4-29-503. Definitions.

(A) That is intended to be associated with a defined population of patients;

(B) That is accountable for the quality and cost of care that is delivered to a defined population of patients; and

(C) Through which the health care providers share in savings created by:

(i) Improving the quality of care to the defined population of patients; and

(ii) Reducing the growth of the cost of care delivered to the defined population;

(2) "Health care professional" means a health care practitioner licensed by the State of Arkansas; and

(3) "Physician" means a doctor of medicine or doctor of osteopathy licensed by the Arkansas State Medical Board whose primary professional activities consist of direct patient care in the State of Arkansas.

4-29-504. Organizational requirements.

(a) An accountable care organization operating in Arkansas shall be formed as a legal business entity.

(b) If a nonphysician-owned business entity is part of an accountable care organization, the accountable care organization shall be a separate legal entity with a separate and independent governing body.

(c)(1) An accountable care organization operating in Arkansas shall have a board of directors or similar governing body.

(2)(A)(i) At least two-thirds (2/3) of the board of directors or similar governing body shall be composed of health care professionals:

(a) Participating in the accountable care organization; and

(b) Elected by health care professionals participating in the accountable care organization.

(ii)(a) Except as provided in subdivision (c)(2)(A)(ii)(b) of this section, at least one-third (1/3) of the total members of the board of directors or similar governing body shall be physicians.

(b)(1) Subdivision (c)(2)(A)(ii)(a) of this section does not apply to an accountable care organization that exists for a purpose that does not include the provision of medical services from a physician.

(2) Subsection (c)(2)(A)(ii)(b)(1) of this section does not prohibit a physician from serving on the board of directors or similar governing body of an accountable care organization under (c)(2)(A)(ii)(b)(1).

(B) This section does not require or prohibit the inclusion of nonphysician health care professionals or hospitals in the remaining membership of the board of directors or similar governing body.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 20-9-501 is amended to read as follows:
20-9-501. Definition.

As used in this subchapter, "peer review committee" or "committee" means a committee of a hospital medical staff, or a committee of a state or local professional association, or a committee of an accountable care organization under § 4-29-501 et seq. that is formed to:

(1) Evaluate and improve the quality of health care rendered by providers of health services; or

(2) Determine that:

(A) Health services rendered were professionally indicated or were performed in compliance with the applicable standard of care; or

(B) The cost of health care rendered was considered reasonable by the providers of professional health services in the area.

SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that this act provides for accountable care organizations to be structured and operated in a manner that protects professional judgment and decision-making by health care professionals; that unless accountable care organizations are so organized, they will be unable to adequately protect patient interests; that protecting patient relationships and the professional judgment of health care professionals will protect and improve patient care; and that the protections for professional judgment and improvements to patient care provided under this act should become effective as soon as possible to benefit the citizens of the State of Arkansas. (b)(1) By December 31, 2011, the Department of Higher Education shall provide the Bureau of Legislative Research with direct read and report only access to the data warehouse of the Arkansas Higher Education Information System concerning student academic data, financial aid data, and related records.

(2)(A) In providing the bureau with the direct read and report only access required under subdivision (b)(1) of this section, the Department of Higher Education shall take reasonable precautions, including electronic blocking or redacting, to prevent the disclosure of:

(i) Personally identifiable information of a student unless the parent or guardian of a minor student or a student who is no longer a minor consents in writing to the disclosure of personally identifiable information about that student; or

(ii) Information that would cause the Department of Higher Education to lose funding under 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, as it existed on January 1, 2011.

(B) The Department of Higher Education shall:

(i) Work with the Department of Education to develop the method of redaction to be used with the Arkansas Higher Education Information System based on the standards used by the Department of Education; and

(ii) Disclose to the bureau and to the Arkansas Lottery Commission Legislative Oversight Committee the method of electronic blocking or redaction the Department of Higher Education will use under this subsection.

(3)(A) The Department of Higher Education shall make its staff reasonably accessible for consultation with bureau staff in developing and responding appropriately to bureau requests under this section.

(B) The bureau staff shall inform the Department of Higher Education of any warehouse data used in the preparation of reports and provide the Department of Higher Education at least one (1) working day to review any student-related warehouse data used in preparation of reports before publicly releasing that student-related data without personally identifiable information of a student.

