(B) "Resides" includes a temporary absence from the state or temporary physical presence in a city that adjoins the Arkansas state line or is separated only by a navigable river from an Arkansas city that adjoins the Arkansas state line.

(21) "State or local authority" means a state or local government authority or agency or a representative of a state or local government authority or agency acting in an official capacity.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 47, Subchapter 2, is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:

20-47-230. Return of committed person to state of residence — Reciprocal agreements.

(a) The Department of Human Services may enter into a reciprocal agreement with the a state that adjoins the Arkansas state line or is separated only

by a navigable river from the Arkansas state line to facilitate the return of a person committed to mental health facilities in this state or another state to the states of their residence.

(b) The state returning a committed person to another state shall bear the expenses of returning the person, unless the state agrees to share costs under a reciprocal agreement made under subsection (a) of this section.

(c) If a state or local authority of another state petitions the department, the department shall enter into a reciprocal agreement with the state or local authority to facilitate the return of a person committed to a receiving facility in this state to the state of his or her residence unless the department determines that the terms of the agreement are not acceptable.

(d)(1) A reciprocal agreement entered into by the department under subsection (a) of this section shall require the department to develop a process for returning a person committed to a receiving facility to the person's state of residence.

(2) A process developed under subdivision (d)(1) of this section shall:

(A) Provide suitable care for the person committed to a mental health facility;

(B) Use available resources efficiently; and

(C) Consider commitment to a proximate mental health facility to make possible the return of the committed person to his or her state of residence.

(e) The department shall coordinate the reciprocal agreement and the process developed under subsection (d) of this section with a mental health facility, mental hospital, health service provider, court, or law enforcement agency located in Arkansas.

SECTION 3. DO NOT CODIFY. (a) This act applies only to a reciprocal agreement between an Arkansas state agency and an agency of another state that is entered into on or after the effective date of this act.

(b) A reciprocal agreement entered into between an Arkansas state agency and an agency of another state before the effective date of this act is governed by the law in effect on the date the reciprocal agreement was entered into, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose."

(a) It is the policy of the State of Arkansas to promote integrity in public employment.

(b) It is the intent of this subchapter to require that a public servant who pleads guilty to or nolo contendere to or is found guilty of ~~any felony offense relating to his or her office, position, or employment~~ the following to forfeit his or her office, position, or employment, and thereafter he or she is disqualified from holding ~~any an~~ an office, position, or employment with a governmental body:

(1) A felony offense relating to his or her office, position, or employment;

(2) A misdemeanor offense involving fraud, dishonesty, bribery, forgery, or other form of corruption relating to his or her office, position, or employment; or

(3) Theft of property under § 5-36-103 when the victim of the theft is the governmental body with which the public servant is associated.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 25-16-1102(3), concerning the definition of a public servant, is amended to read as follows:

(3)(A) "Public servant" means a public official, public employee, or public appointee; ~~and~~ .

(B) "Public servant" does not mean a member of the General Assembly or a person holding an office of trust or profit in the state under Arkansas Constitution, Article 5, § 9; and

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 25-16-1102, concerning the definition of a public official, is amended to add an additional subdivision to read as follows:

(5) "Public official" means a member of the General Assembly or person holding an office of trust or profit in the state under Arkansas Constitution, Article 5, § 9.

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 25-16-1103 is amended to read as follows:

25-16-1103. Forfeiture of office.

(a) ~~Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a~~ A public servant holding ~~any~~ an office, position, or employment in a governmental body shall forfeit the office, position, or employment if he or she pleads guilty or nolo contendere to or is found guilty of a:

(1) A felony offense relating to the public servant's office, position, or employment;

(2) A misdemeanor offense involving fraud, dishonesty, bribery, forgery, or other form of corruption relating to the public servant's office, position, or employment; or

(3) Theft of property under § 5-36-103 when the victim of the theft is the governmental body with which the public servant is associated.

~~(b)(1) This section does not apply to a member of the General Assembly subject to removal from office under the Arkansas Constitution, Article 5~~ A public official may be removed from office under Arkansas Constitution, Article 5.

(2) The General Assembly or the state may consider the following offenses when determining if a public official is qualified:

(A) A felony offense;

(B) Theft of property under § 5-36-103;

(C) Abuse of office under § 5-52-107; or

(D) Witness tampering under § 5-53-110.

