

INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2017-090

3 REQUESTING THAT THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY STUDY A PROPOSED
4 CREATION OF A NEW PROGRAM DESIGNED TO ASSIST WITNESSES AND
5 VICTIMS OF CERTAIN CRIMINAL OFFENSES IN RELOCATING TO ANOTHER
6 PLACE OF RESIDENCE.
7

8 WHEREAS, oftentimes a victim of or witness to a criminal offense is a
9 resident of the same neighborhood, town, or city of the perpetrator of that
10 criminal offense; and
11

12 WHEREAS, because of this proximity, it is at least uncomfortable, if
13 not potentially dangerous for the victim of a criminal offense who may also
14 be required to testify against the perpetrator of the offense, to find
15 himself or herself the neighbor of the perpetrator after the conclusion of
16 the criminal trial or at the completion of the offender's incarceration; and

18 WHEREAS, it is expensive, time consuming, and emotionally taxing to
19 relocate to a new residence; however, it would be necessary for a victim to
20 remove himself or herself from a potentially dangerous, if not life-
21 threatening, proximity to a perpetrator of the criminal offense that made
22 that person the victim in the first place; and

24 WHEREAS, the House Committee on Judiciary should study the possibility
25 of creating a state-funded program designed to help alleviate the costs of
26 relocating a crime victim or witness to another neighborhood, town, or city
27 in order to create that physical distance between the victim or witness and
28 the criminal offender; and

30 WHEREAS, the study should encompass actual costs of relocation, the
31 anticipated frequency that such a program would be used, and by whom, as well
32 as the ability of the program to also address helping the victim or witness
33 gain employment at his or her new place of residence; and

35 WHEREAS, lastly, the study should determine which state agency would be
36 best suited to administer the victim or witness relocation program,

2 NOW THEREFORE,
3 BE IT PROPOSED BY THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY OF THE NINETY-FIRST
4 GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

5
6 THAT the House Committee on Judiciary study a proposed creation of a
7 program designed to assist witnesses and victims of certain criminal offenses
8 in relocating to another place of residence.

10 BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED THAT the Senate Committee on Judiciary be
11 invited to participate in the study.
