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The formula for the Arkansas State CASA Association's grant funding for local programs has been revised to reflect a performance and outcomes based model.

Previously, our grant funding formula was based on the number of children available to be served in each district and the size of the judicial district. This formula did not account for performance of the grant goals or the actual numbers of children served by active volunteers.

The new funding formula allows programs to apply for grants based on performance, that is, the numbers of children actually served, rather than the number in the district available to be served. It takes into account the number of active volunteers serving children to permanence, which is at the heart of our mission; to train quality advocates to speak out in court for abused and neglected children, in order to move those children toward safe, permanent homes.

Last year, our legislative appropriation allowed 1,016 CASA volunteers from 24 local programs to advocate for 3,084 of Arkansas's foster children.

The new formula has been approved by the Administrative Office of the Courts, our State Advisory Council and the National CASA Association.
