Upon motion of Representative Clemmer, **HOUSE BILL NO. 1896** was placed back on second reading for the purpose of amendment.

**AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO HOUSE BILL NO. 1896**

Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 1896** as originally introduced:

Page 1, delete all language after the enacting clause and substitute:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-15-2009(f), concerning public school assessments and remediation, is amended to add an additional subdivision to read as follows:

(11) The state board, in consultation with the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board, may promulgate rules to implement remedial course requirements and cost allocations under § 6-61-110, including without limitation:

(A) Procedures and criteria for public school or school district certification of a student's completion of an individualized academic improvement plan required under this section; and

(B) Procedures and deadlines for public school or school district payments for the cost of remediation allocated to the public school or school district.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2305(b)(4)(C)(i)(b), concerning school funding, is amended to add an additional subdivision to read as follows:

(17) Costs of postsecondary remedial courses allocated to a school district or open-enrollment public charter school under § 6-61-110.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-61-110 is amended to read as follows:

6-61-110. Testing of entering freshmen for remedial courses.

(a)(1) A first-time entering freshman at a state-supported institution of higher education who is admitted to enroll in an associate or a bachelor's degree program shall be tested by the admitting institution for purposes of placement in either college-level credit courses in English language arts and mathematics or remedial courses in English ~~composition, reading,~~ language arts and mathematics.

(2) A first-time entering freshman who graduated from an Arkansas public school in the same year he or she enrolls in a state-supported institution of higher education and who scored at or above the requisite scale score on the appropriate college and career readiness measurement administered by an Arkansas public school under § 6-15-433 shall be placed in a college-level credit course in English language arts or mathematics without additional testing unless the state-supported institution of higher education requires a greater score for college course placement.

(b) Remedial courses shall not provide credit toward a degree.

(c)(1) The Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall determine the:

- (A) Test or other criteria to be used;
- (B) Testing procedures and exemptions;
- (C) Minimum scores or criteria below which students at all state-supported institutions of higher education must take remedial courses; ~~and~~
- (D) Minimum scores or criteria to allow simultaneous enrollment in college-level credit and remedial courses; ~~and~~
- (E) Minimum scores or criteria to allow enrollment in college-level credit courses with concurrent tutoring or participation in an innovative remedial course alternative approved by the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board under subsection (d) of this section.

(2) The ~~board~~ Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall base these decisions on:

- (A) Consultation with representatives of the state-supported institutions of higher education;
- (B) Analysis of the placement procedures presently used by state-supported institutions of higher education in the state;
- (C) Statewide placement testing programs in other states; and
- (D) Pilot projects involving testing of entering freshmen at selected state-supported institutions of higher education in the state.

(3) The ~~board~~ Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board, in collaboration with state-supported institutions of higher education, shall ~~develop~~ approve by institution ~~uniform~~ measurable exit standards for remedial courses ~~that are comparable to the ACT or SAT equivalent required for college-level enrollment in credit courses to be implemented no later than the fall semester of 2010.~~

(d)(1) The ~~board~~ Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall work with state-supported institutions of higher education to:

- (A) ~~Develop~~ Approve strategies for innovative alternatives to traditional instruction and delivery methods for remedial courses; and
- (B) Provide professional development opportunities to help remedial education faculty gain knowledge in best practices and trends in the instruction and delivery of remedial education.

(2) The ~~board~~ Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall report periodically to the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on Education ~~by February 1, 2010,~~ on the progress made in addressing the requirements in subdivision (d)(1) of this section.

(e)(1) The Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board, in collaboration with the State Board of Education and state-supported institutions of higher education, shall develop a system to determine which entity is required to pay the cost of remedial courses and other forms of remediation that are required for students that graduate from an Arkansas public school after January 1, 2016.

(2) The Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board may adopt rules to implement subdivision (e)(1) of this section, including without limitation rules to:

(A) Allocate the cost of remediation between designated entities and individuals;

(B) Define criteria, procedures, and percentages for cost allocation and payment;

(C) Establish criteria to determine student eligibility for cost allocation; and

(D) Specify the cost to be allocated, which may include without limitation:

(i) Tuition;

(ii) Fees;

(iii) Books; and

(iv) Incidental expenses.

(3) The rules adopted by the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board, in collaboration with the State Board of Education, may provide that a portion of the cost of remediation may be allocated to a public school district or open-enrollment public charter school.

(4) A public school or school district may use national school lunch state categorical funding provided under § 6-20-2305 to pay its share of the cost of remediation allocated under this section."

**AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO HOUSE BILL NO. 1922**

Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 1922** as originally introduced:

Page 1, line 8, delete "ARKANSAS" and substitute "ARKANSAS BY PROTECTING THE WATER RESOURCES OF THE STATE"

AND

Delete the subtitle in its entirety and substitute:

"TO IMPROVE ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES IN ARKANSAS BY PROTECTING THE WATER RESOURCES OF THE STATE."

