Amend **Senate Bill No. 154** as originally introduced:

Page 1, delete lines 28 and 29 and substitute the following:
"individuals at least nineteen (19) years of age that offers a high school diploma program, a general education development program, and an industry"

AND

Page 3, line 6, delete "adult education public charter" and substitute "adult education charter school"

AND

Page 3, line 11, delete "public"

AND

Page 4, line 1, delete "no more" and substitute "not counted in the average daily membership of a school district"

AND

Page 4, line 2, delete "than fifty-four (54) years of age"

AND

Page 4, delete lines 4 and 5 and substitute:
"(1) Earned a high school diploma; and"

(b) The department shall adopt a rule establishing the minimum graduation requirements for an adult education charter school to issue a high school diploma that substantially meets or exceeds the basic graduation competencies in core subjects expected by the State Board of Education for public school students."

Amend **Senate Bill No. 171** as originally introduced:

Delete the title in its entirety and substitute:

"AN ACT CONCERNING THE ARKANSAS TEACHER RETIREMENT SYSTEM; TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

AND

Delete the subtitle in its entirety and substitute:

"CONCERNING THE ARKANSAS TEACHER RETIREMENT SYSTEM; AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY."

AND

Delete everything after the enacting clause and substitute the following:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 24-7-602 is amended to read as follows:
24-7-602. Military service credit.

(a)(1) If an active member of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System enters the United States Armed Forces during ~~any a period of compulsory military service, after receiving~~ that a federal military draft was in effect and obtains a refund of member contributions from the system, the compulsory military service required of the member may be established as free credited service under this subchapter, if after an honorable discharge from the United States Armed Forces and before retirement the member repays to the system the actuarial equivalent of the member's ~~benefits~~ refunded service.

(2) In addition, an active member who entered the United States Armed Forces during any period ~~of compulsory military service that a federal military draft was in effect~~ and who becomes an active member ~~within one (1) year of his or her~~ after an honorable discharge from the armed forces is eligible to receive free military service credit under this section, whether or not the member has five (5) or more years of credited service at the time of the reemployment.

~~(b)(3) An active or inactive~~ When a member who entered is first employed after serving in the armed forces United States Armed Forces shall have the period of armed forces service credited as service in the system without cost to the member during a period of time that the military draft was in effect, he or she is eligible to receive free military service credit under this section if the member ~~satisfies the following conditions:~~

~~(1)(A) He or she completes~~ Completes five (5) or more years of actual service in the system; and

~~(2)(A) The armed forces service is not credited as service under any other retirement plan except Social Security.~~

~~(B) Receipt of a pension from the federal military retirement system paid solely for disability shall not be considered as having service credit with another retirement plan~~ Receives an honorable discharge.

~~(c)(b) If mandated by federal law before December 12, 1994, armed service~~ All United States Armed Forces service not otherwise creditable under this section shall be creditable, provided the member pays to the system the actuarial equivalent ~~of for the member's benefits~~ service credit.

~~(d)(4)(c)(1)~~ Effective December 12, 1994, a member who leaves employment with a school to serve, on a voluntary or involuntary basis, in the uniformed services of the United States and returns to employment with a school shall be treated as not having incurred a break in service with the employer. The employer shall certify to the system that reemployment was in accordance with the requirements set forth in

section 4312 of Pub. L. No. 103-353, the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act of 1994, Pub. L. No. 103-353.

(2) Under this subsection, uniformed services of the United States is limited to the United States Armed Forces; the United States Army and the Air National Guard when engaged in active duty for training, inactive duty training, or full-time National Guard duty; the commissioned corps of the Public Health Service; and any other category of persons designated by the President of the United States in time of war or emergency.

(3) The cumulative length of the absence from a position of employment with the employer by reason of service in the uniformed services shall not exceed five (5) years.

(4) A member reemployed under this subsection shall be entitled to accrue benefits for the time he or she served in the uniformed services by paying the employee contributions set forth in § 24-7-406.

(5) An employer reemploying a member under this subsection shall pay to the system the employer contributions due for the time the member served in the uniformed services and shall be those required by § 24-3-103 [repealed]. However, should a member not pay the employee contributions due, then no employer contributions shall be due.

(6) For the purposes of determining the employee and employer contributions due, the member's compensation during the period of service in the uniformed services shall be computed at:

(A) The rate the member would have received had he or she not served in the uniformed services; or

(B) The member's average compensation level during the twelve-month period, or shorter, if applicable, immediately preceding the service.

