(2) Payment for healthcare services provided through telemedicine shall be provided to the distant site physician and the originating site upon submission of the appropriate procedure codes.

(3) This section does not:

(A) Prohibit:

(i) Reimbursement by a health benefit plan to other healthcare professionals; or

(ii) A health benefit plan from paying a facility fee to a provider at the distant site in addition to a fee paid to the healthcare professional; or

(B) Require an insurer to pay more for a healthcare service provided through telemedicine than would have been paid if the healthcare service was delivered in person."

SECTION 5. Arkansas Code Title 23, Chapter 86, Subchapter 1, is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:

23-86-123. Prior authorization by physician.

(a) As used in this section:

(1) "Prior authorization" means the process by which a health carrier determines the medical necessity or eligibility for coverage of a healthcare service before a covered person receives the healthcare service in order to provide coverage and reimbursement for the healthcare service; and

(2) "Telemedicine" means the medium of delivering clinical healthcare services by means of real-time two-way electronic audiovisual communications, including without limitation the application of secure video conferencing, to provide or support healthcare delivery that facilitates the assessment, diagnosis, consultation, treatment, education, care management, or self-management of a patient's health care while the patient is at an originating site and the healthcare professional is at a distant site.

(b) When conducting prior authorization, whether for healthcare services provided through telemedicine or provided in person, a physician who possess a current and unrestricted license to practice medicine in the State of Arkansas shall make all adverse determinations."

Amend [Senate Bill No. 329](#) as originally introduced:

Delete everything after the enacting clause and substitute:

"SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 12-27-114(b), concerning the payment by the Department of Correction and the Department of Community Correction to a county jail for housing inmates, is amended to read as follows:

(b)(1)(A) ~~In the first week of each month, the~~ The Department of Correction and the Department of Community Correction shall prepare an invoice during the first week of each month that lists for each state inmate who was physically housed in a county jail received from a county during the previous month.

(B) The invoice shall reflect the number of days ~~an~~ a state inmate was in the county jail in an awaiting-bed-space status.

(2)(A) The Department of Correction and the Department of Community Correction shall verify and forward the invoices to the applicable county sheriff to certify the actual number of days the state inmates were physically housed in the county jail.

(B)(i) Upon written request of a county judge, county treasurer, or county sheriff, the Department of Correction and the Department of Community Correction shall provide to the county official making the request ~~of~~ a written report summarizing the year-to-date county jail reimbursement invoices prepared and forwarded for verification by the Department of Correction and the Department of Community Correction and payment from the fund.

(ii) In addition, the written report shall include a summary of invoices returned by each county for payment for previous months within the fiscal year, the amounts paid, and any balances owed.

(3)(A) The certified invoices shall then be returned to the Department of Correction and the Department of Community Correction for payment from the fund.

(B) Payment from the fund shall be made within (5) business days of receipt of signed and certified invoices returned by each county, subject to funding made available for payment of the certified notices.

(4) The county sheriff shall maintain documentation for three (3) calendar years to confirm the number of days each state inmate was physically housed in the county jail.

(5) The documentation maintained by the county sheriff is subject to review by the division.

SECTION 2. DO NOT CODIFY. Temporary language.

(a) Any arrearages owed the county jails by the Department of Correction and the Department of Community Correction shall not become immediately due upon the effective date of this act.

(b) Arrearages owed county jails by the Department of Correction and the Department of Community Correction for housing state inmates in the county jails shall be paid out incrementally over the six (6) months after the effective date of this act."

Amend **Senate Bill No. 331** as originally introduced:

Delete all language after the enacting clause and substitute the following:

“SECTION 1. DO NOT CODIFY.

(a) The Arkansas Activities Association (AAA) shall allow an AAA member school to play a home school team if the home school team complies with this act.

(b) A home school team shall comply with the AAA rules for student athletes, including rules concerning:

- (1) Age;
- (2) School semesters;
- (3) Scholarships;
- (4) Physical exams;
- (5) Foreign student eligibility; and
- (6) Amateurs.