AND

Delete everything after the enacting clause, and substitute the following:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 8, Chapter 10, is amended to add an additional subchapter to read as follows:

Subchapter 4 — Public Surface Water Supply Protection Act

8-10-401. Title.

This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Public Surface Water Supply Protection Act".

8-10-402. Legislative findings and purpose.

(a) The General Assembly finds that:

(1) Clean water resources are essential to being able to effectively provide economic opportunities in the state; and

(2) Protecting the water resources of the state will improve Arkansas's ability to promote the economic opportunities available in the state and encourage the development of additional economic opportunities in Arkansas.

(b) The purpose of this subchapter is to encourage petroleum pipeline owners and operators to work with the state to protect and improve water resources and economic opportunities in Arkansas by reducing the risk of pipeline petroleum spills into the public surface water drinking supplies in the state.

8-10-403. Definitions.

As used in this subchapter:

(1) "Petroleum" means crude oil, gasoline, or any other nonvaporous petroleum product carried in a pipeline that crosses into the watershed of a public surface water supply;

(2)(A) "Public surface water supply" means a body of water, including without limitation a river, lake, reservoir, or other impoundment and the watershed

that drains into the river, lake, reservoir, or other impoundment, that is owned, leased, or otherwise used by a public water provider.

(B) "Public surface water supply" does not include water contained in an aquifer or aboveground water storage tank;

(3)(A) "Public water provider" means an entity that provides water for domestic, business, or industrial purposes.

(B) "Public water provider" includes without limitation a consolidated waterworks system created under the Consolidated Waterworks Authorization Act, § 25-20-301 et seq., city government, county government, regional water district, and nonprofit organization; and

(4) "Water course" means a river, stream, bayou, cove, or canal.

8-10-404. Construction of petroleum pipelines.

An owner or operator of a petroleum pipeline is encouraged not to construct a petroleum pipeline within the watershed of a public surface water supply.

8-10-405. Cut-off valve and training.

For each petroleum pipeline that crosses a water course that empties into a public surface water supply above ground or below ground, the owner or operator of the petroleum pipeline is encouraged to:

(1) Install a cut-off valve capable of:

(A) Automatically sensing a loss of petroleum flowing in the petroleum pipeline; and

(B) Automatically and manually cutting off the flow of petroleum on each side of each water course that discharges into a public surface water supply; and

(2) Provide annually to critical staff for the petroleum pipeline operator, the public water provider, and state and local emergency response providers either direct training or funding for training by a third party.

8-10-406. Risk mitigation and response plan.

(a) An owner or operator of a petroleum pipeline is encouraged to create a detailed risk mitigation and response plan for each petroleum pipeline in the watershed of a public surface water supply.

(b) An effective risk mitigation and response plan under subsection (a) of this section:

(1) States clearly each party responsible for implementing the risk mitigation and response plan on behalf of the petroleum pipeline owner or operator;

(2) Includes at least the following:

(A) Quarterly visual inspection of each petroleum pipeline;

(B) An early notification system for each relevant public water provider;

(C) Plans for the construction of containment berms;

(D) Detailed information on the product being carried in each petroleum pipeline;

(E) The annual training requirements for emergency response personnel; and

(F) A safety-related capital improvement plan that includes without limitation the following:

(i) The removal of aboveground petroleum pipeline crossings;

(ii) The installation of additional valves and valve controls; and

(iii) The construction of additional response structures and facilities.

(c)(1) The petroleum pipeline owner or operator is encouraged to submit any risk mitigation and response plan developed under this section to the Department of Health and the appropriate public water provider for comment

8-10-407. Rules.

(a) The Department of Health may promulgate rules necessary to implement this subchapter.

(b) In promulgating rules to implement this subchapter, the Department of Health shall seek input from at least the following:

(A) Public water providers;

(B) Owners and operators of petroleum pipelines;

(C) The Arkansas Department of Emergency Management;

(D) The Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality; and

(E) The Arkansas Natural Resources Commission."

5-37-217. Healthcare fraud.

(a) A person commits healthcare fraud if with a purpose to defraud a health plan:

(1) The person knowingly provides materially false information or omits material information for the purpose of requesting payment from a single health plan for a health care item or service; and

(2) As a result of the materially false information or omission of material information, a person receives payment in an amount that the person is not entitled to under the circumstances.

(b)(1) Health care fraud in the fifth degree is a Class A misdemeanor.

(2) However, if on one (1) or more occasion, the payment or portion of the payment wrongfully received from a single health plan in a period of not more than one (1) year exceeds:

(A) Ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) in the aggregate, health care fraud is a Class D felony;

(B) Twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) in the aggregate, health care fraud is a Class C felony;

(C) Fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) in the aggregate, health care fraud is a Class B felony;

(D) One million dollars (\$1,000,000) in the aggregate, health care fraud is a Class A felony.