(7) If both employee and employer contributions are not paid, the member shall not be entitled to any accrued benefits for the time served in the uniformed services.

~~(e)~~(d) In no event shall a person be credited with a total of more than five (5) years of armed service, except that service credited under subsection ~~(d)~~ (c) of this section shall be in addition to that amount.

~~(f)~~(e) In any case of doubt as to the period of the armed service to be credited a member, the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System shall have the power to determine the period.

~~(g)(1)~~(f)(1) In the case of a death occurring on or after January 1, 2007, if a member dies while performing qualified military service as defined in section 414(u) of the Internal Revenue Code, as it existed on January 1, 2011, the survivors of the member are entitled to any additional benefits, including determining a member's vesting, provided under the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System as if the member had resumed and then terminated employment on account of death.

(2) Additional benefits under subdivision ~~(g)(1)~~ (f)(1) of this section do not include benefit accruals relating to the period of qualified military service.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the operations of a state public retirement system are complex and the system must be able to meet the needs of its members as anticipated by the General Assembly; that certain provisions of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Act are imminently in need of clarification to operate the system efficiently and effectively; that such clarification is of great importance to members of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System and to other citizens of the State of Arkansas; and that this act is immediately necessary in order to maintain an orderly system of benefits for the members of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto."

Amend [Senate Bill No. 299](#) as originally introduced:

Delete everything after the enacting clause and substitute the following:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 20-47-202(9), concerning the definition of "initial screening", is amended to read as follows:

(9)(A) "Initial screening" means initial screening services conducted by a mental health professional provided by a receiving facility or program for individuals residing in the area served by the receiving facility or program who are being considered for referral to an inpatient or outpatient program of the state mental health system to determine whether or not the individual meets the criteria for voluntary or involuntary admission and to determine whether or not appropriate alternatives to institutionalization are available.

(B) These screening services shall be available to community organizations, agencies, or private practitioners who are involved in making referrals to the state mental health system;

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 20-47-202 is amended to add new definitions to read as follows:

(22) "Admission" means the entry into an inpatient or outpatient program designed to offer treatment to a person with a mental illness and operated by a community mental health center, hospital, or receiving facility or program; and

(23) "Assisted outpatient treatment" means a court-ordered outpatient treatment program that allows an individual with a mental illness to comply with treatment while living in the person's own community.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 20-47-207 is amended to read as follows:
20-47-207. Involuntary admission — Original petition.

(a) ~~Written Petition — Venue.~~ Any A person having reason to believe that a person meets the criteria for involuntary admission or assisted outpatient treatment as defined in subsection (c) of this section may file a verified petition with the circuit clerk of the county in which the person alleged to have mental illness resides or is detained.

(b) ~~Contents of Petition.~~ The petition for involuntary admission shall:

(1) State whether the person is believed to be of danger to himself or herself or others as defined in subsection (c) of this section;

(2) Describe the conduct, clinical signs, and symptoms upon which the petition is based. The description shall be limited to facts within the petitioner's personal knowledge;

(3) Contain the names and addresses of any witnesses having knowledge relevant to the allegations contained in the petition; and

(4) Contain a specific prayer for involuntary admission of the person to a hospital or to a receiving facility or program for treatment pursuant to § 20-47-218(c).

~~(c) Involuntary Admission Criteria.~~

~~(1)(c)(1)~~ A person shall be eligible for involuntary admission or assisted outpatient treatment if he or she is in such a mental condition as a result of mental illness, disease, or disorder that he or she poses a clear and present danger to himself or herself or others.

(2) As used in this subsection, “a clear and present danger to himself or herself” is established by demonstrating that:

(A) The person has inflicted serious bodily injury on himself or herself or has attempted suicide or serious self-injury, and there is a reasonable probability that the conduct will be repeated if admission is not ordered;

(B) The person has threatened to inflict serious bodily injury on himself or herself, and there is a reasonable probability that the conduct will occur if admission is not ordered; ~~or~~

(C) The person's recent behavior or behavior history demonstrates that he or she so lacks the capacity to care for his or her own welfare that there is a reasonable probability of death, serious bodily injury, or serious physical or mental debilitation if admission is not ordered; or

(D)(i) The person's understanding of the need for treatment is impaired to the point that he or she is unlikely to participate in treatment voluntarily;

(ii) The person needs mental health treatment on a continuing basis to prevent a relapse or harmful deterioration of his or her condition; and

(iii) The person's noncompliance with treatment has been a factor in the individual's placement in a psychiatric hospital, prison, or jail at least two (2) times within the last forty-eight (48) months or has been a factor in the individual's committing one (1) or more acts, attempts, or threats of serious violent behavior within the last forty-eight (48) months.

