AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO HOUSE BILL NO. 2006

Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 2006** as originally introduced:

Delete everything after the enacting clause and substitute the following:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 27-16-1105(a)(1)(D), concerning minimum issuance standards for driver's licenses, is amended to add additional subdivisions to read as follows:

(x) Has a pending extension Form I-129, Petition for Nonimmigrant Worker or a pending Form I-539, Application to Extend/Change Nonimmigrant Status for dependents, as evidenced by a valid I-797C, Notice of Action; or

(xi) Is a spouse or minor child as described under 8 U.S.C. § 1101(a)(15)(F)(ii) of a bona fide student under 8 U.S.C. § 1101(a)(15)(F)(i) who has been given authorization for optional practical training under 8 C.F.R. § 214.2(f)(10)(ii) established by a valid Employment Authorization Document issued by the Department of Homeland Security.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 27-16-1111(a), concerning the expiration of a driver's license when the applicant is not a United States citizen, is amended to read as follows:

(a) If an applicant for a driver's license under this chapter is not a citizen of the United States as provided under § 27-16-1105(a)(1)(D)(ii)-(ix), the expiration date of the driver's license shall be the shortest of:

(1) The period provided for under § 27-16-901(a)(1)(A); or

~~(2) The date shown on the applicant's United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement of the Department of Homeland Security document I-94; or~~

(3) The last date the applicant may be present in the United States under federal immigration laws, as verified by:

(A) ~~the Division of United States~~ Immigration and Customs Enforcement of the Department of Homeland Security;

(B)(i) The status completion date on a United States Customs and Border Protection Form I-94, Arrival/Departure Record or Admission Stamp;

(ii) An additional two hundred forty (240) days shall be allowed following the status completion date on a United States Customs and Border Protection Form I-94, Arrival/Departure Record or Admission Stamp if the applicant has a valid Form I-797C, Notice of Action; or

(C) If the applicant is a spouse or minor child as described under 8 U.S.C. § 1101(a)(15)(F)(ii) of a bona fide student under 8 U.S.C. § 1101(a)(15)(F)(i) who has been given authorization for optional practical training under 8 C.F.R. § 214.2(f)(10)(ii), the end date on the Employment Authorization Document issued by the Department of Homeland Security."

Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 1863** as originally introduced:

Delete Representative Alexander as a cosponsor of the bill

AND

AND

Page 1, delete all language after the enacting clause and substitute:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 17, is amended to add an additional subchapter to read as follows:

Subchapter 29 -- The Arkansas Teacher Preparation Program Quality Act of 2013.

6-17-2901. Title.

This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Arkansas Teacher Preparation Program Quality Act of 2013".

6-17-2902. Findings.

The General Assembly finds that:

(1) Quality teacher preparation programs are essential in providing a strong teacher workforce across the state;

(2) The state supports a variety of teacher preparation programs;

(3) A data system to track the effectiveness of teacher preparation programs by following teachers is already established; and

(4) The state and its citizens have a vested interest in the quality of teacher preparation programs for teachers.

6-17-2903. Intent.

It is the intent of the General Assembly to provide the public with information regarding the quality and effectiveness of teacher preparation programs in the state by evaluating teacher preparation programs using measureable data that will:

(1) Support quality instructional practices in teacher preparation programs;

(2) Improve student learning;

(3) Encourage teacher preparation programs to continually assess and improve practices; and

(4) Improve teacher recruitment and retention efforts.

6-17-2904. Reporting.

(a) Beginning on July 1, 2014, and each July 1 thereafter, the Department of Education shall prepare a report on the effectiveness of all teacher preparation programs in the state using data collected from each teacher in his or her first five (5) years of placement as a teacher of record in a school district.

(b) The report shall include, without limitation, the correlation between different teacher preparation programs in the state and:

(1) Student academic achievement;

(2) Student academic growth;

(3) Student demographics;

(4) Teacher placement;

(5) Teacher mobility; and

(6) Teacher retention.

(c) The Department of Education shall collaborate with teacher education program providers and the Department of Higher Education to make the report

available to the public on the website of the Department of Education within thirty (30) days of completion.

(d) The information from the report shall be utilized by the State Board of Education and teacher education program providers to evaluate and improve the effectiveness of teacher education programs.

(e) The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules needed to implement this section, including without limitation, rules addressing:

(1) Which teacher preparation programs are included; and

(2) The measurements that will be used by the department to evaluate teacher preparation programs, including without limitation:

(A) Student academic achievement;

(B) Student academic growth;

(C) Student demographics;

(D) Teacher placement;

(E) Teacher mobility;

(F) Teacher retention; and

(G) The method used to analyze the data."

Upon motion of Representative Westerman, **HOUSE BILL NO. 1965** was placed back on second reading for the purpose of amendment.

AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO HOUSE BILL NO. 1965

Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 1965** as originally introduced:

Page 1, lines 9 and 10, delete the title in its entirety and substitute the following:

"AN ACT CONCERNING HEALTH INSURANCE FOR CITIZENS OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS; TO CREATE THE HEALTHCARE REFORM ACT OF 2013; TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

AND

Page 1, line 14, delete the subtitle in its entirety and substitute the following:

"TO CREATE THE HEALTHCARE REFORM ACT OF 2013; AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY."

AND

Delete everything after the enacting clause and substitute the following:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 77, is amended to add an additional subchapter to read as follows:

Subchapter 21 — Healthcare Reform Act of 2013

20-77-2101. Title.

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Healthcare Reform Act of 2013".

20-77-2102. Legislative intent.

(a) The Department of Human Services shall explore design options that reform the Medicaid program utilizing the Healthcare Reform Act of 2013 so that it is a fiscally sustainable, cost-effective, personally responsible, and opportunity-driven program utilizing competitive and value-based purchasing to:

- (1) Maximize the available service options;
- (2) Promote accountability, personal responsibility, and transparency;
- (3) Encourage and reward healthy outcomes and responsible choices;

and

(4) Promote efficiencies and transparency that will deliver value to the taxpayers.

(b)(1)(A) It is the intent of the General Assembly that the State of Arkansas through the Department of Human Services shall utilize a private insurance plan with an independence account for all "low-risk" participants.

(B) The private plan is for all "low-risk" participants who may be eligible for traditional Medicaid.

(2) The Healthcare Reform Act of 2013 shall ensure that:

(A) Private healthcare plans increase and government-operated programs such as Medicaid decrease;

(B) Decisions about the design, operation, and implementation of the private plan, including cost, remain within the purview of the State of Arkansas and not with Washington, D.C.; and

(C) Shall be for citizens of the United States who have resided in Arkansas for a minimum of five (5) years.

(c) It is the intent of the General Assembly that:

(1) The State of Arkansas furnish services to help families and individuals attain or retain capability for independence or self-care; and

(2) Public assistance, the Healthcare Reform Program, and the Medicaid Program shall be sustainable, accountable, cost-effective, person-centered and opportunity-driven programs utilizing competitive and value-based purchasing and private healthcare plans to maximize available services and encourage complete independence from public assistance and services.

(d) It is the intent of the General Assembly to redesign the Healthcare and Medicaid Programs utilizing private sector healthcare plans in order to achieve a person-centered, accountable, and opportunity-driven program.

(e) It is the intent of the General Assembly that the Healthcare and Medical Assistance Programs be a results-oriented system of coordinated care that focuses on independence, freedom, and choice that maximizes the available service options; promotes accountability and transparency; encourages and rewards healthy outcomes, personal responsibility, and responsible choices; drives employment first; and mandates efficiencies and program integrity.