(c) A coach of a home school team shall comply with AAA rules concerning the certification of home school coaches.

(d)(1) This act does not allow a home school team to participate in an AAA sanctioned:

- (A) Conference;
- (B) Conference tournament;
- (C) District tournament;
- (D) Regional tournament; or
- (E) State tournament or event.

(2) This act does not allow eligibility for a recognition award of championship.

(e) A home school team may participate in the following team sports:

- (1) Basketball;
- (2) Baseball;
- (3) Softball;
- (4) Soccer; and
- (5) Volleyball.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that athletics plays a critical role in the life of students; that allowing home school teams to compete against public school teams in certain sports is important; and that this act is immediately necessary to allow scheduling for the 2015-2016 academic year to proceed. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

- (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or
(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto."

(2)(A) "Electronic cigarette" means an electronic product or device that produces a vapor that delivers nicotine or another substance to the person inhaling from the device to simulate smoking, and that is likely to be offered to or purchased by consumers as an electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, or electronic pipe or digital device that provides a vapor of nicotine or another substance when used or inhaled, including without limitation a device that:

(i) Is composed of a heating element, battery, electronic circuit, or a combination of heating element, battery, or electronic circuit;

(ii) Works in combination with a liquid nicotine delivery device composed either, in whole or in part, of pure nicotine and manufactured for use with e-cigarettes;

(iii) Is manufactured, distributed, marketed, or sold as an e-cigarette, e-cigar, e-pipe, or under any other product name or descriptor; and

(iv) Does not include drugs, devices, or combination products approved for sale by the United States Food and Drug Administration.

SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 5-27-233(a)(1), concerning the definition of "e-cigarette", is amended to read as follows:

(1) "E-cigarette" means an electronic ~~oral~~ or digital device that provides a vapor of nicotine or another substance ~~that~~, when used or inhaled, ~~simulates smoking~~, including without limitation a device that:

(A) Is composed of a heating element, battery, electronic circuit, or a combination of heating element, battery, or electronic circuit;

(B) Works in combination with a liquid nicotine delivery device composed either, in whole or in part, of pure nicotine and manufactured for use with e-cigarettes; ~~and~~

(C) Is manufactured, distributed, marketed, or sold as an e-cigarette, e-cigar, e-pipe, or under any other product name or descriptor; and

(D) Does not include drugs, devices, or combination products approved for sale by the United States Food and Drug Administration; and

SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 6-21-609(a), concerning the definition of "e-cigarette", is amended to read as follows:

(a) As used in this section, "e-cigarette" means an electronic ~~oral~~ or digital device that provides a vapor of nicotine or another substance ~~that~~, when used or inhaled ~~simulates smoking~~, including without limitation a device that:

(1) Is composed of a heating element, battery, or electronic circuit, or a combination of heating element, battery, ~~and~~ or electronic circuit;

(2) Works in combination with a liquid nicotine delivery device composed either in whole or in part of pure nicotine ~~and propylene glycol~~ and manufactured for use with e-cigarettes; ~~and~~

(3) Is manufactured, distributed, marketed, or sold as an e-cigarette, e-cigar, e-pipe, or under any other name or descriptor; ~~and~~

(4) Does not include drugs, devices, or combination products approved for sale by the United States Food and Drug Administration.

SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 6-60-803(6), concerning the definition of smoking within The Clean Air on Campus Act of 2009, is amended to read as follows:

(6) "Smoking" means inhaling, exhaling, burning, or carrying any:

(A) Lighted tobacco product, including cigarettes, cigars, and pipe tobacco; ~~and~~

(B) Other lighted combustible plant material; and

(C) E-cigarette or electronic or digital device that provides a vapor of nicotine or another substance when used or inhaled, including without limitation a device that:

(i) Is composed of a heating element, battery, electronic circuit, or a combination of heating element, battery, or electronic circuit;