(3) As used in this subsection, “a clear and present danger to others” is established by demonstrating that the person has inflicted, attempted to inflict, or threatened to inflict serious bodily harm on another, and there is a reasonable probability that the conduct will occur if admission is not ordered.

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 20-47-214(b), concerning a forty-five-day involuntary admission, is amended to read as follows:

(b)(1) Should any person be found guilty of giving false testimony that results in a person's wrongful involuntary admission, he or she shall be liable for civil damages and subject to incarceration for not less than thirty (30) days.

(2) The court shall make a determination at that time whether clear and convincing evidence has been presented that the person sought to be involuntarily admitted is of danger to himself or herself or to others as defined in § 20-47-207.

(3) If this burden of proof has been met, the court shall issue an order authorizing the hospital or receiving facility or program to detain the person for treatment for a maximum of:

~~(A) forty-five (45) days for an involuntary inpatient admission; or~~

(B) Six (6) months for an assisted outpatient treatment order under subdivision (c)(2) of this section.

SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 20-47-214(c), concerning a forty-five-day involuntary admission, is amended to read as follows:

(c)(1) This section shall be construed to allow the person sought to be involuntarily admitted to request treatment under an alternative least restrictive appropriate setting, including assisted outpatient treatment.

(2)(A) The court may order the person to undergo assisted outpatient treatment instead of or in conjunction with an involuntary inpatient admission after a hearing under this section.

(B) If the court verifies that the person who is the subject of the petition meets the criteria for involuntary admission under subsection (b)(2) of this section and if it believes the person can be served through assisted outpatient treatment, the court may order the person to receive assisted outpatient treatment through his or her local community mental health center.

(C) If the court orders assisted outpatient treatment, it shall order the person who is the subject of the petition to comply with his or her treatment plan and all services as prescribed by the treatment team of the local community mental health center.

SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 20-47-215(a)(1), concerning a one-hundred-eighty-day involuntary admission, is amended to read as follows:

(1) Additional one-hundred-eighty-day involuntary admission orders may be requested if, in the opinion of the treatment staff, a person involuntarily admitted continues to meet the criteria for involuntary admission for either inpatient involuntary admission or assisted outpatient treatment, or a combination of both, where applicable.

SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 20-47-218(b)(4), concerning treatment during a period of involuntary admission, is amended to read as follows:

(4) Short-acting and long-acting medication may be used during the forty-five-day admission period, the six-month period of assisted outpatient treatment, and the one-hundred-eighty-day involuntary admission period."

“(b) To the extent possible, the Arkansas Higher Education Performance Reporting System will utilize information from ~~the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools~~ an accrediting agency recognized by the federal Department of Education’s assessment outcomes measures which are required for reaffirmation of accreditation, federal Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System report data, and data collected annually through the Department of Higher Education's Statewide Information System.”

Page 1, delete all language after the enacting clause and substitute:

“SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 17, Subchapter 8, is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:

6-17-812. Compensation for teaching more than the maximum number of students permitted.

(a)(1) If a teacher in grades seven through twelve (7-12) volunteers to teach more than the maximum number of students permitted per day under the Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools and School Districts, then the teacher's pay under his or her contract shall be increased by an amount proportionate to the teacher's base pay and the additional number of students taught by the teacher.

(2) Subdivision (a)(1) of this section permits a teacher to volunteer to teach more than the maximum number of students permitted per day under the Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools and School Districts but does not permit a teacher to exceed the maximum class size permitted under the Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools and School Districts.

(3) A teacher in grades seven through twelve (7-12) may volunteer to use his or her conference period during the day to teach an additional class period or to teach more than the maximum number of students per day and shall be compensated at a pro-rated portion of his or her contract for both the extra class period and for every additional student they teach over the maximum number of students permitted per day under the Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools and School Districts.

(b)(1) A teacher is not required to teach more than the maximum number of students permitted per day under the Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools and School Districts but a teacher may voluntarily teach more than the maximum number of students permitted per day.

(2) A teacher who volunteers under subsection (a) of this section shall sign an agreement with the school district for the additional compensation that is applicable to the semester in which the teacher volunteers to teach more than the maximum number of students permitted per day under the Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools and School Districts.

(3) Neither the school district or the teacher are obligated to enter into or renew an agreement or continue an agreement past the semester in which the agreement is signed.

(c) A school district shall adopt a policy to implement this section.”