(f) To achieve these goals, the Department of Human Services shall apply for any necessary waivers, state plan amendments, or both from the Secretary of the United States Department of Health and Human Services, including without limitation a waiver of the appropriate sections of Title XIX, 42 U.S.C. § 1396 et. seq.

(g) The application for and the provisions of a waiver, state plan amendment, or both under subsection (f) of this section shall be implemented to ensure that upon the enactment of the federal waiver, the Department of Human Services shall adopt rules approved by the General Assembly in order to implement the federal waiver, state plan amendment, or both to create a private-sector-type plan that is free from burdensome federal regulations.

20-77-2103. Purpose.

(a) The purpose of this subchapter is to:

(1) Improve access to quality health care;

(2) Attract insurance carriers and enhance competition in the Arkansas insurance marketplace;

(3) Promote individually owned health insurance;

(4) Strengthen personal responsibility through cost sharing;

(5) Improve continuity of coverage;

(6) Reduce the size of the state-administered Medicaid program;

(7) Encourage appropriate care, including early intervention, prevention, and wellness;

(8) Increase quality and delivery system efficiencies;

(9) Facilitate Arkansas's continued payment innovation, delivery system reform, and market-driven improvements;

(10) Discourage over-utilization;

(11) Reduce waste, fraud, and abuse; and

(12) Increase transparency.

(b)(1) The State of Arkansas shall take an integrated and market-based approach to covering low-income Arkansans by offering new coverage opportunities, stimulating market competition, and offering alternatives to the existing Medicaid program.

(2) The market-based approach shall:

(A) Maximize the available service options;

(B) Promote accountability, personal responsibility, independence, self-care, and transparency;

(C) Encourage and reward healthy outcomes and responsible choices; and

(D) Promote efficiencies that will deliver value to the participants, the state, and the federal government.

20-77-2104. Definitions.

As used in this subchapter:

(1) "Carrier" means a private entity certified by the State Insurance Department and offering plans through the Health Insurance Marketplace;

(2) "Cost sharing" means the portion of the cost of a covered medical service that must be paid by or on behalf of eligible individuals, consisting of copayments or coinsurance but not deductibles;

(3) "Eligible individual" means an individual who is an adult between nineteen (19) years of age and sixty-five (65) years of age with an income that is equal to or less than one hundred thirty-eight percent (138%) of the federal poverty level, including without limitation an individual who:

(A) Would not be eligible for Medicaid under laws and rules in effect on January 1, 2013;

(B) Has been authenticated to be a United States citizen or documented qualified alien according to the federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, Pub. L. No. 104-193; and

(C) Is not determined to be more effectively covered through the standard Medicaid program, such as an individual who is medically frail or other individual with exceptional medical needs for whom coverage through the Health Insurance Marketplace is determined to be impractical or overly complex, or that would undermine continuity or effectiveness of care;

(4) "Healthcare coverage" means healthcare benefits as defined by certification or rules, or both, promulgated by the State Insurance Department for the Qualified Health Plans or available on the marketplace;

(5) "Health Insurance Marketplace" means the vehicle created to help individuals, families, and small businesses in Arkansas shop for and select health insurance coverage in a way that permits comparison of available Qualified Health Plan based upon price, benefits, services, and quality, regardless of the governance structure of the marketplace;

(6)(A) "Low risk" means Medicaid-eligible citizens who are not aged, blind, or disabled as defined by the Department of Human Services on January 1, 2013.

(B) "Low risk" includes children eligible for Medicaid and for the ARKids First Program Act, § 20-77- 1101 et seq., commonly known as the "ARKids B program" as defined by the Department of Human Services on January 1, 2013;

(7) "Premium" means a charge that must be paid as a condition of enrolling in healthcare coverage;

(8) "Program" means the Healthcare Reform Program established by this subchapter;

(9) "Qualified Health Plan" means a State Insurance Department certified individual health insurance plan offered by a carrier through the Health Insurance Marketplace; and

(10) Independence Account means a flexible personalized account for the recipient that can be used for medical expenses, employment training, and costs of education.

20-77-2105. Public-sector-type plans.

(a) The Department of Human Services shall design public-sector-type plans that reform the Medicaid program so that it is a person-centered, financially sustainable, accountable, cost-effective, transparent, and opportunity-driven program with choices that:

(1) Utilizes private-sector modeled, competitive, and value-based purchasing to maximize the available service options, promote accountability and transparency, encourage and reward healthy outcomes, independence, upward mobility, employment-first, and responsible choices;

(2) Promotes efficiencies and the coordination of services across all populations;

(3) Ensures that recipients pay fair share and that program integrity resounds throughout the program; and

(4) Ensures the state will have a fiscally sound source of publicly financed healthcare for the most needy Arkansans.

(b) In developing and implementing this system of reform, the Department of Human Services shall pursue the following principles and goals:

(1) Allow recipients to make reasoned and cost-effective choices about their health by providing them with the information and array of service options they need and offering rewards for healthy decisions, employment and training, and personal accountability and cost effectiveness;

(2) Encourage personal responsibility by deploying cost sharing, encouraging shopping for healthcare services and assuring the information available to beneficiaries is easy to understand and accurate, providing an intermediary if necessary, and providing adequate access to needed services;

(3) Enable consumers to receive individualized health care that is outcome-oriented, focused on prevention and wellness, disease management, recovery, and maintaining full independence;

(4) Enable consumers to become engaged in their healthcare by establishing Independence accounts that drive personal responsibility and incentivize and reward health behaviors, employment, and outcomes;

(5) Promote private-sector-type competition between healthcare providers to ensure best-value purchasing and the best price possible to leverage resources and to create opportunities for improving service quality and performance;

(6) Redesign purchasing and payment methods to assure fiscal accountability;

(7) Encourage and reward service quality and cost effectiveness by tying reimbursements to evidence-based performance measures and standards, including those related to patient satisfaction;

(8) Ensure that all beneficiaries have a primary care medical home or care management that drives wellness, prevention, and coordinated care that provides quality and is cost-effective for the taxpayer;

(9)(A) Continually improve technology to be fully transparent on cost and price, including designing and deploying a transparency tool so that recipients can shop and be rewarded for cost-effective, quality-driven choices and take advantage of recent innovations and advances that help decision makers, consumers, and providers to make informed and cost-effective decisions regarding health care.

(B) The technology under subdivision (b)(9)(A) of this section may engage the consumers, case managers, and clinicians in tracking health outcomes and improving health; and

(10)(A) Design an enterprise-wide program integrity plan to promote and enforce program integrity through continual audits to ensure that waste and fraud are eradicated.

(B) The department may choose any method for achieving and implementing the principles enumerated in this act that provides program flexibility in exchange for federal budgetary certainty and under which Arkansas will operate all facets of the state's Medicaid program free from federal rules and regulations;

(c) The department shall submit a report to the Governor and the General Assembly by December 1, 2013, and annually thereafter describing the status of the administration and implementation of the private-sector-type plan.

20-77-2106. Administration of the Healthcare Reform Program.

(a) The Department of Human Services shall:

(1) Create and administer the Healthcare Reform Program; and

(2) Submit Medicaid State Plan Amendments and apply for any federal waivers necessary to implement the program in a manner consistent with this subchapter.

(b) Implementation of the program is conditioned upon the receipt of necessary federal approvals free from burdensome federal rules.

(c) The program shall include premium assistance for eligible individuals to enable their enrollment in a Health Plan through the Health Insurance Marketplace.

