21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23 SECTION 1. (a) The Breast Cancer Control Program created in the
24 Department of Health under Arkansas Code § 20-15-1304 and its powers, duties,
25 and functions are transferred to the *Department of Health and Human Services*
26 by a type 2 transfer as defined by Arkansas Code § 25-2-105.

27 (b) The Breast Cancer Control Advisory Board established in Arkansas
28 Code § 20-15-1304 and its powers, duties, and functions are transferred to
29 the *Department of Health and Human Services* by a type 2 transfer as defined
30 by Arkansas Code § 25-2-105.
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32 SECTION 2. *This act shall be effective only if Senate Bill 45 as*
33 *introduced in the Eighty-Fourth General Assembly becomes law.*
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35 SECTION 3. *EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the*
36 *General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that passage of Senate Bill 45 as*



1 introduced into the Eighty-Fourth General Assembly may leave the Breast
2 Cancer Control Program and the Breast Cancer Control Advisory Board outside
3 any state agency, potentially disrupting authority to conduct business,
4 placing breast cancer control programs at risk of losing essential funding,
5 and increasing the risks of breast cancer to the citizens of this state.
6 Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately
7 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
8 become effective on:

9 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

10 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
11 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
12 bill; or

13 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
14 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
