involved in controlling primates located within the county, and for any other animal control costs.

20-19-602. Insurance — Signs — Notification.

(a)(1) A possessor of a primate shall maintain liability insurance coverage of not less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for each occurrence for liability damages for destruction of or damage to property and for death or bodily injury to a person caused by the primate.

(2) The possessor of a primate shall provide a copy of the policy for liability insurance to the county sheriff's department on an annual basis to obtain or renew a permit.

(b)(1) The possessor of a primate shall post and display a sign at each possible entrance on the premises where a primate is kept.

(2) The sign shall be clearly legible and easily readable by the public.

(3) The sign shall warn that there is a primate on the premises.

20-19-603. Inspection.

The possessor of a primate shall allow an official of the county sheriff's department, an animal control officer, the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission Wildlife Officer, or a law enforcement officer of the municipality or county in which the primate is kept to enter the premises to ensure compliance with this subchapter.

20-19-604. Public contact — Warnings of escape.

(a) A possessor of a primate shall not bring a primate to a commercial or retail establishment unless the possessor is bringing the primate to a veterinarian clinic.

(b)(1) If a primate escapes or is released, the possessor of the primate shall contact immediately the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission and law enforcement officials of the city or county in which the possessor resides to report the escape or release.

(2) The possessor is liable for all expenses associated with efforts to recapture the primate.

20-19-605. Confiscation.

(a) A primate may be confiscated immediately by a county sheriff's department if:

(1) The possessor does not have a permit for personal possession issued under this section;

(2) The possessor does not have the liability insurance coverage required under this subchapter;

(3) The conditions under which the primate is kept are directly or indirectly dangerous to human health and safety; or

(4) The caging violates requirements of the Arkansas cruelty to animals statutes.

(b)(1) If a primate is confiscated, the possessor is liable for the costs of placement and care for the primate from the time of confiscation until the time the primate has been relocated to an alternative facility.

(2) The county sheriff's department shall seek to place the confiscated primate with a wildlife sanctuary, humane society, or an institution accredited by the American Zoo and Aquarium Association."

(2) "Licensed pharmacy" means a pharmacy licensed by the Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy;

(3) "Medicaid" means the medical assistance program established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. § 1396 et seq., and administered by the Division of Medical Services of the Department of Human Services; and

(4) "Retail" means a sale for use or consumption and not for resale.

20-77-2002. Assessment.

(a)(1) A provider fee is assessed on each licensed pharmacy for each state fiscal year in an amount calculated as a percentage of each licensed pharmacy's gross retail prescription receipts.

(2) The Director of the Division of Medical Services of the Department of Human Services shall administer the assessment program created in this subchapter.

(b) The Division of Medical Services of the Department of Human Services shall seek approval from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to treat the provider fee as an allowable cost for Medicaid reimbursement purposes.

(c) A provider of pharmacy services shall not be guaranteed, expressly or otherwise, that any additional moneys paid to the provider for services under this subchapter will equal or exceed the amount of the provider fee.

(d)(1) The division shall ensure that the rate of assessment of the provider fee established in this section equals but does not exceed, the maximum rate of assessment established under federal law and rule for health care-related provider fees without reduction in federal financial participation in Medicaid.

(2) If the division determines that the rate of the assessment of the provider fee established in this section exceeds the maximum rate of assessment that federal law and rule allow for health-care related provider fees without reduction in federal financial participation in Medicaid, the division shall lower the rate of assessment of the provider fee to a rate that is equal to the maximum rate that federal law and rule allow for healthcare related provider fees without reduction in federal financial participation in Medicaid.

20-77-2003. Calculation of tax liability — Notification to pharmacies — Quarterly adjustment authorized.

(a) The determination of the amount of the provider fee under this subchapter shall be the monthly gross retail prescription receipts reported to the Department of Finance and Administration under § 20-77-2005 multiplied by the tax rate established by rule by the Department of Human Services.

(b)(1) The tax rate established under this subchapter may be a graduated rate based on gross retail prescription receipts and shall not exceed a rate of six percent (6%) per year of gross retail prescription receipts.

(2) However, the rate shall not exceed one-tenth of one percent (0.1%) per year in the case of licensed pharmacies of which eighty percent (80%) or more of gross retail prescription receipts are attributable to prescription drugs that are delivered directly to the patient by common carrier, by mail, or by a courier service.

(c)(1) The Department of Human Services shall notify each licensed pharmacy of the amount of the provider fee that is due.

(2) The provider fee may be paid in increments over the balance of the assessment period.

(d)(1) The Department of Human Services may adjust the rate of the provider fee quarterly on a prospective basis.

(2) The Department of Human Services may adjust more frequently for individual providers if there is a substantial and statistically significant change in their pharmacy sales characteristics.