(d)(1) Where appropriate, the Department of Human Services may pay premiums and supplemental cost-sharing subsidies directly to the Qualified Health Plans for enrolled eligible individuals.

(2) The intent of the payments under subdivision (d)(1) of this section is to increase participation and competition in the Health Insurance Marketplace, intensify price pressures, and reduce costs for both publicly and privately funded health care and deliver value to the taxpayers.

(e) To the extent allowable by law:

(1) The Department of Human Services shall pursue strategies that promote insurance coverage of children in their parents' or caregivers' plan, including children eligible for the ARKids First Program Act, § 20-77- 1101 et seq., commonly known as the "ARKids B program"; and

(2) The Department of Human Services shall develop a strategy to inform Medicaid recipient populations whose needs would be reduced or better served through participation in the Health Insurance Marketplace.

(f) The program shall include cost sharing for eligible individuals that is comparable to that for individuals in the same income range in the private insurance

market and is structured to enhance eligible individuals' investment in their healthcare purchasing decisions.

(g) The program used shall be the most cost effective program available on the market to deliver value to the taxpayers.

(h)(1) The State Insurance Department and Department of Human Services shall administer and promulgate rules to administer the program approved by the General Assembly authorized under this subchapter.

(2) No less than thirty (30) days before the State Insurance Department and Department of Human Services begin promulgating a rule under this subchapter, the proposed rule shall be presented to the Legislative Council.

(i) The program authorized under this subchapter shall terminate within one hundred twenty (120) days after a reduction in any of the following federal medical assistance percentages:

(1) One hundred percent (100%) in 2014, 2015, or 2016;

(2) Ninety-five percent (95%) in 2017;

(3) Ninety-four percent (94%) in 2018;

(4) Ninety-three percent (93%) in 2019; and

(5) Ninety percent (90%) in 2020 or any year after 2020.

(j) An eligible individual enrolled in the program shall affirmatively acknowledge that:

(1) The program is not a perpetual federal or state right or a guaranteed entitlement; and

(2) The program is subject to cancellation upon appropriate notice, and waiting lists may be implemented; and

(k) This program shall not take effect until the federal government approves that:

(1) The program is not a perpetual federal or state right or a guaranteed entitlement;

(2) The program is subject to cancellation upon appropriate notice, and waiting lists may be implemented; and

(3) The program is not an entitlement program.

20-77-2107. Independence Account for recipients.

(a)(1) As part of the private plan, the Department of Human Services shall design an Independence Account for all recipients in the private plan that will be the focus of driving personal responsibility, independence, healthy living, and upward mobility.

(2) The recipient may be incentivized without limitation to achieve a healthier life style, better health, employment, or education.

(b)(1) The Independence Account shall be used without limitation to ensure that funds deposited by the state to be used for:

(A) Healthcare-related expenses;

(B) Employment training and costs associated with employment; and

(C) Education, training, and educational expenses for their children.

(2) Funds may be rolled over from year to year so that the account grows to help the recipient to achieve a better lifestyle.

(c) The goal of this account is to drive personal responsibility and upward mobility so that the recipient can live free from government subsidy.

(d)(1) The department shall establish and oversee an assessment and coordination process to assure proper decision making and program planning for recipients occur in addition to financial eligibility.

(2) The assessment and coordination process shall determine healthcare status, track utilization, assist with employment and monitor outcomes.

(3) The department may also choose to establish an administrative services organization as a means to manage populations across human services programs.

(e)(1) The department shall also design and implement either internally or through the health carrier, a transparency tool to enable recipients to be able to shop for cost-effective and quality-based care.

(2) The transparency tool shall engage the recipients in the cost and quality of their health care.

(3) If a recipient chooses cost-effective and quality-based providers, he or she shall be rewarded through his or her Independence Account.

(f) The department shall adopt rules to govern the Independence Account to be approved by the General Assembly.

20-77-2108. Waiver and state plan amendment.

(a)(1) The Department of Human Services shall apply for and obtain a waiver, a state plan amendment, or both that provide full program flexibility in exchange for federal budgetary certainty under which Arkansas will operate all facets of the state's Medicaid program.

(2) The waiver, state plan amendment, or both, and flexibility sought shall provide that this subchapter shall not be effective until the United States Government waives the following federal provisions or mandates:

(A) Actuarial Soundness under 42 C.F.R. 438.6(c) or all actuarial soundness rules;

(B) Equal Access to Care under 42 USC § 1396a(a)30, or all equal-access-to-care rules;

(C) Section 1902(a)(23) of Title XIX of the Social Security Act or a state or federal law that is commonly known as the "any willing provider" or a "free choice of provider" provision, 42 U.S.C. Section 1902(a)(10)(B), Section 1902(a)(17), or any references to free choice of providers;

(D) Amount, duration, and scope of services;

(E) Comparability of eligibility standards;

(F) Cost sharing under Section 1902(a)(14) insofar as it incorporates section 1916;

(G) Cost sharing under Section 1902(a)(14), 1916(e) and(f), and 42 C.F.R. 447.51, 447.53(e) and 447.56;

(H) Freedom of choice under Section 1902(a)(23) and all references to freedom of choice;

(I) Statewideness under Section 1902(a)(1) and all references to statewideness;

(J) Statewideness/Uniformity under Section 1902(a)(1)and all references to statewideness;

(K) Reasonable promptness under Section 1902(a)(8)and all references to reasonable promptness;

(L) Section 1902(a)(10)(C)(i) to allow Health Savings Accounts or Independence Accounts;

(M) Income and Resource Rules under Section 1902(a)(10)(C)(i);

(N) Payment for self-directed Care under Section 1902(a)(32), or both;

(O) Mandatory and optional services under 42 C.F.R. 440 or any references to mandatory and/or optional services; and

(P) Mandatory health benefits regulations under 45 C.F.R. Parts 147, 155, and 156 benchmark and benchmark-equivalent under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148; and

(3) This subchapter shall not be effective until the United States Government allows:

(A) The state to create resource tests or asset tests;

(B) The state to time limit able-bodied recipients and hold able-bodied recipients to strict work requirements;

(C) Health savings accounts or Independence Accounts;

(D) A program or option that is for citizens only;

(E) The state to create waiting lists for all Medicaid services under State wideness/Uniformity Section 1902(a)(1) and Reasonable Promptness § 1902(a)(8);

(F) The state to eliminate wrap-around services for all “low-risk” participants on Medicaid or Medicaid expansion or on the private plan; and

(G) The State of Arkansas to gradually implement the private plan.

(b) By December 1, 2013, the Department of Human Services shall provide proof to the cochairs of the Legislative Council that the private plan created under this subchapter is ready to be implemented and that all systems are in place and all healthcare networks are established in each county of this state.

(c)(1) A participant in the private plan created under this subchapter is eligible for only those benefits provided by a Health Plan or other appropriate care-management entity.

(2) Wrap-around services are not included and are not available to participants in this private plan created under this subchapter.

(3) The program shall not be effective until the state receives a formal commitment from the United States Government that wrap-around services are not part of the program.

(d) The Department of Human Services shall develop a model and seek to:

(1) Waive provisions of Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. § 1396 et. seq., requiring:

(A) State-wideness to allow for the provision of different services in different areas/regions of the state;

(B) Comparability of services to allow for the provision of different services to members of the same or different coverage groups;

(C) Prohibitions restricting the amount, duration, and scope of services included in the Medicaid state plan;

(D) Prohibitions limiting freedom of choice; and

(E) Retroactive payment for medical assistance, at the state’s discretion.