(c) The Department of Higher Education shall provide other information and records requested by the bureau as soon as possible and in whatever reasonable form requested.

(d) To the extent possible, the Department of Higher Education, in cooperation with the Department of Education, shall maintain the Arkansas Higher Education Information System in a manner that will ultimately be compatible with implementing a P-20 student data system for the state.

6-60-903. Compliance by institutions of higher education.

(a) An institution of higher education shall provide the data required under this subchapter at the time and in the manner:

(1) Required by rules of the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board; and

(2) Published from time to time by the Department of Higher Education.

(4) By October 15, 2011, the financial aid file of the Arkansas Higher Education Information System.

(b)(1) The Department of Higher Education shall provide the data whether the data is complete or incomplete or received from an institution of higher education late or on time, with a report to the bureau concerning:

(A) The name of an institution of higher education that has not submitted complete and correct data by a deadline published by the Department of Higher Education; and

(B) The type of data the institution failed to submit or needs to correct.

(2) The Department of Higher Education shall upload to the bureau any completed, late, or corrected data as soon as it is received by the Department of Higher Education.

(c)(1) The bureau shall take reasonable precautions, including electronic blocking or redacting, to prevent the disclosure of personally identifiable information of a student, as that term is defined in 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, as it existed on January 1, 2011, unless the parent or guardian of a minor student or a student who is no longer a minor consents in writing to the disclosure of personally identifiable information about that student.

(2)(A)(i) The bureau shall use a method of redaction substantially similar to the one used by the Department of Education based on the standards used by the Department of Education.

(ii) The bureau shall not include in a report any set of data that contains less than ten (10) units of data.

(B) The bureau staff shall inform the Department of Higher Education of any warehouse data used in the preparation of reports and provide the Department of Higher Education at least one (1) working day to review any student-related warehouse data used in preparation of reports before publicly releasing that student-related data without personally identifiable information of a student.

(d) The Department of Higher Education shall provide other information and records requested by the bureau as soon as possible and in whatever reasonable form requested.

(e) The Department of Higher Education shall provide a bimonthly report to the Arkansas Lottery Commission Legislative Oversight Committee on the progress of developing the direct read and report only access to the data warehouse of the Arkansas Higher Education Information System to be used by the bureau under this act.

(2) Neither the state nor any defendant within the action shall be liable for expenses which that a person incurs in bringing an action under this section.

(d) Employees or fiscal agents charged with the duty of referring or investigating cases of Medicaid fraud who are employed by or who contract with any governmental entity shall not be eligible to receive a reward under this section.

(2) If the Attorney General elects not to petition the court on behalf of the person, the person may petition the court on his or her own behalf.

(c) Neither the state nor any defendant within the action is liable for expenses that a person incurs in bringing an action under this section.

(d) An employee or fiscal agents charged with the duty of referring or investigating a case of medicaid fraud who are employed by or contract with any governmental entity are not eligible to receive a reward under this section.

(a) An employee who is discharged, demoted, suspended, threatened, harassed, or in any other manner discriminated against in the terms and conditions of employment by his or her employer because of lawful acts done by the employee in furtherance of an action under this subchapter or other efforts to stop one (1) or more violations of this subchapter is entitled to all relief necessary to make the employee whole.

(b) Relief available under this section includes:

(1) Reinstatement with the same seniority status that employee would have had but for the discrimination;

(2) Two (2) times the amount of back pay and interest on the back pay, if applicable; and

(3) Compensation for any special damages sustained as a result of the discrimination, including litigation costs and reasonable attorney's fees.

(c) An employee may bring an action in circuit court for the relief provided in this section.

(d) A civil action under this section may not be brought more than three (3) years after the date when the retaliation occurred.

SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE.

It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the statutes authorizing procedures for the recovery of false or fraudulent Medicaid claims are in immediate need of this revision to encourage citizens of the state to help recover public funds and Medicaid moneys that have been wrongfully misappropriated and will otherwise be lost forever; and that the provisions of this act are essential to successful operations and activities of the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit of the Attorney General's office and the Department of Human Services.