(3) The Department of Human Services may define the adjustment criteria for the provider fee by rule.

20-77-2004. Offset against Medicaid payments due from a licensed pharmacy.

(a) If a licensed pharmacy requests an offset of state Medicaid payment due from the licensed pharmacy, the Director of Division of Medical Services of the Department of Human Services may offset the provider fee state Medicaid payment due from that licensed pharmacy.

(b) The amount of an offset under subsection (a) of this section shall result, so far as practicable, in withholding from the licensed pharmacy an amount substantially equal to the provider fee due from the licensed pharmacy.

20-77-2005. Records — Report of gross retail prescription receipts — Confidentiality of information.

(a) Each licensed pharmacy shall keep records necessary to determine gross retail prescription receipts.

(b)(1) The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration may prescribe the form and contents of any forms or other documents required under this section.

(2) Each licensed pharmacy shall report the gross retail prescription receipts to the Department of Finance and Administration.

(3) The Department of Finance and Administration shall provide the Department of Human Services with the information necessary to implement this subchapter.

(4) The Department of Finance and Administration shall adopt rules to implement this subsection.

(c) The information obtained by the Department of Human Services from the Department of Finance and Administration is confidential and shall not be disclosed except as authorized under this subchapter.

20-77-2006. Notice requirements — Unpaid or delinquent taxes — Procedure for collection — Failure to pay taxes.

(a)(1) The Department of Human Services shall notify a licensed pharmacy if the licensed pharmacy has had a provider fee under this subchapter due for more than ninety (90) days.

(2) The notice required under subdivision (a)(1) of this section shall specify the amount of the provider fee that is due.

(3) If a licensed pharmacy fails to pay its provider fee due within thirty (30) days after receipt of the notice required under subdivision (a)(1) of this section, the licensed pharmacy provider fee is delinquent.

(b)(1) If a provider fee under this subchapter is unpaid and delinquent, the Department of Human Services may bring an action to compel the payment of the provider fee in the circuit court of the county in which the licensed pharmacy is located.

(2) The Department of Human Services may cancel or refuse to issue, extend, or reinstate a Medicaid provider agreement to a licensed pharmacy that fails to pay the provider fee under this subchapter.

(c) The Department of Human Services may request the Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy to deny, suspend, or revoke the license of a licensed pharmacy that fails to pay the provider fee assessed under this subchapter.

20-48-2007. Use of funds.

(a) The licensed pharmacy provider fee owed or, if an offset has been made, the balance after the offset, if any, shall be remitted by the licensed pharmacy to the Department of Human Services.

(b)(1) The provider fee assessed and collected under this subchapter shall be deposited into a designated account within the Arkansas Medicaid Program Trust Fund to provide payments for services related to the Medicaid pharmacy program.

(2) The designated account shall be separate and distinct from the general fund and shall be supplementary to the trust fund.

(c)(1) The designated account moneys in the trust fund from the provider fee imposed and collected under this subchapter that are unused at the end of a fiscal year shall be carried forward.

(2) The designated account moneys in the trust fund from the provider fee imposed and collected under this subchapter shall not be used to supplant other local, state, or federal funds.

(3) The designated account moneys in the trust fund from the provider fee imposed and collected under this subchapter shall be exempt from budgetary cuts, reductions, or eliminations caused by a deficiency of general revenues.

20-77-2008. Appeals.

Appeals regarding this subchapter shall be made to the Pulaski County Circuit Court.

20-77-2009. Rules.

The Department of Human Services shall adopt rules to implement this subchapter."

(3) No position established under this section may exceed the salary rate of the highest maximum annual salary rate or the highest grade level position authorized by the General Assembly in the requesting institution's operating appropriation act.
(4) The institution shall provide justification to the Department of Higher Education for the need to allocate positions from the central pool.
(5) Titles shall not be assigned to the institution from the central pool until specific positions are requested by the institution and recommended by the Department of Higher Education. The Director of the Department of Higher Education shall provide a monthly report detailing the justification for the allocation of positions from the pool to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee for review. The report shall also include an accounting of the titles or classifications established from the central pool and the source of funds associated with the positions.
(6) If an institution requests any central pool position to be continued during the subsequent fiscal year, the position must be requested as a new position in the institution's subsequent fiscal year budget request.

(b) Colleges - (1) The Department of Higher Education shall establish and maintain a central pool of two hundred fifty (250) positions to be used to establish additional positions when an institution does not have sufficient positions available to meet unanticipated enrollment growth, industry training demands, and its mandated responsibilities.

(2) Central pool positions are to be used by the institutions if the personnel service needs exceed the number of positions authorized by the General Assembly and that were not anticipated at the time of the passage of the institution's operating appropriation act.