(2) Waive the applicable provisions of Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. § 1396 et. seq., required to:

(A) Expand cost-sharing requirements above the five per cent (5%) of income threshold for beneficiaries in certain populations; and

(B) Establish Independence Accounts that encourage personal responsibility and reward beneficiaries who reach certain prevention and wellness targets or employment, or educational goals;

(3) Establish waiting lists if necessary for Medicaid services;

(4) Expand disease management and wellness programs for all Medicaid beneficiaries;

(5) Empower and mandate able-bodied Medicaid beneficiaries to work whenever possible and mandate all able-bodied Medicaid beneficiaries who are not working to search for work;

(6) Drive competition into the Medicaid program and ensure best prices.

(e)(1) State obligations for uncompensated care shall be projected, tracked, and reported to identify potential incremental future decreases.

(2) The Department of Human Services shall recommend appropriate adjustments to the General Assembly.

(3) Adjustments shall be made by the General Assembly as appropriate.

(f) The Department of Human Services shall track the Hospital Assessment Fee as defined in § 20-77-1902 and report to the General Assembly subsequent decreases based upon reduced uncompensated care.

(g) On a quarterly basis, the Department of Human Services and the State Insurance Department shall report to the Legislative Council or to the Joint Budget Committee, if the General Assembly is in session, available information regarding:

(1) Program enrollment;

(2) Patient experience;

(3) Economic impact, including enrollment distribution;

(4) Carrier competition; and

(5) Avoided uncompensated care.

20-77-2109. Standards of healthcare coverage through the Health Insurance Marketplace.

(a) Healthcare coverage shall be achieved through a health plan or other appropriate quality-based plan.

(b) All participating carriers in the Health Insurance Marketplace shall offer quality approved health care.

(c) To assure price competitive choice among healthcare coverage options, the State Insurance Department shall assure that at least two (2) Qualified Health Plans or appropriate care alternatives are offered in each county in the state.

(d) Health insurance carriers offering health care coverage for program-eligible individuals shall participate in Arkansas Payment Improvement initiative including:

(1) Assignment of primary care clinician;

(2) Support for patient-centered medical home; and

(3) Access of clinical performance data for providers.

(e) On or before July 1, 2013, the State Insurance Department shall implement through certification requirements, rule, or both the applicable provisions of this subchapter.

20-77-2110. Enrollment.

(a) The General Assembly shall assure that a mechanism within the Health Insurance Marketplace is established and operated to facilitate enrollment of eligible individuals.

(b) The enrollment mechanism shall include an automatic verification system to guard against waste, fraud, and abuse in the Healthcare Reform Program.

20-77-2111 Effective date.

This subchapter shall be in effect until June 30, 2017, unless amended or extended by the General Assembly.

19-5-1140. Healthcare Reform Program Trust Fund.

(b)(1) The Healthcare Reform Program Trust Fund shall consist of moneys saved and accrued under the Healthcare Reform Act of 2013, § 20-77-2101 et seq.

(c) The fund may be used by the Department of Human Services to pay for future obligations under the Healthcare Reform Program created by the Healthcare Reform Act of 2013, § 20-77-2101 et seq.

SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Healthcare Reform Program requires private insurance companies to create, present to the Department of Human Services for approval, implement, and market a new kind of insurance policy; and that the private insurance companies need certainty about the law creating the Healthcare Reform Program before fully investing time, funds, personnel, and other resources to the development of the new insurance policies. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto."

SECTION 6. DO NOT CODIFY. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE.

(a) The General Assembly finds that:

(1) It is the duty of the State of Arkansas to provide a general, suitable, and efficient system of free public schools to the children of the state, under Arkansas Constitution, Article 14, § 1;

(2) The General Assembly is obligated to ensure the provision of an adequate and equitable system of education;

(3) The House Committee on Education, the Senate Committee on Education, and the Eighty-ninth General Assembly examined national school lunch state categorical funding to determine how the funding affects student achievement;

(4) While the state's goal in providing national school lunch state categorical funding is to provide a greater level of resources to school districts with the highest concentration of economically disadvantaged students, the current method of funding should be improved to better meet that goal;

(5) The evidence presented to the House Committee on Education, the Senate Committee on Education, and the Eighty-ninth General Assembly

indicates that the method in which national school lunch state categorical funding is distributed should change;

(6) Evidence presented to the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on Education in March 2013 shows that the current method of funding national school lunch state categorical amounts should be revised to align more directly with student achievement;

(7) The current method of distributing national school lunch state categorical funding does not differentiate between the family income levels of students who are at significantly different poverty levels;

(8) A change in the method of distributing national school lunch state categorical funding should produce a greater alignment of funding with concentrations of national school lunch students and focus the existing resources on programs associated with achievement gains for economically disadvantaged and low-performing students;

(9) School districts should only be permitted to use national school lunch state categorical funding to fund evidence-based programs directed at improving student achievement for economically disadvantaged and low-performing students;

(10) The House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on Education, meeting jointly, adopted two recommendations for national school lunch state categorical funding:

(A) Replace the current national school lunch state categorical funding mechanism with a model that provides funding for economically disadvantaged students on a sliding scale; and

(B) Prioritize and focus school districts' allowable uses of educational funding for economically disadvantaged students;

(11) The recommendations in subdivision (10) were adopted partially in response to a report by the Bureau of Legislative Research indicating that current national school lunch state categorical funding levels have not achieved desired achievement gains. The bureau also found that the number of allowed uses for national school lunch state categorical funding may dilute the impact of the funding but that further study would be necessary to determine whether this is so;

(12) While these concerns are important, the General Assembly has not had sufficient time to act on the findings and recommendations of the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on Education to find the best possible solution to the identified problems and recommendations. More time and study is needed to determine how best to implement the recommendations. However, it is clear that the evidence strongly suggests that an increase of national

school lunch state categorical funding for the upcoming school year is unlikely to produce the expected increase in academic achievement for the students for whom the funding is provided.

(b) The House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on Education, in conjunction with the bureau and the Department of Education, shall conduct a study and make the following recommendations to the Eighty-ninth General Assembly for consideration during the 2014 Fiscal Session:

(a) By July 1, 2014, the Department of Education and the Department of Career Education shall develop a Career Path Program for Arkansas public high schools.

(b) The program shall provide a student who is sixteen (16), seventeen (17), or eighteen (18) years of age the opportunity to select a career focus and complete vocational-technical training that leads to a certificate of completion in the vocational-technical area of study and a high school diploma.

(c) The purpose of the program is to address the educational and career training of students who:

(1) May desire a career path other than the traditional enrollment in postsecondary education as a first-time full-time freshman; or

(2) Have left high school and want to return to complete their secondary education.

(d)(1) When a student enrolls in the program, the school, the Adult Education Section of the Department of Career Education, the student, and the parent jointly shall develop an education plan for the participating student that:

(A) Includes learning opportunities, vocational-technical training, tutoring, and mentoring designed to meet the participating student's needs;

(B) Includes meetings with a guidance counselor;

(C) Is not based entirely on traditional credit-based instruction;

(D) May provide for a minimum number of hours of adult education programming based on:

(i) The educational needs of the participating student;

and

(ii) The employment of the student, if applicable; and

(E) May include without limitation transitional courses and courses for concurrent credit.

(e) In developing the program, the Department of Education and the Department of Career Education may include without limitation:

(1) Exempting the student from the compulsory attendance requirements of § 6-18-201 while the student is participating in the program;

(2) Providing counseling, mentoring, tutoring, or other support services identified under the student's education plan;

(3) Flexibility in the number of instructional hours required to be delivered on a school campus; and

(4) An alternative or dual high school diploma.

