Page 1, delete line 5 and substitute:

"By: Representative Julian"

AND

Add Representatives D. Altes, C. Armstrong, J. Burris, Dale, Deffenbaugh, J. Dickinson, Fite, Hutchison, Julian, Murdock, Walker, H. Wilkins as cosponsors of the bill

AND

Page 1, line 9, delete "ARKANSAS;" and substitute "ARKANSAS'S ISOLATED SCHOOL AREAS; TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY;"

AND

Delete the subtitle in its entirety and substitute:

"TO AMEND PROVISIONS OF TITLE 6 OF THE ARKANSAS CODE; TO IMPROVE EDUCATION IN ARKANSAS'S ISOLATED SCHOOL AREAS; TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY."

AND

Delete everything after the enacting clause and substitute:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-20-604(e), concerning isolated school

funding, is amended to read as follows:

(e)(1) ~~Except as provided in subdivision (e)(2) of this section, a~~ A school district meeting the requirements of subsection (b) of this section shall receive an additional amount equal to ten percent (10%) of the per-student foundation funding amount under § 6-20-2305(a)(2) multiplied by the prior-year three-quarter average daily membership of the isolated school area to be used for the operation of the isolated school area if the school district has school facilities open for kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12) in one (1) or more isolated school areas meeting the requirements of subsection (b) of this section.

~~(2) A school district shall receive an additional amount equal to ten percent (10%) of the per-student foundation funding amount under § 6-20-2305(a)(2) multiplied by the prior-year three-quarter average daily membership of the isolated school area to be used for the operation of the isolated school area if:~~

~~(A) The school district has school facilities serving students in any grade in kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12) in one (1) or more isolated school areas meeting the requirements of subsection (b) of this section; and~~

~~(B) The school district closed an isolated facility serving students in grades seven through twelve (7-12) between January 1, 2008, and July 1, 2008.~~

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that due to a recent decision of the Supreme Court of Arkansas the special needs funding currently provided to isolated schools is in jeopardy; that the state should effectuate the original purpose of the law; that this amendment to the law is necessary to prevent the hardship that may be placed on school districts with isolated schools due to the loss of funding for special needs; and that this act is immediately necessary because school districts affected by this act and the Department of Education need to resolve the funding issues under this act for the 2013-2014 school year. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2013."

Amend **HOUSE BILL NO. 1042** as engrossed,

Immediately before SECTION 1 of the bill, add a new section to read as follows:

“SECTION 1. DO NOT CODIFY. Findings and intent.

(a) In 2005, the United States Supreme Court issued a ruling in Kelo v. City of New London that could potentially change the landscape for eminent domain matters across the country.

(b) The purpose of this bill is to emphasize and promote the protection of private property from government taking for a private use.

(c) It is the intent of this bill that an entity given the power of eminent domain by law shall not condemn property for the purposes of:

(1) Developing private retail, office, commercial, industrial, or residential development;

(2) Enhancing tax revenue; or

(3) Transferring property to another entity to achieve a purpose distinct from the initial purpose stated for commencement of an eminent domain proceeding.

(d)(1) It is not the intent of this bill to extend any new powers to the entities exempted under this bill.

(2) The entities are exempted as they are not within the scope of this bill.”

(A) Is composed of a heating element, battery, electronic circuit, or a combination of heating element, battery, or electronic circuit;

(B) Works in combination with a liquid nicotine delivery device composed either, in whole or in part, of pure nicotine and manufactured for use with e-cigarettes; and

(C) Is manufactured, distributed, marketed, or sold as an e-cigarette, e-cigar, e-pipe, or under any other product name or descriptor; and

(2) "Self-service display or vending machine" means a display or vending machine:

(A) That contains e-cigarettes or e-cigarette products;

(B) That is located in an area where customers are permitted;

and

(C) In which e-cigarettes or e-cigarette products are readily accessible to a customer without the assistance of a salesperson.

(b)(1) It is unlawful for a person or business to give, barter, or sell to a minor:

(A) An e-cigarette; or

(B) An e-cigarette product.

(2) A business owner who pleads guilty or nolo contendere to or is found guilty of violating subdivision (b)(1) of this section is guilty of a violation and is subject to a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100) per violation.

(3) An employee of a business who violates subdivision (b)(1) of this section is subject to a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100) per violation.

(c)(1) It is unlawful for a minor to:

(A) Use or possess or to purchase, or attempt to purchase:

(i) An E-cigarette; or

(ii) An E-cigarette product; or

(B) For the purpose of obtaining or attempting to obtain e-cigarettes or e-cigarette products, falsely represent himself or herself to be eighteen (18) years of age or older by displaying proof of age that is false, fraudulent, or not actually proof of the minor's age.

(2) An e-cigarette or e-cigarette product found in the possession of a minor may be confiscated and destroyed by a law enforcement officer.

(d) It is not an offense under subsection (c) of this section if the minor was acting as an agent of a business within the scope of employment.

(e) A person or business that sells e-cigarettes or e-cigarette products has the right to deny the sale of e-cigarettes or e-cigarette products to any person.

(f) It is unlawful for a business to fail to display in a conspicuous place or on each vending machine a sign indicating that the sale of e-cigarettes or e-cigarette products to or purchase or possession of e-cigarettes or e-cigarette products by a minor is prohibited by law.