(c) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this section that the defendant was a clerk, bookkeeper, or other employee other than an employee charged with the active management and control in an executive capacity of the affairs of the corporation who executed the orders of his or her employer or of a superior employee generally authorized to direct his or her activities."

Page 2, delete lines 1 through 36

AND

Page 3, delete lines 1 through 16

Page 3, line 30, delete "recoupment" and substitute "recovery"

AND

Page 3, delete lines 32 through 36 and substitute:

"20-77-2102. Definitions.

As used in this subchapter:

(1)(A) "Abuse" means provider practices that are inconsistent with sound fiscal, business, or medical practices and result in an unnecessary cost to the Medicaid program or in reimbursement for services that are not medically necessary or that fail to meet professionally recognized standards for health care.

(B) "Abuse" includes recipient practices that result in an unnecessary cost to the Medicaid program;

(2)(A) "Fraud" means a purposeful deception or misrepresentation made by a person with the knowledge that the deception could result in some unauthorized benefit to the person or another person.

(B) "Fraud" includes any act that constitutes fraud under applicable federal or state law;

(3) "Health plan" means a publicly or privately funded health insurance or managed care plan or contract under which a health care item or service is provided and through which payment is made to the person who provided the health care item or service;

(4) "Investigation" means investigations of fraud, abuse, or illegal acts perpetrated within the medical assistance program by providers or recipients of medical assistance care, services, and supplies;

(5) "Person" means an individual or entity other than a recipient of a health care item or service;

(6) "Recovery" means any action or attempt by the inspector to recoup or collect Medicaid payments already made to a provider with respect to a claim by:

(A) Reducing other payments currently owed to the provider;

(B) Withholding or setting off the amount against current or future payments to the provider;

(C) Demanding payment back from a provider for a claim already paid; or

(D) Reducing or affecting in any other manner the future claim payments to the provider.

(7) "Single health plan" includes without limitation the Arkansas Medicaid Program; and

(8) "Waste" means that taxpayers are not receiving reasonable value for money in connection with a government-funded activity due to an inappropriate act or omission involving mismanagement, inappropriate actions, and inadequate oversight by the person with control over or access to government resources."

Page 4, delete line 4 and substitute "of the Governor and is independent from the Department of Human Services."

AND

Page 5, line 3, delete "(2)" and substitute "(2)(A)"

AND

Page 5, delete line 4 and substitute the following:

"investigate medical assistance program fraud and abuse.

(B)(i) The Office of Medicaid Inspector General shall review provider records only for the three (3) years before an investigation begins.

(ii) However, if a credible allegation of fraud has been made or if the office has reason to believe that fraud has occurred, the office may review provider records for the five (5) years before the investigation began;"

(B) The office shall regularly communicate with and educate providers about the office's fraud and abuse prevention program and its audit policies and procedures.

(C) The office shall educate providers annually concerning its areas of focus within the medical assistance program, appropriate billing and documentation, and methods for improving compliance with program rules, policies, and procedures;

(B) Recommend to the Department of Human Resources that it take appropriate actions authorized under the department's jurisdiction to ensure that the medical assistance program is the payor of last resort;"

Page 8, delete lines 10 and 11 and substitute "year to the Governor;

(25) Identify and order the return of underpayments to providers;

(26) Maintain the confidentiality of all information and documents that are deemed confidential by law;

(27) Implement, facilitate, and maintain federally required directives and contracts required for Medicaid integrity programs;

(28) Implement and maintain a hotline for reporting complaints regarding fraud, waste, and abuse by providers;

(29) Audit, investigate, and access Medicaid encounter data, premium data or other information from an entity contracted with for the purpose of serving Medicaid programs;

(30)(A) Promulgate administrative rules to establish policies and procedures for audits and investigations that are consistent with the duties of the office under this chapter.

(B) The rules shall be posted on the office's website;

(31) Identify conflicts between the Medicaid state plan, department rules, Medicaid provider manuals, Medicaid notices, or other guidance and recommend that the department reconcile inconsistencies;

(32) When conducting an audit, investigation, or review under this subchapter, classify violations as either:

(A) Errors that do not rise to the level of fraud or abuse; or

(B) Fraud or abuse;

(b) The cost savings from member benefit programs and increased member contributions shall take place or be approved before or at the same time as an employer contribution increase.

(c) The system may rely upon actuarial reports by the system's actuary to determine the relative impact of changes to member benefit programs and increased member contributions, including whether the cost savings from member benefit programs and increased member contributions is equal to or exceeds the value of the proposed employer contribution increase."