(f) The State Board of Education and the State Board of Career Education may promulgate rules as necessary to implement this section."

(3) Medicaid is one of the largest percentage expenditures of Arkansas tax dollars, and there is a need for reforming approaches to the use of these dollars; and

(4) The approach created in this section to dealing with this population has never been implemented in Arkansas.

(b)(1) The Department of Human Services shall contract with an experienced vendor to implement a two-year Medicaid Primary Care Case Management shared-savings pilot program in the Arkansas Delta region to begin January 1, 2014.

(2) The pilot program shall encompass a minimum of five thousand (5,000) recipients who:

(A) Are not currently in the Arkansas Patient-Centered Medical Home Program, the federal Comprehensive Primary Care Initiative, or a similar homehealth program;

(B)(i) Have catastrophic or chronic conditions as defined by the Johns Hopkins Adjusted Clinical Groups System; or

(ii) Are women with a history of past high-risk pregnancies, poor birth outcomes or preterm deliveries; and

(C) Whose estimated costs are in the top quartile for their defined population.

(c) The vendor shall recruit an adequate number of primary care clinics to initiate the program.

(d) The Medicaid Primary Care Case Management shared savings pilot program shall exclude the Alternatives for Persons with Disabilities, the Division of Developmental Disabilities Services Alternative Community Services, Elder Choices, Living Choices Assisted Living waivers, and members of the Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly.

(e) The Medicaid Primary Care Case Management program shared savings pilot program shall include without limitation the following Arkansas delta counties:

(h)(1) Savings realized under the Medicaid Primary Care Case Management program shall be shared:

(A) Thirty-four percent (34%) with the department; and

(B)(i) Sixty-six percent (66%) with the Medicaid Primary Care Case Management shared-savings pilot program vendor up to a maximum sharing cap of five percent (5%) of the total cost of administrative and health service expenditures as defined by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Service.

(ii) Further, fifty percent (50%) of savings received by the vendor shall be shared with eligible contracted network primary care providers based upon meeting agreed upon performance standards.

(2) Twenty five percent (25%) of the Medicaid Primary Care Case Management shared-savings pilot program vendor's administrative per member per month fee shall be at risk and shall be paid back to the state if savings are not realized.

(i)(1) After the Medicaid Primary Care Case Management shared-savings pilot program has operated for fifteen (15) months, the department shall utilize an agreed upon savings algorithm to calculate savings based on the first twelve (12) months of operations, allowing three (3) months of run-out.

(2)(A) Savings shall be disbursed within thirty (30) calendar days of final calculation.

(B) After the initial year of operation, savings shall be calculated on a quarterly basis.

(j) This section does not conflict with or reduce the Medicaid hospital access payments under section § 20-77-1901 et seq.

(k)(1) This section does not require a physician to participate in the pilot program created under this section.

(2) A physician has the right to refuse to contract under the pilot program created under this section or to terminate the contract at any time without penalty.

(l) If requested, the vendor shall agree to support any contracted physician in meeting the requirements of the Arkansas Patient-Centered Medicaid Home model."

23-61-802. Definitions.

As used in this subchapter:

(1) "Federal act" means the federal healthcare laws established by Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by Pub. L. No. 111-152, and any amendments to, or regulations or guidance issued under, those statutes existing on the effective date of this act;

(2)(A) "Health benefit plan" means a policy, contract, certificate, or agreement offered or issued by a health insurer to provide, deliver, arrange for, pay for, or reimburse any of the costs of healthcare services.

(B) "Health benefit plan" does not include:

(i) Coverage only for accident or disability income insurance, or both;

(ii) Coverage issued as a supplement to liability insurance;

(iii) Liability insurance, including without limitation general liability insurance and automobile liability insurance;

(iv) Workers' compensation or similar insurance;

(v) Automobile medical payment insurance;

(vi) Credit-only insurance;

(vii) Coverage for on-site medical clinics; or

(viii) Other similar insurance coverage, specified in federal regulations issued under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, Pub. L. No. 104-191, and existing on the effective date of this act, under which benefits for healthcare services are secondary or incidental to other insurance benefits.

(C) "Health benefit plan" does not include the following benefits if they are provided under a separate policy, certificate, or contract of insurance or are otherwise not an integral part of the plan:

(i) Limited scope dental or vision benefits;

(ii) Benefits for long-term care, nursing home care, home health care, community-based care, or a combination of these; or

(iii) Other similar, limited benefits specified in federal regulations issued under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, Pub. L. No. 104-191, and existing on the effective date of this act.

(D) "Health benefit plan" does not include the following benefits if the benefits are provided under a separate policy, certificate, or contract of insurance, there is no coordination between the provision of the benefits and any exclusion of benefits under any group health plan maintained by the same plan sponsor, and the benefits are paid with respect to an event without regard to whether benefits are provided with respect to such an event under any group health plan maintained by the same plan sponsor:

(i) Coverage only for a specified disease or illness; or

(ii) Hospital indemnity or other fixed indemnity insurance.

(E) "Health benefit plan" does not include the following if offered as a separate policy, certificate, or contract of insurance:

(i) Medicare supplemental health insurance as defined under section 1882(g)(1) of the Social Security Act, Pub. L. No. 74—271, as existing on the effective date of this act;

(ii) Coverage supplemental to the coverage provided to military personnel and their dependents under Chapter 55 of Title 10 of the United States Code and the Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Uniformed Services, 32 C.F.R. Part 199; or

(iii) Similar supplemental coverage provided to coverage under a group health plan;

(3) "Health insurance" means insurance that is primarily for the diagnosis, cure, mitigation, treatment, or prevention of disease, or amounts paid for the purpose of affecting any structure of the body, including transportation that is essential to obtaining health insurance, but excluding:

(A) Coverage only for accident or disability income insurance, or any combination thereof;

(B) Coverage issued as a supplement to liability insurance;

(C) Liability insurance, including general liability insurance and automobile liability insurance;

(D) Worker's compensation or similar insurance;

(E) Automobile medical payment insurance;

(F) Credit only insurance;

(G) Coverage for on-site medical clinics;

(H) Coverage only for limited scope vision benefits;

(I) Benefits for long-term care, nursing home care, home health care, community-based care, or any combination thereof;

(J) Coverage for specified disease or critical illness;

(K) Hospital indemnity or other fixed indemnity insurance;

(L) Medicare supplement policies;

(M) Medicare, Medicaid, or the Federal Employee Health Benefit Program;

(N) Coverage only for medical and surgical outpatient benefits;

(O) Excess or stop-loss insurance; and

(P) Other similar insurance coverage:

(i) Under which benefits for health insurance are secondary or incidental to other insurance benefits; or

(ii) Specified in federal regulations issued under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, Pub. L. No. 104-191, and existing on the effective date of this act, under which benefits for healthcare services are secondary or incidental to other insurance benefits;

(4) "Health insurer" means an entity that provides health insurance or a health benefit plan in the State of Arkansas, including without limitation an

insurance company, medical services plan, hospital plan, hospital medical service corporation, health maintenance organization, fraternal benefits society, or any other entity providing a plan of health insurance or health benefits subject to state insurance regulation;

(5) "Qualified employer" means a small employer that elects to make its full-time employees eligible for one (1) or more qualified health plans offered through the small business health options program, and at the option of the employer, some or all of its part-time employees, provided that the employer:

(A) Has its principal place of business in this state and elects to provide coverage through the small business health options program to all of its eligible employees, wherever employed; or

(B) Elects to provide coverage through the small business health options program to all of its eligible employees who are principally employed in this state;

(6) "Qualified health plan" means a health benefit plan that has in effect a certification that the plan meets the criteria for certification described in section 1311(c) of the federal act; and

(7)(A) "Small employer" means an employer that employed an average of not more than fifty (50) employees during the preceding calendar year.