(c) A public official or public servant may hold a public office after he or she is removed from an office, position, or employment with a governing body if an offense identified in subdivision (b)(2) of this section is expunged and permitted under applicable law.

SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 25-16-1104 is amended to read as follows:

25-16-1104. Disqualification from office.

~~A person public servant~~ who pleads guilty or nolo contendere to or is found guilty of a ~~felony offense relating to his or her office, position, or employment in a~~

~~governmental body~~ an offense under § 25-16-1103(a) shall be disqualified and barred from holding ~~any an~~ office, position, or employment in a governmental body.

SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 25-16-1105 is amended to read as follows:

25-16-1105. Enforcement.

(a)(1) Forfeiture of an office, position, or employment may be raised at the time a public servant pleads guilty or nolo contendere to or is found guilty of ~~a felony offense relating to his or her office, position, or employment in a governmental body~~ an offense under § 25-16-1103(a).

(2)(A) If the issue of forfeiture is raised against a public servant, the circuit court shall order the public servant to pay a penalty.

(B) The circuit court shall determine the amount of the penalty under subdivision (a)(2)(A) of this section by considering the following:

(i) The length of time over which the offense occurred;

(ii) The amount of money the offense cost the

governmental body;

(iii) The amount of the public servant's salary during the time period in which the offense occurred;

(iv) The severity of the public servant's breach of public trust; and

(v) Any other information the court considers relevant.

6-20-2308. Public School Student Transportation Funding Act of 2013.

(a) This section shall be known and may be cited as the "Public School
Student Transportation Funding Act of 2013."

(b) The General Assembly finds that:

(1) Public school student transportation is currently funded on a per-
student basis as part of the foundation funding formula, under which each Arkansas
school district receives the same amount of per-student funding for student
transportation;

(2) The actual costs of providing student transportation vary widely
among Arkansas school districts, and, consequently, the state student transportation
funding for some districts is well below actual transportation costs while for other
school districts it is well above actual transportation costs;

(3) There is no persuasive reason to provide each Arkansas school district the same amount of per-student funding for student transportation without regard to a district's actual student transportation cost;

(4) As discussed in the Odden and Picus 2006 report, "Recalibrating the Arkansas School Funding Structure," student transportation costs were included in the foundation funding formula until a separate standards-based funding formula could be developed;

(5) A standards-based student transportation funding formula based on route miles has been developed which would accurately and fairly fund the student transportation costs of Arkansas school districts;

(6) The Bureau of Legislative Research presented a standards-based student transportation funding formula to the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on Education for the 2008, 2010, and 2012 adequacy studies; and

(7) The student transportation funding formula presented by the bureau would be ninety-eight percent (98%) accurate in funding school districts' actual student transportation costs.

(c) Beginning with the 2013-2014 school year, the Department of Education shall provide to a school district annual state funding for student transportation based on the school district's student transportation costs as determined by a standards-based formula where student transportation cost is a function of a school district's historical route miles.

(d) Except as provided under subsection (e) of this section, all student transportation funding provided under this subchapter shall be distributed as provided under this section.

(e) To provide a smooth transition to accurate student transportation funding, the department shall distribute to a school district student transportation funding under this section in an amount that is:

(1) For the 2013-2014 school year, not less than seventy-five percent (75%) of the amount of funding within the per-student foundation funding amount for the 2012-2013 school year that represents the calculation for student transportation;

(2) For the 2014-2015 school year, not less than fifty percent (50%) of the amount of funding within the per-student foundation funding amount for the 2012-2013 school year that represents the calculation for student transportation;
and

(3) For the 2015-2016 school year, not less than twenty-five percent (25%) of the amount of funding within the per-student foundation funding amount for the 2012-2013 school year that represents the calculation for student transportation.

(f) The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules to implement this section.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that it is the state's constitutional obligation to provide a general, suitable, and efficient free system of public schools in the state; that many school districts have high student transportation costs and must use a greater amount of foundation funding for student transportation than other school districts; that the student transportation funding and distribution under this act are needed to ensure that proper resources are provided to public schools and school districts under the state's constitutional obligation; that the Department of Education will begin the distribution of public school funding for the 2013 - 2014 school year in August 2013; and that this act is immediately necessary so that public schools and school districts will receive the amount of funding provided under this act for the 2013-2014 school year. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2013."