(B) For purposes of this subdivision (7):

(i) All persons treated as a single employer under subsection (b), subsection (c), subsection (m) or subsection (o) of section 414 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as existing on the effective date of this act shall be treated as a single employer;

(ii) An employer and any predecessor employer shall be treated as a single employer;

(iii) All employees shall be counted, including part-time employees and employees who are not eligible for coverage through the employer;

(iv) If an employer was not in existence throughout the preceding calendar year, the determination of whether that employer is a small employer shall be based on the average number of employees that is reasonably expected that the employer will employ on business days in the current calendar year; and

(v) An employer that makes enrollment in qualified health plans available to its employees through the small business health options program and would cease to be a small employer because of an increase in the number of its employees shall continue to be treated as a small employer for

purposes of this subchapter as long as it continuously makes enrollment through the small business health options program available to its employees.

23-61-803. Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace.

(a) There is created a nonprofit legal entity to be known as the "Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace".

(b)(1) The Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace is created as a political subdivision, instrumentality, and body politic of the State of Arkansas and, as such, is not a state agency.

(2) Except to the extent provided by this subchapter, the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace is exempt from:

(A) All state, county, and local taxes; and

(B) All laws other than the Freedom of Information Act of 1967, § 25-19-101 et seq., governing state agencies, including without limitation:

(i) The Arkansas Procurement Law, § 19-11-201 et seq.;

(ii) The Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, § 21-5-201 et seq.; and

(iii)(a) The Arkansas Administrative Procedure Act, § 25-15-201 et seq.

(b) Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace shall adopt policies, procedures, and rules to implement its obligations under this subchapter.

(3)(A) Prior to the adoption, amendment, or repeal of any policy, procedure, or rule, the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace shall:

(i)(a) Give at least thirty (30) days' notice of its intended action. The thirty-day period shall begin on the first day of the publication of notice.

(b) The notice shall include a statement of the terms or substance of the intended action or a description of the subjects and issues involved and the time, the place where, and the manner in which interested persons may present their views on the intended action or the subjects and issues involved.

(c) The notice shall be mailed to any person specified by law and to all persons who have requested advance notice of rule-making proceedings.

(d)(1) Unless otherwise provided by law, the notice shall be published in a newspaper of general daily circulation for three (3) consecutive days and, when appropriate, in those trade, industry, or professional publications that the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace may select.

(2) The notice shall be published by the Secretary of State on the Internet for thirty (30) days in accordance with § 25-15-218;

(ii)(a) Afford all interested persons at least thirty (30) days to submit written data, views, or arguments, orally or in writing. The thirty-period period shall begin on the first day of the publication of notice under subdivision (b)(3)(A)(i)(a) of this section.

(b) Opportunity for oral hearing must be granted if requested by twenty-five (25) persons, by a governmental subdivision or agency, or by an association having no fewer than twenty-five (25) members.

(c) The Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace shall fully consider all written and oral submissions concerning the proposed rule before finalizing the language of the proposed rule and filing the proposed rule as required by subdivision (b)(3)(E) of this section.

(d) Upon the adoption, amendment, or repeal of a policy, procedure, or rule, the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace, if requested to do so by an interested person either prior to adoption, amendment, or repeal or within thirty (30) days thereafter, shall issue a concise statement of the principal reasons for and against its adoption, amendment, or repeal, incorporating therein its reasons for overruling the considerations urged against its adoption, amendment, or repeal; and

(iii) Comply with § 25-15-301 et seq.

(B) The thirty-day periods for giving public notice under subdivision (b)(3)(A)(i)(a) of this section and for receiving written data, views, or arguments, orally or in writing under subdivision (b)(3)(A)(ii)(a) of this section shall run concurrently.

(C)(i) If the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace finds that imminent peril to the public health, safety, or welfare or compliance with federal laws or regulations requires adoption of a policy, procedure, or rule upon less than thirty (30) days' notice and states in writing its reasons for that finding, it may proceed without prior notice or hearing, or upon any abbreviated notice and hearing that it may choose, to adopt an emergency rule.

(ii) The rule may be effective for no longer than one hundred twenty (120) days.

(iii) If, after the expiration of the effective period of an emergency rule, the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace wishes to adopt a successive emergency rule that is identical or substantially similar to the expired

emergency rule, the agency shall not adopt the successive emergency rule earlier than thirty (30) days after the expiration of the emergency rule.

(D)(i) The Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace shall file with the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee, the Secretary of State, the Arkansas State Library, and the Bureau of Legislative Research a copy of each policy, procedure, or rule adopted by it and a statement of financial impact for the rule.

(ii) The Secretary of State shall keep a copy of each policy, procedure, or rule filed under subdivision (c)(1) of this section in the permanent register required under § 25-15-204(d)(2).

(iii)(a) The scope of the financial impact statement shall be determined by the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace but at a minimum shall include the estimated cost of complying with the policy, procedure, or rule and the estimated cost for the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace to implement the policy, procedure, or rule.

(b) If the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace has reason to believe that the development of a financial impact statement will be so speculative as to be cost prohibitive, the agency shall submit a statement and explanation to that effect.

(c) If the purpose of a Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace policy, procedure, or rule is to implement a federal rule or regulation, the financial impact statement shall be limited to any incremental additional cost of the state policy, procedure, or rule, as opposed to the federal rule or regulation.

(E)(i)(a) Each policy, procedure, or rule adopted by the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace is effective thirty (30) days after filing of the final policy, procedure, or rule unless a later date is specified by law or in the rule itself.

(b) A final rule shall not be filed until the thirty-day public comment period required under subdivision (b)(3)(A)(ii)(a) of this section has expired.

(c)(1) After the expiration of the thirty-day public comment period and before the effective date of the rule, the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace shall take appropriate measures to make the final rule known to the persons who may be affected by the rule.

(2) Appropriate measures shall include without limitation posting the following information on the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace's website:

(A) The final rule;

(B) Copies of all written comments submitted to the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace regarding the rule;

(C) A summary of all written and oral comments submitted to the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace regarding the rule and the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace's response to those comments; and

(D) The proposed effective date of the final rule.

(ii)(a) However, an emergency rule may become effective immediately upon filing or at a stated time less than thirty (30) days after filing if the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace finds that this effective date is necessary because of imminent peril to the public health, safety, or welfare.

(b) The Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace's finding and a brief statement of the reasons for the finding shall be filed with the rule.

(c) The Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace shall take appropriate measures to make emergency rules known to the persons who may be affected by the emergency rules.

(F) The Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Oversight Committee shall review the proposed revised or amended policy, procedure, or rule and, if it is believed that the rule or regulation is contrary to legislative intent, shall file a statement thereof with the Legislative Council.

(c) The Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace shall operate subject to the supervision and control of the Board of Directors of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace. The board shall consist of the following members to be appointed on or before July 1, 2013:

(1)(A) Three (3) members appointed by the Governor.

(B) One (1) member appointed by the Governor shall be a representative of insurance agents or brokers licensed to sell health insurance in the State of Arkansas.

(C) Two (2) members appointed by the Governor shall be consumer representatives.

(2)(A) Three (3) members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

(B) One (1) of the members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall be a representative of a health insurer.

(C) One (1) of the members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall be a representative of small employers;

(3)(A) Three (3) members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

(B) One (1) of the members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall be a representative of a health insurer.

(C) One (1) member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall be a member of a health-related profession licensed in the State of Arkansas;

(4) The Insurance Commissioner or his or her designee; and

(5) The Director of the Department of Human Services or his or her designee.

(d)(1)(A) The initial members appointed by the Governor under subdivision (c)(1) of this section shall serve terms as follows:

(i) One (1) initial member shall be appointed to a term of four (4) years;

(ii) One (1) initial member shall be appointed to a term of six (6) years; and

(iii) One (1) initial member shall be appointed to a term of eight (8) years.

(B) A member subsequently appointed to the board under subdivision (c)(1) of this section shall serve a term of six (6) years.

(2)(A) The initial members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate under subdivision (c)(2) of this section shall serve terms as follows:

(i) One (1) initial member shall be appointed to a term of four (4) years;

(ii) One (1) initial member shall be appointed to a term of six (6) years; and

(iii) One (1) initial member shall be appointed to a term of eight (8) years.

(B) A member subsequently appointed to the board under subdivision (c)(2) of this section shall serve a term of six (6) years.

(3)(A) The initial members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives under subdivision (c)(3) of this section shall serve terms as follows:

(i) One (1) initial member shall be appointed to a term of four (4) years;

(ii) One (1) initial member shall be appointed to a term of six (6) years; and

(iii) One (1) initial member shall be appointed to a term of eight (8) years.

(B) A member subsequently appointed to the board under subdivision (c)(3) of this section shall serve a term of six (6) years.

(e) The appointing authorities under this section shall ensure that a majority of the voting members of the board have relevant experience in:

- (1) Health benefits administration;
- (2) Healthcare finance;
- (3) Health plan purchasing;
- (4) Healthcare delivery system administration; or
- (5) Public health or health policy issues related to the small group and individual markets and the uninsured.

(f) The board shall select one (1) of its members as chair.

(g)(1) Subject to review by the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee, the board may authorize by a majority vote of the total membership of the board cast during its first regularly scheduled meeting of each calendar year:

(A) Payment to its members of a stipend per day not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100) for each meeting attended or for any day while performing substantive business of the board; and

(B) Reimbursement of actual expenses while performing substantive business of the board.

(2) Members of the board shall receive no other compensation, expense reimbursement, or in-lieu-of payments.

(h)(1) The board shall hire the Executive Director of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace to:

(A) Plan and administer the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace; and

(B) Employ necessary staff.

(2) The board may plan and administer the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace and employ necessary staff on an interim basis until the executive director is hired.

(3) The employees of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace are not eligible to participate in the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System under § 24-4-101 et seq.

(i)(1) Neither the board nor its employees shall be liable for any obligations of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace.

(2) The board may provide in its bylaws or rules for indemnification of and legal representation for the board members and board employees.

(j)(1) The board shall adopt articles, bylaws, and operating rules in accordance with this subchapter within ninety (90) days after the appointment of the board.

(2) The articles, bylaws, and operating rules shall be reviewed by the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee.

(k) The board shall keep an accurate accounting of all activities, receipts, and expenditures on behalf of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace and report to the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee as requested by the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee.

(l)(1) The board shall have the authority to apply for and expend on behalf of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace any state, federal, or private grant funds available to assist with the implementation and operation of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace.

(2)(A) The Insurance Commissioner may apply for any state, federal, or private grant funds available to assist with the implementation and operation of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace.

(B) If the Insurance Commissioner applies for and receives any state, federal, or private grant funds available to assist with the implementation and operation of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace, the Insurance Commissioner shall enter into a memorandum of understanding with the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace concerning the use and expenditure of the grant funds.

(m)(1) The board may contract with eligible entities to assist with the planning, implementation, and operation of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace.

(2) For purposes of this subsection:

(A) An eligible entity includes without limitation an entity that has experience in individual and small group health insurance, benefit administration, or other experience relevant to the responsibilities to be assumed by the entity; and

(B) A health insurer or an affiliate of a health insurer is not an eligible entity.

(3) In contracting with an eligible entity under subdivision (m)(1) of this section, the board shall give preference to eligible entities that have relevant experience.

(4) The board shall establish a competitive bidding process for awarding contracts under this subchapter to an eligible entity.

(B) The competitive bidding process for awarding contracts under this subchapter to an eligible entity shall be reviewed by the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee.

(n) The board may enter into information-sharing agreements with federal and state agencies and other state marketplaces to carry out its responsibilities under this subchapter, provided such agreements:

(1) Include adequate protections with respect to the confidentiality of the information to be shared; and

(2) Comply with all applicable state and federal laws and regulations.

(o) As a condition of participating in the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace, a health insurer shall pay the assessments, submit the reports, and provide the information required by the board or the Insurance Commissioner to implement this subchapter.

(p) The board and any eligible entity under subdivision (m)(1) of this section shall provide claims and other plan and enrollment data to the Department of Human Services and the Insurance Commissioner upon request to:

(1) Facilitate compliance with reporting requirements under state and federal law; and

(2) Assess the performance of the Arkansas Health Independence Program, including without limitation the program's quality, cost, and consumer access.

23-61-804. Duties of Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace.

The Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace shall:

(1)(A) Implement procedures and criteria for the certification, recertification, and decertification of health benefit plans as qualified health plans in coordination with the Insurance Commissioner and in compliance with state and federal law.

(B) The procedures and criteria shall comply with applicable:

(i) Federal law;

(ii) Federal waivers obtained by the state to implement the Health Care Independence Program established by the Healthcare Independence Act of 2013, § 20-77-2101 et seq., if enacted; and

(iii) Rules promulgated by the State Insurance Department and the Department of Human Services under the Healthcare Independence Act of 2013, § 20-77-2101 et seq., if enacted;

(2) Provide for the operation of a toll-free telephone hotline to respond to requests for assistance;

(3) Maintain an Internet website through which enrollees and prospective enrollees of qualified health plans may obtain standardized comparative information on such plans;

(4) Assign a rating to each qualified health plan offered through the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace and determine each qualified health plan's level of coverage in accordance with regulations issued by the Secretary of the United States Department of Health and Human Services under section 1302(d)(2)(A) of the federal act;

(5) Use a standardized format for presenting health benefit options in the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace;

(6) Review compensation rates for licensed brokers and agents;

(7) Establish and make available by electronic means a calculator to determine the actual cost of coverage after application of a premium tax credit under section 36B of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as existing on the effective date of this act and any cost-sharing reduction under section 1402 of the federal act;

(8)(A) Establish a small business health options program through which qualified employers may access coverage for their employees.

(B) The small business health options program, without limitation, shall enable a qualified employer to specify a level of coverage so that any of its employees may enroll in a qualified health plan offered through the program at the specified level of coverage;

(9) Subject to section 1411 of the federal act, grant a certification attesting that, for purposes of the individual responsibility penalty under section 5000A of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as existing on the effective date of this act, an individual is exempt from the individual responsibility requirement or from the penalty imposed by that section of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 because:

(A) There is no affordable qualified health plan available through the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace, or the individual's employer, covering the individual; or

(B) The individual meets the requirements for any other such exemption from the individual responsibility requirement or penalty;

(10) Transfer to the Secretary of the United States Department of the Treasury the following:

(A) A list of the individuals who are issued a certification under subdivision (10) of this section, including the name and taxpayer identification number of each individual;

(B) The name and taxpayer identification number of each individual who was an employee of an employer but who was determined to be

eligible for the premium tax credit under section 36B of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as existing on the effective date of this act because:

(i) The employer did not provide minimum essential coverage; or

(ii) The employer provided the minimum essential coverage, but it was determined under section 36B(c)(2)(C) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as existing on the effective date of this act either to be unaffordable to the employee or not to provide the required minimum actuarial value; and

(C) The name and taxpayer identification number of each individual who:

(i) Notifies the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace under section 1411(b)(4) of the federal act that he or she has changed employers; and

(ii) Ceases coverage under a qualified health plan during a plan year and the effective date of that cessation;

(11) Provide to each employer the name of each employee of the employer described in subdivision (11)(B) of this section who ceases coverage under a qualified health plan during a plan year and the effective date of the cessation;

(12)(A) Select entities qualified to serve as navigators and award grants to enable navigators to:

(i) Conduct public education activities to raise awareness of the availability of qualified health plans;

(ii) Distribute fair and impartial information concerning enrollment in qualified health plans and the availability of premium tax credits under section 36B of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as existing on the effective date of this act and cost-sharing reductions under section 1402 of the federal act;

(iii) Facilitate enrollment in qualified health plans;

(iv) Provide referrals to any applicable office of health insurance consumer assistance or health insurance ombudsman or to any other appropriate state agency or agencies for any enrollee with a grievance, complaint, or question regarding his or her health benefit plan, coverage, or a determination under that plan or coverage.

(B) The board shall ensure in the navigator selection process that the navigators are geographically, culturally, ethnically, and racially representative of the populations served; and

(E) Provide information in a manner that is culturally and linguistically appropriate to the needs of the population being served by the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace; and

(13) Otherwise comply with a requirement the board determines is necessary to obtain or maintain the approval to establish or administer a state-based health insurance marketplace.

23-61-805. Funding — Publication of costs.

(a)(1) The General Assembly shall establish a reasonable initial assessment or user fee and reasonable increases or decreases in the amount of future assessments or user fees and penalties and interest charges for nonpayment of an assessment or user fee charged to participating health insurers for the efficient operation of the exchange.

(2) Beginning October 1, 2014, and annually by October 1 thereafter, the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace shall report to the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee in the manner and format that the committee requires its recommendations for the initial assessment or user fee and increases or decreases in the amount of future assessments or user fees and penalties and interest charges for nonpayment of an assessment or user fee charged to participating health insurers.

(3) Beginning January 1, 2015, and annually by January 1 thereafter, the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee shall review the recommendations of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace under subdivision (a)(1) of this section and report to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives the committee's recommendations for the initial assessment or user fee and future increases or decreases in the amount of assessments or user fees and penalties and interest charges for nonpayment of an assessment or user fee charged to participating health insurers.

(b)(1) An assessment may be offset in an amount equal to the amount of the assessment paid to the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace against the premium tax payable for the year in which the assessment is levied.

(2) An offset shall not be allowed for a penalty assessed under subsection (c) of this section.

(c)(1) All assessments and fees shall be due and payable upon receipt and shall be delinquent if not paid within thirty (30) days of the receipt of notice of the assessment by the health insurer.

(2)(A) Failure to timely pay the assessment will automatically subject the health insurer to a penalty not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the assessment and interest as established by the board.

(B) The penalty and interest is due and payable within the next thirty-day period.

(3) The Board of Directors of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace and the Insurance Commissioner may enforce the collection of the assessment and penalty and interest in accordance with this subchapter and the Arkansas Insurance Code.

(4) The board may waive the penalty and interest authorized by this subsection if the board determines that compelling circumstances exist that justify a waiver.

(d)(1) The Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace shall publish the average costs of licensing, regulatory fees, and any other payments required by the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace and the administrative costs of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace on an Internet website to educate consumers on such costs.

(2) Information published under subdivision (d)(1) of this section shall include information on moneys lost to waste, fraud, and abuse.

23-61-806. Rules.

(a) The Insurance Commissioner may promulgate rules to implement this subchapter.

(b) Rules promulgated under this section shall not conflict with or prevent the application of regulations promulgated by the Secretary of the United States Department of Health and Human Services under the federal act.

23-61-807. Relation to other laws.

(a) This subchapter is amendatory to the Arkansas Insurance Code.

(b) Provisions of the Arkansas Insurance Code that are not in conflict with this subchapter are applicable to this subchapter.

(c) This subchapter and actions taken by the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace under this subchapter shall not be construed to preempt or supersede the authority of the Insurance Commissioner to regulate the business of insurance within this state.

(d) Except as expressly provided to the contrary in this subchapter, a health insurer offering a qualified health plan in this state shall comply fully with all applicable health insurance laws of this state and regulations adopted and orders issued by the commissioner.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 10, Chapter 3, is amended to add an additional subchapter to read as follows:

Subchapter 27 — Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee

10-3-2701. Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee.

(a) The Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee is established.

(b)(1) The Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee shall consist of the following members of the General Assembly appointed as follows:

(A) Six (6) members of the House of Representatives shall be appointed to the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and

(B) Six (6) members of the Senate shall be appointed to the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

(2) In making appointments, each appointing officer shall select members who have appropriate experience and knowledge of the issues to be examined by the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee and may consider racial, gender, and geographical diversity among the membership.

(c)(1) The Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee shall study matters pertaining to the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Act, § 23-61-801 et seq., as the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee considers necessary to fulfill its mandate.

(2) The Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee may request reports from the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace pertaining to the operations, programs, or finances of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace as it deems necessary.

(d) Annually by December 15, the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee shall provide to the General Assembly any analysis or findings resulting from its activities under this section that the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee deems relevant.

(e)(1) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall each designate a cochair of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee.

(2) The Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee shall meet at least quarterly upon the joint call of the cochairs of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee.

(3) A majority of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee constitutes a quorum.

(4) No action may be taken by the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee except by a majority vote at a meeting at which a quorum is present.

(f) Members of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee are entitled to per diem and mileage reimbursement at the same rate authorized by law for attendance at meetings of interim committees of the General Assembly and shall be paid from the same source.

(g)(1) With the consent of both the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee may meet during a session of the General Assembly to perform its duties under this section.

(2) This subsection does not limit the authority of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Legislative Oversight Committee to meet during a recess as authorized by § 10-3-211 or § 10-2-223.

SECTION 3. NOT TO BE CODIFIED. (a)(1) The health insurance marketplace developed through a Federally-facilitated Exchange Partnership model shall transfer to the control of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace on July 1, 2015, if the Board of Directors of the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace determines that the establishment of a state-based marketplace is approved by the United States Department of Health and Human Services on or before July 1, 2015.

(2) The board may extend the date of transfer under subdivision (a)(1) of this section.

(b) The board shall participate in the Federally-facilitated Exchange Partnership to assist in planning the transition to a state-based health insurance marketplace.

SECTION 4. NOT TO BE CODIFIED. Legislative intent.

It is the intent of the General Assembly by the enactment of this act to establish a private, nonprofit, health insurance marketplace.

SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the federal healthcare laws established by Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by Pub. L. No. 111-152, allow each state to establish a health insurance marketplace or opt to participate in a health insurance marketplace operated by the United States Department of Health

and Human Services; that the state has elected to create a state-based marketplace effective on July 1, 2015; and that this act should become effective at the earliest opportunity to begin the process of planning for the implementation of a state-based marketplace and transitioning to a state-based marketplace. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto."

We, your committee on Enrolled Bills, to whom was referred the following:
